ROSTER MOVE—The Rays have placed RH **Tyler Glasnow** (right elbow sprain) on the 10-day IL and recalled INF **Mike Brosseau** from Triple-A Durham...Glasnow underwent a MRI this morning in Chicago, which revealed a partial UCL tear as well as flexor strain...a timeline for his return will be determined after further medical evaluation.

RAY MATTER—The Rays have won four consecutive games and are 7-1 in their last 8 games to reach a season-high 19 games over .500...the Rays own sole possession of the best record in the majors for a third straight day, while they have held at least a share of the majors' best record for nine consecutive days and 14 of the last 16 days...the 1½-game cushion for the majors' best record is their largest in June or later since June 10, 2010 (+2.0), according to Stats LLC...the Rays own sole possession of the best record in the AL for a 10th straight day and 21st time in 22 days...the Rays have been alone in first place in the AL East since the end of play on May 24, and they have a season-high-tying 3-game lead over the Red Sox.

- + Their 43-24 record represents the best 67-game start in franchise history, passing a 41-26 record in both the 2010 and 2019 seasons.
- + The Rays are 24-5 since May 13, 30-9 since May 2 and 38-16 since April 16—each are the best records in the majors over those spans.
- + The Rays have played 43 games against teams currently at .500 or better, and their .628 winning pct. (27-16) in these games is tied with the Astros for the best mark in the majors...to compare, the White Sox have played 31 such games and they are 13-18 in them.
- + The Rays are 7-0-2 in their last nine series, the longest active series unbeaten streak in the majors, and 12-6-3 in series play this year.
- + With 95 games left, the Rays are on pace to finish 103-59, which would set a franchise record for wins in a season (97-65 in 2008)...it would be the 2nd-best winning pct. in club history (40-20 in 2020).
- + During this 24-5 stretch the Rays have outscored their opponents, 179-90 (+89), and their 5 losses have been by a combined 7 runs.
- + Since 2019, the Rays are an AL-best 179-110 (.619), which ranks 2nd in the majors over that stretch behind the Dodgers (189-99).

RAYS SINCE MAY—Since the start of May, the Rays are a major-league-best 30-10 (.750), a 3-game cushion over the Cubs (27-13) over that stretch... the Rays lead the majors since then with a 2.65 ERA (Cubs, 2.91) and are tied with the Dodgers for 2nd in the majors with 220 runs scored behind the Astros (227)...over this stretch, Rays starters lead the majors with a 1.04 WHIP and .202 opp avg. and rank 3rd with a 3.06 ERA, and the bullpen leads the majors with 19 wins and leads the AL with a 2.20 ERA.

KING OF THE ROAD—At 24-10, the Rays own the best road record in the majors, ahead of the Red Sox (20-10) and A's (18-9)...the Rays lead the majors with 202 runs scored and 5.94 R/G on the road, are tied for 2nd with 114 XBH and rank 3rd with 50 HR...the Rays are 7-2-1 in road series and 8-3 in road series openers, and their four road sweeps are most in the majors.

- + The Rays are 13-3 over their last 16 road games, 17-5 in their last 22 and
 - 22-6 in their last 28 after a 2-4 start...over this 22-6 stretch, the Rays have outscored opponents, 179-99 (+80), averaged 6.39 R/G, pitched to a 3.07 ERA and made 10 errors vs. their opponents' 32 errors.
- + The Rays have scored 6+ runs in 17 road games, most in the majors...their 11 road games of 8+ runs are tied for 1st in the majors.
- Four of the 10 road losses have been in walk-off fashion...the Rays have been tied or leading in the 9th inn. of 28 of 34 road games.
- Since Aug 10, 2020, the Rays are a majors-best 44-16 (.733) on the road, an 8-game cushion over 2nd-place LAD (33-21) since then.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE—The Rays rank 3rd in the majors with 333 runs scored behind the Astros (358) and Dodgers (347)...the Rays rank 6th in the majors and 4th in the AL at 4.97 R/G despite a .232 avg. that ranks 21st in the majors and 11th in the AL...from 1900–2020, 467 teams averaged 4.97 R/G but none did it with an avg. as low as the Rays—the lowest for a team scoring 4.97 R/G was .247 by the 2020 Yankees and 1991 Tigers.

- + The Rays rank 4th in the AL with a .319 OBP, 7th with 203 XBH and T-5th with 81 HR...their .232 avg.—which would be the lowest in club history (.238, 2020)—includes .239 with RISP and .228 with RISP/2 outs, which rank 21st and 15th in the majors, respectively.
- + The Rays have struck out a major-league-most 704 times, ahead of

- the Tigers (671)...the Rays are on pace for 1,702 SO, which would be a major league record ahead of the 2019 Tigers (1,595)...the Rays have a majors-most 46 games of reaching double-digit strikeouts.
- + The Rays are 38-12 (.760) when hitting a homer and 16-3 (.842) when hitting multiple homers...54.3 pct. (44 of 81) of their homers have come with runner(s) on base, which would pass 2005 (47.1) for the highest rate in franchise history...this is also the highest rate in the majors this season, ahead of the Giants (51.1 pct.) and Mets (50.0).
- + Since May 6, the Rays are batting .281 (86-for-306) with RISP, 5th in the majors and 3rd in the AL over that span...this has increased their season avg. w/ RISP from a major-league-worst .192 to .239.

PITCHING PROPERLY—The Rays have pitched to a 3.23 ERA (610.2-IP, 219-ER) this season, which ranks 5th in the majors and 2nd in the AL behind the White Sox (3.19)...the Rays have allowed 3 runs (or fewer) 40 times, 2nd in the majors behind the Padres (41), and are 32-8 when doing so.

- + Rays pitching had a 4.85 ERA through the first 13 games of the season but since then have pitched to a 2.84 ERA (492-IP, 155-ER) in 54 games since April 16, best in the majors over that stretch (SD: 3.13).
- + Since May 19, 57.3 pct. (43 of 75) of the runs allowed by Rays pitching have come on home runs: 19 solo, 10 two-run, one grand slam.
- + Rays starters have pitched to a 3.43 ERA (322.2-IP, 123-ER) this season, 8th in the majors and 2nd in the AL behind Chicago (2.98).

WHAT A RELIEF—The Rays bullpen has an AL-best 3.00 ERA (288-IP, 96-ER), 3rd in the majors behind the Padres (2.57) and Cubs (2.59)...this includes a 0.79 ERA (45.1-IP, 4-ER) in 11 games since June 2 and a 1.48 ERA (73-IP, 12-ER) in 18 games since May 25, both the best in the majors over those stretches...the Rays bullpen also has a 1.85 ERA (136-IP, 28-ER) in 32 games since May 9. 2nd in the majors since then behind the Cubs (1.34).

- + The Rays bullpen ranked 26th in the majors with a 5.07 ERA thru April 21, but since April 22 their 2.18 ERA ranks 1st in the majors.
- + The Rays bullpen enters tonight's game on a scoreless streak of 19.1 IP, with 4 hits, 4 BB and 20 SO over that stretch...a Rays reliever hasn't allowed a run since **Diego Castillo** (2-R/1-ER) in the 11th inning on Wed vs. WSH...all 6 runs (4 ER) allowed by the Rays bullpen since June 2 came in the same game on Wed vs. WSH.

FASHIONABLY LATE—In the 8th inning and later, the Rays have outscored their opponents, 98-57 (+41), and 80-37 (+43) when excluding extra innings...the +41 run differential over these frames is the highest in the majors, ahead of the Padres (32) and Indians (25)...the 98 runs scored in the 8th inning or later lead the majors, ahead of the Astros (87)...their 48 runs in the 8th inning lead the majors, 32 runs in the 9th are tied with the Astros for 1st and 18 runs in extras are tied for 2nd behind CIN (19).

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays haven't lost a game by more than 2 runs since May 8 at OAK (6-3), a stretch of 32 consecutive games which is the longest single-season streak in the majors since the Indians (37) from Aug 24–Oct 1, 2017...it is the 2nd-longest streak in franchise history behind Aug 5–Sep 9, 2012 (33)...since April 15, the Rays are 38-17 (.691) and 15 of their 17 losses have been by 2 runs (or fewer)...said another way, 53 of their last 55 games have ended with either a Rays win, or a loss by 2 runs (or fewer).

+ The Rays are 21-16 (.568) in games decided by 2 runs (or fewer) this season, 8th in the majors, including 14-8 in their last 22 games of this type after a 7-8 start...the Rays are 8-10 (.444) in 1-run games, 22nd in the majors, after going a majors-best 14-5 last season.

WEB GEMS—According to Sports Info Solutions, the Rays lead the majors with 57 Def. Runs Saved, a signifcant lead over the 2nd-place Padres (36)... their outfield leads the majors with 18 Runs Saved, ahead of BOS (15), and the infield (1B, 2B, 3B, SS) ranks 1st with 33 Runs Saved ahead of SD (28)... the Rays have saved 14 runs on infield shifts, most in the majors...according to StatCast, the Rays also lead the majors at 26 Outs Above Average.

+ The Rays lead the majors with a .98949 fielding pct., ahead of the Astros (.98926)...their 26 errors are the 2nd-fewest in the majors.

RAYS vs. WHITE SOX—Last night was the first meeting between the two clubs since July 21, 2019, going 693 days in between...tonight is the second of 6 games in the season series, with a 3-game set at Tropicana Field from Aug 20-22...the Rays have won four consecutive games at Guaranteed Rate Field dating back to April 8, 2019, and they are 6-1 there since the start of the 2018 season...the Rays faced the White Sox in the first post-season series in franchise history, winning the 2008 ALDS in 4 games.

LAST START—On Wed vs. WSH, took no decision in the shortest start of his career (3 IP)...yielded a 2-run homer to **Juan Soto** in a 29-pitch 1st inning...evaded a 2-on, 1-out jam in the 2nd with a groundout and strike-out before allowing a game-tying, solo homer to **Ryan Zimmerman** in the 3rd...his line: ND, 3 IP, 5 H, 3 R/ER, 3 BB, 4 SO, 2 HR, 77 pitches, 45 strikes.

- + The Soto homer was the first of his career allowed to a lefty...lefties are hitting .400 (10-for-25) off him, compared to .229 vs. righties.
- + Has allowed 10 hits and 7 runs in his last 2 starts spanning 6.1 IP.
- + His avg. exit velocity on balls in play was 86.5 mph, lowering his season avg. from 92.3 mph to 91.7 mph.

IN THE ZONE—Has thrown first-pitch strikes to 67.1 pct. of his batters faced, the highest rate among AL rookies and 11th overall in the AL (min. 30 IP)...he also ranks among AL rookie leaders in whiff rate (37.8 pct., 2nd), strikeout rate (29.6 pct., 5th), SO/BB ratio (3.50, 8th) and FIP (4.11, 9th).

+ 70.6 pct. (12 of 17) of his runs allowed have come with 2 outs, the 2nd-highest rate in the majors (min. 5 starts) behind OAK James Kaprielian (77.8)...four of his 6 HR allowed have come with 2 outs.

FLAME THROWING—His avg. fastball velocity is 97.2 mph, 5th in the majors among traditional starters, 2nd in the AL behind NYY **Gerrit Cole** (97.3 mph), and highest in the majors among left-handed starters, ahead of SD **Adrián Morejón** (96.3 mph) and CHW **Carlos Rodón** (95.7)... has reached 100 mph 10 times this season, 2nd in the majors among

starting pitchers behind deGrom (128)...is the second left-handed starter since StatCast data is available (2015) to throw 10+ fastballs at 100+ mph in a single season, joining SEA James Paxton (42) in 2016...the only other left-handed starter to reach 100 mph this season is Rodón (twice)...ten of the fastest 11 pitches among lefty starters have been by McClanahan.

+ Threw four fastballs that eclipsed 100 mph last postseason, including a 101.2 mph heater in Game 3 of the ALDS...only three pitchers reached a higher velocity than him last postseason: LAD **Brusdar Graterol** (7), LAD **Dustin May** (2) and TB **Tyler Glasnow** (1).

SMOOTH SLIDER—Since his season debut on April 29, his 28 SO with the slider rank 5th in the majors and 3rd in the AL, while his 62 swings-and-misses with the pitch are 4th in the majors over that stretch...min. 50 PA this season, his 48.1 pct. whiff rate on the pitch ranks 7th in the majors.

+ Is allowing a .206 opp avg. (13-for-63) against the slider, compared to .313 (21-for-67) against his other three offerings combined.

DEBUT: TAKE 2—Last postseason, made 4 apps in relief and became the first pitcher in major league history to debut in the postseason...was one of three to make his ML debut last postseason, along with Twins OF Alex Kirilloff and Padres LH Ryan Weathers (one day after McClanahan).

- According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the official statistician for Major League Baseball, a player's major league debut—in the case of a player appearing in the postseason before the regular season—is his postseason appearance...therefore, McClanahan's major league debut remains Game 1 of the ALDS on Oct 5, 2020 vs. NYY.
- + Is currently ranked as the No. 70 overall prospect in the minors by MLB.com, and No. 23 by *Baseball America*—which also tabbed him as having the Best Changeup in the Rays organization.

SPRING THINGS—Did not allow a run in three official Grapefruit League apps (1 start) this spring, striking out seven of his 10 BF across 3 IP...made his only start on March 3 vs. PIT, throwing a scoreless inning and stranding a leadoff single...made his next 2 apps at home against the Red Sox, going 1 IP on both March 9 and March 15 and striking out all 6 BF.

2020 RECAP—Was part of the Rays 60-man player pool and spent the summer at the alternate site in Port Charlotte...made his major league debut in Game 1 of the ALDS vs. NYY, becoming the first pitcher in major league history to debut in the postseason...prior to the 2020 postseason, only two position players had made their major league debuts in the postseason: KC **Adalberto Mondesi** in 2015 and OAK **Mark Kiger** in 2006.

+ Became the first pitcher and second player in major league history to appear in a World Series game before appearing in a regular season game, joining Mondesi in the 2015 World Series at NYM.

ON THE FARM—In two minor league seasons with the Rays, is 11-6 with a 3.17 ERA (127.2-IP, 45-ER) in 28 career apps (26 starts)...totaled 7 IP over 4 starts after he was drafted in 2018 before going 11-6 with a 3.36 ERA (120.2-IP, 45-ER) in 24 apps (22 starts) between three levels in 2019, his first full season...began the season with Class-A Bowling Green and was named to the Midwest League midseason All-Star Team...promoted to Class-A Charlotte June 8, making 9 apps (8 starts) with them before an Aug 4 promotion to Double-A Montgomery...his 154 SO ranked 2nd among Rays minor leaguers and his 11 wins tied for 5th in the system.

AMATUER CAREER—Became the second product of the University of South Florida to play for the Rays, joining **Dave Eiland** in 1998–2000...as a redshirt sophomore in 2018, posted a 3.42 ERA (76.1-IP, 29-ER) and 120 SO, and his 14.1 SO/9 IP ratio ranked 2nd in Division I...ranked by *Baseball America* as the No. 8 overall player in the 2018 Amateur Draft.
