#### 2023 ALL-STAR

RHP Alexis Díaz was the Reds' lone National League All-Star, his first career selection... is the first Reds reliever to make the All-Star team since Aroldis Chapman in 2015 and the first righthanded reliever since Francisco Cordero in 2009...assistant athletic trainer Tomás Vera worked on the NL's medical staff.

#### WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES

The Reds went 62-100 (.383) in 2022 and 82-80 (.506) in 2023...among all Major League teams from 2022 to 2023, the Reds ranked second to the **Rangers** (90-72, .556) for the largest increase in **wins** (+20, Tex +22) and largest increase in **winning percentage** (+.123, Tex +.136)...courtesy @EliasSports.

#### FROM 100 TO POSTSEASON

The Reds fell short in their bids to become the third team ever to make the playoffs following a 100-loss season (2017 Twins, 2020 Marlins) and the fifth Postseason team with a losing home record during the regular season (1981 Royals, 19-28; 2001 Braves, 40-41; 2020 Marlins, 11-15; 2023 Astros, 39-42).

- IF/OF Nick Senzel was Player of the Week for 4/24-4/30.
- In the second week of his Major League career, SS Matt McLain was Player of the Week for 5/22-5/28.
- 1B Spencer Steer was the Rookie of the Month for May.
- In the third week of his Major League career, IF Elly De La Cruz was Player of the Week for 6/19-6/25.
- LHP Andrew Abbott, IF Matt McLain and IF/OF Spencer Steer were named to Baseball America's MLB All-Rookie Team.

## RED HOTS

- The Reds became the first team in Major League history to move into first place alone in 9 games or fewer after falling 5 or more games under .500 while facing a deficit of at least 5 games...on 6/9 were 29-35 and trailed the first-place Pirates by 5.0 games...beginning 6/10 won 9 straight games to move into first place alone on 6/19.

  The Reds' 12-game winning streak from 6/10-6/23 tied their modern club record (5/16-5/27, 1939 & 4/30-5/12, 1957).
- The Reds went 18-9 in June, their highest victory total in any month since June 2014 (18-10).
- From 6/14-7/8 Reds batters established a new franchise record for consecutive games with at least 1 home run (22g, 45hr), a streak snapped in the 1-0 loss at Mil in the final game heading into the All-Star Game break...the 1956 Reds held the team record by homering in 21 consecutive games
- The Reds and Orioles shared the Major League lead with 48 come-from-behind wins...the Reds won 24 games in their final plate appearance, including 10 walkoff wins.

#### **ROSTER NOTES**

- 65 players appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds, second-most of any team in the Major Leagues this season (LAA, 66) and 1 player shy of the single-season club record established in 2022.
- 40 pitchers, including position players C Luke Maile (4 times) and IF Jason Vosler (twice), appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds, a new single-season club record (38 pitchers, 2022).
- 17 pitchers started at least 1 game for the Reds, tying the single-season club record (2003, 2022)...17 starters tied the Dodgers and Rockies for most in the National League...the Athletics led the Major Leagues with 24 starters.
- The Reds finished the season with 8 rookies on the roster.
  - RHP Fernando Cruz, IF Elly De La Cruz, IF Christian Encarnacion-Strand, IF Noelvi Marte, IF/OF Spencer Steer,
- LHP Andrew Abbott, RHP Connor Phillips and LHP Brandon Williamson.

  Had a season-high 12 rookies on the 27-player roster for the 8/23 day/night doubleheader at LAA.
- 16 Reds players made their Major League debuts this season, the most of any team in the majors...listed below in the order in which they debuted:
  - RHP Casey Legumina. RHP Levi Stoudt. IF Matt McLain. LHP Brandon Williamson. RHP Eduardo Salazar. OF TJ Hopkins, LHP Andrew Abbott, IF Elly De La Cruz, RHP Ricky Karcher, RHP Randy Wynne, RHP Jake Wong, IF Christian Encarnacion-Strand, RHP Lyon Richardson, IF Noelvi Marte, RHP Carson Spiers, RHP Connor Phillips.
- 23 rookies played in at least 1 game for the Reds, the most of any team in the Major Leagues and tied for fourth-most in club history (26 in 1909, 25 in 2016, 24 in 1914 & 2017, 23 in 2022)...courtesy @EliasSports.

#### LET THE KIDS PLAY

- Reds rookies produced 68 HR, 238 RBI, 51 go-ahead RBI and 75 stolen bases...are the most HR, RBI and go-ahead RBI totals by any Major League team's rookies and second-most stolen bases total by any team's rookies (Oak, 89sb).
- Established single-season club records for HR (68) and stolen bases (75) by rookies...produced the Reds' second-most RBI (260 in 1935) in a season by rookies...courtesy @EliasSports.
- With 68 HR the Reds established a new club record for homers in a season by rookies (Spencer Steer 23, Matt McLain 16, Elly De La Cruz 13, Christian Encarnacion-Strand 13, Noelvi Marte 3)...the record was held by the 2008 team
- that recorded **54 HR** by rookies (**Joey Votto** 24, **Jay Bruce** 21, **Chris Dickerson** 6, **Ryan Hanigan** 2, **Paul Janish** 1). The Reds became the first team in Major League history with **3 rookies**, in a single season, with at least **10 HR** & **10** stolen bases each (Elly De La Cruz, Matt McLain, Spencer Steer).
  - For the first time since 1890, when Cincinnati joined the National League, 4 Reds rookies produced at least 10 HR... prior to this season, never had more than 2 rookies in the same season with 10 HR...courtesy @EliasSports.
  - 3 rookies made at least 89 apps (Spencer Steer 156, Elly De La Cruz 98, Matt McLain 89)...most recently produced in the same season 3 rookies with at least 89 apps in 2009 (Chris Dickerson 97g, Paul Janish 90g, Ryan Hanigan 90g).
- Elly De La Cruz is the only Major League player since RBI became an official statistic in 1920 to produce in his first 98 career apps at least 91 hits, 13 HR, 44 RBI and 35 stolen bases...courtesy @EliasSports.
- On 8/22 at LAA, in his 64th career game, Elly De La Cruz recorded his 20th stolen base to become the fastest player since 1900 to accumulate at least 10 HR and at least 20 steals...Barry Bonds did it in his 65th career appearance, just ahead of Reds rookies Chris Sabo (66g) and Gary Redus (67g)...courtesy @EliasSports.
- Elly De La Cruz and Spencer Steer on 7/4 at Wsh became the first set of rookie teammates in Major League history to finish in the same game 4-for-4 with at least 1 RBI (since RBI became an official statistic in 1920)...courtesy @EliasSports.
- IF Matt McLain (5/22-5/28) and IF Elly De La Cruz (6/19-6/25) each earned National League Player of the Week awards, McLain in the second week of his career and De La Cruz in his third week.

- Rookie pitchers made 61 starts for the Reds, including 19 of the Reds' 27 games in September:
- LHP Brandon Williamson (23gs), who began the season at Class AAA Louisville, went 1-1, 5.89 in 4 starts in September.
- LHP Andrew Abbott (21gs), who began the season at Class AA Chattanooga, went 0-2, 6.10 in 5 starts in September.
- RHP Connor Phillips (5gs), who began the season at Class AA Chattanooga, went 1-1, 6.97 in 5 starts in September. RHP Lyon Richardson (4gs), who began the season at Class A Daytona, went 0-1, 8.68 in 2 starts in September.
- RHP Carson Spiers (2gs), who began the season at Class AA Chattanooga, went 0-1, 6.92 with 1 save in 2 starts and 2 relief apps in September.
- RHP Fernando Cruz (2gs), who last year at age 33 made his ML debut with 14 apps, started the 7-0 loss on 9/19 vs Min.
- Richardson, Abbott, Spiers, Williamson and Phillips made their Major League debuts this season.

- The Reds fell short in their bid to become fifth Postseason team to post a losing home record during the regular season
- (1981 Royals, 19-28; 2001 Braves, 40-41; 2020 Marlins, 11-15; 2023 Astros, 39-42)...courtesy @EliasSports Beginning 5/26 the Reds went 37-22 (.627) over their last 9 road trips covering 18 road series...was the second-best road record in the Major Leagues during that span (Hou, 36-20, .643)
- The Reds won 12 of their last 19 road series, including a streak of 7 straight road series wins snapped by the Brewers in the last series before the All-Star Game break.
- From 5/26-7/6, the Reds won at least 7 straight road series for only the third time in their history (1923, 1976).

#### **ELIMINATED**

On 9/22 the Reds were eliminated from Central Division contention...on 9/30, on the second-to-last day of the season, were eliminated from Wild Card contention...fell short in their bid to become the first team to win a division after losing at least 100 games the season before (62-100)...in 2022 were eliminated from the Central on 9/10 and from the Wild Card on 9/13.

#### **RUNNING MEN**

- Led the Major Leagues with 190 stolen bases (AZ 2nd, 166sb), the Reds' highest total since 1997 (190sb)...led the National League in steals for the first time since 2015 (134sb)...recorded at least 3 SB in 27 games, the most such games by any team in the Major Leagues, with a season high of 9 steals on 6/3 vs Mil...in 2022, the Reds recorded 58 steals.
- The Reds recorded 50 stolen bases in June, their highest steals total in a calendar month since September 1912 (53sb).
- 6 times this season recorded at least 5 stolen bases in a game (last, 8/16 vs Cle)...prior to this season, the Reds hadn't recorded as many as 5 stolen bases in a game since 4/10/17 at Pit.
- Their 9 stolen bases on 6/3 vs Mil (Jake Fraley 3, Spencer Steer 2, Jonathan India 2, Will Benson, Stuart Fairchild) was their highest single-game total since they swiped 9 bases on 5/30/1976 vs LAD...the Reds' modern single-game record for stolen bases in a game remains 10 (5/29/1913 at StL).
- With Elvis Peguero pitching, Elly De La Cruz on 7/8 at Mil became only the fourth Reds batter ever to steal second, third and home in the same inning (Hans Lobert 9/27/1908, Dode Paskert 5/23/1910, Greasy Neale 8/15/1919)...became the first Major League batter to steal second, third and home in the same inning since Mia's Jon Berti did it on 8/25/2020 at NYM...became the first Reds batter with a straight steal of home since Brandon Phillips did it on 7/10/2009 at NYM.

#### **LEADING OFF**

- The Reds held a lead in 11 of their first 12 games, second only to TB (13-0) and matching LAD, NYY, Sea and LAA
- This year's team is only the 13th in franchise history to hold a lead in 11 of their first 12 games of the season (1988, 1986, 1980, 1978, 1973, 1970, 1958, 1941, 1940, 1919, 1913, 1898)...courtesy @EliasSports.
- No Reds team ever held a lead in each of their first 12 games of the season.

#### **SHORT HOPS**

- For the seventh consecutive year, the Reds started a different shortstop on Opening Day (Zack Cozart 2012-2017, José Peraza 2018, José Iglesias 2019, Freddy Galvis 2020, Eugenio Suárez 2021, Kyle Farmer 2022, Jose Barrero in 2023).
- It is the Reds' longest such streak since 1900 for that position.
- 3 previous times since 1900, there were stretches of at least 7 straight Opening Days without consecutive starts at shortstop by the same player (though not necessarily 7 different shortstops): 1906-1914 (Mike Mowrey, 2 starts), 1968-1974 (Dave Concepcion, 3 starts) and 2004-2012 (Alex Gonzalez, 2 starts)...notes courtesy @EliasSports.
- In 2022, Kyle Farmer led the Reds with 97 starts at SS...on 11/18/22, he was traded to the Twins for RHP Casey Legumina.

#### **WEATHER REPORT**

- The Reds' game on 4/5 vs the Cubs was postponed by threatening weather after a 1-hour, 43-minute delay...was the 20th weather postponement in the 21 seasons of Great American Ball Park.
  The Phillies' home opener scheduled for 4/6 was postponed at 5:50 p.m. on 4/5 due to an uncertain weather forecast.
- For only the third time since 1997, when @EliasSports began recording such data, Reds games were postponed on consecutive days...games on 8/15 & 8/16, 2020 were rescheduled after a Reds player tested positive for COVID-19...6 games were postponed following 9/11 and rescheduled for the end of that 2001 season (10/2-10/7).

#### THE ONLY REDS

- LHP Andrew Abbott is the only Major League pitcher since 1893, when the mound was moved to its current distance, to begin his career with 3 consecutive scoreless starts of at least 5.0 innings...over his first 3 starts began his Major League career with 17.2 scoreless innings, a new club record since 1893...broke that team record held by Wayne Simpson, who in 1970 began his Major League career with 15.0 scoreless innings...@EliasSports.

  In the 10-inning, 5-4 win on 6/12 at KC, RHP Ricky Karcher became the only Reds pitcher since 1969, when the save
- became an official statistic, to record a save in his Major League debut...was 1 of 5 pitchers in the Major Leagues this season to record a save in his Major League debut, joining TB's **Braden Bristo** (4/13 vs Bos), Min's **Brent Headrick** (4/19 at Bos), SF's **Keaton Winn** (6/13 vs StL) and TB's **Jacob Lopez** (8/14 vs SF)...courtesy @EliasSports.

#### 16.000

- Joey Votto on 8/21 reached 16.000 years of Major League Service.
- Became only the fifth active players with at least 16.000 years of MLS, joining Miguel Cabrera (20.074), Zack Greinke (19.030), Adam Wainwright (18.000) and Justin Verlander (17.146).

- In the 7-1 win on 9/10 vs StL, Joey Votto came off the 10-day injured list to become the ninth player in Major League history to homer on his 40th birthday (off Andrew Suárez), the first since Alex Rodriguez in 2015.
- Became the first Reds player to homer at age 40 since Jim Edmonds did it at age 40 years, 86 days on 9/21/2010 at Mil off Dave Bush.
- Votto homered on his birthday for the fourth time.

#### **DOUBLE DIPPING**

- The Reds played 3 day/night doubleheaders:
  - On 8/13 at PNC Park the Reds and Pirates split a day/night DH.
  - On 8/23 the Reds swept the Angels in Anaheim (9-4, 7-3 wins), their first sweep of a 9-inning doubleheader since 7/6/2014 vs Cubs (4-2, 6-5 wins) and their first sweep of a 9-inning doubleheader on the road since 6/5/1999 at KC
- On 9/1 at Great American Ball Park the Reds and Cubs split at day/night twinbill.

  In the doubleheader on 8/23 at LAA, RHP Fernando Cruz became the first Reds player to pitch in both games of a doubleheader since RHP Matt Bowman did it on 5/27/2019 vs Pit.
- Prior to this season, the Redlegs were swept in each of their previous 2 doubleheaders, on 9/13/22 vs Pit (6-1, 1-0 losses) and 9/17/22 at StL (5-1 loss, 1-0 loss in 11 innings).

#### THE SKIPPER.

- David Bell completed his fifth season as a Major League manager (333-375, .470, 2020 Wild Card)...was hired on 10/22/18...on 9/22/21, the club announced a 2-year contract extension through 2023...on 7/28/23, the club announced a 3-year contract extension through 2026.

- most by a Reds pitcher in 2023 (Nick Lodolo, 4/8 at Phi)...Hunter Greene recorded a team-high 14 strikeouts on 9/20 vs Min.

  Produced 2 of the 3 longest scoreless streaks by a Reds pitcher this season (17.2ip
- from 6/5-6/16, 17ip from 7/15-7/31)...reliever Sam Moll finished the season with 20game and 19.0-inning scoreless streaks, both staff highs. Luke Maile caught 20 of his 21 starts, the only exception on 9/16 at NYM...in that
