Hall of Fame

The Braves today congratulate manager Brian Snitker on his induction into the Appalachian League Hall of Fame. Snitker and Dale Alexander comprise the 2024 induction class.

Snitker had stints in the Appy League as both a player and manager, including making his professional debut with the Kingsport Braves in 1977. He batted .270 over 55 games that season, slugging eight home runs.

He managed in the league for a single season, skipping the 1996 Danville Braves to a 37-29 record and a second-place finish in the division.

The modern Appalachian League began in 1957, its first year as a short-season league for Minor League Baseball, and underwent a new transformation in 2021 as it became a summer collegiate baseball league in partnership with MLB and USA Baseball.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Mets tonight open a four-game weekend series with what is the seventh of 13 total games between the teams this season...The two meet for the final time for a three-game set at Truist Park in Atlanta, September 24-26, in the Braves final homestand of the season.

A The Braves and Mets have split six total games this season, three wins apiece...New York was the first team to take a series from Atlanta this year, winning two-of-three games at Truist Park, April 8-11.

A Atlanta went 10-3 in 13 games with New York last season, a .769 winning percentage...Since the Mets were founded in 1962, the best single-season winning percentage the Braves have logged against New York is .778, going 14-4 in 18 games with the Mets in both 1964 and 1966.

A The Braves have won 19 of the last 26 games with New York dating to the 2022 season, outscoring the Mets 166-109 (+57) over the stretch.

A The Braves have taken the season series from their NL East rivals for six consecutive seasons...Prior to last year's 10-3 mark, they went 10-9 in both 2022 & 2021, 7-3 in 2020, 11-8 in 2019 and 13-6 in 2018...Since the start of the 2018 season, Atlanta is 64-41 (.610) against New York overall.

A The Braves won the first series between the clubs at Citi Field this season, two-games-to-one... Atlanta went 5-2 against New York here last season, including a 21-3 victory in the first game of a doubleheader here, August 12.

A RH Luis Severino has three starts in his career against Atlanta, including one earlier this season, and is 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA (5 ER/15.0 IP) all-time versus the Braves...The 6-foot-2, 218-pound right-hander faced the Braves here at Citi Field on May 12, and allowed four hits and two runs over 5.0 innings in a no-decision...The Mets went on to win, 4-3...Severino has allowed just two total runs in 12.1 innings over his last two starts, winning both.

LOSS: Atlanta allowed four first-inning runs yesterday afternoon to Cincinnati and trailed the entire game, losing 9-4...The Braves and Reds were set to play a doubleheader before Game 2 was rained out and rescheduled for September 9th.

A The game yesterday afternoon marked Atlanta's 100th of the season, and this season marks the third straight year in which the Braves have won at least 54 of their first 100 games...Atlanta last failed to win as many games in 2021, when the club was 49-51 through 100 games...The Braves would go on to win the 2021 World Series.

A Atlanta has lost four consecutive games, dating to the second game of Sunday's doubleheader vs. St. Louis...It is the club's third losing streak of at least four games this season, with its longest drought being five games, spanning June 7-12 at Washington (3) and Baltimore (2).

CHRIS SALE: The left-hander tonight makes the fourth start of his career against the Mets, and his first at Citi Field...Sale has never lost to New York, going 1-0 with a 2.81 ERA (5 ER/16.0 IP) over his three starts, while his team is a perfect 3-0.

A Citi Field is one of just two active parks in baseball in which Sale has never pitched, along with Great American Ball Park in Cincinnati...The Braves travel to play the Reds in September.

A Sale tonight makes his first start after the All-Star Game, after going 13-3 with a 2.70 ERA (33 ER/110.0 IP) in 18 games before the break...Since the induction of the All-Star Game in 1933, just five other Braves pitchers won at least 13 games before the break, with John Smoltz in 1996 (14 wins) the last to do so.

A His 13 wins lead the majors, and he ranks sixth with a 2.70 ERA and 140 strikeouts...Sale ranks in the 90th percentile or better among all pitchers in hard-hit percentage (90th, 31.9%), expected ERA (93rd, 2.69), strikeout percentage (94th, 32.4%) and average exit velocity (96th, 85.9 mph).

A He has allowed no more than two runs in each of his last seven starts dating to June 7...Sale has pitched to a 5-2 record with a 2.13 ERA (10 ER/42.1 IP) in that span, with his two losses coming in 1-0 and 2-1 defeats.

WELCOME BACK: The Braves today reinstated 3B Austin Riley from the paternity list and designated INF Zach Short for assignment...Riley returns to the club after he and his wife Anna welcomed their second child, William "Beau" Riley, on Tuesday morning.

A Riley has batted .255/.325/.451 over 86 games on the season, including a .316/.388/.667 line over his last 33 games dating to June 14.

A Over 17 games in the month of July he has 11 extra-base hits, including four homers, and has slugged .581...Riley is a career .292/.350/.620 batter in the month of July, and his 36 homers are his most in a calendar month in his career.

A Dating to the 2021 season, Riley's 18.5 fWAR are most by a third baseman in the National League, and trail just José Ramírez (20.5) at the position in the majors.

MATT OLSON: Went 2-for-5 with a pair of singles yesterday afternoon, his first multi-hit game of the month and his first since going 2-for-4 on June 18...He entered play just 8-for-69 (.116/.205/.188) in 19 games between multi-hit efforts.

A Olson's two hits had exit velocities of 109.6 and 105.1 miles per hour, and he had two outs at 99.1 and 98.1...He ranks in the 89th percentile in baseball with an average exit velocity of 92.1 mph.

A Olson has 126 batted balls this season over 95 miles per hour, and is batting .440 on such hits...For reference, the major league average on such balls in play is .487.

Today's Game

- A* Set to make his first start of the second half and fourth of his career against New York (NL).
- A* Will be his first start against the Mets since 2021 with Boston.
- A* Named an All-Star for the eighth time in his career and first for the National League.
- A* His 13 wins are the most by an Atlanta pitcher prior to the break since Hall-of-Famer John Smoltz also won 13 in 1996, on his way to the Cy Young Award..
- A* Became the seventh pitcher in franchise history to record 13 wins before the ASG.
- A* Snapped a six-game streak with at least seven strikeouts and two or fewer runs allowed.
- A* His separate six and five-game streaks were the longest and second longest in Braves franchise history (dating to 1901).
- A* For the second time this season, Sale recorded a five-game streak with at least seven strikeouts and two or fewer runs allowed.
- A* Became the first Braves player in the modern era to have even one such streak of at least five games...Research courtesy of StatsPerform.
- A* Has struck out at least 10 hitters in a game 84 times...Is tied with Hall-of-Famer Steve Carlton and ranks eighth on the all-time leaderboard for 10+ strikeout games.
- A* His nine games with at least 7.0 innings pitched are the second most in the majors.
- A* His 13 wins are the most in the majors...among qualified starters, Sale ranks first in FIP (MLB - 2.33), second in WHIP (NL - 0.95), third in BB/9 (NL - 1.96) and in strikeouts (NL - 140) and second in ERA (NL - 2.70).
- A* His eight wins at home are the most in baseball.
- A* Through 18 starts this season, Sale has only issued two free passes or more in six of his starts.
- A* Hitters are chasing 34.2% of his pitches out of the strike zone this season; it's the third highest rate in the majors among qualified starters.
- A* Recording strikes on 68.3% of pitches thrown this year; it is the second highest rate in the National League among qualifiers.
- A* Sporting an 11.08 strikeout per nine innings rate through his career; the highest rate among active pitchers (min. 1,500 IP).
- A* Opposing hitters are averaging 85.0 mph on balls in play against Sale; tied for the lowest mark in the majors among qualified starters with teammate Max Fried.

2024 Recap

- A* Struck out Martín Maldonado to reach 2,300 on his career on June 27.
- A* Sale's eight wins in the span of 10 games to start the season are the most by a Braves pitcher since Hall-of-Famer John Smoltz won nine of his fist 10 in 1996...Smoltz won the Cy Young Award the same year.
- A* Snapped his streak of consecutive games with nine strikeouts at four games on June 1...The streak was tied for the longest on the season with Tyler Glasnow at the time.
- A* LH Chris Sale was named as the National League Pitcher of the Month for May... He went a perfect 5-0 with a 0.56 ERA (2 ER/32.0 IP) across five starts, walking just two and fanning 45.
- A* The award was Sale's fifth career Pitcher of the Month honor, and his first since winning back-to-back awards in June and July of 2018 while with Boston.
- A* His 0.56 ERA is the lowest in baseball during the month of May since Tommy Greene pitched to a 0.29 ERA in six starts with Philadelphia in 1991...Greene struck out 30 in 31.0 frames while Sale fanned 45 hitters in 32.0 innings pitched.
- A* Sale's ERA is the lowest in a calendar month by an Atlanta starter with at least five outings since Kris Medlen pitched to a 0.50 ERA in August, 2012.
- A* Per Baseball Reference...since 1910, it's the lowest ERA by a Braves starter in a calendar month who had at least 45 strikeouts and 30.0 innings pitched.
- A* Sale is one of 18 pitchers in history with at least five monthly awards and the eighth left-hander of the group... He is the first Brave to win the award since teammate Max Fried did so in September 2021.
- A* The 35-year-old led the majors in ERA in May, ranked second among NL pitchers in strikeouts and WHIP, and tied for seventh in opponents' average.
- A* Between April 19 and May 26, Sale had won each of his seven outings going a perfect 7-0 with a 1.17 ERA (6 ER/46.0 IP) with 58 strikeouts and just four walks.
- A* His wins in seven consecutive turns was the longest streak by a Braves starter since Russ Ortiz won eight straight outings in 2003...No Atlanta starter has a longer streak of consecutive starts with a win since Ortiz.
- A* Morton and Chris Sale become the first pair of teammates to have each made an Opening Day start and record the last out of a World Series since Hall-of-Famer Dennis Eckersley and Cy Young award-winner Bret Saberhagen with Boston in 1998... Research courtesy of Elias Sports Bureau.
- A* Morton was the Opening Day starter for Tampa Bay in 2020 and induced a groundout from Corey Seager for the final out in Game 7 of the 2017 World Series with Houston.
- A* Sale was the Opening Day starter for the Red Sox (2018-'19) and the White Sox (2013, '14 & '16)...He struck out Manny Machado in Game 5 as the final out of the '18 Fall Classic with Boston.
- A* Pitching to a 4.50 ERA in the first frame while sporting a 2.73 ERA in all other innings.
