METSCELLANEOUS: Yesterday, the Mets defeated the Diamondbacks, 8-5, to begin their final road trip before the All-Star Break...New York is 9-18 over its last 27 games...The team continues their three-game tonight vs. Arizona and will conclude the first half with a three-game series in San Diego from July 7 - July 9.

BACK IN THE WIN COLUMN: New York has won three straight games for the first time since their three-game sweep of the Phillies from May 30-June 1...The last time the Mets won four straight games was when they won a season-high-tying five straight games from May 17-May 21.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Mets are fresh off taking a three-game set from the Giants, their first series win since their three-game sweep of the Phillies from May 30 - June 1...With a win today or tomorrow, New York would capture consecutive series since taking two out three from the Rays (May 16-18) and sweeping the Guardians (May 19-21).

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga has recorded 101 strikeouts through his first 15 career major league games, that is the fourth-most by a Mets pitcher in franchise history...Only Dwight Gooden (113), Nolan Ryan (109) and Matt Harvey (109) recorded more in their first 15 career starts...His 101 strikeouts are the fifth-most by a Japanese born pitcher through 15 career games...He trails only Hideo Nomo (138), Masahiro Tanaka (119), Yu Darvish (106) and Daisuke Matsuzaka (102).

KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST: Senga has won six games during his rookie campaign, tied for the most by a Mets rookie in the last six years (David Peterson won six games in 2020)...With a win today, Senga would tie Steven Matz for the most first-half wins by a Mets rookie since 2012...The last Mets rookie hurler to win more games was Robert Gsellman (eight wins in 2017)...Senga's six wins are tied for the major league rookie lead and lead the National League outright...Senga's 101 strikeouts are the most by an NL rookie and second-most by any rookie, trailing Houston's Hunter Brown's 103 punchouts...Among rookies with 50.0 or more innings pitched, Senga is second in the majors and first in the NL with a 11.13 SO/9 rate and opponent's average (.209).

SNAKE CHARMER: Francisco Lindor has reached base safely in all 16 of his games played vs. Arizona in his career, hitting safely in 15 of the 16 contests...All told, he has posted a .359/.419/.656 slashline with 12 RBI and 15 runs scored against the Diamondbacks.

CHASE IS OASIS: Starling Marte has hit safely in 38 of 42 career games against the Diamondbacks and has posted a .341/.381/.604 slashline with eight home runs, 18 doubles, three triples and 33 RBI vs. Arizona...In 37 career games at Chase Field, including 18 games played at the venue as a member of the Diamondbacks in 2020, Marte owns a .366 (53-145) average, the third-best mark in the ballpark's history (min. 100 at-bats).

CATCH US IF YOU CAN: New York recorded a season-high-tying four stolen bases yesterday, bringing their season tally to 67 steals in 74 attempts...The team's 90.5 percent success rate is the best in the majors...The Mets had a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught from May 14-June 29...Overall, New York has been successful in 41 of their last 42 stolen base attempts...Starling Marte has swiped 22 bags this year, tied for sixth in the majors and third in the National League...His 336 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 341 steals.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo is tied for fourth in the majors with nine home runs since June 8...Nimmo now has 13 home runs, tied for his most before the All-Star break in his career (also, 2018)...Seven of his 13 homers have tied the game or given New York the lead...He has a .977 OPS over his last 23 games with three doubles, nine homers, 20 RBI and 14 runs...He is tied for third in the majors and shares the NL lead with nine game-winning RBI this season and tied for third in the NL and tied for sixth in the majors with 16 go-ahead RBI.

THE PHAM-NOMENON: Tommy Pham is batting .359 (37-103) since May 28 with a 1.072 OPS...He ranks third in the majors in OPS and fourth in batting average during that span...Has 11 multi-hit efforts and 24 RBI during that timeframe.

WHEN YOU'RE IN SCORING POSITION, YOU'RE PHAMILY: Pham leads the Mets with a .341 (14-41) average with runners in scoring position...Since May 18, has 12 hits in 25 at-bats with RISP...He leads the NL in SLG (.960) and OPS (1.523) with RISP over that timeframe.

D-BACKS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 14-3 over their last 17 games against the Diamondbacks...That span includes an eight-game winning streak from September 9, 2019-May 31, 2021...New York has won the season series against Arizona each season since 2018.

ATTABOY ALVAREZ: Yesterday, Francisco Alvarez hit his 14th homer of the season, breaking Travis d'Arnaud's franchise record for home runs by a rookie catcher set in 2014...Alvarez's go-ahead, 467-foot, two-run blast in the seventh...The tape-measure shot was the longest by a Met this season and the 13th-longest in the majors this season per Statcast...Among NL rookies, Alvarez is tied for second in home runs and ranks fifth in SLG with a .471 clip...Alvarez's 14 home runs are the fourth-most in a season by a catcher in his age-21 season or younger behind Johnny Bench (26, age 21, 1969), Darrell Porter (16, age 21, 1973) and Johnny Bench (15, age 20, 1968)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

HOME RUN HAPPY: This season, the Mets have hit 108 home runs through their first 85 games, the seventh-most in franchise history during that span...Last season, the Mets had 85 home runs through their first 85 games...The Mets have homered three or more times in a game 14 times this season, surpassing their total of 12 from 2022.

LINDOR CITY OVER HERE: Over his last 16 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .288 (15-52) with 13 runs, three doubles, five home runs, 12 RBI, 10 walks and five steals with a 1.044 OPS...Over the last 26 games, Lindor has posted a .952 OPS with 18 runs, five doubles, seven home runs, 16 RBI, 16 walks, seven steals, a .379 OBP and a .573 SLG...He has posted a 2.7 fWAR this year, which ranks 14th in the National League...His 37 extra-base hits are 13th-most in the National League.

FIRST IS THE BEST: The Mets are 24-11 (.686) when scoring first this season...The Mets are 15-35 (.300) when their opponent scores first.

FIRST IS THE WORST: The Mets have been outscored 60-23 in the first inning this year...New York has posted a 5.82 ERA (55 ER/85.0 IP) in the first inning this season...That is the sixth-highest first inning ERA in the majors...Last year, the Mets posted a 4.39 ERA (79 ER/162.0 IP) in the first frame.

DR. ROBERTSON: David Robertson recorded his 12th save yesterday...The veteran right-hander has posted a 2-2 record with 12 saves and a 1.93 ERA (8 ER/37.1 IP) in 34 appearances this season...He has walked 11, while striking out 44...He ranks eighth in ERA among NL relievers...He is tied for 19th in the NL with 44 punchouts...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .194 (13-72) average this year.

SEE YA IN SEATTLE: On Sunday, Major League Baseball announced that Pete Alonso was selected to the National League All-Star team...He will join the NL All-Star squad as they square off against the AL All-Stars on July 11 at T-Mobile Park in Seattle...This is Alonso's third career All-Star nod, tied with Keith Hernandez for the most by a Mets first baseman...Alonso is the 13th Met in club history to make at least three All-Star rosters.

MOONBLASTS BY THE SPACE NEEDLE: Alonso also announced Sunday night that he will participate in the 2023 Home Run Derby...A two-time Derby winner, Alonso will attempt to become the second player to win the event three times (also, Ken Griffey Jr.)...He will be the 10th player to compete in the HR Derby at least four times, joining Griffey Jr. (eight), Mark McGwire (seven), Barry Bonds (six), Sammy Sosa (six), Albert Pujols (five), Lance Berkman (four), Robinson Canó (four) and David Ortiz (four).

WHAT A PERFORMANCE!: Congrats to Head Performance Coach Dustin Clarke who will manage the NL's strength and conditioning at the 2023 All-Star Game in Seattle, WA...Clarke is in his ninth season as the head performance coach and his 13th season in the organization.

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT: RHP Mike Vasil was named to the National League 2023 SiriusXM Futures Game roster...The 23-year-old has made 12 starts between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse where he has combined to go 1-3 with a 4.37 ERA (28 ER/57.2 IP) with 13 walks and 66 strikeouts...He was selected by the Mets in the eighth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Virginia.

SENGA NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Tossed 5.0 innings and allowed two runs on five hits, two walks and eight strikeouts against the Brewers on June 28...Became the 20th Mets rookie pitcher to reach the 100-strikeout mark in a season and the first since Steven Matz in 2016.

SENGA GENESIS: Has recorded 101 strikeouts through his first 15 career major league games, that is the fourth-most by a Mets pitcher in franchise history...Only Dwight Gooden (113), Nolan Ryan (109) and Matt Harvey (109) recorded more in their first 15 career starts...His 101 strikeouts are the fifth-most by a Japanese born pitcher through 15 career games...He trails only Hideo Nomo (138), Masahiro Tanaka (119), Yu Darvish (106) and Daisuke Matsuzaka (102).

PUTTING THE K IN FORK: Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 55 of his 101 strikeouts through 15 starts...The pitch has a 58.8 percent whiff rate and a 27.2 percent putaway rate...Opponents have managed just 10 hits in 80 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .125 batting average.

SHUT 'EM OUT: On May 30 against the Phillies, Senga became the 10th rookie in franchise history to throw 7.0 or more innings, while one hit or less and was the first Met since Steven Matz did so on August 14, 2016...Joins Jonathon Niese, who tossed a complete game shutout on June 10, 2010, as the only Mets rookie to accomplish the feat without allowing a walk.

ALL I DO IS WIN: Senga became the only Japanese-born pitchers to start their career 3-0 and is the fourth player in franchise history to earn the win in their first two career major league starts, joining Steven Matz, Mike Pelfrey and Gary Gentry...Additionally, he joins Kazuhisa Ishii, Hideki Irabu and Koji Uehara as the only Japanese-born pitchers to win each of their first two career major league starts...Senga fell just shy of becoming the second Mets starting pitcher ever to begin his career 4-0, a record held by Steven Matz.

MLB DEBUT NOTES: Senga became the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts in his major league debut...His eight strikeouts were tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born pitcher in their major league debut and tied for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in their major league debut.

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Prior to joining the Mets, Senga spent 11 seasons in Japan's NPB with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...During his NPB career he posted a 87-44 record with a 2.59 ERA (313 ER/1,089.0 IP) and 1,252 strikeouts (10.3 K/9.0)...He was also a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019 and 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019 and 2020).

2022: Last season, Senga went 11-6 with a 1.94 ERA (31 ER/144.0 IP), 156 strikeouts, a 1.06 WHIP and a 0.4 HR/9 rate over 22 appearances.

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION: Senga appeared in four games in the 2017 World Baseball Classic for Team Japan...He posted a 0.82 ERA, throwing 11.0 innings and allowing one run on seven hits with 16 strikeouts and one walk...He also pitched in two games during the Tokyo Summer Olympics, throwing a total of 3.0 scoreless innings as Japan won the gold medal on its home turf.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO (2-3, 5.94)

LAST TIME OUT: Recorded a season-high six strikeouts in the Mets 5-4 loss against the Giants...Threw 5.0 innings and allowed two runs on five hits, with three walks and six strikeouts...Made his first time recording more than five strikeouts since September 15, 2022.

COOKIE'S COMEBACK: In his starts on May 25 and May 31 against Chicago-NL and Philadelphia, respectively, Carrasco allowed just two runs over 12.2 innings compared to 18 runs allowed across the 18.2 innings he threw in his first four starts of the season...In those 12.2 innings, Carrasco fanned eight batters, which equals the total strikeouts he tallied in his first three starts of the year.
