METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off yesterday...On Thursday, the Mets earned a 4-2 come-from-behind win over the Milwaukee Brewers to earn a place in the National League Division Series.

DIVISION BELL: The Mets will play in the Division Series for the first time since 2015...Overall, it's their ninth appearance in the series...The Mets are 12-4 all-time in the series.

ONE, SINGULAR SENSATION: The Mets are 9-11 in the first game of a Postseason Series...The Mets earned an 8-4 win in Game 1 of the 2024 NL Wild Card Series.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are facing the Phillies in the Postseason for the first time in franchise history...The Mets are 2-4 against the NL East in the Postseason...The last time the Mets faced off against a divisional opponent was in 1999, when they faced the Atlanta Braves in the NLCS.

SPOOKY SZN: According to Sarah Langs and Elias, prior to 2024, only one pitcher had started a Postseason game after making one or no MLB appearances that season...In 1945, Virgil Trucks started two World Series games after returning from WWII...AJ Smith-Shawver did it in Game 1 of the 2024 NL Wild Card Series.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga is set to take the bump for the second time this season...He made one start on July 26 vs. Atlanta and allowed two earned runs on two hits with one walk and struck out nine over 5.1 innings...At the end of the start, he strained his left calf and has been on the 60-Day IL since then...He has made 30 career MLB starts, going 13-7 with a 2.99 ERA (57 ER/171.2 IP) with 78 walks and 211 strikeouts...He is 1-1 with a 1.46 ERA (2 ER/12.1 IP) in two career starts against the Phillies.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: In game three of the NL Wild Card Series, Pete Alonso hit the 10th go-ahead homer in the ninth inning or later in a winner-take-all game in Postseason history...It was the first ever with a team trailing.

SAVE THE CHEERLEADER, SAVE THE WORLD: There have been 12 players in franchise history to record a save in the Postseason...Jeurys Familia owns the franchise record with five Postseason saves...Armando Benitez, Tug McGraw and Billy Wagner are tied for second with three saves each...Edwin Diaz has appeared in three Postseason games...He is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER/4.1 IP) with three walks and five strikeouts in Postseason play.

ROAD TO RICHES: The Mets are 23-22 on the road in the Postseason...On Tuesday, the Mets earned their first road victory in the Postseason since an 8-3 victory over the Cubs on October 21, 205 in Game 4 of the NLCS.

ADDICTED TO THE PLAYOFFS: J.D. Martinez has appeared in 35 Postseason games, batting .290 (36-124) with 15 runs, five doubles, 10 home runs, 33 RBI, 19 walks, a .384 OBP and a .573 SLG.

TO RYNE OWNSELF BE TRUE: Ryne Stanek has appeared in 25 Postseason games...He is 3-0 with a 2.45 ERA (6 ER/22.0 IP) with six walks and 22 strikeouts in the playoffs.

TO THE POST: The Mets are 54-41 all-time in Postseason play...The club's .568 winning percentage is the third-best in major league history...Only the Marlins (24-16, .600) and the Yankees (244-178, .578) have a better winning percentage...The Mets own the third-best ERA in Postseason history with 3.22 ERA...Only the Orioles/Browns (2.80) and Athletics (3.14) have a lower ERA.

WILD OUT: The Mets previously made the Postseason as the Wild Card team in 1999, 2000, 2016 and in 2022...In 1999, New York defeated the Diamondbacks, 3-1, in National League Division Series and fell to the Atlanta Braves 4-2, in the League Championship Series...The 2000 Mets defeated the Giants, 3-1 in the NLDS and the Cardinals, 4-1 in the NLCS...The team fell to the Yankees 4-1 in the World Series...The 2016 Mets fell to the Giants, 1-0, in the one-game Wild Card Game...The Mets lost a best-of-three-game series to the San Diego Padres, dropping two games to one in 2022 at Citi Field.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The Mets are in the Postseason for the first time since 2022 and for the 11th time in franchise history...This marks the fifth Wild Card berth in team history...Also in 1999, 2000, 2016 and 2022.

POSTING UP: Pete Alonso appeared in all 162 Mets games this year...Outside of 2020, he became the second Mets player to appear in every single game, joining Félix Millán (1975)...John Olerud appeared in 162 of 163 games during the 1999...This year marked the third time in his career he has appeared in 160 or more games (also, 2019 & 2022).

ON THE RECORD: New York won 20 of their last 29 on the regular season...The Mets finished the year going 89-73...In 2023, the team finished at 75-87...The Mets were a season-low 11 games under .500 on June 2 (24-35)...Since then, the Mets went 65-38...Following a loss on May 29, the Mets played 107 games, going 67-40 in that span...Their .626 winning percentage was the best in the majors in that span...They outscored their opponents 541-433 during those 107 games.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets finished the season going 43-38 away from Citi Field in 2024...The Mets surpassed their road win total of 2023 (32-49)...The Mets hit .254/.316/.416 on the road this year...They ranked seventh in the majors in AVG and SLG and were 10th in OBP.

DANCING IN SEPTEMBER: The Mets went 17-9 in September...Their .654 winning percentage was third in the majors and the second-best in the National League...Their 3.21 ERA in the month was the third-best in the National League.

OMG: Jose Iglesias recorded a hit in both games of the team's doubleheader on the final game of the season...He ended the year with a 22-game hitting streak...It is the longest hitting streak of his career and it is the longest streak by a Mets player this year...His previous high was an 18-game streak from May 27-June 18, 2013 with the Red Sox...The last time a Mets player had a longer streak was Wilson Ramos, when he recorded a 26-game hitting streak from August 3-September 3, 2019...Iglesias batted .395 (34-86) over that span with 14 runs, four doubles, one home run, four RBI, one walk, two steals, a .429 OBP and a .477 SLG.

A LEADING MAN: Francisco Lindor hit 26 home runs when batting first this season...That tied a record for the most in franchise history...He joined Curtis Granderson (26 HR/140 Games, 2015) as the franchise leader...In 109 games batting in the leadoff spot this year, Lindor batted .303/.374/.552 with 82 runs, 31 doubles, one triple, 26 home runs, 71 RBI, 42 walks, 23 steals with a .926 OPS...The Mets went 64-43 when Lindor bated first this season.

30-FOR-30: Lindor recorded his second 30/30 season as a Met and the fifth of his career...Only four players in Mets history have recorded multiple seasons with 30 home runs and 30 doubles - David Wright (2007-08), Carlos Beltrán (2006-07), Carlos Delgado (2006 and 2008) and Howard Johnson (1989 and 1991).

FWAR, WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?: Francisco Lindor finished the season with a 7.6 fWAR...That was the sixth-best mark in the majors and the second-best mark in the National League...Only Shohei Ohtani (9.1 fWAR) had a higher mark...Lindor's 17.4 defensive fWAR was third in the majors.

ALL YOUR BASE ARE BELONG TO US: The Mets stole 106 bases out of 128 attempts this year, giving them a 82.8% success rate...It is the second-highest in franchise history...Last year, the team was successful in 88.7% (118-133) of stolen base attempts, the highest in team history...Brandon Nimmo was not caught in 15 stolen base attempts this year...His 15 steals were a career-best...Francisco Lindor stole 29 bases this year...That is two shy from his career-best 31, accomplished last year.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo hit .241/.344/.419 with 44 runs, 14 doubles, one triple, 12 home runs, 39 RBI and 39 walks in 74 road games...This compared to a .207/.310/.379 slashline with 11 doubles, two triples, 11 home runs and 38 walks in 75 games at home in 2024...Overall, Nimmo hit 23 home runs this year, one short of his career-best 24 he accomplished last season...His 90 RBI were a career-best...He recorded 77 walks this year...That's three short of his career-best 80 he recorded in 2018.

THE PENIS MIGHTIER: From the All-Star break until the end of the season, the Mets bullpen has posted a 3.74 ERA, the sixth-lowest mark in the National League in that span...Overall, the Mets relief staff have struck out 648 batters this season, which was fifth in the majors and third in the NL...Their 648 strikeouts were second-most in franchise history...The team recorded 571 punchouts in 2023...The 2021 team recorded the franchise record with 658 punchouts from the bullpen.

YOUNG HEARTS RUN FREE: Mark Vientos hit 27 home runs this year...He joined Darryl Strawberry (1983-1986), David Wright (2005-2007), Michael Conforto (2017), Pete Alonso (2019) and Francisco Alvarez (2023) as the only players in franchise history age 24 or younger to have 25 or more home runs in a season...He joined Wright (2005-2008, 2010), Howard Johnson (1987, 1989, 1991) and Robin Ventura (1999) as the only third baseman in franchise history with 25 or more home runs in a season (min. 50% games at 3B each season).

ED, EDD & EDDY: In 15 games since August 29, Edwin Díaz has converted six save opportunities, posting a 1.69 ERA (3 ER/16.0 IP) with five walks and 30 strikeouts...He posted a 3.00 ERA (9 ER/27.0 IP)- with 10 walks and 47 strikeouts in 27 games following the All-Star break...He was 3-1 with 10 saves, a 4.05 ERA (12 ER/26.2 IP) with 10 walks and 37 strikeouts in 27 games prior to the break...This year marks his fourth year in which he converted at least 20 saves for the Mets...Only John Franco (seven) and Armando Benítez (five) had more as a Met...His 224 saves since his debut in 2016 are the second-most...Only Kenley Jansen (305) has more.

SENGA NEWS & NOTES

POSTSEASON DEBUT: Today, Kodai Senga will make his first Postseason start after making just one start in the regular season...Senga missed nearly the first four months of the season with a right should capsule strain...After his one start on July 26, against Atlanta, Senga missed the rest of the regular season with a strained left calf...The right-hander made five rehab starts, one with High-A Brooklyn and four with Triple-A Syracuse...In his five rehab starts, Senga allowed six runs over 14.0 innings and recorded 15 strikeouts.

REMARKABLE ROOKIE: In his rookie campaign, Kodai Senga recorded 202 strikeouts and became the 18th rookie pitcher in the Modern Era (Since 1900) to have 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Senga's 202 punch outs were the second-most by a Mets pitcher behind only Dwight Gooden's 276 strikeouts in 1984...He joined Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsusaka (201) as the only Japanese-born rookie hurlers to reach 200 strikeouts...Senga's 12 wins were tied with Ron Darling (1984) for the seventh-most wins in a single season by a Mets rookie and was the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee (13, 2011)...His 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP) was the fifth-lowest in a single season by a Mets rookie behind only Jerry Koosman (2.08, 1968), Jon Matlack (2.32, 1972), Dwight Gooden (2.60, 1984) and Tom Seaver (2.76, 1967).

KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST: In 2023, Senga finished second in the NL and fifth in the majors among qualifiers in ERA...His 202 strikeouts were the tied for the eighth-most in the NL and tied for the 14th-most in the majors...Senga held opposing batters to a .208 average, the third-lowest mark among qualifiers in the NL and the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...His 10.93 SO/9 rate was the fifth-best mark among qualified major league pitchers last season.

SENGA GENESIS: In his last 18 starts of the 2023 season dating back to June 10, Senga pitched to a 2.57 ERA (31 ER/108.2 IP), struck out 129 batters and recorded 12 quality starts...During that span, his ERA was the fifth-best in the majors and his 10.68 SO/9 rate was the 12th-best (Min. 75.0 IP).

I LOVE MY NEW HOME: In 2023, Senga's 2.42 ERA (25 ER/93.0 IP) at Citi Field was the second-best home mark in the majors among qualifiers...Senga held opposing batters to a .179 average at home, the third lowest-mark in the majors among qualifiers...His 12.00 K/9 rate at home was the fifth-highest in the majors among qualifiers.

PUTTING THE K IN FORK: Last season, Senga's "ghost fork" accounted for 110 of his 202 strikeouts during his rookie campaign...The pitch had a 59.5 percent whiff rate and a 28.2 percent putaway rate...Opponents managed just 18 hits in 163 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .110 batting average.

SPOOKY GOOD: Last season, Senga led all rookie pitchers in bWAR (4.5) and fWAR (3.4)...He was the only rookie to qualify for the ERA title...Finished the season ranked fifth in the majors and second in the NL with a 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP), the fifth-lowest mark by a Mets rookie in franchise history.

HARD TO HIT: In his rookie season, Senga had three starts of 7.0 or more innings with two or fewer hits allowed, which tied for the second-most such starts in the majors this season...Additionally it tied with Dwight Gooden for the most such starts by a Mets rookie in a single season...Only Nolan Ryan (Four, 1970) and Jacob deGrom (Five, 2015) have had more such starts in a single season in franchise history.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Last season, Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He was the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

NEW YORK METS PITCHING BREAKDOWN
