STAY INFORMED

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RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their six-game road trip against the Orioles (1-2) and Tigers (three to play) tonight in Detroit...have lost three of four and seven of their last 10 games on the heels of a season-high-tying nine-game winning streak (Aug. 3-12)...are tied for the AL's best record since July 20 at 21-11 (also: BOS)...have the second-hardest remaining schedule in the AL with an opp. winning pct. of .511 (TEX - .511)...have held a 3.0-game lead in the AL East for the last three days...have spent 98 days leading the division, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...this includes a season-high 58 consecutive days in first place (June 27–pres.)...only the Dodgers (145), Braves (143), and Brewers (113) have spent more time leading their divisions...have held the AL's best record for 97 days, second most in team history behind 2023 (106), according to Stats Perform.

★ Five straight Rays reached safely during a two-out, three-run rally, accounting for all of the club's runs in yesterday's 3-1 victory at Oriole Park...they tallied four singles and a walk, marking their sixth time this season recording four two-out hits (or more) in a frame (last: Aug. 12 at ATH - 4H in 4th).
★ **Nick Martinez** retired 18 of his 19 BF over 6.0 IP of work, with his lone blemish being a one-out double in the 3rd before he set down his final 11 BF...he became the ninth Rays pitcher (12x) to allow one or zero baserunners over 6.0 IP or more...the Rays rotation has made an MLB-leading and club-record three such starts this season (also: **Drew Rasmussen**, 2x, last: June 5 at MIA).
★ Over their last four games, the Rays have scored only nine runs (2.3 R/G) and tallied 5 XBH (3 2B, 2HR)...the club has been held to three runs or fewer 20 times in 36 games since the All-Star break, tied with the Cardinals for third most in MLB to the Angels (23G) and Yankees (22G).
★ Yesterday marked their 20th win without the benefit of a home run, tying the Twins for the AL lead, and their third with 0 XBH, including their first on the road in over a calendar year (last: 0 XBH in 2-1 win on Aug. 16, 2025 at SF)...the Rays lead MLB with 16 games recording 0 XBH.
★ Rays pitchers have yielded three runs in the last two games (1.50 ERA/18.0IP 3ER) on the heels of a season-high streak of six straight games yielding five runs or more (Aug. 16-21), which was their longest since May 19-25, 2024 (also 6G).
★ The pitching staff has allowed a home run in 13 consecutive games, tied for the sixth-longest streak in franchise history and their longest since April 17–May 1 (G2), 2019 (also 13G), with their last longer stretch being a club-record 19-game streak from July 9–Aug. 1, 2017.
★ The Rays are an AL-best 23-13 (.639) when opposed by left-handed starting pitchers, third in the majors behind the Brewers (26-12/.684) and Diamondbacks (23-11/.676)...they have lost their last two such games, both vs. BAL **Trevor Rogers** (Aug. 16-21), after winning three of four from July 24–Aug. 10).

SERIES STUFF—The Rays have dropped three consecutive series (Aug. 14–pres.), all against AL East opponents, on the heels of three straight series wins during a 9-0, West Coast road trip from Aug. 3-12...it marks their longest skid since dropping their final three sets of the 2025 campaign (Sept. 19-28; excl. multi-season spans)...they haven't lost four consecutive series since July 21–Aug. 3, 2025...despite their recent struggles, the Rays are still 10-6-3 over their last 19 sets (June 19–pres.)...in the wake of a 2-5-1 stretch (May 22–June 17)...prior to that, they won eight straight series from April 24–May 20...they have won four of their last five series on the road (July 20–pres.) since going 1-6-1 from May 22–July 20.
★ This marks the Rays season-high seventh straight series against an opponent that entered with a sub-.500 record...they are 16-10-1 in such sets (7-5-1 vs. .500+)...six of their final nine series will come against opponents that currently hold winning records, beginning this weekend vs. SD.
★ The club has lost a season-high three straight series-opening contests, its longest streak since a five-game drought to conclude 2025 (Sept. 12-26)...the Rays still rank third in the majors with a 26-16 (.619) mark in openers, trailing the Brewers (30-12/.714) and Yankees (28-14/.667).

ALL I DO IS WIN—**Drew Rasmussen** has earned the win in each of his last six starts, tied with three other pitchers (5x, last: **David Price** from June 25–July 25, 2014) for the second-longest streak in franchise history behind **Blake Snell's** club-record nine-start stretch from Aug. 10–Sept. 23, 2018...it marks the majors' second-longest streak this season behind MIA **Sandy Alcantara's** seven-start run from June 1–July 4 and is the longest single-season streak by an AL pitcher since NYY **Max Fried** won six straight starts from Aug. 27–Sept. 24, 2025...the last AL hurler with a longer such streak was TOR **Jose Berrios**, who won seven consecutive starts from Aug. 9–Sept. 14, 2024...Rasmussen has turned in a 2.31 ERA (35.0IP 9ER), 0.94 WHIP, and .198/.255/.254 (25-for-126) opp. slash line with 40 SO and 8 BB since the streak began (July 21–pres.), ranking eighth in the AL in WHIP and opp. average in that timeframe and ninth in strikeout...he has yielded only 1 HR during the streak (0.26 HR/9.0IP).
★ Rasmussen has received 6.69 runs of support per 9.0 IP during the winning streak, raising his season-long run support average from 5.16 to 5.69, fourth highest among AL starters to ATH **J.J. Ginn** (5.98), **MIN Taj Bradley** (5.89), and TOR **Jose Soriano** (5.67)...the Rays are 12-3 when providing him with multiple runs of support compared to 3-6 with one or zero runs of support.
★ He has thrown his changeup at a career-high 12.3 pct. rate and held opponents to a .159 (10-for-63) average on the offering, 10th among AL pitchers (min. 50AB)...the Rays staff utilizes changeups at a 20.6 pct. clip, which would surpass the 2016 Angels for the highest rate by any staff in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008)...Tigers batters have a 34.8 pct. whiff rate on changeups, second-highest in the AL behind the Angels (36.0%).

THE BAKE SHOW—**Bryan Baker** converted his 26th consecutive save opportunity yesterday, extending the longest streak in franchise history...it marks the majors' second-longest streak this season behind SD **Mason Miller's** 28-save run (March 28–July 29) and is the longest single-season streak by an AL pitcher since CLE **Emmanuel Clase** converted 34 straight saves from May 20–Sept. 25, 2024...his MLB-leading 37 saves are tied for seventh most in a season in team history, including the most since **Alex Colomé** had 47 in 2017...Baker is on pace for 46 saves, which would be the third most by a Ray behind Colomé and **Fernando Rodney** (48) in 2012...he's already the fifth Ray to hold the outright MLB lead in saves at any point after the calendar flips to August, joining Colomé (2017, led MLB), Rodney (2012, latest date: Sept. 18), **Rafael Soriano** (2010, latest date: Sept. 21), and **Roberto Hernández** (1999, latest date: Sept. 4), according to Stats Perform...Baker is three saves shy of tying Colomé (40) in 2017 for the most in club history before the end of August.

THE CHAN, THE MYTH, THE LEGEND—**Chandler Simpson** has hit safely in 14 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the majors and longest by a Ray since his career-best 18-game run from June 25–July 12, 2025...he is one of four Rays with multiple hitting streaks of 14 games or more in his career, joining **Yandy Diaz** (3x), **Aubrey Huff** (2x), and **Ben Zobrist** (2x)...only Diaz and Huff (both 2x) have recorded multiple streaks of 15 games or more in their Tampa Bay careers...with a 2-for-3 effort yesterday, Simpson surpassed HOU **Yordan Alvarez** (43G) for the most multi-hit games in the AL—he could join Diaz (2025, 11st) as the only Rays to pace the AL in the category...Simpson is also tied for the AL lead in triples (6) and stolen bases (35) and ranks fourth in hits (142)...he owns the majors' third-lowest strikeout (8.5%) and whiff rates (10.3%).
★ Since breaking out of a 3-for-44 skid (May 30–June 17), Simpson has hit safely in 45 of his last 53 games (June 19–pres.), pacing the majors in average (.74), hits (.76), and steals (21) over that timeframe—the next closest player over that span is batting .332 (LAD **Freddie Freeman**)...Simpson is the third Ray to bat .374 or better over a 35-game stretch (min. 150AB), joining spans by Huff in 2002 (July 17–Sept. 10, .374) and **Fred McGriff** in 2001 (5x, last: April 29–July 1, .374).
★ Simpson (.310) is only 10 points behind Alvarez (.320) for the AL's best batting average...he is attempting to join Diaz (2023) as the only AL batting champions in Rays history...he has previously won an NCAA Division I batting title at Georgia Tech in 2022 (.433) and a Minor League Baseball batting crown in 2024 (.355).
★ With 79 SB, Simpson is one steal shy of becoming the 30th player in the modern era (since 1900) to swipe 80 SB across their first two major league seasons...he would join CIN **Elly De La Cruz** (2023-24, 102SB) and SEA **Ichiro Suzuki** (2001-02, 87SB) as the only players in the Wild Card (since 1995) era to turn the trick.

TAKE THIS SHOW ON THE ROAD—Dating back to July 20, the Rays are an MLB-best 13-3 over their last 16 road contests, their best mark over a 16-game span on the road since going 14-2 from Aug. 10–Sept. 2, 2020...they have done this despite going 8-8 across 16 home games in that span, including losses in six of their last eight contests at Tropicana Field...they pace the AL in road average (.286), slugging pct. (.458), OPS (.802), and home runs (24) over that timeframe—this, compared to their .256 average, .379 slugging pct., .680 OPS, and 13 HR at home across that span...on the mound, Rays pitchers have worked to a 3.06 ERA (144.0IP, 49ER) on the road since July 20 (2nd in MLB; NYY, 2.17) compared to a 4.16 (145.0IP, 67ER) mark at home (24th in MLB).
★ Before their 13-3 run, the Rays dropped 17 of their previous 23 road games (6-17, May 24–July 19) en route to a 21-27 mark away from home, 21st in the majors, and were an MLB-best 35-15 at home.

MOTOR CITY KITTIES—The Rays and Tigers begin a three-game series at Comerica Park tonight, the second set of a six-game season series that began when Detroit swept the Rays at Tropicana Field from June 1-3, which remains the only time they have been swept at home this season...this marks the second time they have dropped their first three matchups with the Tigers to begin a season, joining 2011 (5G)...the Rays can, at best, tie the season series with a sweep, which would mark the second straight stalemate between the clubs (3-3 in 2025)...since winning nine of 10 against the Tigers between May 17, 2022–Aug. 4, 2023, the Rays have gone 6-12 in the last 18 meetings, including 1-6 in the last seven (June 22, 2025–pres.)...they have lost back-to-back sets at Comerica Park (2024-25) since taking two of three games at the venue in 2023 and three of four in 2022...overall, the Rays have lost six of their last seven meetings with Detroit and are 4-14 against the club since 2024.
★ **Yandy Diaz** is a career .303 (.54-for-178) hitter with 7 2B, 5 HR, 24 RBI, and 28 R across 46 games vs. Detroit...includes a .342/.375/.553 (26-for-76) slash line with seven multi-hit efforts in his last 18 games against the club (April 1, 2023–pres.).

TONIGHT'S START—Drew Rasmussen will toe the rubber tonight for his 25th start of the campaign and his 155th career appearance (106th start)..he leads AL arms (min. 100.0IP) in opp. on-base pct. (.253), strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.52), WHIP (0.95), and ranks highly in opp. OPS (2nd, .573), walks per 9.0 innings (2nd, 1.67), opp. AVG (4th, .206), and opp. SLG (4th, .319)...is three starts shy of tying seventh-ranked **Jeremy Hellickson** and **Blake Snell** (108GS) for the most starts in franchise history.

- ✦ With a win tonight, he would establish a career-high, seven-game winning streak, the second-longest winning streak in franchise history behind **Blake Snell's** nine-game run from Aug. 10-Sept. 23, 2018...would tie AZ **Brandon Pfaadt** (June 30–pres.) for the longest active streak in the majors.
- ✦ Rasmussen is 4-0 in August, and with a win tonight would become the 10th pitcher in the majors and third AL pitcher to record five wins or more in a month this season alongside TOR **José Soriano** (5G - Mar./Apr.) and CLE **Gavin Williams** (5G - Mar./Apr.).
- ✦ Since 2021, his 2.84 ERA (579.2IP, 183ER) ranks fourth among MLB pitchers (min 500.0IP) behind LAD **Shohei Ohtani** (2.68), ATL **Chris Sale** (2.78), and MIL **Brandon Woodruff** (2.79).

LAST TIME OUT—Earned his 13th win of the season after tossing 5.0 innings for his sixth straight win on Aug. 19 vs. TOR (W, 5.0IP, 7H, 5ER, 2BB, 5SO, HR)...retired the side in order in the first two frames...surrendered an **Alejandro Kirk** solo home run in the 4th inning, the first long ball he has allowed in his last 33.1 IP, dating back to July 9 vs. NYY (**Ben Rice**)...struck out **Jesús Sánchez** to begin the 5th inning before yielding three RBI-singles and a sacrifice fly...set down **Andrés Giménez** for the final out in the 5th frame before handing the ball to **Cam Booser** for the 6th.

- ✦ Marked his sixth win across six straight starts since the All-Star break (July 21–pres.)...the Rays have won 15 of his 24 starts this year.
- ✦ He became the fifth Rays pitcher (7x) to win six consecutive starts, the first since **Blake Snell** (9GS)...also became the only MLB starter this year with six wins or more without a loss following the All-Star break.

SHIFTING GEARS—Across four career appearances (two starts) against the Tigers, Rasmussen is 1-0 with a 1.69 ERA (10.2IP, 2ER), a .179 (7-for-39) opp. average, and 14 strikeouts...made both starts with the Rays in 2022, turning in a combined 8.0 innings of scoreless ball with nine strikeouts...his most recent appearance against the Tigers came on September 25, 2024 at DET, where he delivered 2.0 innings of relief (2.0IP, 3H, 2ER, 4SO)..his teams are 2-2 lifetime against Detroit.

- ✦ He has made three career appearances (one start) at Comerica Park, where he has logged a 3.18 ERA (5.2IP, 2ER) with a .150 (3-for-20) opp. average.
- ✦ He is 10-4 with a 3.40 ERA (95.1IP, 36ER) and 102 strikeouts against AL clubs this season...with a win tonight, he will earn his league-leading 11th win against the AL and is currently tied with rotation-mate **Nick Martinez** with 10 wins.
- ✦ Rasmussen is slated to make his sixth start of the season against an AL Central club, pitching to a 3-2 record with a 1.50 ERA (30.0IP, 5ER) with 36 strikeouts and a 0.87 WHIP in the previous five...his 1.50 ERA against the AL Central is the lowest among pitchers facing the division this season (min 30.0IP), ahead of KC **Michael Wacha** (1.74).
- ✦ He is 9-5 with a 2.72 ERA (119.1IP, 36ER) over 31 career appearances (22 starts) vs. AL Central foes, including 8-5 with a 2.25 ERA (108.0IP, 27ER) in the 22 starts.

ROAD WORK—The right-hander is making his 13th road start of the season...is 5-2 with a 2.79 ERA (67.2IP, 21ER) and 65 strikeouts to 11 walks...Rasmussen has logged a career 22-9 record with a 3.00 ERA (290.2IP, 97ER) across 77 road contests (54 starts).

- ✦ Since 2021, Rasmussen's 22 career road wins pace Rays arms...boasts a lifetime .733 (22-9) winning pct. on the road with Tampa Bay, the highest clip in franchise history (min. 25GS), ahead of **David Price** (.701).
- ✦ Rasmussen's 2.80 ERA (276.1IP, 86ER) during road games is the lowest clip in Rays history (min. 250.0IP)...the next lowest mark under the same parameters belongs to Price (3.48ERA, 569.0IP/220ER)...under the same criteria, his career 3.00 (290.2IP, 97ER) road ERA is the third-lowest clip among active MLB starters behind AZ **Corbin Burnes** (2.94) and ATL **Chris Sale** (2.98).

ALL THE STARS—Since the All-Star break, Rasmussen has gone 6-0 with a 2.31 ERA (35.0IP, 9ER) across six starts...he is the first pitcher in franchise history to win his first six starts following the All-Star break and he is the only pitcher in the majors to do so this season.

- ✦ His .760 (19-6) winning percentage after the All-Star break as a Ray is the highest in franchise history (min. 30GS) and the third-highest mark since the inaugural All-Star Game in 1933, trailing **Julio Urias** (.844), and **Johnny Beazley** (.826)...is the first pitcher in franchise history since **Tyler Glasnow** (2023) to record seven wins following the All-Star break.
