TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners embark on a 10-game road trip with the first of 3 games against the Los Angeles Angels...Seattle will also see the Oakland Athletics (4 G, 9/2-9/5) and St. Louis Cardinals (3 G, 9/6-9/8) on the trip...tonight's game against the Halos will be streamed exclusively on **APPLE TV+** with **Wayne Randazzo** and **Dontrelle Willis** on the call and **Heidi Watney** serving as field reporter...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzos** and **Aaron Goldsmith** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won Wednesday's rubber match with Tampa Bay by a 6-2 score to secure their 2nd-consecutive series win and improve to 4-2 to begin **Dan Wilson's** managerial career.

- Yard Cards** - The Mariners are 55-36 when they hit at least 1 home run this season, compared to 13-30 when they do not homer.
- Taylor of Troy** - Rookie reliever **Troy Taylor** has not allowed a run over his last 5 appearances and has allowed just 1 run in 6.1 innings to begin his Major League career...he has held opponents to a .167 (4x24) average while recording 8 strikeouts to just 2 walks.
- Rosters Set to Expand Sunday** - The Major League, 26-man roster is set to expand to 28 players for all 30 teams this Sunday...each team will be allowed a maximum of 14 pitchers when rosters expand.
- From Europe's Boot** - Today's Angels starter Samuel Aldegheri is set to become the first pitcher born and raised in Italy to appear in a Major League game...INF Alex Liddi became the first player born and raised in Italy to appear in the Majors when he made his MLB debut with the Mariners in 2011.
- Cap is Back** - INF **J.P. Crawford** (right hand fracture) was reinstated from the 10-day Injured List on Wednesday and went 0-for-3 with 1 walk and 1 run scored in his return to the lineup.
- Outfield Pop** - **Randy Arozarena**, **Julio Rodriguez** and **Victor Robles** Wednesday became the first trio of Mariners starting outfielders to each homer and record multiple hits since Aug. 29, 2006 vs. Los Angeles-AL (Raúl Ibáñez, Ichiro Suzuki and Chris Snelling).
- One Week of Wilson at the Helm** - **Dan Wilson** managed his first game last Friday against the San Francisco Giants after being named the 21st manager (18th full-time) in franchise history the previous day.

UNREAL STARTING PITCHING...Mariners starting pitchers are 46-45 with a 3.31 ERA (287 ER, 781.1 IP), 153 walks, 733 strikeouts and a 1.04 WHIP, leading MLB rotations in ERA, WHIP, Opp. AVG (.223), SO/BB (4.79), and BB/9 (1.76), while ranking 3rd in the Majors in fWAR (14.3) trailing Philadelphia (14.5) and Atlanta (14.4)...over their last 4 starts (8/25-c), they hold a 1.40 ERA (4 ER, 25.2 IP) with 31 strikeouts to just 2 walks.

RANDY CLOSING IN ON 20-20...**Randy Arozarena** went 3-for-4 with 2 runs, 1 home run and 1 RBI in Wednesday's game...Randy is now sitting at 18 home runs and 20 stolen bases on the season...with 2 more home runs, he will join José Ramírez-CLE as the only players in the Majors to have 20+ homers and stolen bases in each of the past 4 seasons...Trea Turner-PHI, who currently sits at 14 HR and 14 SB also has a chance to complete his 4th-consecutive 20-20 season.

BAG CHASERS...the Mariners are 109-134 (81.3%) in stolen base attempts this season, ranking 2nd in the American League in stolen base percentage, trailing only Toronto (82.1%)...Seattle is on pace to set the franchise record in stolen base percentage, surpassing the 80.6% mark achieved by the 2001 team...**Dylan Moore's** 27 stolen bases are tied for 6th-most in the AL...**Julio Rodriguez** is 2 stolen bases away from joining Ichiro Suzuki as the only players in Mariners history to steal 20+ bases in each of their first 3 Major League seasons.

SIX-CESFUL STARTERS...Mariners starting pitchers have tossed 6.0+ scoreless innings 28 times this season, most in the Majors by a wide margin, ranking ahead of Philadelphia (21), Houston (20) and New York-AL (20)...**Bryce Miller** and **Logan Gilbert** have each done so on 7 occasions, the only two pitchers in the Majors this season with 7 starts of 6.0+ scoreless innings while **Bryan Woo** (5 G, T-5th), **Luis Castillo** (5, T-5th) and **George Kirby** (4) have contributed to Seattle's MLB-leading total...the Mariners also lead the Majors in most 7.0+ scoreless inning starts with 17, ranking ahead of the Phillies (13)...Gilbert paces the Majors in that category with 5 such starts.

OFF THE TOP RALE...first baseman/outfielder **Luke Raley** has a .991 OPS in 20 August games, hitting .264 (14x53) with 11 runs, 2 doubles, 5 home runs, 14 RBI and 11 walks, with a .406 on-base percentage and .585 slugging percentage during the month...Raley's .991 OPS during the month ranks 9th-best in the American League (min. 50 PA), while his 180 wRC+ ranks T-6th best in the AL.

STRIVE FOR FIVE, FOUR AND SOAR...in 47 games this season when scoring 5+ runs, the Mariners are 43-4 (.915) which is the best record in the Major Leagues...in 66 games when scoring 4+ runs, the Mariners are 55-11 (.833), which is the 2nd-best record in the Majors behind San Diego (.851/63-11).

MUÑOZ: ONE OF THE BEST...in 51 appearances this season **Andrés Muñoz** has a 1.76 ERA (10 ER, 51.0 IP) with 24 walks and 65 strikeouts, sporting a 0.98 WHIP and 11.5 strikeouts-per-9 innings rate...the 2024 All-Star has also held opponents to a .151 batting average (26x172)...among pitchers with at least 50.0 IP this season, Muñoz's .154 opponent batting average ranks 5th-lowest in the Majors, while him and fellow All-Stars Mason Miller-OAK and Kirby Yates-TEX are the only pitchers to hold their opponents to a .155 batting average with a strikeouts-per-9 rate of at least 10.

THE THRILL ON THE HILL...the Mariners pitching staff leads the **Major Leagues** in ERA (3.50), opponent batting average (.223), WHIP (1.09), fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.34), fewest hits-per-9 innings (7.49), strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.78), opponent OPS (.654) and quality starts (81)...Seattle's pitching staff has 13 shutout wins, tied for most in the Majors with Atlanta, Boston and Philadelphia.

QUALITY IN QUANTITY...the Mariners lead the **Majors** in quality starts (81) by a wide margin, with next-closest Philadelphia (68), Kansas City (66) and Atlanta (59)...Seattle has 4 pitchers with 14+ quality starts and 5 with 9+: **Logan Gilbert** (21 QS, most in MLB), **Luis Castillo** (17, T-9th), **George Kirby** (16, 12th), **Bryce Miller** (14, T-15th) and **Bryan Woo** (9), making them the only starting rotation in the Majors to meet each of those criteria.

AS YOU KNOW...**Victor Robles** is batting .293 (44x150) with 19 runs, 10 doubles, 4 home runs, 13 RBI and 16 stolen bases, getting on base at a .350 clip and slugging .440 (.790 OPS) since joining the Mariners, and...**YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...that his 16 consecutive stolen bases without being caught are the most to begin a Mariners career in franchise history, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that Robles has been worth 1.6 WAR (*Baseball Reference*) this season, tied for the 3rd-most among players with less than 200 plate appearances this season?...he trails only Jose Iglesias-NYM (2.2 bWAR) and Matt Wallner-MIN (2.1).

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- 26-year-old right-hander is making his 28th start of the season and his 2nd against Los Angeles-AL...he is also making his 84th career start and 8th against the Angels.
• Is in his third season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
• Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
• Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record with 7 earned runs, 3 walks, 34 strikeouts and .263 opponent batting average in 5 games started.
• Named Colonial Athletic Pitcher of the Year in 2019 for Elon University after posting a 2.75 ERA and 19-8 record in 88.1 innings pitched across 14 games started.

LAST TIME OUT...L#10 on 8/24 vs. SF...he pitched 4.2 innings and allowed 3 runs on 9 hits with 1 walk and 3 strikeouts...his 21st outing that he has allowed 3-or-less runs in an outing.

ROAD WARRIOR...in his last 9 starts away from T-Mobile Park, he is 4-2 with a 2.89 ERA (17 ER, 53.0 IP) and 51 strikeouts...he has allowed 2-or-less runs in 8 of those 9 contests...in each of those 8 starts with less than 2 runs allowed, he has spun at least 5.0 innings.

NO FREE RIDES...is the only pitcher since 1900 (min. 50 GS) to have more games started than walks allowed (83 starts, 61 walks).

TOP RANKS...in 2024, ranks 1st in SO/BB (7.79) and 2nd in BB/9 (1.13) in the Majors...since his debut in 2022, he ranks 1st in MLB with 1.15 BB/9 (min. 400.0 IP)...Miles Mikolas-STL ranks 2nd during that span with a 1.65 BB/9 mark.

WALK THE WALK...among pitchers with at least 125.0 innings pitched this season, Kirby has the 2nd-fewest walks in the Majors with 20 (Zach Eflin-BAL/TB, 15)...his BB% is 3.1%, trailing Eflin (2.7%) for the best in MLB and ranks in the 99th percentile of all Major League pitchers.

UNDER CONTROL...has not allowed more than 3 walks in any of his first 83 career starts, the 3rd-longest streak in MLB history to start a career by a starting pitcher...he is 14 starts behind Chris Bosio for 2nd-best...has a 58-start streak with 2-or-less walks, the longest active streak in the Majors by a starting pitcher.

NO JUNE GLOOM...in his 5 starts in June, he held a 3-0 record with a 1.74 ERA (6 ER, 31.0 IP) and 31 strikeouts to 3 walks...the 1.74 ERA in June is his lowest in a month during his career...his ERA was the 2nd lowest on the Mariners (min. 20 IP), trailing Logan Gilbert with a 1.51 ERA.

A LOT OF 0s...did not allow a run in 17.0-consecutive innings from his start on 4/15 vs. Cincinnati to allowing 1 run in the 4th inning against the Astros on 5/3.

LEADING BY EXAMPLE...since his MLB debut on 5/8/22, he ranks among the top pitchers in the American League in various categories (min. 350 IP), including SO/BB (1st, 7.48), WHIP (5th, 1.11), ERA (3rd, 3.40), innings pitched (4th, 476.0), wins (5th, 30) and strikeouts (8th, 456).

END THE INNING...this season, opposing hitters are batting .220 (42x191) with 7 doubles, 2 triples and 7 home runs and 44 strikeouts with 2 outs in an inning...with 2 outs and runners in scoring position, hitters are batting .224 (14x67) with 14 strikeouts.

QUALITY MATERIAL...recorded his 16th quality start of the season in his start at Pittsburgh on 8/18...in 2023, had 20 starts of at least 6.0 innings while allowing 3 earned runs or fewer, which ranked T-5th in the Majors and T-3rd among AL pitchers.

GET A WHIFF OF THIS...earned a personal single-game career-high against Arizona on 4/27 with 12 strikeouts...tallied 23 swings-and-missed during that start which also marked a career-high...19 of his whiffs were fastballs.

MISSION CRITICAL...the Mariners own a 33-19 record in games that Kirby tosses at least 6.0 innings in his career...in games Kirby goes 5.2 innings or less, the Mariners are 11-19.

MARINERS HISTORY...Kirby has made 83 starts in his career and tallied 456 strikeouts...even prior to today's start, he ranks 5th in Mariners franchise history for most strikeouts through a pitchers first 83 starts with the franchise.

STRIKE 24...began his outing on 8/24/22 vs. Washington by throwing 24 consecutive strikes, the most to start a game since the pitch tracking era (1988-c), passing the 21 thrown by Joe Musgrove on 8/30/18 vs. STL with PIT.
