RAY REPORT—The Rays wrap up a season-long, 10-game, 10-day homestand against the Nationals (2-1), Royals (2-2), and Diamondbacks (2-0, one to play) today at Tropicana Field...following tomorrow's off day, which is their final reprieve before the All-Star break, will transition into July with a six-game road trip against the Royals (3G) and Astros (3G) starting Tuesday night in Kansas City...have won four straight games, their longest streak since May 17-22 (5G), and are 6-3 on the current homestand on the heels of a 1-5 West Coast road trip (June 12-17)...are 15 games over .500 for the first time since June 11 (40-25)...are an MLB-best 30-12 at home, tied with 2008 for their second-best home start behind 2023 (33-9)...including the current set, have gone 4-5-2 in their last 11 series since winning eight straight (April 24-May 20)...are 6-3 on a stretch of 23 games in 24 days leading into the Midsummer Classic (June 19-July 12)...are 13-18 since May 24 (13th in AL/T25th in MLB) after producing an MLB-best 22-4 record between April 22-May 23...had the best record in the AL for 35 straight days between May 9-June 12, which included eight consecutive days atop the majors from May 18-25...have spent 42 days in first place in the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...yesterday, overtook the Yankees for the division lead by winning pct., their first time atop the AL East since June 12...marks the latest into a season they have led the division since July 18, 2023...spent 14 consecutive days in second from June 13-26 following a 35-day stint in first from May 9-June 12.

- ★ The Rays secured a series win and a winning homestand with last night's 4-2 victory...five pitchers combined to issue no walks in a scheduled bullpen day.
- ★ It marked the 10th time in team history the pen has thrown 7.0 IP or more with 7 SO or more and no walks, first since July 6, 2023 vs. PHI (8.0IP, 9SO)...Rays relievers have walked only three of their last 146 BF (2.1%...overall, the club's staff leads the AL with eight games issuing 0 BB.
- ★ Per Stats Perform, **Michael Grove** (W, 3.0IP, H, 0R, 4SO) became the fourth Ray to earn the win with 3.0 scoreless innings or more in relief in his club debut, joining **Chris Ellis** (Aug. 17, 2021 vs. BAL), **Andrew Bellatti** (May 9, 2015 vs. TEX), and **Esteban Yan** (April 2, 1998 vs. DET).
- ★ It marked the Rays 21st comeback win, tied with the White Sox for second most in the AL to the Athletics (23)...they have come from behind in five of their last seven wins (June 14-pres.).
- ★ The Rays have recorded a season-high three straight multi-homer games, their longest streak since Aug. 22-25, 2025 (3G) with their last longer stretch coming from April 11-14, 2025 (4G)...they have scored 16 of their 23 runs (69.6%) via the long ball during the streak compared to eight of 27 runs (29.6%) in their previous eight games (June 16-24)...are 20-1 when out-homer their opponent.
- ★ The club's 40-9 (813) record when scoring four runs or more is the best in the AL...the Rays have reached that mark in five straight games, their third-longest streak this season behind runs of seven (May 15-22) and six games (April 19-16).
- ★ They have scored in the opening frame in a season-high-tying three straight games (4x, last: May 29-31) and four of their last five games overall...the Rays are 20-9 when plating a 1st-inning run.
- ★ Opponents are 1-for-18 (.056) with RHP vs. Rays pitching the last three games...the staff has turned in a 1.50 ERA (36.0IP, 23-for-129) with 33 SO and 5 BB during the current four-game winning streak.
- ★ This is the 10th time this season the Rays have won the first two contests of a three-game series...they went on to complete the sweep in seven of the previous nine instances, with the lone losses coming on May 13 at TOR (5-3) and April 29 at CLE (3-1).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays recalled **RHP Trevor Martin** from Triple-A Durham and optioned **RHP Michael Grove** to Durham...this marks Martin's fourth major league stint, joining May 31-June 3, May 15-27, and April 20-26...he went 2-0 with a 0.77 ERA (11.2IP, 1ER) and .150 (6-for-40) opp. average over six appearances for the Bulls during June.

WHAT'S AT STAKE—With a win today, the Rays would:
★ Win five straight games for the first time since May 17-22...record their fifth winning streak of five games or more, extending their major league lead.
★ Tally their eighth sweep, breaking a tie with the Dodgers for the most in the majors while surpassing 2023, 2021, and 2008 (all 7) for the most in club history before the calendar flips to July.
★ Secure their seventh home series sweep, extending their MLB lead (2nd: CWS, 5, could sweep KC today)...record seven sweeps at Tropicana Field before the end of June, surpassing 2023 and 2008 (both 6) for the most in franchise history.
★ Sweep the D-backs for the fourth time, first since Aug. 16-18, 2024 at Tropicana Field...claim their sixth straight series win over Arizona (2016-pres.), extending the longest streak in club history.
★ Record their second sweep over an NL opponent, joining May 1-3 vs. SF.

THE CAMINER SHOW—**Junior Caminero** has homered in a career-high-tying three straight games (4x, last: Aug. 22-25, 2025)...it marks the longest streak by a Ray since he last turned the trick, with the most recent longer stretch belonging to **Brandon Lowe** (4G from April 8-11, 2023)...his 5 HR during that streak are tied for the most in club history over any three-game span (see table on the right)...he has 6 HR in his last five games, matching his total from his previous 44 games combined (May 8-June 22)...Caminero is the first player in Rays history to record multiple seasons with 20 HR or more before the All-Star break (23HR in 2025)...his 72 career home runs are third most by a Dominican-born player before turning 23, trailing only **Juan Soto** (98) and **Fernando Tatis Jr.** (81), and 24th most by any player in the modern era (since 1900).
★ Caminero has homered in the 1st inning in a franchise-record three consecutive games...it marks MLB's longest streak since SF **Rafael Devers** (3G) from Aug. 31-Sept. 2, 2025 (Stats Perform)...the Rays lineup as a whole last homered in the opening frame in four straight games from May 21-25, 2022.

THE BIG THREE—The Rays 1-3 hitters, **Yandy Diaz**, **Jonathan Aranda**, and **Junior Caminero**, are a combined 7-for-18 (.389) with 2 2B, 3 HR, 8 RBI, 5 BB, 2 SO, 7 R, and a 1.542 OPS through two games this series...on the season, the trio has accounted for 46 of the Rays 71 homers (64.8%) and 156 of their 345 RBI (45.2%)...in the 14 games in which those three have occupied the top three spots in the Rays order, as they have, in each of the last three games, they have combined for a .355/.455/.663 (.59-for-166) line with 12 2B, 13 HR, 39 RBI, 29 BB, 34 SO, and a 1.117 OPS...this includes a combined .425 (.45-for-106) average, 22 XBFI, and 1.355 OPS over the last nine such games (May 18-pres)...if Caminero (4/7RBI) records 3 RBI today, they would become the first trio in club history to each tally 50 RBI at the midway point of the season (thru 81G) and the AL's first since Baltimore's **Gunnar Henderson** (57), **Adley Rutschman** (55), and **Anthony Santander** (53) in 2024.
★ Caminero is batting .347 (.17-for-49) with 1 2B, 7 HR, 17 RBI, and a 1.196 OPS over his last 13 games.
★ Diaz is 18-for-38 (.4747) with 4 2B, 6 RBI, 7 BB, 10 R, and six multi-hit efforts during an 11-game on-base streak (June 16-pres)...he has reached base in 38 of his last 39 games (May 12-pres.), ranking second in MLB with a .451 OBP in that span (LAD **Shohei Ohtani** - .464), and 72 of his 77 games overall.
★ Aranda has hit safely in a season-high 10 straight games, batting .405 (15-for-37) with 3 2B, 2 HR, and 9 RBI during the streak, which is the second longest of his career behind June 15-28, 2025 (13G)...Aranda has tallied an RBI in five straight contests, tied for the second-longest stretch of his career behind July 29, 2025-March 26, 2026 (7G) and tied for the longest active run in MLB with CLE **Khalil Watson** and NYY **Aaron Judge** (IL)...he has an extra-base hit in a career-high four consecutive games, the majors' longest active streak.

ALL ABOUT THAT BASE—Through 80 games, **Yandy Diaz's** 141 times on base are already the most in club history through the midway point of the season (thru 81G), surpassing **B.J. Upton** in 2008 (139 TOB)...he needs to reach base 12 times over the Rays next 14 games to break Upton's mark of 152 TOB before the All-Star break...his 141 TOB rank fourth in the AL and are good for a pace of 285 TOB over a full season, which would break **Aubrey Huff's** record of 259 TOB from 2003.

DOMESTIC SWEET DOME—**Yandy Diaz** has reached base safely in 25 straight home games (May 5-pres.), the majors' longest single-season streak since LAD **Shohei Ohtani** (30G) from July 19-Sept. 21, 2025...the last Ray with a longer stretch was **Randy Arozarena** (33G) from April 12-June 24, 2023...it ties **Julio Lugo** (June 15-Aug. 15, 2005) for the seventh-longest single-season streak in Rays history, one shy of **Randy Winn's** sixth-ranked streak (26G from May 8-July 13, 2002), and is tied for 13th longest overall (incl. multi-season streaks)...Diaz, who has reached base safely in 38 of his 39 home games, is slashing .419/.495/.731 (39-for-93) with 8 2B, 7 HR, 25 RBI, 13 BB, 12 SO, and 23 R at Tropicana Field during the streak, which is the longest single-season run of his career and the second longest overall behind a 29-game stretch between July 21, 2019-April 28, 2021.
★ His .376 (.53-for-141) home average on the year ranks second in the majors to TEX **Josh Jung** (.378).

TROP SHOTS—There have been five fair balls hit off Tropicana Field's four catwalks through nine games of the current homestand compared to three in the Rays first 33 home games...the eight total catwalk collisions through 42 games are already the most in a season since 2022 (8), and the last time there were more was 2019 (10)...the single-season record is 15 catwalks in 2016...for more information on the catwalks, see page 486 of the 2026 Rays Media Guide.

SNAKES IN THE BAY—MLB's 1998 expansion franchises conclude their lone series of 2026 this afternoon...this marks the Rays sixth time hosting the D-backs, joining series in 2024 (3-0), 2019 (2-1), 2013 (1-1), 2010 (1-2), and 2006 (3-0)...they won two of three games last year from April 22-24, 2025 at Chase Field, with both wins coming in extra frames...three of the last six meetings between the clubs have been decided in extra innings compared to two of the first 27 matchups...the Rays have won nine of their last 10 games vs. Arizona (June 28, 2023-pres.) and have claimed five straight series (2016-pres)...their 22-11 (.667) all-time record vs. the D-backs is their best against any opponent.
★ **Yandy Diaz** has reached base safely in 16 of 17 career games vs. the D-backs, batting .348 (23-for-66) with 9 2B and 7 RBI, including 9-for-17 (.529) during a four-game hitting streak (April 23, 2025-pres.).

TODAY'S START—Drew Rasmussen will toe the rubber today for his 16th start of the campaign and 146th career appearance (97th start)...has made the ninth-most starts in franchise history (96GS), trailing **Jeremy Hellickson** and **Blake Snell** (both 108GS)...min. 75.0 IP, leads AL arms in opp. AVG (.194/61-for-314), opp. on-base pct. (.235), strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.93), and WHIP (0.88)...ranks second in ERA (2.62) behind **NYY Cam Schlichter** (1.62).

- With a win today, Rasmussen would reach five home wins this season, tying for the AL lead with six others...with a win today, he would also join teammates **Nick Martinez** (5-1) and **Shane McClellan** (5-1) as the only trio of AL teammates with five home wins or more this season...the only other trio in the majors to turn the trick are Milwaukee's **Aaron Ashby** (7-0), **Kyle Harrison** (5-1), and **Jacob Misiorowski** (5-0).
- He is one of 15 AL pitchers with eight quality starts or more this season, a group that also includes rotation-mate **Martinez** (9QS), and holds the second most among Rays arms since the start of 2021 (29QS) behind **McClellan** (38QS).
- Since 2021, his 2.76 ERA is second best among all major league pitchers (min. 500.OIP), behind **LAD Shohei Ohtani** (2.66).
- Rasmussen's career 12.0 bWAR is the fifth-highest mark among AL right-handers since the start of 2022...his 2.6 bWAR this year is tied for fourth highest among AL right-handed pitchers...teammate **Martinez's** 2.8 bWAR is tied for second under the same criteria.

LAST TIME OUT—Rasmussen delivered a fourth straight quality start despite being dealt the loss on June 22 vs. KC, allowing two runs on four hits and five strikeouts with a season-high-tying two walks (2x, last: May 17 vs. MIA)...allowed a pair of doubles to **Maikel Garcia** in the 1st inning and **Lane Thomas** in the 2nd frame before retiring 10 straight batters and 15 of his last 18 before handing the ball over to the bullpen to begin the 7th inning.

- Is one of 12 AL pitchers to toss four straight quality starts or more in a row this season...**BOS Sonny Gray** is the only pitcher in the AL to work five-straight QS this year (May 30-pres.).

ACRES OF DIAMONDS—Across two career starts against the Diamondbacks, Rasmussen has posted a 5.14 ERA (7.OIP, 4ER) and seven strikeouts...he has never pitched into the 6th inning against Arizona.

- In his last start on April 24, 2025 at AZ, he allowed four earned runs on five hits with five strikeouts in a no-decision...did not allow a baserunner in 2.0 innings of work in his lone home start against the club on Aug. 18, 2024.
- He is 1-1 with a 2.81 ERA (25.2IP, 8ER) through eight career appearances (four starts) vs. NL West foes...as a starter, he is 1-1 with a 2.33 ERA (19.1IP, 5ER).

JUST HOW HE DREW IT UP—During June, Rasmussen is 2-2 with a 1.00 ERA (27.OIP, 3ER) across four starts, leading AL qualifiers in ERA, third in MLB behind **SF Logan Webb** (0.71) and **MIL Jacob Misiorowski** (0.96)...Rasmussen's 0.59 WHIP this month is the lowest in the majors and his .141 (13-for-92) opp. average is the second lowest in the AL behind **CLE Tanner Bibee** (.138)...his 34 strikeouts in June are tied for sixth most in MLB.

- The right-hander's 1.00 ERA would be the fourth-lowest ERA by a pitcher during any single month in franchise history (min. 25.OIP), trailing **Chris Archer's** 0.73 ERA (July 2013), **Rich Hill's** 0.78 ERA (May 2021), and **Archer's** 0.84 ERA (April/March 2015)...Rasmussen's 1.00 ERA would be the club's lowest June ERA under the same parameters, ahead of **Shane McClellan's** 1.36 mark in 2022.
- He is the only MLB pitcher to allow three runs or fewer this month (min. 25.OIP)...would be the third pitcher in franchise history to give up three runs or fewer in any month, joining **Hill** (3R, May 2021) and **Blake Snell** (3R, Aug. 2018) and the third AL pitcher to turn the trick during June in the wild card era (since 1995), joining **Michael Fulmer** (2R) in 2016 and **Yovani Gallardo** (3R) in 2015.
- Rasmussen's 0.59 WHIP would be the lowest during any month in franchise history (min. 25.OIP), ahead of **Ryan Yarbrough's** 0.63 clip in Aug. 2019...would be the 10th MLB pitcher to post a 0.60 WHIP or lower (min. 25.OIP) during June in the live-ball era (since 1920) and the third AL arm to do so, joining **BAL Grant Jackson** (0.50, 1973) and **CWS Hoyt Wilhelm** (0.53, 1965).
- Over 16 appearances (13 starts) in June over his career, he is 5-4 with a 2.58 ERA (73.1IP, 21ER), 74 strikeouts, and a .202 (53-for-262) opp. average...his career June ERA is the eighth lowest mark among active MLB starters (min. 70.OIP).

IT'S THE TROP—Rasmussen is making his eighth start at home this season...is 4-2 with a 2.90 ERA (40.1IP, 13ER), and he has gone 5.0 IP or more with 3 ER or fewer in five of his seven outings at Tropicana Field this year.

- His .571 (16-12) home winning pct. as a Ray ranks eighth in franchise history (min. 250.OIP)...teammate **Shane McClellan** (26-8) tops the list at .765.
- Rasmussen's 2.69 ERA (170.1IP, 51ER) at Tropicana Field is the lowest mark in the venue's history (min. 150.OIP), ahead of **Blake Snell's** 2.70 (276.1IP, 83ER) clip.
- Since 2021, Rasmussen is one of five MLB arms (min. 250.OIP) to allow 200 hits or fewer at home (200), alongside **TEX Jacob deGrom** (152), **LAD Tyler Glasnow** (166), **HOU Cristian Javier** (182), and **LAD Shohei Ohtani** (198).

RIGHT ON—Right-handed hitters are batting .138 (17-for-128) with 35 SO and 3 BB against Rasmussen, the lowest mark in the majors (min. 100BF)...right-handed batters are hitting .111 (4-for-36) against his cutter, 1-for-19 (.053) off his four-seamer, and 9-for-52 (.173) against his sinker.

- Min. 300 BF, his .178 (66-for-370) opp. average vs. right-handed batters since the start of 2025 is the lowest in the majors.
