STREAKING

The Reds have won 6 of their last 8 games since 5/29, when they were 6 games under .500 (22-28) and 7.0 games out of first place, both season highs...their 4-game winning streak snapped by last night's 5-1 loss was their longest since a season-high 6-game winning streak from 4/3-4/7 and included their first 4-game series sweep in St. Louis since May 1990.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 1 (0-0) of a 3-game series vs Andrew Gruman's first-place Brewers and Game 1 of a 6-game homestand that includes an upcoming 3-game weekend series vs the Rockies...the Reds are coming off a brief 4-game road trip, their first 4-game series sweep at StL since May 1990...Sun's dramatic 8-7 win at StL completed a 14-14 stretch in which the Reds played 28 games in 31 days, including one scheduled day off (5/24) plus 2 rainouts...tonight's game will be their first home game of the season without attendance or fan mask restrictions.

TRANSACTIONS: The Reds today placed on the 10-day injured list RHP Sonny Gray (right groin strain) and recalled from Class AAA Louisville RHP Art Warren (#77).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds and Brewers will play 6 times in the next 9 days...dating back to last season, the Reds won 5 of the last 9 games vs the Brewers but lost the last 3 games...Cin went 2-2-2 in 6 series vs Mil in 2019 (8-11 record) and 2-0-1 in last season's 3 series (6-4 record).

REHABBING: OF Aristides Aquino (left hamate fracture) is on a rehabilitation assignment at Class AAA Louisville...has made 4 apps for the Bats, including 3 starts in RF and 1 start at DH (5-12, .417, 2 2b, 1hr, 4rbi, 6bb, 0k, 3r, .611obp, .833slg, 1.444ops)...Aquino hasn't played for the Reds since 4/13...he is eligible to come off the 10-day injured list Sunday.

DOT, DOT, DOT...: The Reds went 8-7-4 in their 19 completed series, including 4-3-2 at GABP and 4-4-2 on the road...have 2 series sweep win (3g vs Pit, 4g at StL) and 3 series sweep losses (3g vs Ari, 3g at StL, 4g vs SF)...are 1-20 when recording fewer hits than the opponent, their only win an 8-7 victory on 6/6 at StL...are 25-18 when hitting at least 1 HR, 17-9 when hitting at least 2 HR and 3-12 when they don't homer...the game time on 6/17 at SD has been changed to 8:40et (from 10:10et) to accommodate "San Diego's Opening Day" ceremonies and a post-game fireworks show as the Padres celebrate Petco Park's first game back at full capacity...minor league SS Jose Garcia has changed his last name to Barrero in honor of his mother, who died in May...Barrero appeared in 24 games for the Reds last season.

FIRST SACKERS: The Reds have used 8 players at first base, including Joey Votto (30g, 29gs), Alex Blandino (17g, 8gs), Tyler Stephenson (13g, 11gs), Mike Moustakas (9g, 7gs), Kyle Farmer (5g, 2gs), Mike Freeman (4g, 1gs), Max Schrock (2g) and Tucker Barnhart (1g)...the Reds used as many as 9 first basemen as recently as 2019 (Aristides Aquino, Barnhart, Blandino, Curt Casali, Derek Dietrich, Farmer, Brian O'Grady, Josh VanMeter, Votto).

YOUNG GUNS: The Reds have used 9 rookie players so far this season, including IF Jonathan India (48g), C/1B Tyler Stephenson (46g), OF Mark Payton (23g), RHP Ryan Hendrix (18g), IF Max Schrock (12g), RHP José De León (9g), RHP Art Warren (2g), RHP Ashton Goudeau (3g) and RHP Vladimir Gutierrez (2gs).

BONUS BASEBALL: The Redlegs have played 9 extra-inning games (7-2), including eight 10-inning games before the 12-inning, 6-5 win on 5/15 at Coors Field...the Reds won their last 5 extra-inning games...scored the runner on second base in 10 of the 11 extra innings while outscoring opponents, 19-14...in extra innings, the Reds are hitting .425 while posting a staff ERA of 8.18.

ONE / TWO PUNCH: Reds batters in the leadoff and No. 2 positions in the starting lineup combine to lead the Major Leagues in batting average (.324), on-base percentage (.382), slugging percentage (.610), hits (161), HR (38), runs (92), RBI (89), extra-base hits (64) and total bases (303)...Jesse Winker leads the club with 27 starts batting leadoff, while Nick Castellanos has 32 starts batting second...the Reds are 10-14 in the 24 games in which Winker leads off and Castellano hits behind him...Winker and Castellanos haven't hit in the top 2 spots of the Reds' lineup since 5/28 at Cubs, the only instance in the last 13 games.

2-WAY PLAYERS: IF Alex Blandino (4g, 3.2ip, 4h, 5r, 4er, 4bb, 1k, 1hr), IF Mike Freeman (1 batter faced, struck out Archie Bradley) and IF Max Schrock (1g, 0.2ip) have combined for 6 relief apps for the Reds.

- Twice this season - for the only times since 1902 - 2 position players pitched in the same game for the Reds...Blandino & Schrock pitched in the 19-4 loss on 5/20 vs SF, and Blandino & Freeman pitched in Tue's 17-3 loss vs Phi.
- Blandino is the only Reds position player in the expansion era (since 1961) to appear in 4 games as a pitcher in a single season.
- Blandino is the first Major League position player with 4 pitching apps in a season since 2019 (Russell Martin, Stevie Wilkerson, Tyler White)...no Major League position player has made at least 5 pitching apps in a single season since Min's Chris Gimenez pitched 6 times in 2017.
- Most recently, in Tue's 17-3 loss vs Phi, Blandino entered the game in the eighth inning to pitch in relief of LHP Cionel Pérez, then played shortstop for the final out of the top of the ninth after he switched positions with Freeman...Blandino allowed a grand slam to Matt Joyce, his final batter...notes courtesy @ EliasSports.

Tonight's Pitcher - #53 Vladimir Gutierrez, RHP

RED HOTS

- Tonight is making his third Major League appearance.
- Earned his first career victory in Thu's 4-2 win at StL...threw 31 pitches in the first inning (3h, 2r, 1bb, 1sb, 1bk)...after a 2-out walk to Matt Carpenter in the first, retired his next 10 batters until he walked José Rondón to lead off the fifth inning...overall, retired 13 of his last 15 batters (2 walks)...improved his career record to 1-1 in beating Adam Wainwright, whose career mark dropped to 170-103.
- On 5/28 was promoted from Class AAA Louisville to start at Wrigley Field in his Major League debut...in that 1-0 loss, allowed only a solo HR to David Bote leading off the top of the fifth inning...first career strikeout victim was Willson Contreras, his 14th batter...gametime temperature was 50 degrees with a wind chill of 45 degrees and the wind blowing in at 9 miles per hour.
- Until his 5/28 promotion spent the minor league season at Louisville, where he went 2-0, 2.65 in 3 starts (17ip, 9h, 5er, 7bb, 21k, 3hr, .153oba, 0.94whip).
- In 2021 spring training "A" games went 0-1, 0.00 in 1 start and 4 relief apps (7ip, 2h, 1r, 0er, 2bb, 11k, 1hbp, 0hr, .087oba, 0.57whip).
- In September 2016 was signed to a minor league contract by Reds scouts Tony Arias, Chris Buckley and Bob Engle.
- Pitched in Class A Daytona in 2017, at Class AA Pensacola in 2018 and at Class AAA Louisville in 2019.
- Entered the 2021 season rated by *Baseball America* the 14th-best prospect in the organization.
- In 2020 his changeup and curveball were rated by *Baseball America* the best in the organization.
- Was Rookie of the Year of the 2013-2014 Cuban National Series season.
- In August 2014 was rated by *Baseball America* the 14th-best prospect in Cuba.
- In February 2015, while in Puerto Rico for the Caribbean Series, left the Cuban team to pursue a career in the Major Leagues.
- During showcases for Major League scouts reportedly hit 97 miles per hour on the radar gun.
- Following each of the last 2 seasons played for Licey in the Dominican Winter League (12gs, 2-6, 3.40, 45ip, 37h, 17bb, 41k, 1.20whip, .220oba).

Tomorrow's Pitcher - #58 Luis Castillo, RHP

RED HOTS

- The Reds' 2019 and 2021 Opening Day starting pitcher is making the 103rd start of his Major League career.
- Fri's 6-4 win at StL snapped his 7-game and 7-start losing streaks, both the longest of his career...was the first Reds pitcher to lose 7 straight decisions or lose 7 consecutive apps, all as a starting pitcher, since Homer Bailey lost 7 consecutive starts from 7/31-9/5, 2018...per @EliasSports, no Reds pitcher ever, in a single season, has lost 8 consecutive apps, all as a starting pitcher.
- Fri's win was his first since his second start of the season, an 11-4 win on 4/7 vs Pit...in 9 starts between winning decisions went 0-7, 7.29 (.330oba), including 0-7, 7.91 over 7 consecutive starts (.324obp).
- This season has posted ERAs of 13.50 in the first inning (12ip, 21r, 18er) and 4.86 after the first inning (46.1, 30r, 25er)...his 21 runs allowed and 18 earned runs allowed in the first inning are the most in the Major Leagues...in 2020, allowed 6 runs in the first inning of his 12 starts.
- On 5/18 vs SF produced a season-high 8 strikeouts through the first 3 innings...became the first Reds pitcher with 10 strikeouts through a game's first 4 innings since Jim Maloney did it on 5/21/1963 at Mil.
- Since his Major League debut in 2017 leads the Reds' pitching staff in wins (34), starts (102), IP (578.0) and strikeouts (631).
- In 2019 averaged 10.67 strikeouts per 9 innings, the highest ratio in Reds history for pitchers with a minimum of 125 innings...in the shortened 2020 season averaged 11.44 strikeouts per 9 innings over 70 innings pitched...in 2021 is averaging 8.18 strikeouts per 9 innings.

- His 21 career HR vs the Brewers rank second only to his 28 HR vs the Cubs.
- In his last 27 apps has 8 HR and 18 RBI.
- From 5/25-6/4 made 9 consecutive starts batting leadoff, his first career apps in the top spot in the lineup...hit safely in 7 of his 9 games batting first and reached base safely in 8 of those 9 apps (8-38, .211, 3 solo HR, 3bb, 7r).
- In the 2-1 win on 5/25 at Wsh made his first career start batting leadoff and in the sixth inning hit a solo HR off Max Scherzer that extended the Reds' lead to 2-0.
- In the 3-0 win on 5/27 at Wsh hit his first career leadoff HR (off Stephen Strasburg).

- From 5/7-6/6 missed the last 28 games while on the 10-day injured list with a broken left thumb...the Reds went 14-14 in his absence.
- Yesterday was returned from a rehabilitation assignment and reinstated from the 10-day injured list...hit .190 in 6 rehabilitation apps for Louisville (4-21, 1 2b, 1 3b, 2rbi)...in Sat's 6-3 Bats win vs St. Paul finished a homer shy of the cycle.
- In the 10-inning, 1-0 win on 5/5 vs WSox made his 1,800th Major League appearance...in the bottom of the fourth inning was hit by a Dallas Keuchel changeup and left the game after the fifth with the broken left thumb.
- In the third inning of the 8-6 win on 4/30 vs Cubs became the third Reds player and ninth active player with 300 career home runs...his 2-run HR off Jake Arrieta gave the Reds a 3-2 lead they would not relinquish...on the Reds' all-time home run list trails only Hall of Famers Johnny Bench (389) and Frank Robinson (324).
- Has made 22 starts batting third in the lineup and 7 starts batting fourth...hit cleanup in 6 of his 11 starts from 4/16-4/28 and in 5 of the Reds' 10 games during the absence of Mike Moustakas...were his first apps batting fourth since May 2018...has 36 career starts batting cleanup.
- In the eighth inning of the 10-inning, 3-2 win on 4/17 vs Cle recorded the first 2 outs of the Reds' 31st triple play, their first since 7/25/2017 at NYY...Josh Naylor lined into the 3-3-5 triple play...Votto also participated in the July 2017 triple play.
- Is the 2010 National League Most Valuable Player and Hank Aaron Award winner, a 6-time NL All-Star, a *Sporting News* NL All-Star and the only Reds first baseman ever to win a Rawlings Gold Glove Award.
- Holds franchise records for career games played at first base (1,754) and intentional walks (141).

33 JESSE WINKER, if

Homestand: 1-5

- In his 50th appearance hit his 15th, 16th and 17 HR, a new single-season career high (2019, 16hr in 113g)...with 37 RBI is 6 shy of his career high (2018, 43rbi in 89g).
- Is the only player in Reds history to produce in a single season a pair of 3-homer games (5/21 vs Mil, 6/6 at StL)...most recently, Atl's Adam Duvall had two 3-homer games last season.
- In Sun's 8-7 win at StL produced his second 3-homer game of the season (off John Gant 2, Alex Reyes) and a career-high 6 RBI...his solo HR with 1 out in the top of the ninth inning snapped the 7-7 tie...the Reds built a 7-0 lead, but the Cardinals tied it with 7 runs in the sixth inning.
- Received votes for National League Player of the Month but finished behind SD's Fernando Tatis Jr....teammate Nick Castellanos also received votes.
- Has a 5-game hitting streak (9-23, .391, 4hr, 8rbi, 7r, .440obp, .913slg, 1.353ops).
- In his last 15 apps beginning 5/21 is hitting .365 (23-62, 9hr, 14rbi, 17r, .429obp, .794slg, 1.223ops), including 5 multi-hit games, a pair of 4-hit games and 3-homer games on 5/21 vs Mil and 6/6 at StL.
- Has 3 leadoff HR this season and 7 in his career.
- Hit safely in 40 of his 51 apps overall and reached base safely in 44 of his 51 apps.
- From 5/21-5/23 vs Mil became the first Reds batter with 5 HR in a 3-game series since Willie Greene did it from 9/24-9/26, 1996 vs Cubs (5hr) and the first ML player since José Abreu did it from 8/21-8/23, 2020, also vs Cubs (6hr).
- On 5/21 vs Mil became the 31st player in Reds history to produce 3 HR in a game, accomplished for the 39th time (off Adrian Houser 2, Josh Lindblom)...had another 3-homer game and a career-high 6 RBI in the 8-7 win on 6/6 vs the Cardinals that led the Reds to their first 4-game sweep in St. Louis since 1990.
- On 5/23 vs Mil hit a 456-foot HR off Freddy Peralta, the longest homer of his career and the second-longest by a Reds batter this season (Tyler Naquin, 5/21 vs Mil off Adrian Houser, 459 feet).
