TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue their 6-game homestand today with the last of 3 games against the Kansas City Royals (0-2)...Seattle will also host the Atlanta Braves (3 G, 5/4-5/6) on the homestand...today's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Dave Valle** on the call with **Angie Mentink** serving as field reporter...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners fell to the Royals last night by a 3-2 score in 10 innings...Seattle is 6-3 over its last 9 games and 8-5 over its last 13 games...the Mariners went 5-1 on their last road trip against the Cardinals (3-0) and Twins (2-1)...the M's return to the Midwest on their next road trip with 3 games at the Chicago White Sox (5/8-5/10), followed by 4 games at the Houston Astros (5/11-5/14).

• **Let The Sunshine In** - The Mariners are 9-3 (.750) in 12 day games this year, as opposed to 7-15 (.318) in 22 night games...Seattle ranks 2nd in the Majors in day game record behind Detroit (.786/11-3).

• **Royal Flush** - In 25 career games against the Royals, **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .381 (40x105) with 8 doubles, 5 homers, 26 RBI and a 1.030 OPS...the .381 AVG marks his highest against any opponent.

• **Bub Tube** - Three different active Mariners have homered off Royals starter Kris Bubic in their career: **Mitch Garver** (2 HR), **J.P. Crawford** (1) and **Josh Naylor** (1).

• **The Rock Says** - In his sole start against KC in 2025, **Luis Castillo** tossed 6.0 scoreless innings at Kauffman Stadium on Sept. 18 in a 2-0 Mariners win...Castillo recorded his 10th of 11 wins last year.

ON SUNDAYS, WE WEAR STEELHEADS...the Mariners are 3-0 in their **Steelheads uniforms** coming into play today...in home Sunday games, the Mariners have won 8-0 (3/29 vs. CLE), 6-1 (4/12 vs. HOU) and 5-2 (4/19 vs. TEX)...every Sunday home game, the Mariners honor the 1946 Seattle Negro League team by wearing the Seattle Steelheads uniforms...the Mariners are committing \$500,000 to support local Black-led baseball and softball initiatives...for more information, visit Mariners.com/Steelheads.

J-ROD'S LAST 20...over his last 20 contests (4/11-c), **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .350 (28x80) with 12 runs, 7 doubles, 4 home runs, 14 RBI, 6 walks and is 3-for-3 in stolen base attempts, getting on base at a .402 clip, slugging .588 with a .990 OPS in 87 plate appearances.

14+: MARINERS HAVE 3 OF LAST 4...of the 4 most recent 14+ strikeout performances across the Majors, the Mariners have 3 of them: **George Kirby** twice last season (June 8 at LAA, Sept. 14 vs. LAA) and **Emerson Hancock** last night...the fourth is Braves starter Grant Holmes, set to start Wednesday in Seattle.

RANDY JOHNSON'S NUMBER 51 RETIRED...**Randy Johnson's** #51 was retired last night, joining fellow Hall of Famers **Ken Griffey Jr. (#24)**, **Edgar Martinez (#11)**, **Ichiro Suzuki (#51)** and **Jackie Robinson (#42)** as the only numbers retired by the Mariners...Johnson became be the 14th player in MLB history to have his number retired by multiple teams, as his and Ichiro's #51 became the 8th number to be retired by the same team for multiple players (in addition to #42 which is retired across Major League Baseball)...Randy was inducted into the Mariners Hall of Fame in 2012 and the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 2015...the Arizona Diamondbacks retired his #51 in 2015.

• **Johnson Statue Coming In 2027** - Mariners Chairman & Managing Partner **John Stanton** announced yesterday that **Randy Johnson** will be honored with a statue at T-Mobile Park in 2027...Johnson will join **Dave Niehaus** (2011), **Ken Griffey Jr.** (2017), **Edgar Martinez** (2021), and **Ichiro Suzuki** (2026), as well as **Mike Cameron** and **Mark McLemore** raising the American flag in 2001 statue, set for later this year, as Mariners legends to be immortalized with a statue at T-Mobile Park.

YESTERDAY'S ROSTER MOVES...the Mariners selected right-hander pitcher **Nick Davila** (DAH-vee-lah) from Double-A Arkansas, optioning left-handed pitcher **Josh Simpson** back to Triple-A Tacoma, a day after recalling him...the Mariners also recalled catcher **Jhonny Pereda** (pah-RAY-duh) and placed infielder **Will Wilson** on the 10-day Injured List (fractured left thumb, retroactive to April 30)...Davila will make his Major League debut when he first appears in a game, while Pereda will make his Mariners debut when he first appears in a game.

HE'S GOT THE COLE WORLD...over his last 15 games (4/16-c), **Cole Young** is batting .327 (18x55) with 8 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run, 10 RBI, 3 walks and 2 stolen bases...the 22-year-old ranks T-8th among all position players with 1.8 Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball-Reference*) this season, along with Mike Trout-LAA and 4 other players...Young also leads second basemen and ranks 2nd in MLB with 9 defensive runs saved.

KEEP YOUR FRIENDS CLOSE...the Mariners have played an MLB-leading 13 one-run games this season, going 5-8 (.385) in those contests...Seattle leads MLB in one-run games (280) since 2021, and one-run games (502) since 2016...since 2021, Seattle's 155-125 (.554) record in one-run games ranks 2nd-best in the big leagues behind Milwaukee (.567/136-104).

HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...today the Mariners wrap up their '80s Weekend with '80s Pin Day...fans can also enjoy **Mariners Value Games** during each game of the Braves series (5/4-5/6)...visit Mariners.com/Tickets for more information.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Emerson Hancock** dazzled in his start last night, registering a career-high 14 strikeouts across 7.0 innings of one-run ball...the 14 strikeouts are the **most by any pitcher in the Majors** this season, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Hancock became just the fourth pitcher in Mariners history to record a 14+ strikeout, zero walk game?...the righty joined Mark Langston (1988), Hall of Famer **Randy Johnson** (2x, 1993, '97), and **George Kirby** (2x, both in 2025)...last night, the Mariners retired Johnson's #51 and also announced that they would be erecting a statue in "The Big Unit"'s honor in 2027.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - MAY 3

- **1998** - Current Mariners manager **Dan Wilson** hits an inside-the-park grand slam in a 10-6 win vs. Detroit.
- **2018** - **James Paxton** pitched the 5th individual no-hitter in Mariners history at the Toronto Blue Jays. He became the first Canadian MLB pitcher to throw a no-hitter on Canadian soil and just the second Canadian pitcher to ever throw a no-hitter. Paxton was the first American League pitcher to record a 16-strikeout game and a no-hitter in the same season since Nolan Ryan (TEX) accomplished this feat in the same game on 5/1/91 vs. TOR. It marked the Mariners fourth no-hitter since 2012, tied with San Francisco for most during that span.
- **2022** - **George Kirby** makes his MLB debut, tossing 6.0 scoreless innings with 7 strikeouts against the Tampa Bay Rays. He became the first Mariners player to toss 6.0+ scoreless innings in an MLB debut. The Mariners would go on to win the game in 10 innings on a **Ty France** walk-off single.

ABOUT CASTILLO...

- The 33-year-old right-hander is set to make his 7th start of the year and his 250th career start...it will also be his 1st start of the season against the Royals and the 9th of his career.
• Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on Dec. 23, 2011.
• Made MLB debut on June 23, 2017 vs. Washington (w/ CIN).
• Signed a 5-year contract extension with the Seattle Mariners on Sept. 24, 2022 after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati on July 30, 2022.
• Named an All-Star in 2019 (CIN), 2022 (CIN) and 2023 (SEA).

LAST TIME OUT...L#2 on April 27 at Minnesota, tossing 5.0 innings and allowing 7 runs (7 ER) on 7 hits (2 HR) with 2 walks to 3 strikeouts...he threw 97 pitches (62 strikes) in his 6th start of the season.

"I've been in this game a long time and you know some things like this happen... You go through some bad stretches. All I have to do is continue to throw the ball the way I've been throwing - attacking the zone. I know that the results are going to come." -- Luis Castillo through interpreter Freddy Llanos postgame on April 27

SEASONED VET...will make his 250th career start today vs. Kansas City...will become 1 of 5 active pitchers with 250+ starts since 2017, joining Patrick Corbin-4Tms (269 GS), José Berríos-MIN/TOR (259 GS), Aaron Nola-PHI (258 GS), and Kevin Gausman-5Tms (256 GS)...becomes the 19th active player with 250+ game starts.

HOME SWEET HOME...is making his 4th home start of the season...across 59 starts at home as a Mariners starter, he is 22-14 with a 2.92 ERA (113 ER, 348.1 IP) and has thrown 6.0+ IP in 40 of those starts with the Mariners going 30-10 when he tosses 6.0+ innings at home.

HOW HE FARES...among Mariners pitchers with 50+ home starts, he leads in ERA (2.92) and ranks 2nd in WHIP (1.016) behind rotation-mate Logan Gilbert (0.998), 2nd in SO/9 (10.15), 2nd in opponents' batting average (.208) and is tied with Hisashi Iwakuma for 8th-most strikeouts (393).

VS. KANSAS CITY...making his 9th career start against the Royals, 6th with the Mariners and just his 2nd start facing Kansas City at T-Mobile Park...the last time he faced them here at home (8/27/23), he threw 7.0 shutout innings while allowing just 1 hit to his 6 strikeouts, marking just the 2nd time in his career he has thrown 7.0+ with 0 ER and 1 hit allowed (also: 7/4/19vs. MIL w/ CIN)...in his last start vs. Kansas City at Kauffman Stadium (9/18/25), he spun 6.0 scoreless frames, allowing just 3 hits and earning the win.

DOMINATING THE DAY...is making his 2nd day start of the season (last: 4/5 at LAA)...is 11-5 with a 2.57 ERA (38 ER, 133.1 IP), 15 quality starts and 155 strikeouts to 32 walks allowed across 23 day starts home with the Mariners...the Mariners are 13-10 during Castillo's day starts at T-Mobile Park and 12-4 when he goes 6.0+ innings...also owns a 3.17 ERA (25 ER, 71.0 IP) with 62 strikeouts and 17 walks across 13 day starts since 2025.

MAY FLOWERS...across 15 starts in May as a Mariner (since 2023), he is 4-5 with a 3.25 ERA (32, 88.2 IP), 86 strikeouts to 25 walks allowed for a 3.44 strikeout-to-walk ratio and a 8.73 SO/9...has tossed 6.0+ in 11 of those 15 starts in May, including 10 quality starts.

GOING THE DISTANCE...has tossed 6.0+ innings in 149 career starts, the 6th most in MLB since 2017...has tossed a quality start in 136 of those starts, the 5th-most games since 2017 and has thrown 6.0+ scoreless innings in 40 career starts, 2nd-most since 2017, trailing only Zack Wheeler (42 G).

IN COMMAND...has tossed 6.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer walks in 54 career games since 2023 (last: 3/30 vs. NYY), 5th-most in MLB across that span, trailing only Logan Webb (71 G), teammate George Kirby (60 G), Zack Wheeler (60 G) and Tarik Skubal (57 G).

STEERING THE SHIP...across 112 career starts in a Mariners uniform, he has gone 5.0+ innings in 102 of those starts, 6.0+ innings in 68 starts, and 7.0+ innings in 22 starts...in his start on Aug. 26, 2025 vs. San Diego, recorded his 600th strikeout with Seattle, becoming the 13th pitcher in franchise history with 600+ strikeouts.

WHO HOLDS THE TRIDENT...his 3.53 ERA with Seattle is the 6th-lowest ERA in franchise history (min. 500.0 IP), behind Félix Hernández, Randy Johnson, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton (all 3.42 ERA), and George Kirby (3.55) while ranking ahead of Logan Gilbert (3.60)...his 659 strikeouts with the Mariners are 10th-most in franchise history (next: Hisashi Iwakuma, 714 SO)...his 1.169 WHIP and 9.2 strikeouts-per-nine innings each rank 4th-best among Mariners with 500.0+ innings pitched.

WHIFF LEADER...leads MLB since 2017 with 3,454 swings and misses across his career, ranking ahead of Kevin Gausman (3,438) and Max Scherzer (3,308)...his 1,268 career swinging strikeouts are 3rd-most in MLB since 2017, trailing Max Scherzer (1,320), Kevin Gausman (1,306), and ranking ahead of Gerrit Cole (1,267).

LA PIEDRA...among qualified pitchers since 2017 (his debut season), he is 5th in quality starts (136), 5th in games started (249), 6th in innings pitched (1439.0), 7th in total strikeouts (1519) and 12th in wins (84).

ALL-DECADE ACCOLADES...is one of 5 pitchers in the last 10 seasons (2017-c) to have at least 1,500 strikeouts and a WHIP below 1.20, joining Gerrit Cole, Aaron Nola, Max Scherzer, and Zack Wheeler.
