TOUCHING ALL THE BASES

D-BACKS LAUNCH INTERACTIVE APP: The D-backs launched a series of interactive games within the MLB Ballpark app that will allow fans to stay connected from home during the 60-game season and beyond...fans can download the Ballpark App for free and after navigating to the D-backs' homepage, click on Interactive Games to earn points during daily competi-tions, with the opportunity to win prizes each day throughout the season.

BEHIND HOME PLATE: Each series, the D-backs will highlight a charitable cause or team initiative with cardboard cut-outs in the Batter's Box:

- ◆ For the first series, members of the “D-backs for Change” council are joined by D-backs legend Luis Gonzalez and former D-backs pitcher Edwin Jackson.
- ◆ The group's goal is to help bring meaningful change and equality to our communities and includes the areas of diversity and inclusion.
- ◆ Jackson is a founding member of The Players Alliance, which is working with MLB and the MLB Players Asso-ciation on these issues.

IN LEFT FIELD: At David Peralta's request, a group of teddy bears have been placed in the bleachers to help remind him of his fans and his family.

- ◆ As players are unable to visit Phoenix Children's Hos-pital and Banner Cardon Children's hospital due to the pandemic, smaller versions of these bears will be deliv-ered throughout the season, courtesy of David and the Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation.
- ◆ The bears are wearing jerseys from the D-backs Youth Jersey Program, which outfits 121 Little Leagues and 65,000 players and coaches throughout Arizona.
- ◆ Mixed in with the bears are some favorite Disney char-acters of David's daughters, Sofia and Isabella.
- ◆ Several of the bears will be wearing train conductor hats in honor of David's "Freight Train" nickname.
- ◆ For every Chase Big Fly homer that lands in the Teddy Bear section, the D-backs and Chase will add \$1,000 to the Play Ball Fund, which is devoted to youth sports across Arizona.

HERE'S THE STORY: The D-backs are facing the Dodgers in their home opener for the third time in club history (following a season-opening road trip) [SEE NOTE].

- ◆ Arizona is 6-2 in its last 8 home games vs. Los Angeles.
- ◆ **Starling Marte** has hit safely in his first 5 games with the D-backs.

ROSTER MOVE: Prior to tonight's game, the D-backs selected C/OF **Daulton Varsho** from the Alternate Training Site and optioned INF **Kevin Cron** to the Alternate Training Site.

- ◆ Varsho, who was named the D-backs' 2019 Minor League Player of the Year, is named after the late Darren Daulton, a teammate of his father, Gary, with the Phillies in 1995.

HOME OPENER HIJINKS: The D-backs have won 4 straight home openers and are 5-2 all-time in their first game back @ Chase Field (following a season-opening road trip only).

DO YOU REMEMBER?: The D-backs won their last 5 home games of 2019 and were 17-6 in their final 23 games @ Chase Field.

STRIKEOUT STUFF: From 2016-19, ranked among NL leaders in strikeouts per 9.0 IP (2nd, 11.86) and strikeouts (3rd, 836).

- 2019 REVIEW:** Set career highs in strikeouts (235), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (12.13) and starts (33), going 12-8 with a 4.34 ERA.
- Ranked third in club history with 12.13 strikeouts per 9.0 IP, trailing only Randy Johnson (13,41 in 2001 and 12.56 in 2000).
