🎒 METS NOTES 🥮

Mets: Scored two runs in the bottom of the ninth to win in walk-off fashion for the fourth time this season, tied with Oakland for the most in the majors... Have won six consecutive games, their longest streak since winning eight in a row from August 3-10, 2019...Are a season-high four games above .500... Improved to 8-5 in one-run games...Was the team's sixth comeback win.

Patrick Mazeika (0-1, RBI): Had his second walk-off fielder's choice of the week (also, May 7 vs. Arizona)...His two walk-off fielder's choices are tied for the most in Mets history with Carl Everett, who also had two walk-off FC in the span of one week, September 1 and September 4, 1996 (h/t Mark Simon).

- He is the first player since RBI became official in 1920 with multiple walk-off RBI within his first four career games...Thanks to Elias.
- The last time one player had each of the Mets' last two walk-off RBI was when Wilmer Flores had each of the Mets' first three walk-off RBI in 2018.

Marcus Stroman (6.1 IP, 4 H, ER, 2 BB, 5 K): Held the O's scoreless through six innings and left the game in a scoreless tie with the bases loaded and one out in the seventh inning (one run scored).

• Lowered his ERA to 2.01 (9 ER/40.2 IP)...Has allowed two earned runs or fewer in all but one of his starts this season.

Upcoming Probable Pitching Matchups

Orioles: Suffered their second walk-off loss of the season.

John Means (6.0 IP, 6 H, 3 K): Extended his career-best scoreless streak to 15.0 innings before being lifted in favor of a pinch hitter with the bases loaded in the seventh...Has thrown back-to-back scoreless starts for the first time in his career...Lowered his ERA to 1.21 (7 ER/52.0 IP).

Has allowed three earned runs or fewer in all eight of his starts and has four scoreless outings on the year.

Jeurys Familia (1.0 IP, H, BB, K): Earned his first win of the year...Was his 11th consecutive scoreless appearance (9.2 IP).

Dominic Smith (1-1, RBI): Lined a game-tying RBI single in the ninth inning... Entered the game after Albert Almora Jr. exited in the eighth.

Michael Conforto (1-4, RBI): Cut the Mets' deficit in half with an eighth-inning RBI single...Is batting .600 (6-10) with seven RBI in RISP situations this month.

Francisco Lindor (1-2, BB): Extended his hitting streak to five games (.438, 7-16)...Has been on base 12 times (seven hits, five walks) in his last five games.

Jeff McNeil (2-2): Logged his second multi-hit game of the season before leaving the game after the third inning with body cramps.

 Has reached base safely in 19 consecutive starts, the second-longest streak of his career (reached in 22 straight starts from August 13-September 9, 2018).

Albert Almora Jr. (0-3): Made his third start of the season...Left the game after running into the outfield fence in the eighth inning.



Pat Valaika (0-0, RBI): Broke a scoreless tie in the seventh inning with a pinchhit sac fly.
