BIRD WATCHING: The St. Louis Cardinals continue their longest road trip of the season tonight (11 games in 10 days) with the third game of a 5-game series in Cincinnati...the Cardinals split yesterday's day/night doubleheader against the Reds with a 2-1 win in Game 1 and a 6-5 loss in 10 innings in Game 2...last night's Game 2 loss snapped the Cardinals three game win streak...the Redbirds are 3-2 in the 1st five games of this trip, taking 2-of-3 from the Cubs last weekend at Wrigley Field...this week's 5-game series in Cincinnati is the longest the two teams have played here in the Queen City since a 5-game set August 7-10, 1952 at Crosley Field...the Cardinals have won a season best four consecutive series (at NYY, vs. COL, vs. PHI, at CHC)...including tonight's game, the Cardinals have 36 games remaining in the regular season with 15 at home and 21 on the road.

FLIGHT PATTERN: St. Louis enters play today in 3rd place in the National League Central, 13.5 games behind 1st place Milwaukee; 3.5 games ahead of 4th place Pittsburgh and 3.0 games out of the final National League Wild Card position...the Cardinals are 6-4 in their last 10 games, 11-9 in last 20 and 13-17 in last 30...they are 33-34 vs. teams that are currently above .500 and 31-28 vs. the sub .500 teams.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: With approaching/surpassed personal Triple Crown highs in BA (.289), HR (21) & RBI (92), 2025 NL Silver Slugger **Alec Burleson** is currently leading the majors in both RBI and a career-high 32 doubles...according to research by the *Elias Sports Bureau*, there have only been seven players to lead MLB in both 2B's & RBI - the last being Colorado's **Todd Helton** in 2000.

WALKER'S 20/20 VISION: Adding his career and team-high 17th stolen base in Game 2 yesterday, **Jordan Walker** (24 HR) pulled closer into view of the Cardinals first 20 HR/20 SB season since OF **Tommy Pham** (23 HR/25 SB) did so in 2017...Pete Crow-Armstrong (30/30), **Elly De La Cruz** and CJ Abrams are the lone MLB players with 20/20 totals this season. **THE DAILY DOUBLE:** Walker, who has doubled in three-straight games (4 doubles total), is also in a heated race for the team lead in HR, RBI, 2B, hits & total bases and is just four back of **Alec Burleson** in both RBI and doubles - the lone team with 2 players in NL Top-10 in NL in both RBI & 2B's.

CLOSE CALLS: With two additional one-run decisions in yesterday's double-header, the Cardinals and Reds played their 7th game (out of 10) settled by 2 runs or fewer this season, and their 2nd extra inning game...the Cardinals have played 29 games decided by one run this season (21-18) and 14 extra inning games (8-6).

RILEY ROLLING: All-Star closer **Riley O'Brien** closed out yesterday's Game 1 win by striking out the side in order in the 9th (1st time this season to do so) to preserve the 2-1 win, as his bullpen mates carried the win with 4.0 scoreless innings leading up to the 9th...the save for O'Brien was his NL-leading 31st...Riley is unscored upon in his last 10.0 IP dating to July 20 at LAA, his last blown save, and he's converted 18 of his last 19 save opportunities.

RECORDS ARE MEANT TO BE BROKEN: With his ejection in the 10th inning last night, Cardinals Manager **Oli Marmol** passed Hall of Fame managers **Whitey Herzog** and **Roger Bresnahan**, and moved into 2nd on the team's all-time managerial ejections list with 24, trailing only Hall of Fame manager **Tony La Russa (39)**...Marmol, who is in his 5th season at the helm of the Cardinals, is in need of just 11 wins for his 400th career managerial win.

CLOSING THE GABP ON 100: The Cardinals (97-95) are just three wins shy of 100 all-time wins at Great American Ball Park (2003-present) as they look to join the Milwaukee Brewers (102-94) as only visiting teams to win 100+ games at the venue.

CINCINNATI CONNECTIONS

Terry Francona played in 86 games in 1990 with the Louisville Redbirds (AAA), including five at pitcher...his father, **Tito Francona**, played parts of two seasons (1965-66) with St. Louis...became a Cardinal via trade by Cleveland in exchange for a player to be named (Dec. 15, 1964)...originally signed by the St. Louis Browns before the 1952 season (MLB debut for Baltimore in 1956).

César Prieto made his MLB debut at Cincinnati on Aug. 29, 2025 & collected 1st MLB hit on Aug. 31 off **Emilio Pagán**.

Caleb Ferguson pitched in 26 games (one start) for the Reds this season...was born in Columbus, OH...graduated from West Jefferson High School.

Hall of Famer **Scott Rolen** played his final four seasons with the Reds (2009-12)...won the 2010 Gold glove and was a two-time All-Star (2010-11).

Reds Asst. Pitching Coach **Matt Tracy** was born in St. Louis...graduated from Christian Brothers College HS.

Justin Bruihl pitched for the Reds Triple-A Louisville affiliate in 2024.

Riley O'Brien made his MLB debut with Cincinnati (Sept. 28, 2021 at Guaranteed Rate Field).

Bryan Torres made his MLB debut at Cincinnati on May 23, 2026 (G1)...singled off Chris Paddock for his first MLB hit and homered off Jose Franco.

Julio Rangel served as Bullpen Coach for the Reds in 2019.

Pierce Johnson pitched three seasons (2010-12) at Missouri State University...set the school's single-season record with 119 strikeouts in 2012.

Cardinals.TV broadcaster **Mark Sweeney** played outfield for both the Cardinals (1995-97) and Reds (1999).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Vince Coleman** played in 33 games for Cincinnati in 1996.

Reds Senior Advisor **Cam Bonifay** played two minor league seasons with the Cardinals...worked for St. Louis as a professional scout and special asst.

Reds Special Asst. to the GM **John Morris** played five seasons (1986-90) with the Cardinals.

Reds President of Baseball Ops **Nick Krall** previously interned for the New Jersey Cardinals of the NY Penn League (SS).

Reds broadcaster **Jeff Brantley** pitched in 48 games for St. Louis in 1998.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Jim Edmonds** played 13 games for the Reds in his final season (2010).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Julían Javier** played in 44 games for the Reds during his final 1972 season.

Reds Senior Advisor **Eric Davis** played two seasons (1999-2000) for St. Louis.

Cardinals Principal Owner and Chief Executive Office **William DeWitt Jr.** was a prior owner of the Reds and shareholder of the Cincinnati Bengals...his father, **William O. DeWitt**, was a sole owner of the Reds from 1961-67.

Reds CEO **Robert Castellini**, Chairman **W. Joseph Williams Jr.** and Vice Chairman **Thomas Williams** were Cardinals investors from 1995-2006...interests were sold as a condition of their acquisition of a controlling ownership stake of the Reds.

TONIGHT'S START:

- The 29-year old makes his 24th start of the season (25th career) and 122nd career appearance. Leahy's first 97 Major League career appearances all came in relief.
- Led off his last start by striking out Kyle Schwarber (looking) for his 100th strikeout this season, marking his first MLB season with 100 strikeouts.
- Enters tonight on a career-best four-game winning streak (June 28-present).
- Since June 23, ranks 3rd in MLB in ERA (1.52) over 47.1 innings pitched. Tied with Detroit's Troy Melton and Arizona's Brandon Pfaadt over that period for most starts yielding 2 runs or fewer (8).
- His nine wins this season are a career high and rank 2nd on St. Louis to Andre Pallante (12).
- Led the NL and ranked 5th in MLB among qualifying pitchers with his 1.38 ERA (26.0 IP/4 ER) in the month of July ... It was the team's best July mark since 2009 when Adam Wainwright (1.17) & Joel Pineiro (1.22) had stellar Julys.
- Kyle's 117.1 innings pitched are a single-season MLB career high as are his 105 strikeouts. His career single season high for IP as a professional is 144.2 in 2022 between Memphis (AAA) and Springfield (AA).
- Ranks in MLB's 97th percentile in arm extension (7.3 ft.) which is measured from how far off the mound he releases the ball on average.
- Has made 7 starts during nationally televised games: Easter Sunday on NBC/Peacock Sunday Night Baseball in Detroit, April 11 vs. Boston on FOX, Game 2 of a Doubleheader at Cincinnati on May 23 on FOX, May 30 vs. the Cubs on FOX, July 4 at Chicago's Wrigley Field on FOX, Friday, July 10 vs. Braves on Apple TV and July 20 at the LA Angels on ESPN.
- Kyle's 97 career relief appearances before his 1st career Major League start (Sept. 28, 2025 at CHI) were the most by a Cardinal since Jordan Hicks (April 21, 2022 at Miami) who made his 1st career start after having made 114 career relief appearances.

LAST TIME OUT (Wednesday, August 12 vs. Philadelphia): W 7-1; 5.0 IP, 6 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 0 BB, 6 SO, 0 HR - 81 pitches.

- Ran off his 9th straight start holding his opposition to 2 runs or less (June 23-present).
- Five runs of support are his most since four on May 23 at Cincinnati (game 2)

2026 HIGHLIGHTS:

DON'T WALK: Became one of two Cardinals to strike out 8 or more batters with 0 walks in his Aug. 7 start vs. COL, joining Dustin May at MIL (5/27).

BEND, DON'T BREAK: Ranks 2nd among MLB starting pitchers in Opp. BA with 2 outs & RISP at .082 BA (4-49) trailing Angels Jack Kochanowicz (.077).

EN GARDE: Ranks 7th among NL pitchers with his 25 Opponent's Sword Swings (Max Meyer & Jesus Luzardo, T-1st with 32). A “sword” swing is an expression of the art of forcing a batter to take an uncomfortable, awkward swing.

AIR BENDER: Boasts average swing & miss distances of 5.8 inches on his sweeper.

HIGH HEAT: Despite pitching in high heat (94 degrees) & humidity, he fanned a career high 9 batters while throwing a career single-game high 102 pitches on 7/26 vs. CIN

HELLO 4TH OF JULY: Hurlled 5.0 scoreless innings through the Wrigley Field fog as the Cardinals handed the Cubs a 3-0 shutout on Independence Day ... Leahy allowed three singles and struck out six on only 77 pitches ... Following a 49-minute pre-game rain delay, JJ Wetherholt homered on the first pitch of the game . The game was also halted for 15 minutes after the 6th inning due to heavy fog combined with smoke from nearby fireworks.

PARK PLACE: Each of his first six road games took place at Parks (Petco Park, Comerica Park, Daikin Park, loanDepot park, PNC Park, Great American Ball Park). His start at Target Field on June 12 ended the string.

CENTRAL FOCUS: Earned wins in three of his seven starts against NL Central opponents this season (April 28 at PIT, May 4 vs. MIL, July 4 at Chicago) to improve to 5-1 in his career against divisional opponents.

NO DECISIONS: Has earned the decision in 12 of his 22 starts, but just 4 decisions in his last 13 starts.

STRETCHING OUT: Has worked at least 5.0 innings in 18 of his 22 starts on the year, including a career-high 6.1 innings on 6/22 vs. Arizona.

SNAKE CHARMER: Blanked the Diamondbacks on just 3 hits over his career single-game high 6.1 IP on 6/22 vs. ARI, but took a no-decision while exiting the game with a scoreless tie.

OH MOTHER: Blanked the Padres over his 5.0 IP on just 2 hits on May 10 (Mother's Day), and was in line for the win before the Padres Nick Castellanos tied the game with a 2-out, 2-strike 2-run HR to tie the game at 2-2, and then SD won it in the 10th, 3-2.

LEAHY VS. CINCINNATI:

- Makes his 4th career start and 12th career appearance against the Reds tonight.
- Owns a career mark of 0-0, 6.13 ERA against Cincinnati (25.0 IP/17 ER) and an 0-0 mark with 6.00 ERA (15.0 IP/10 ER) in his three starts - both coming this season.
- Kyle's top two strikeout efforts have both come against the Reds: July 26, 2026 (9 K) and May 23, 2026-G2 (8 K).
- Made his 1st career start against the Reds in nightcap of May 23, 2026 DH at Great American Ball Park and took ND in the extra inning loss. Struck out a career high 8 batters over his 5.0 IP.
- Has allowed 14 runs & 22 hits in his last four meetings with the Reds including a relief outing on Sept. 15 2025 at Busch Stadium.
- Converted one of his two career MLB saves against the Reds: Aug. 30, 2025 at GABP in 4-2 win (1.1 scoreless IP)

LAST APPEARANCE VS. REDS (July 26, 2026 at Busch Stadium): ND, L 5-3; 6.0 IP, 6 H, 2 R, 2 ER, 1 BB, 9 SO, 2 HR - 102 pitches
