METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action last night and defeated the A's, 9-2... The Mets have won seven of their last eight games...The Mets are 77-13 when scoring first this season...New York is 34-10-3 in 47 series this year...The Mets continue a seven-day, six-game road trip (3-1) to Milwaukee (2-1) and Oakland (1-0)...The Mets are off on Monday and then return to Citi Field for a two-game series against the Marlins.

SUMMER SLAM: The Mets recorded their seventh grand slam of the season last night... That is tied for the fifth-most in franchise history...The team has recorded eight grand slams in a season three times, in 1999, 2000 and 2018...The franchise record is 10 slams, accomplished in 2006...Eduardo Escobar became the sixth different Mets player to hit a grand slam this year...That is tied for the most in team history with the 1987, 2000, 2006, 2016 and 2018 teams.

DAYMAN: The Mets have won 12 of their last 15 games in the sunshine...Overall, New York is 37-18 in day games this season...The team's .673 winning percentage in the sunlight is the second-best in the National League...The Mets have posted a 3.04 ERA with 142 walks and 539 strikeouts in the daytime...Their 3.04 ERA in the daytime is third in the majors and second in the NL.

A-OK: The Mets have played 17 games against the Athletics...It's the first time the two teams have played each other since 2017 and the first time the two teams will play in Oakland since 2014...Mark Canha, who played for the Athletics from 2015-21, is a .242/.347/.434 hitter at the ballpark...He has recorded 166 runs, 52 doubles, six triples, 45 home runs, 146 RBI and 128 walks at the yard...Starling Marte has played 32 games at the ballpark and is a .328 (44-134) hitter with 20 runs, 11 doubles, a triple four home runs, 22 RBI with a .359 OBP and a .515 SLG...Francisco Lindor has appeared in 17 games in Oakland and is a .338 (23-68) hitter with eight runs, six doubles, two home runs, five RBI with a .361 OBP and a .515 SLG in that span.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets will conclude their Interleague schedule with three games against the Athletics...The Mets are 8-10 against the American League this year...The Mets own a lifetime record of 234-226 against the AL, good for a .508 winning percentage...The team's .508 winning percentage ranks second in the National League.

I <3 STREAKS: Jacob deGrom has struck out eight or more and walked one or none in eight straight starts, the longest such streak in MLB history...Enters today's start riding a 40-start streak of allowing three earned runs or fewer, also the longest streak in MLB history...Further, deGrom has not allowed more than five hits or three runs in any of his last 29 starts...He is tied with Tony Gonsolin for the longest such streak, done mostly while deGrom was on the IL this season...DeGrom has not allowed more than four runs or eight hits in any of his last 59 starts...Can take sole possession of the longest streak of that variety in MLB history today as well.

LINDOR CITY: Francisco Lindor has reached base safely in 15 straight games...He is batting .328 (21-64) with 11 runs, four doubles, a triple, four home runs, 13 RBI, four walks with a .377 OBP and a .609 SLG in the streak that started on September 7...He is on a nine-game hitting streak, batting .300 (12-40) with five runs, a double, a triple, two home runs, seven RBI, a walk with a .842 OPS over that span...He has hit 25 home runs this season...That surpasses Asdrubal Cabrera's 23 home runs in 2018 for the most by a Mets shortstop in a single season...He is batting .304/.374/.483 with 38 runs, 10 doubles, two triples, nine home runs, 33 RBI, 23 walks with an .856 OPS in 59 games following the All-Star break...Lindor ranks fifth in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 6.7 fWAR this season.

THIS ONE GOES TO 11: Over the last 11 games, the Mets bullpen has posted a 2.04 ERA (nine earned runs/39.2 innings)...The have posted a .171 opponent's batting average with seven walks and struck out 59...Overall, the Mets bullpen has posted a 3.53 ERA this season...That ranks third in the National League.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,458 batters this season, which places them second the majors...The team's 1,458 strikeouts are already the second-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.71 K/9 IP, a rate...Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06... More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (26.1 percent), the highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history.

YOU DOWN WITH OBP?: New York is batting .262/.333/.423 away from Citi Field...Their .262 road average is the best in the NL and third in the majors and their .333 OBP is second in the National League...Brandon Nimmo (.404), Jeff McNeil (.393) and Mark Canha (.379) rank three through five in road OBP in the National League.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo is batting .306/.404/.498 with 59 runs, 14 doubles, three triples, 12 home runs, 42 RBI, 39 walks with a .902 OPS in 75 road games this season...This compares to a .221/.309/.329 slashline in 68 games at home.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets have posted a .644 winning percentage (38-21) following the All-Star break...That is tied with the 1988 squad for the second-highest winning percentage in franchise history, right below the 1969 team (.671)...The team's 38 wins are tied for tied for fourth-most in the majors since the break...The Mets are batting .265/.343/.428 with 64 home runs in 59 games following the break...This compares to a .252/.324/.397 slashline with 92 homers before the All-Star Game...The Mets rank second in average, first in OBP and fifth in SLG following the break.

A'S-METS NOTES: The Mets are in Oakland for the first time since August 19-20, 2014.

PETE & PETE: Pete Alonso has recorded 15 home runs with runners in scoring position... His 15 home runs lead the major leagues and tie a franchise record set by Todd Hundley in 1996...Alonso has matched his home run total from 2021 with 37 home runs...The only Mets to have 37 or more home runs in consecutive seasons are Alonso, Darryl Strawberry (1987-88) and Mike Piazza (1999-2000)...Alonso and Strawberry are the only two Mets to reach 37 home runs in year three times.

THE ROAD TO 100: Francisco Lindor has recorded a career-high 99 RBI this season...His 99 RBI are a franchise record for a shortstop...Pete Alonso is second in the majors and owns the National League lead with 121 RBI this season, while Lindor's 99 RBI place him fourth in the NL...Only five times in franchise history have the Mets had multiple players with 100 more RBI on the same team...The 2008 Mets were the last team to accomplish this feat (Carlos Beltrán, Carlos Delgado and David Wright).

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso is the only player in the majors with at least 25 doubles and 35 home runs in each of the last two years...He is just the third player in Mets history with 25 doubles and 35 homers in back-to-back years, joining Darryl Strawberry in 1987-88 and Mike Piazza in three straight seasons from 1999-2001.

RIB EYE STEAKS: Pete Alonso ranks second in the majors and tops the National League with 121 RBI this season...He is three RBI from tying the franchise record...Only once before in franchise history has a Met finished the season with the most RBI...Howard Johnson recorded a career-best 117 RBI in 1991 to lead the National League...He has 27 game-winning RBI this season, the most since the stat was first tracked in 1974...His 35 go-ahead RBI are tied for the second-most in a single season in Mets history...Keith Hernandez had 36 go-ahead RBI in 1985.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets seeking their 47th road win...The team's 46 wins on the road are the seventh most all-time...Their 46 road wins are their highest total since they went 47-34 in 2007...Their .605 road winning percentage is the second-best in franchise history...Only the 1986 (.654) team had a better winning percentage on the road...Their .605 road winning percentage is third-best in MLB and second-best in the NL...Overall they are 46-30 on the road this year.

HECK OR HIGHWATER: The Mets are once again a season-high 40 games over .500... Prior to this year, it is their most games over .500 since the final game of the 1988 season (100-60), their highwater mark for that year...The last time the Mets were 41 games over .500 was when they were 54-games (108-54) above .500 on October 6, 1986, the final day of the season...The Mets have won 96 games...That is the third-most in the major leagues...The last time they won more games was in 2006, when they tallied 97 victories...The Mets have only recorded 100 wins in a season three times in franchise history: 1986 (108), 1988 (100) and 1969 (100)...The Mets are 96-56 through 152 games... That is the second-best mark in Mets history...Only the 1986 team (99-53) posted a better record.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Diaz leads major league relievers with 110 strikeouts...That is 18 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)... Diaz has posted a 0.72 ERA (three earned runs/37.1 innings) with 17 hits, eight walks and 72 strikeouts in 36 appearances since the start of June.

ROAD SQUIRREL: Jeff McNeil is batting .347 (86-248) with 31 runs, 23 doubles, a triple, three home runs, 25 RBI, 15 walks with a .393 OBP and a .484 SLG in 65 road games this year...His .347 road batting average leads the major leagues...McNeil is third in the majors and in the National League with a .317 batting average...He is behind only Freddie Freeman (.328) and Paul Goldschmidt (.320) for the major league lead...José Reyes is the only player in Mets history to be crowned a batting champion after hitting .337 in 2011.

deGROM NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Struck out a season-high 13 batters through 5.0 innings in the team's major league record-tying 20-strikeout, 7-3 win against the Pirates on September 18...After allowing a lead off double, deGrom retired the next 15 straight batters before allowing two singles and a three-run home run to finish with four hits, three earned runs, one home run, zero walks and 13 strikeouts.

WALKIN' AFTER MIDNIGHT: DeGrom did not issue a walk in his 13-strikeout outing, becoming the first pitcher in major league history with 13 strikeouts and zero walks in a 5.0-inning start...Joins Alex Cobb and Zack Greinke as the only pitchers in major league history with 13 strikeouts in a start of 5.0 innings or less...DeGrom has five career games with at least 13 strikeouts and zero walks, tying Max Scherzer and Gerrit Cole for the third-most such starts since 2015...Dwight Gooden, Tom Seaver and Sid Fernandez are the only other pitchers in franchise history to have multiple starts with 13 or more strikeouts and zero walks.

RIGHT WHERE HE LEFT OFF: Since returning from the IL on August 2, deGrom has been one of MLB's top pitchers, ranking among leaders in WHIP (0.61, first), strikeout rate (44.1 percent, first), strikeouts (86, first), opponent average (.153, second), wins (five, tied for 13th) and ERA (2.32, 15th).

MILESTONE ALERT: With a win on September 7, deGrom tied Jon Matlack for seventh in Mets history with 82 victories...With a win today, he will take sole possession of seventh place...Al Leiter is next in line with 95 wins.

HISTORY LESSON: Recorded his fourth double-digit strikeout game of the season and 57th of his career in his last outing...DeGrom is three games shy of tying Tom Seaver's franchise record for most double-digit strikeout games.

THIS IS GETTING RIDICULOUS: Through his first nine starts this season, deGrom yielded just 29 hits and four walks while striking out 86 batters...He is the only pitcher in major league history to record 80-plus strikeouts with than 10 walks and fewer than 30 hits allowed in the first nine starts of the season and has done so in back-to-back years...DeGrom allowed 25 hits and eight walks and had 93 strikeouts through nine starts in 2021.

THE EXCELLENCE IS SUSTAINABLE: Since 2018, deGrom owns a 1.97 ERA in 100 starts...That is the best mark in the major leagues in that span (min. 500.0 IP)...He has 336 strikeouts in 36 starts since 2020...He and Dwight Gooden are the only Mets pitchers ever to fan 300 or more in a span of 36 games...See the chart below for an overview of his 2018 and 2019 Cy Young Award-winning seasons compared to his last three seasons combined:

200 CLUB: On August 7, 2022 against Atlanta, deGrom set the MLB record for most strikeouts through a pitcher's first 200 career starts with 1,523...He surpassed the previous record set by Yu Darvish with 1,517...Through his first 200 games, deGrom recorded a 2.50 ERA...Only five pitchers have had a lower ERA through 200 career games (min. 1,000 IP): Dutch Leonard (2.09), Carl Mays (2.23), Reb Russell (2.28), and Baseball Hall of Famers Red Faber (2.41) and Tom Seaver (2.42).

AUGUST IS THE HOTTEST MONTH: In his first month back in over a year, deGrom finished the month of August among the MLB leaders in several categories...He led the majors in strikeouts (55), WHIP (0.55), opponent's batting average (.136), opponent's OPS (.388) and K/BB (18.33).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MAX SCHERZER (10-4, 2.15)

LAST TIME OUT: Reinstated from the Injured List before the game, Scherzer recorded his 200th win and had a perfect game through 6.0 innings before being pulled with 68 pitches...He recorded nine strikeouts in the outing as the Mets defeated the Brewers, 7-2, to earn a postseason berth.

200 SPRINT: Scherzer's 200th win came in his 428th career game...He became the 30th pitcher to win 200 of his first 428 career appearances...The other 29 pitchers include 23 Hall of Famers as well as Roger Clemens, Andy Pettitte, CC Sabathia, Justin Verlander, Tim Hudson and George Mullin.
