PITTSBURGH PIRATES (72-83) vs. CINCINNATI REDS (76-80)

SEPTEMBER 22, 2024 AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK, CINCINNATI, OH - 1:10 EDT - GAME #156/ROAD #78

RHP PAUL SKENES (10-3, 2.07 ERA) vs. RHP HUNTER GREENE (9-4, 2.83 ERA)

THE PIRATES: lost 7-1 yesterday afternoon in the middle game of their weekend series here at Great American Ball Park...Are 2-7 in their last nine games since winning four straight from September 8-11...Have won 15 games in their last at-bat (their most since having 16 last at-bat wins in 2021)...Have won eight games when trailing after seven innings (their most since winning nine times in 2019 when trailing after seven frames)...Have played in 50 one-run games, which are tied for the second-most in the National League behind the Brewers (51); it's also the most one-run games for the team since playing in 51 one-run contests in 2018...Have the best stolen base percentage (85.8 percent) in MLB...Have gone 23-25 against the National League Central (Pittsburgh's last winning record against the NL Central came in 2018 when the team went 43-33).

AND THE WHIFF: Paul Skenes has a strikeout per 9.0 inning rate of 11.29 this season...According to StatsPerform, he would be the fifth player all time to have a season rate 11.0 or greater at the age of 22 or younger (minimum 100.0 innings), joining Taj Bradley (2023), Mark Prior (2002), Kerry Wood (1998) and Dwight Gooden (1984).

ROOKIE SENSATION: Paul Skenes struck out seven batters while allowing just one run in 6.0 innings Monday night...Skenes also lowered his ERA to 2.07, which is the lowest for a pitcher (minimum 100.0 innings pitched) through their first 21 starts since Montreal's Steve Rogers carried a 1.95 ERA through his first 21 starts from July 18, 1973, to April 27, 1974...Skenes also became the first pitcher in MLB history to have a sub-2.20 ERA and 150-plus strikeouts in their first 21 games...He also compiled his 15th game with seven-plus strikeouts, tying Larry McWilliams (1983) for the eighth-most such games by a Pirates starter in a single season.

DYNAMIC DUO: This year the Pirates are just the ninth National League team since 1900 to have two rookie pitchers (Paul Skenes with 158 and Jared Jones with 125) each record at least 125 strikeouts in the same season...Prior to this year, the 2022 Reds were the last team to accomplish that when Hunter Greene had 164 strikeouts and Nick Lodolo had 131 punchouts.

NICK WITH THE STICK: Nick Gonzales comes into today with a 12-game on-base streak, which is the longest of his career...Gonzales is hitting .311 (14-for-45) with a pair of doubles, triple, two RBI and four runs scored during his current 12-game on-base streak.

TAKING A FINAL STAND: The Pirates will return to Pittsburgh following today's game for their final homestand of the season with three games against the Brewers beginning Tuesday night...The Pirates are 38-40 at home this season, including 11-12 against the NL Central.

BOMBS AWAY AT GABP: The Pirates have gone deep in nine consecutive games at Great American Ball Park...Since the beginning of last season, the only game in which the Pirates did not connect for at least one home run came on April 1 of 2023.

KEEPING UP WITH CUTCH'S MILESTONES: Andrew McCutchen comes into today one run shy of tying Arky Vaughan (936) for 10th all time in Pirates history...McCutchen ranks second among all active players with 1239 runs scored, trailing only Freddie Freeman (1298)...McCutchen is also two extra base hits shy of 800 in his career (his 798 extra base hits are the third-most among active players)...McCutchen has also played in 1573 games as a Pirate...His next game will tie him with Tommy Leach for ninth all time in team history.

RED HOTS: Bryan Reynolds is tied with Brendan Donovan for the most hits (14) against the Reds this year...Rowdy Tellez is 5-for-14 with three doubles in his career against Hunter Greene...Jared Triolo is 10-for-19 (.526) with two doubles and two home runs in five career games played at Great American Ball Park...Oneil Cruz has hit safely in eight of his last nine games played at Great American Ball Park, going 11-for-36 (.306) with four home runs.

FIRING CUBAN MISSILES: Aroldis Chapman comes into today ninth in all of MLB among relief pitchers with 92 strikeouts (Josh Hader leads all relievers in MLB with 101 strikeouts)...Chapman's 92 punchouts are the second-most in a single season by a Pirates left-handed reliever...The only Pirates southpaw reliever with more strikeouts in a single season is Rod Scurry (94 in 1982).

TODAY'S STARTER **RHP PAUL SKENES** **#30**

AGE: 22 **SIGNED:** Thru 2024
HOW ACQUIRED: Selected by the Pirates in the 1st round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

STARTING OFF: The 22-year-old righthander is in his first Major League season with the Pirates...He began the season with Triple-A Indianapolis where he posted an 0.99 ERA (27.1ip/3er) and recorded 45 strikeouts while allowing just eight walks in seven starts before being selected to the Major League roster on May 11...Was the No. 1 overall selection by the Pirates in the 2023 First-Year Player draft out of Louisiana State University.

LAST TIME OUT: Skenes allowed one run in 6.0 innings, struck out seven batters, and lost a 4-0 decision to St. Louis' Andre Pallante on September 16 at Busch Stadium.

VS. CINCINNATI: Skenes will be making his third start against the Reds...He allowed one run in 6.0 innings while winning a 4-1 decision against Carson Spiers on June 17 at PNC Park...He also struck out nine batters in 6.0 innings in the team's 7-0 shutout on August 22 at PNC Park.

BODY OF WORK: Is making his 22nd career start today...He has allowed three earned runs or fewer in 20 of his 21 career outings, including two or fewer 18 times and one or fewer 12 times (five scoreless outings).

- Of his 21 career starts, 15 have been quality starts...That's tied with Mitch Keller for the most on the team.

AS A PIRATES ROOKIE: Skenes comes into today with 158 strikeouts, which are the most by a Pirates rookie...The previous record since 1900 was 142, which was held by Cy Blanton in 1935... Skenes ranks second among all National League rookies this season in strikeouts...Since making his MLB debut on May 11, Skenes' 158 punchouts are the sixth-most in all of MLB behind Chris Sale (173), Tarik Skubal (168), Cole Ragans (163), Dylan Cease (160) and Sonny Gray (159).

SELECT COMPANY: Skenes has a 2.07 ERA after his first 21 starts...According to Baseball Reference, that's the lowest ERA for a pitcher (minimum 100.0 innings pitched) through their first 21 starts since Montreal's Steve Rogers carried a 1.95 ERA through his first 21 starts from July 18, 1973 to April 27, 1974...Skenes also is also the first pitcher in MLB history to have a sub-2.20 ERA and 150-plus strikeouts after his first 21 games...He has also compiled 15 games with seven-plus strikeouts, tying Larry McWilliams (1983) for the eighth-most such games by a Pirates starter in a single season.

SHUT OUTS: The Pirates shut out the Cubs 5-0 in Skenes' start on September 3 at Wrigley Field... It was the third time this season Skenes did not allow a run in a game in which the Pirates went on to toss a shutout along with July 11 at Milwaukee and August 22 vs. Cincinnati...Pittsburgh's pitching staff has recorded 11 shutouts this year, which are the sixth-most among all National League teams.

LEAGUE LEADERS: Since making his Major League debut on May 11, Skenes ranks among the NL leaders in ERA (first, 2.07), WHIP (third, 0.98), strikeout-to-walk ratio (fourth, 4.94), strikeouts (fourth, 158), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (second, 11.29) and batting average against (third, .204).

100 K CLUB: Skenes reached 100 career strikeouts in his 13th career game in his outing on July 29 at Houston...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became just the sixth player all-time since the current mound distance was established in 1893 to reach 100 strikeouts in 13 or fewer games and the first since Masahiro Tanaka did so in 2014...The others to do so were Kerry Wood in 1998 (12 games), Hideo Nomo in 1995 (12 games), Jose DeLeon in 1983 (13 games) and Herb Score in 1955 (12 games).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Skenes made the start for the National League at the 2024 All-Star Game in Arlington on July 16, tossing a scoreless first inning with three groundouts and a walk...He was the first Pirate to earn the starting honors in the All-Star Game since Jerry Reuss in 1975...Dock Ellis (1971), Bob Friend (1960 All-Star Game on July 11), Vernon Law (1960 All-Star Game on July 13) and Bob Friend (1956) are the only other Pirate pitchers to start in the Midsummer Classic.

- He was the fifth rookie to ever start the All-Star game, joining LAD Hideo Nomo in 1995, LAD Fernando Valenzuela in 1981, DET Mark Fidrych in 1976 and WSH Dave Stenhouse in 1962.

JUST KEEP WINNING: Skenes took his first loss as a professional (Major or Minor Leagues) on July 23 vs. St. Louis despite pitching a career-high 8.1 innings, allowing just two runs on four hits with eight strikeouts and no walks in what was his 12th career start...He was the first pitcher in Pirates history to not take a loss in each of his first 11 Major League games, all of which were starts...The previous best had been 10 by Zach Duke in 2005 (source: Elias Sports Bureau).

Is 5-3 with a 3.75 ERA (69.2ip/29er) in 13 starts this season at PNC Park...Is 1-0 with a 1.23 ERA (14.2ip/2er) in three career appearances (two starts) against the Brewers (he made his Pirates debut against Milwaukee last year on 8/5 at American Family Field).

RACKING UP PUNCHIES: Skenes recorded seven or more strikeouts in nine consecutive games dating back to the second game of the doubleheader in Detroit on May 29 through his start on July 23 vs. St. Louis, surpassing the previous franchise record of seven set by Mitch Keller from April 27-May 31, 2023.

- The nine-game streak matched the Major League record by a rookie, done by Dwight Gooden from August 11-September 23, 1984 and Brandon Beachy from August 9-September 24, 2011 [source: Elias Sports Bureau].
- In total, Skenes has recorded seven or more strikeouts in 15 of his 21 career outings.

MILITARY MAN: Spent the first two years of his collegiate career at the Air Force Academy, where he earned the 2022 John Olerud Award as the nation's best two-way player while both pitching and catching...He majored in Military Strategic Studies while at Air Force and was a member of Cadet Squadron 9.

- Has pledged to donate \$100 for every strikeout he records this season to the Gary Sinise Foundation to support our nation's defenders, veterans, first responders, their families, and those in need...ESPN's Pat McAfee has also pledged to match Paul's donation at the end of the season.
