METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Braves, 11-6, last night at Citi Field... The Mets have lost 12 of their last 14 games...The Mets are in the midst of a five-game homestand (1-1) against the Braves (1-1) and Mariners for two games...The Mets and Mariners will head to Williamsport, PA on Sunday for the MLB Little League Classic.

EAT THE METS: Today at 6:30 p.m. in the back of the press box, the Mets are treating members of the media to a free sampling of Naz's Halal Food...Naz's Chicken Platter – A flavorful mix of marinated chicken gyro meat, served over fluffy, aromatic basmati rice and paired with a crisp salad of lettuce, tomatoes, and cucumbers... Naz's Lamb Platter – A flavorful mix of marinated lamb gyro meat, served over fluffy, aromatic basmati rice and paired with a crisp salad of lettuce, tomatoes, and cucumbers

LEADING ON: The Mets lost a 6-0 lead in the fourth inning last night...It was tied for their largest lead lost in a game this season (also: 4/27 at WAS) as well as their largest lead lost in a game against the Braves (also: 8/26/70 and 4/7/04)... It marked just the fourth time in franchise history the club has lost a six-run lead at home (also: 8/8/65 vs. CHC, 8/26/70 vs. ATL and 7/30/15 vs. SD)...It is just the second season in franchise history with multiple leads lost of six or more runs (also: 1965)...The Mets have lost leads of four-plus runs in three straight games for the first time in franchise history...Courtesy of SNY.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has reached base safely in all 11 games this month... He is batting .12/.43 (.279) with 10 runs, four homers, seven RBI, seven walks, three steals, a .392 OBP and a .558 SLG...Soto has recorded a Major League-leading 91 walks this year...He is looking to recorded his sixth season with 100+ walks...With 11 more works, he will become the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier... John Olerud recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season.

BRETT THE MET: Brett Baty is batting .271 (16-59) with 12 runs, one double, four homers, eight RBI, six walks, a steal, a .333 OBP and a .492 SLG over his last 19 games...He has recorded multiple hits in back-to-back games...In 54 games at Citi Field this year, he is batting .298/359/556 with four doubles, 11 homers, 28 RBI and three steals.

100 GRAND BAR: Pete Alonso is two RBI away from 100 this season...He is looking to record his fourth season with 100+ RBI...That would place him second in team history...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Alonso ranks third in team history in RBI...Wright is the leader (970), followed by Darryl Strawberry (733)...Alonso's 98 RBI are tied for the most in the majors.

LONG BALLS: Pete Alonso's 254 home runs since he joined the league in 2019 are tied for the second-most in the majors with Kyle Schwarber (254)...They trail only Aaron Judge (270)...Alonso's 682 RBI are the most in the majors since 2019... Since his Major League debut in 2019, his 25 multi-homer games are the third-most in the league, trailing only Aaron Judge (37) and Kyle Schwarber (28).

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Alonso has reached base three or more times in 27 games this season, tied with Kyle Tucker for the third-most such games in the NL and the fifth-most such games in the major...His seven games reaching base four times are tied for the ninth-most in the NL and tied for the 12th-most in the majors...Has reached base four or more times in 39 career games, which is the seventh-most such games in franchise history...With runners in scoring position this season, is batting .333 (40-120) with eight doubles, 13 home runs, 71 RBI, 25 walks and a 1.164 OPS...Since August 1, he has gone 5-10 with a 1.662 OPS and 12 RBI with runners in scoring position.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch where they play 16 of 19 games against the NL East...They are 1-1 in that span...The Mets are 16-12 against the NL East this season.

OUCH: Mets batters have been hit by a pitch 66 times this season which is the third-most in the majors...Alonso's 98 times being hit by a pitch are the most in franchise history.

20/20 VISION: The Mets became the only team in the National League and the third team in the majors to feature four players with 20 or more home runs (Pete Alonso, Francisco Lindor, Nimmo and Juan Soto)...The Yankees and Athletics also have four players with 20+ homers...The Mets have had seven seasons in which at least four players recorded 20+ homers (also: 2024, 2023, 2019, 2016, 2000, 1987)...The team's record is five players with 20+ homers in 2019 (Alonso, Michael Conforto, J.D. Davis, Todd Frazier and Jeff McNeil).

ALVY WAY BACK: Since being recalled from Triple-A Syracuse on July 21, Francisco Alvarez has reached base in 13 of his 15 starts...In 17 games since July 21, has batted .280/390/580 (14-50) with 10 runs, four doubles, one triple, three home runs, eight RBI and nine walks.

TWO AWAY: Edwin Díaz has 248 saves in 503 career games in the major leagues...According to Elias, his 248 saves are the ninth-most saves for any pitcher through his first 500 career games and the most for any active pitcher... The most saves in first 500 career MLB games among active pitchers: Díaz (248), Kenly Jansen (244), Aroldis Chapman (240), Josh Hader (227 in 465 games), Raisel Iglesias (212).

BLADES OF STEAL: The Mets have safely stolen 34 consecutive bases, the longest active streak in the majors...It's the longest single season for the Mets since they recorded 35 straight steals from May 14-June 29, 2023...It is tied with the 2024 Chicago Cubs for the ninth-longest such streak in Major League history... They lead the majors with a 90.3% stolen base rate...This is the highest stolen base rate in franchise history...The previous high was set in 2023 (88.7%)...They have been caught stealing only 10 times this year, which is the fewest in the majors... The club's current streak of 47 straight games without getting caught is Major League history...Juan Soto has stolen a career-high 18 bases this year...Brandon Nimmo has swiped 12 bases...His career-best is 15 which he accomplished in 2024.

LAST TIME OUT: Recorded his fourth loss of the season after allowing three runs (one earned) over 4.1 innings on August 8 at Milwaukee (2 H, 3 BB, 2 K, HR)...Was scoreless through his first 4.0 innings allowing just one hit and one walk...Left-handers went 1-9 against him in his last start...Marked his first loss since May 19 at Boston...Three of his four losses this year have come on the road...Has not pitched into the sixth inning in a career-high six consecutive starts...Has allowed eight home runs over his last nine starts after only allowing one through his first nine starts...Has given up a home run in four straight games for the second time in his career (also: 9/20/23-4/1/24)...Has allowed three walks or more in four straight starts, the second-longest such streak of his career (most: 6 GS from 4/2-5/5/23).

SO FAR SO GOOD: In 18 starts this season, the right-hander has gone 7-4 with a 2.30 ERA (24 ER/94.0 IP)...He has thrown at least 5.0 innings in 13 of those 18 starts and has allowed three runs or fewer in 15 of those starts...Among pitchers who have thrown at least 80.0 innings this season, he ranks third in ERA (second in NL)...With the same qualification, his 6.70 H/9.0 IP ratio ranks fifth, his .205 opponents' BA (70-341) is the seventh best and his 48.4 groundball percentage is the 11th-highest in the National League...Has held right-handers to a .193 average this season (32-166) compared to a .217 average vs. lefties (38-175).

KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST: Senga has picked up 60 of his 88 strikeouts on the ghost fork this season...Has held batters to a .108 average with his ghost fork this season, which is the lowest opponents' batting average among any qualified pitcher throwing a split-finger pitch and the fifth-lowest opponents' BA among any qualified pitcher throwing any pitch...Has a run value of nine with his forkball this season, which is the third-best among all qualified pitchers throwing a split-finger pitch...His 40.9% whiff rate is the second highest, trailing only Fernando Cruz's 60.2% whiff rate with his split-finger ball...In his rookie year (2023), Senga's "ghost fork" accounted for 110 of his 202 strikeouts...The pitch had a 59.5% whiff rate and a 28.2% put away rate...Opponents managed just 18 hits in 163 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .110 batting average.

GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES: Has allowed three earned runs or fewer in 42 of his 48 career starts...Since the mound was moved back in 1968, he is one of six pitchers to record 42 such starts in their first 48 career games, joining only Paul Skenes (43), Gerrit Cole (43), Shane McClellan (43), Lance McCullers Jr. (42) and Jacob deGrom (42)...His 42 such starts are tied with deGrom for the most in franchise history through a starters first 48 career games...He had allowed three earned runs or less in 31 consecutive starts from 6/23/23 to 7/11/25...It was the longest active streak in the majors and tied the second-longest such streak in franchise history...He trailed only Jacob deGrom's 40 starts (from 9/9/19-9/18/22) and deGrom's 31 starts (from 4/16/18-4/3/19).

SENGA GENESIS: Through Senga's first 48 career starts he has posted 299 strikeouts...With 1 K tonight, he would join Dwight Gooden (410), Matt Harvey (343), Noah Syndergaard (337) and Jacob deGrom (319) as the only Mets to reach the 300 strikeout milestone through 49 career games...His 299 strikeouts are also the fifth-most among Japanese-born pitchers through their first 48 starts, trailing only Hideo Nomo (387), Yu Darvish (382), Shohei Ohtani (323) and Masahiro Tanaka (303)...His career 2.74 ERA (81 ER/265.2 IP) is the eighth-best in franchise history through a player's first 48 starts with the club.

VS. ATLANTA/NATIONAL LEAGUE: Will be making his third career start against the Braves tonight...Has gone 2-0 with a 3.97 ERA (5 ER/11.1 IP), three walks and 16 strikeouts in those games...Against NL East opponents this season, Senga is 8-3 with a 2.29 ERA (20 ER/78.2 IP)...The Mets are 10-4 in games this season where Senga has started against a National League team...He has gone 6-3 with a 2.07 ERA (17 ER/74.0 IP) in those games...In his career, he is 19-8 with a 2.47 ERA (56 ER/203.2 IP), 91 walks and 223 strikeouts against NL teams...The Mets have gone 24-12 in those contests.

2024 REWIND: He missed nearly the first four months of the 2024 season with a right shoulder capsule strain...Returned and made one regular season start on July 26 vs. Atlanta, throwing 5.1 innings and allowing two runs on two hits with nine strikeouts and one walk before exiting with an injury...Missed the rest of the regular season with a strained left calf...He made it back for the Postseason and he made his first career Postseason start on October 5 in Game 1 of the NLDS against the Phillies...Threw 2.0 innings allowing one run, a home run in the first inning, and recorded one walk and three strikeouts...Finished the Postseason making three appearances and pitching 5.0 innings while striking out four.

REMARKABLE ROOKIE: During his rookie campaign in 2023, Kodai Senga recorded 202 strikeouts and became the 18th rookie pitcher in the Modern Era (Since 1900) to have 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Senga's 202 punch outs were the second-most by a Mets pitcher behind only Dwight Gooden's 276 strikeouts in 1984...He joined Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsuzaka (201) as the

only Japanese-born rookie hurlers to reach 200 strikeouts...Senga's 12 wins were tied with Ron Darling (1984) for the seventh-most wins in a single season by a Mets rookie and was the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee (13, 2011)...His 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP) was the fifth-lowest in a single season by a Mets rookie behind only Jerry Koosman (2.08, 1968), Jon Matlack (2.32, 1972), Dwight Gooden (2.60, 1984) and Tom Seaver (2.76, 1967)...He finished seventh in NL Cy Young voting.

HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: In 2023 Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver (1967) as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He was the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.
