**RECENT REDBIRDS:** The St. Louis Cardinals conclude their third home stand of the season, a six-game May opener against the Chicago White Sox (1-2) and New York Mets (0-2). Today, the Cardinals host the New York Mets for the third and final game after dropping the first two games of the series. St. Louis is 1-4 on this homestand, winning the first game, 3-0, against the White Sox and dropping the last four games, tying their longest losing streak of the season. The Cardinals haven't lost five straight games since June 10-14, 2023, six games that culminated with a loss at Citi Field against the Mets. Following today's game, the Cardinals fly to Milwaukee where they will begin a seven-game road trip against the Brewers (May 9-12) and finish with the Los Angeles Angels (May 13-15) in Anaheim.

**FLIGHT PATTERN:** St. Louis opens today in 5th place in the National League Central, 6.5 games out of the division lead held by Milwaukee (21-14) and Chicago (22-15). St. Louis is home for 15 games in a 22-game stretch from May 3-26.

**GAME TIMES CHANGED:** Major League Baseball announced their new network partnership replacing last year's Peacock Network games. This year's schedule will affect two of the upcoming games for the St. Louis Cardinals. The final home game of the Red Sox series on Sunday, May 19, and the final game of the Cubs series at Wrigley Field on Sunday May 16, will both be switched to a 12:05 p.m. Central Time first pitch.

**CONTRERAS TO I.L.; PAGÉS RECALLED:** Cardinals catcher **Willson Contreras** was placed on the 10-day Injured List with a left arm fracture after getting hit on a swing by Mets' designated hitter **J.D. Martinez** in last night's game. Contreras was called for catcher's interference. Catcher **Pedro Pagés** was recalled from Memphis (AAA) and added to the roster prior to today's game. This is Pagés third recall this season and has appeared in five Major League games with two at-bats and one RBI.

**SONNY DAYS:** On the mound for the Cardinals today is ace **Sonny Gray**. Gray enters today's game with a 4-1 record and 0.89 ERA. The four wins lead the Cardinals and rank T-6th among National League pitchers, while his 0.89 ERA would lead all of Major League Baseball, but falls 5.0 innings short of qualifying. Gray's 0.89 ERA is the lowest by any Cardinals pitcher through his first five appearances as a starting pitcher dating back to 1910. The Tennessee-born right-hander has won all four starts in his career against the Mets.

**DAY TRIPPERS:** The Cardinals play their 20th day game of the season today (5-14 record), T-2nd most in MLB and making up 51.3% of their contests. The Mets are playing their 19th day game of the season and have a 9-9 record ... Since Busch Stadium III opened in 2006, the Cardinals are 29-21 (.580) all-time in Wednesday home day games.

**AVOIDING THE SWEEP:** The Cardinals have lost the first two games of a series for only the third time this season, dropping the first two of a four-game series at Los Angeles (March 28-31) to open the season and the first two of the Milwaukee series (April 19-21) at Busch Stadium. The Brewers shutout the Cardinals 2-0 to sweep the home team at Busch Stadium for the 'Birds only sweep of the season. The last time the Mets swept the Cardinals was April 1-4, 2007 at Busch Stadium to open the 2007 season.

**CARP SHARP:** In his first minor league rehabilitation game at Memphis, INF **Matt Carpenter** was 2-for-3 with a home run, walk and two RBI in four plate appearances while playing first base the entire game. Carpenter's home run was a 404-foot blast to centerfield. It also marked the first game Carpenter played against **Jackson Holliday**, the son of his longtime friend in the Cardinals organization **Matt Holliday**. Jackson, the top Orioles prospect, was playing second base for Norfolk.

#### NEW YORK CONNECTIONS

**Steven Matz** was originally selected by the Mets in the 2nd round of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Ward Melville High School in East Setauket, NY and pitched parts of his first six seasons (2015-20) in New York...was born in Stony Brook, NY.

**Tommy Edman** doubled off **Steven Matz** for his first career MLB hit (June 14, 2019 at Citi Field).

**Brendan Donovan** (April 25, 2022 at Busch III), and **Masyn Winn** (Aug. 18, 2023 at Busch III) made MLB debuts against the Mets.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **José Oquendo** played the first two seasons MLB career with the Mets...traded by New York with **Mark Davis** to St. Louis for **John Young** and **Angel Salazar** (April 2, 1985).

**Adam Ottavino** was selected by St. Louis in the 1st round (#30 overall) of the 2006 MLB Draft...pitched parts of six seasons in the Cardinals minor league organization (2006-11)...made his MLB debut with St. Louis in 2010.

**José Quintana** made one postseason and 12 regular season starts for the Cardinals in 2022...acquired at the 2022 MLB Trade Deadline with **Chris Statton** from Pittsburgh in exchange for **Johan Oviedo** and **Malcom Nuñez**.

**Matt Carpenter's** younger brother, Tyler, played two seasons in the Mets organization (2011-12).

**Harrison Bader** was selected by the Cardinals in the 3rd round of the 2015 MLB Draft...played parts of six seasons in St. Louis (2017-22) where he won the 2021 NL Gold Glove in center field.

Mets Pitching Coach **Jeremy Hefner** pitched his final professional season (2016) in the Cardinals minor league organization.

Hall of Fame Manager **Joe Torre** played for and managed both the Cardinals (1969-74 & 1990-95) and Mets (1975-77 & 1977-81).

Mets Clubhouse Operations Coordinator **Scott Keltner** previously worked in the Cardinals organization in the Busch Stadium (2016-21) and AutoZone Park (2014-15) visiting clubhouses.

Cardinals Hall of Famer & Mets broadcaster **Keith Hernandez** was selected by the Cardinals in the 42nd round of the 1971 MLB Draft...played 10 seasons in St. Louis (1974-83)...won the 1979 NL MVP Award...named to two National League All-Star teams and won six Gold Gloves.

Mets VP of Amateur Scouting **Kris Gross** was a Cardinals amateur scout for three seasons (2010-12).

Cardinals broadcaster **Ricky Horton** was born in nearby Poughkeepsie, N.Y....graduated from F.D. Roosevelt High School in Hyde Park.

Cardinals reporter **Jim Hayes** was born in New York City and raised in nearby Nyack, NY...graduated from SUNY-Geneseo.

**Taylor Megill's** older brother, **Trevor Megill**, was originally selected by St. Louis in the 3rd round of the 2014 MLB Draft, but did not sign, returning to Loyola Marymount (Calif.) University.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Jason Isringhausen** was selected by the Mets in the 44th round of the 1991 MLB Draft...pitched parts of four seasons in New York (1995-97, 1999, 2011).

Cardinals reporter **Mark Sweeney** was traded to the Mets with **Jeromy Burnitz**, **Lou Collier**, **Jeff D'Amico**, and cash (January 21, 2002)...attended Spring Training with New York before released (March 13, 2002).

Cardinals AGM/Player Dev. **Gary LaRocque** previously served as Scouting Dir., AGM & VP/ Player Dev. and Scouting with the Mets from (1998-2005)...appointed VP of Pro Scouting in 2006.

TODAY'S GAME

NL Rankings: Wins (4, T-6th), Winning Pct. (.800, T-8th).

- Makes his 6th start of the season and 2nd against the Mets this season. Last start vs. NYM was 12 days ago at Citi Field. Earned the win tossing 6.0 innings allowing a season-high four runs (1 ER).
- Has an 0.89 ERA through his first five starts with the Cardinals, lowest by a Cardinals pitcher in his first five starts with the organization since 1910.
- Has yet to allow a run in the first four innings of any start this season.
- Surpassed 1,600 career innings in his last start vs. CWS (5/3), firing 7.0 scoreless innings of three -hit ball in a 3-0 win over the Chicago White Sox, his 7th career win vs. the Pale Hose, the opponent he has his 3rd-most wins against.
- Ranks 18th in the National League with 38 strikeouts despite making his first start on April 9.
- Would lead the National League in ERA (0.98), but is five innings shy of qualifying after his most recent start.
- Opened the season with 17.0 scoreless innings, longest by a Cardinals starting pitcher this season and 4th-longest in MLB.
- The last time a Cardinals pitcher opened the season with 17.0 scoreless innings or more was **Woody Williams** (24.2 IP) in 2003, who set the franchise record in the Divisional Era (1969-present). - *Elias*
- Struck out 12 batters vs. MIL (4/21), his most since a career-high 13 vs. HOU (4/7/23); the 15th double-digit strikeout game of his career.
- Recently became the 13th active pitcher to reach the 100 win milestone (4/15 at OAK), joining teammates **Lance Lynn** (137, 5th) and **Kyle Gibson** (105, 10th).
- Gray is one of three free-agent starters (**Lance Lynn** & **Kyle Gibson**) that the Cardinals signed this past off-season.
- Has joined his fifth Major League team: Athletics (2013-17), Yankees (2017-18), Reds (2019-21), Twins (2022-23) and Cardinals (2024).

- Selected by the Oakland Athletics in the 1st round (18th overall) of the 2011 Major League Draft out of Vanderbilt University.
- His 3.45 career ERA ranks 6th among active pitchers & 1,532 strikeouts rank 15th.
- Has made seven career starts at Busch Stadium, with four of those being Quality Starts. He is 2-3, 2.90 ERA career at Busch (40.1 IP/13 ER). Five of his seven starts at Busch Stadium were with the Cincinnati Reds.

2024

- Has struck out 32 batters over his first four starts for the Cardinals, the first pitcher in franchise history to post 30 or more and the most since **Stu Miller** with 29 in 1952.
- Struck out a season-high 12 batters over 6.2 innings in a 2-0 loss to MIL (4/21). Marked his 15th career double-digit strikeout game and first since a career-high 13 vs. HOU (4/7/23). Surrendered a two-out single to Owen Miller in the 7th as part of three consecutive hits before exiting.
- Made his Cardinals regular season debut on April 9 vs. Philadelphia. Joined **John Smoltz** (Aug. 23, 2009 at San Diego - 5 IP, 3 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 9 K) as the 2nd Cardinal since 1901 (37th MLB pitcher overall) to pitch 5.0+ scoreless innings with 5 hits or fewer, zero walks, and 5+ strikeouts in his first game with the franchise.
