ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

2B Jonathan India is trying to become only the third rookie in Major League history to lead his league in on-base percentage (Cie's **Joe Jackson**, .468, 1911 & Cin's **Cuckoo Christensen**, .426, 1926)...ranks third in the National League and fourth in the majors in on-base percentage (.404)...in the first inning, leads all Major League batters in hitting (.417) and on-base percentage (.522)...since he became the Reds' leadoff hitter on 6/5, ranks second in the Major Leagues in on-base percentage (.441, Freddie Freeman .444)...leads all Major League rookies in on-base percentage and walks...ranks second among National League rookies in hitting, RBI, OPS and stolen bases.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 1** of a 4-game series vs **Mike Burkhardt's Cubs** and **Game 1** of the Reds' first road trip of the second half, a 7-game jaunt that includes their first visit since **2019** to NYM's **Citi Field** (3g)...the Reds followed the **All-Star break** with a **3-6 homestand** vs the **Brewers** (0-3), **Mets** (1-2) and **Cardinals** (2-1)...Wednesday the Reds completed a stretch of **10 consecutive games vs first-place teams** (4-6), including **7 straight games vs the Brewers** (3-1 at Mil, ASG, 0-3 vs Mil, 1-2 vs NYM)...following this road trip return to **Great American Ball Park** for an off day and then a 6-game homestand vs the **Twins** (2g) and **Pirates** (4g) that kicks off a stretch in which the Reds will play **21 consecutive days**.

TRANSACTIONS: The Reds today reinstated from the 3-day paternity list **LHP Amir Garrett** and optioned to Louisville **IF Alejo Lopez**.

SERIES NOTES: In their most recent meeting, over the **Fourth of July weekend** at **Great American Ball Park**, the Reds recorded their first **series sweep** of the Cubs (3g) since a **4-game sweep** from **6/21-6/24, 2018**, also at **GABP**...**Joey Votto** ranks third among all active players with **39 HR** and **128 RBI** against the Cubs, trailing in both categories only **Albert Pujols** (57-146) and **Ryan Braun** (40-141)...over 4 seasons from **2015-2018**, the Cubs' **.671 winning percentage** vs the Reds (51-25) was the best by any team against any division opponent.

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES: The Reds have lost **30** of their **last 44 games** at **Wrigley Field**, including **4** of the last **6 games** over the last 2 seasons...since a 4-1 Reds win on **6/25/14** and beginning **9/15/14**, the Cubs have won **28** of the **last 32 night games vs Cin** at **The Friendly Confines**.

LEADING OFF: In the first inning of each of **6 consecutive apps** from **7/18-7/24**, leadoff hitter **Jonathan India** reached base safely via **walk, double, HR, HBP, single** and **walk**...the streak was snapped by a strikeout yesterday...**India's** streak of reaching base safely to lead off the first inning in **6 consecutive games** ties the longest streak of any player this season (**Jose Altuve**, **5/10-5/16**)...is the longest such streak by a Reds batter since leadoff hitter **Pokey Reese** reached in 6 straight from **5/7-5/13, 2000**...courtesy **@Elias Sports**.

BONUS BASEBALL: The Redlegs have played **13 extra-inning games** (8-5), including a season-high **12 innings** in a **6-5 win on 5/15 at Col** and a **7-5 loss on 6/21 at Min** that snapped their 6-game extra-innings winning streak...the Reds scored the runner on second base in 14 of the 19 extra innings while being outscored by the opponents, **29-26**...in extra innings, the Reds are hitting **.358** while posting a staff **ERA of 8.84**.

DOT, DOT, DOT...: Dayton Dragons **RHP Carson Spiers** has been named High-A Central Pitcher of the Week...he went 2-0, 0.90 in a pair of starts vs Fort Wayne (10ip, 5h, 1er, 1bb, 15k)...the Reds went **15-12-6** in their **33 completed series**, including **8-7-3 at GABP** and **7-5-3 on the road**...have **5 series sweep wins** (3g vs Pit, 4g at StL, 3g vs Col, 3g at Mil, 3g vs Cubs) and **5 series sweep losses** (3g vs Ari, 3g at StL, 4g vs SF, 4g at SD, 3g vs Mil).

BETTER LATE THAN NEVER: The Reds rank third in the Major Leagues and lead the National League with **28 come-from-behind wins** (Bos 32, TB 30)...after the sixth inning, Reds batters rank among the National League leaders with **175 runs** (1st), **286 hits** (1st ML), **59 doubles** (2nd), **42 HR** (3rd), **.260 BA** (1st ML), **.431 slugging percentage** (2nd) and **.346 on-base percentage** (1st ML)...from **7/1-7/5** the Reds trailed in 5 consecutive games but won all 5...was their longest such streak since **1918**.

HISTORIC: **Joey Votto** has **1,975 career hits, 309 HR** and **1,014 career RBI**...he is trying to become only the second Major League player ever to record in the same season his **2,000th hit, 300th home run** and **1,000th RBI**...**Billy Williams** did it in **1971**...**Votto** recorded his **300th HR** on **4/30 vs Cubs** (2-run off **Jake Arrieta**) and his **1,000th RBI** on **6/30 vs SD** (solo HR off **Joe Musgrove**).

TOP OF THE ORDER: Reds batters in the top 3 spots in the starting lineup combine to lead the National League in **hits** (353, 1st in ML), **doubles** (77, 2nd ML) and **total bases** (605, 2nd ML)...in the Reds' **last 44 games** beginning 6/5, **Jonathan India, Jesse Winker** and **Nick Castellanos** **30 times** batted first, second and third, respectively, in the lineup...the Reds went **19-11** (.633) in those games.

ALL-STARS: In **LF Jesse Winker** and **RF Nick Castellanos**, the Reds placed **2 starters** in the **All-Star Game's** starting lineup for the first time since **2013 (1B Joey Votto, 2B Brandon Phillips)** and had **2 starting outfielders** in the lineup for the first time since **1956 (Gus Bell, Frank Robinson)**...**LHP Nick Lodolo** and **IF Jose Barrero** represented the organization in the **SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game**.

DRAFT DAY: In Major League Baseball first-year player draft, the Reds selected **SS Matt McLain** (UCLA) with the **17th overall pick**, **CF Jay Allen** (John Carroll High School, Fort Pierce, FL) with the **30th selection** (compensation for the loss of free agent **RHP Trevor Bauer**) and **C Mat Nelson** (Florida State, Johnny Bench & Buster Posey Awards winner) with the **35th pick** (competitive balance pick).

RED HOTS

- Tonight is making his second start of the second half.
- In the 9-6 loss at Coors Field on 5/14 allowed a season-high 8 runs (3+ip)...in 10 starts since then is 4-1, 2.12 (63.2ip, 15er, .257oba).
- With a 1.29 ERA so far in July, ranks second in Major Leagues (Corbin Burnes, 0.99).
- From 5/21-5/30 was on the 10-day injured list with a left foot sprain...in 9 starts since his return is 4-0, 2.14 (59ip, 14er, .253oba).
- Started 3 of the Reds' 5 shutout wins...Sonny Gray started the other 2.
- Reds batters scored at least 10 runs in 5 of his starts...the Reds went 5-0 in those 5 starts.
- In the 3-0 win on 5/7 at Cle threw his first career no-hitter, third career complete game and second career shutout...was the 17th no-hitter in Reds history and fourth in Major League Baseball on the 2021 season's 37th day, the second-fastest ever to 4 no-hitters in a single season (4 no-hitters in the first 25 days of the 1917 campaign)...the longest no-hit bids of his career had been 6.0 innings (7/17/15 for Bos at LAA, 7/30/16 for Sea at Cubs)...allowed 2 baserunners...Amed Rosario reached second base on a double error by 2B Nick Senzel with 1 out in the bottom of the sixth inning, and Cesar Hernandez walked 1 out later...at 34 years, 175 days old is the oldest Reds pitcher to throw a no-hitter (Tom Seaver 33 years, 211 days in 1978)...the Reds broke the scoreless tie with 3 runs in the top of the ninth inning...the start of the game was delayed 1 hour, 23 minutes by weather.
- Following his no-hitter was named National League Player of the Week, his first weekly award.
- In the 9-6 loss on 5/14 at Col, his first start after his no-hitter, allowed a season high 11 hits and 8 runs, his highest totals since he allowed 12 hits and 9 runs on 6/2/16 for Sea at SD...allowed a leadoff triple to Garrett Hampson.
- Joined Anthony DeSclafani as the only Reds pitchers since 1893, when the pitcher's mound was moved to its current distance from home plate, to begin a season with consecutive starts of at least 5.0 scoreless innings...DeSclafani did it last season (5ip/3h, 6ip/2h)...courtesy @EliasSports.
- Is his second season with the Reds...joined the club in December 2019, when he signed a 2-year contract through this year.

- His 2-run double in the first inning Fri vs StL produced his 1,009th and 1,010th career RBI, tying and then moving past Hall of Famer Frank Robinson into fourth place alone on the Reds' all-time list...Pete Rose is third with 1,036 RBI.
 - Has a 3-game hitting streak (5-12, .417, 1 2b, 2hr, 6rbi, .500obp, 1.000slg).
 - Hit safely in 6 of his last 7 apps (11-26, .423, 2 2b, 3hr, 8rbi, .516obp, .846slg).
 - In his last 38 apps beginning 6/11 is hitting .309 (42-136, 6 2b, 1 3b, 8hr, 29rbi, 22r, .409obp, .544slg, .953ops).
 - Beginning 7/2 has reached base safely in each of his last 19 apps,second-longest active streak in the Major Leagues (21-65, .323, 4 2b, 1 3b, 4hr, 14rbi, .463obp, .600slg, 1.063ops)...DJ LeMahieu leads the majors with a 35-game on-base streak.
 - From 5/7-6/6 missed 28 games while on the 10-day injured list with a broken left thumb...the Reds went 14-14 in his absence.
 - In his second appearance after he came off the 10-day IL, on 6/9 vs Mil, began a 6-game RBI streak that tied his career high (August 2010, April 2018)...the 12 RBI during that streak was the highest total over any 6-game span in his career.
 - In the 10-inning, 1-0 win on 5/5 vs WSox made his 1,800th Major League appearance...in the bottom of the fourth inning was hit by a Dallas Keuchel changeup and left the game after the fifth with the broken left thumb.
 - Did not play in the 10-7 win on 6/22 at Min while serving a 1-game suspension for his actions on Sat at SD that led to his 13th career ejection.
 - In the third inning of the 8-6 win on 4/30 vs Cubs became the third Reds player and ninth active player with 300 career home runs...his 2-run HR off Jake Arrieta gave the Reds a 3-2 lead they would not relinquish...on the Reds' all-time home run list, with 309 HR trails only Hall of Famers Frank Robinson (324) and Johnny Bench (389).
 - In the eighth inning of the 10-inning, 3-2 win on 4/17 vs Cle recorded the first 2 outs of the Reds' 31st triple play, their first since 7/25/2017 at NYY...Josh Naylor lined into the 3-3-5 triple play...Votto also participated in the July 2017 triple play.
 - In the first inning of the 7-5 loss on 6/19 at SD was ejected after arguing a check-swing strikeout...was the 13th ejection of his career, his first this season...singled on the first pitch of his first plate appearance the next day.
 - In the eighth inning of the 4-3 win on 7/10 at Mil was ejected after arguing a check-swing strikeout...was the 14th ejection of his career, his second of the season.
 - On 6/30 vs SD homered off Joe Musgrove for his 1,000th Major League RBI...was his 1,821st career appearance.
 - Made his 14th Opening Day roster...appeared in his 13th Opening Day game, fifth-most in Reds history, 1 game behind Johnny Bench and 4 games behind all-time franchise leaders Barry Larkin and Pete Rose (17).
 - Is the 2010 National League Most Valuable Player and Hank Aaron Award winner, a 6-time NL All-Star, a *Sporting News* NL All-Star and the only Reds first baseman ever to win a Rawlings Gold Glove Award.
 - Holds franchise records for career games played at first base (1,792) and intentional walks (142)...shares with Joe Morgan the club career record for number of seasons with at least 100 walks (6).

- 33 JESSE WINKER, lf Homestand: 11-39 (.282), 5 2b, 1hr, 6rbi
- Is an All-Star for the first time in his career...in the American League's 5-2 win at Coors Field, started in RF batting sixth behind teammate Nick Castellanos...in the second inning walked (Lance Lynn) and in the fifth grounded out (Nathan Eovaldi).
 - Has a 3-game hitting streak, including a double in each (6-12, .500, 3 2b, 1hr, 4rbi, .571obp, 1.000slg).
 - Through his third plate appearance on Sunday was hitting .290 (96-331), his lowest batting average of the season...since then is 11-for-27 (.407, 5 2b, 1hr, 6rbi).
 - Hit safely in 67 of his 91 apps...reached base safely in 78 of his 91 apps...is on pace to reach base safely in 127 games...will fall short of the club record for number of games reaching base safely via hit, walk or HBP (150, Joey Votto, 2017).
 - On 6/6 at StL, in his 50th appearance hit his 15th, 16th and 17 home runs to establish a new single-season career high (2019, 16hr in 113g).
 - In the 10-7 win on 6/22 at Min, in his 65th appearance, established a new career high with 45 RBI (2018, 43rbi in 89g).
 - Is the only player in Reds history to produce in a single season a pair of 3-homer games (5/21 vs Mil, 6/6 at StL)...most recently among Major Leaguers, Atl's Adam Duvall had two 3-homer games last season.
 - On 5/21 vs Mil became the 31st player in Reds history to produce 3 HR in a game, accomplished for the 39th time...had his second 3-homer game and a career-high 6 RBI in the 8-7 win on 6/6 vs the Cardinals that led the Reds to their first 4-game sweep in St. Louis since 1990.
 - Received votes for National League Player of the Month for May but finished behind SD's Fernando Tatis Jr....teammate Nick Castellanos also received votes.
 - Has 3 leadoff HR this season and 7 in his career.
 - From 5/21-5/23 vs Mil became the first Reds batter with 5 HR in a 3-game series since Willie Greene did it from 9/24-9/26, 1996 vs Cubs (5hr) and the first ML player since José Abreu did it from 8/21-8/23, 2020, also vs Cubs (6hr).
 - On 5/23 vs Mil hit a 456-foot HR off Freddy Peralta, the longest homer of his career and the second-longest by a Reds batter this season (Tyler Naquin, 5/21 vs Mil off Adrian Houser, 459 feet).
 - In the third inning of the 7-2 loss on 5/11 at Pit became the 41st player to hit a homer that reached on the fly or bounced into the Allegheny River (61st time).
 - Started at designated hitter in 5 of the Reds' 7 interleague road games (3-19, .158, 2 2b, 2rbi, 3bb, 6k).
