## REDS

 LHP Brandon Williamson (4-4, 4.47) vs. RHP Jose Quintana (2-5, 3.05) WPIX • WCBS 880 AM • ESPN 1050METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Redlegs, 3-2, on Saturday Night.. The Mets have dropped back-to-back games...New York is in a stretch of 17 straight games without an off-day (4-5)...The Mets finish their penultimate homestand (3-3), a seven-game stand against Arizona (31) and Cincinnati ( $0-2$ )...Following this series the Mets head out on their final road trip of the year, a seven-game trip to Miami (three games) and Philadelphia (four games).

BRINGING BIG SEXY BACK: Today, RHP Bartolo Colón, a member of the 2015 National League championship team, will officially retire as a member of the Mets in a press conference prior to the game...The first 15,000 fans attending today's game will receive a Bartolo Colón "Big Sexy" long sleeve shirt...Former Mets Manager Terry Collins, whom Colón played for all three years in Queens, will also attend the press conference.

PUT BACK THE BROOMS: The Mets are looking to avoid their seventh sweep of the season...The last time the Mets were swept by the Reds in a three-game series was from May 20-22, 2013 at Citi Field.

I DON'T WANT TO ROCK, DJ: Over his last 24 games, DJ Stewart is batting $.315(28-89)$ with 15 runs, six doubles, 10 home runs, 23 RBI and a 1.084 OPS...In 47 games this year, Stewart is batting .269 (35-130) with 18 runs, eight doubles, 11 home runs, 26 RBI, 11 walks, a . 342 OBP and a .585 SLG... Stewart recorded a career-high 12 home runs in 100 games with Baltimore in 2021.

DINGERS!: The Mets have socked 196 home runs this season...That is the fifth-most in the National League...The 2022 Mets hit 171 home runs...The team's 196 home runs are the sixth-most in a single season in franchise history...Next up is the 2000 team, which hit 198 in the season...Four teams in franchise history have cracked 200+ home runs in a single year 2019 (242), 2017 (224), 2016 (218) and 2006 (200).

EL JEFF-E: In 43 games since the start of August, Jeff McNeil is batting .292 (50-171) with 26 runs, seven doubles, one triple, six home runs, 18 RBI, seven walks with four steals, a . 333 OBP and a . 450 SLG...He has homered twice in his last six games.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga has recorded 191 strikeouts...That is the second-most strikeouts by a rookie in franchise history... He is $10-7$ with a 2.95 ERA ( 51 ER/155.1 IP) with 72 walks and 191 strikeouts in 27 starts this season... His 2.95 ERA ranks fourth in the majors and third in the National League...His 191 strikeouts are the seventh-most in the NL...With nine more strikeouts, he would become the 13th pitcher in franchise history to record 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Jacob deGrom and Noah Syndergaard were the last pitchers to do so...Tom Seaver owns the franchise record with nine such seasons.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo had his seven-game hitting streak, snapped last night...He batted .345 (10-29) with four runs, three doubles, one triple, one home run, three RBI, with a . 406 OBP and a . 621 SLG during that stretch...He has socked a career-best 23 home runs this season... Nimmo has recorded 60 RBI in 2023... His career-best is 64 , which he recorded in 2022...Nimmo is slashing .305/.359/.626 with 10 extra-base hits and six RBI in 14 games in September.

GOT TO GO TO MO'S: Ronny Mauricio has safely hit in nine of his first 12 career games...He is batting . 302 (13-343) with two runs, two doubles, one home run, six RBI, three walks and five steals in his first 12 career games... He is one of five players in franchise history to record a hit in each of his first five career major league games.

REDS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 24-21 against the Reds since Citi Field opened in 2009.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has recorded his second season with 45 or more home runs, becoming the only player in franchise history to do so...He recorded his third season with 40 or more home runs...He became the fifth player in major league history with three or more seasons of 40 or more homers in their first five years, joining Ralph Kiner (four), Ryan Howard (three), Albert Pujols (three) and Eddie Mathews (three)... He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs...He is tied for second in the majors and is second in the National League with 45 home runs...Alonso's 191 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

30-FOR-30: Lindor has recorded 33 doubles and 26 home runs this season... He is looking to become the 12th player in franchise history to record a 30/30 season...The last player to accomplish that feat was Pete Alonso in 2019...He has stolen 26 bases this year... He is looking to become the fourth player in franchise history to record 30 doubles, 30 home runs and 30 steals in a single-season...He would join David Wright (2007), Howard Johnson (1991 \& 1989) and Darryl Strawberry (1987).

LINSANITY: Over his last 77 games, Francisco Lindor is batting . 285 (82288) with 59 runs, 16 doubles, two triples, 14 home runs, 43 RBI, 34 walks, 20 steals with a . 369 OBP, a . 500 SLG and an . 869 OPS...Lindor has stolen a career-high 26 bases this season.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1969, the Mets blanked the Expos, 5-0, in Montreal...Jerry Koosman hurled a complete game allowing only six hits, four walks and struck out three... He improved to $15-9$ with a 2.27 ERA on the year...The Mets recorded 10 hits including two each from Ken Boswell, Wayne Garrett and AI Weiss.

DOWN ON THE FARM: The Binghamton Rumble Ponies improved to 73-61 on the season as four pitchers combined for a two-hit shutout to defeat the Reading Fightin Phils, 6-0...Benito García, Trey McLoughlin, Matt Minnick and Daison Acosta allowed just two hits and struck out eight in the contest...Jet williams reached base and recorded an RBI, while Luisangel Acuña stole his 57th base of the season.

## QUINTANA NEWS \& NOTES

RECENTLY: Quintana made his first start with the Mets on July 20 against his former team, the Chicago White Sox....Quintana signed a two-year contract with New York on December 9, 2022...The southpaw began the season on the IL due to a stress fracture in his rib cage...Underwent surgery on March 17.

LAST TIME OUT: Quintana made his tenth start of the season on September 11 against the Diamondbacks at Citi Field...He threw 5.0 innings and allowed two runs and two walks while striking out four batters.

300 CLUB: Today, Quintana will make his 300th career major league start... He is the 11th active pitcher to reach the milestone and joins Clayton Kershaw, Madison Bumgarner and Wade Miley as the only active left-handed ptichers with 300 or more career starts.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP: Made five appearances across St. Lucie (A), Binghamton (AA) and Syracuse (AAA) as part of his rehab assignment after being placed on the 60-day IL with a left rib fracture...Threw 15.2 innings in five games, four of which were starts, pitching to a 4.60 ERA (8 ER/15.2 IP) while tallying 16 strikeouts compared to eight walks.

CIN CITY: Tonight, Quintana will make his 13th start against the Reds...Quintana last faced Cincinnati on September 17, 2022 at Busch Stadium with the Cardinals... Threw 8.0 shutout innings allowing just two hits and struck out six batters...Holds a career 3.06 ERA ( 24 ER/70.2 IP) against the club.

HOT STREAK: Quintana's homerless inning streak came to an end at 97.1 innings in his start on August 12 at St. Louis after allowing a solo homer to Tyler O'Neill to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning...The last pitcher before Quintana to reach 90.0+ homerless innings was Tyson Ross (100.0 IP) in 2015...Courtesy of Elias...Last season Quintana owned the lowest ERA (0.89) in Major League Baseball during the month of September last year and is the lowest ERA in any month in his career.

LEFT 'EM SPEECHLESS: Reached 1,500 career strikeouts in his start vs. Colorado on August 16, 2022...Quintana currently ranks fifth among active MLB lefties in strikeouts $(1,575)$ behind Clayton Kershaw $(2,934)$, Chris Sale $(2,180)$, Madison Bumgarner (2070) and Patrick Corbin $(1,585)$.

2022 SEASON: Quintana allowed two earned runs or fewer in 26 starts in the regular season...Posted a season-high 19.1-inning scoreless streak from September 11-28, the longest scoreless streak in by a Cardinals pitcher in 2022... NL Ranks 2022: ERA (2.93, 8th), Games Started (31, T10th), HR/9 IP (0.43, 1st), GIDP/9 IP (1.25, 1st), GIDP (25, T1st)
