To clinch a spot in the postseason for the 10th time in team history and the first time since 2023.

RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their six-game homestand against the Padres (3-0) and Mets (1-1, one to play) tonight at Tropicana Field...following tonight's game, will depart for a seven-game, eight-day road trip against the Rangers (4G) and Braves (3G)...beginning tomorrow in Texas, will play 14 of their final 23 games on the road...have won five of six and seven of their last nine games in the wake of a 2-7 stretch (Aug. 14-22)...are an AL-leading 18-9 in their last 27 games (Aug. 3-pres.) and an MLB-best 27-13 in their last 40 (July 20-pres.)...have the AL's hardest remaining schedule with an opp. winning pct. of .519...following this series, five of their seven remaining opponents are currently in position to qualify for the postseason...hold a 4.5-game lead over the second-place Yankees in the AL East standings...have spent 107 days leading the division, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...this includes a season-high 67 consecutive days in first place (June 27-pres.)...are seeking their fifth AL East division title, first since winning the division in back-to-back seasons from 2020-21...have held the AL's best record outright for 106 days, tied with 2023 for the most in franchise history, according to Stats Perform.

- ★ The Rays out-hit the Mets, 13-3, and held them to an 0-for-5 clip with RISP in last night's 6-2 win, evening the current series at 1-1...they improved to 41-1 when out-homering an opponent, including 28 consecutive wins since the lone loss on May 25 at BAL (39-0 in 9th inn. games).
- ★ All three Mets hits came in the opening frame, with Rays pitchers holding their final 31 BF hitless...it was the ninth time in club history the Rays did not permit a hit from the 2nd inning on and second this season, joining July 26 vs. CLE...it was their third time turning the trick after yielding three 1st-inning hits (or more), along with Aug. 26, 2025 at CLE and June 20, 2012 at WSH.
- ★ It was their 53rd time holding an opponent to two runs or fewer, second most in the AL to the Yankees (55)...they are 48-5 in such games (27-1 at home), tallying 19 straight wins (July 8-pres.).
- ★ The bottom third (7-9) of the Rays order went 6-for-10 in the win, their most hits since July 24 vs. CLE (7-for-13)...their 58 RBI since the All-Star break are tied with the Tigers for third most in the AL behind the Red Sox (81) and Orioles (61)...they tallied 100 RBI in the first half, 13th in the AL.
- ★ The club has won 11 of its last 12 games vs. NL foes, (June 21-pres.), MLB's best interleague record over that span...entering that stretch, their 12-17 mark in Interleague play ranked 11th in the AL and 23rd in the majors.
- ★ This marks the second time in three series and third time in five sets the Rays have required a rubber match to determine a series victor...entering this stretch, only three of their previous 19 series had been decided in the final game (June 8-Aug. 17).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays reinstated **RHP Griffin Jax** (right elbow discomfort) from the 15-day IL and optioned **RHP Alex Cook** to Triple-A Durham...tonight marks Jax's first major league start in exactly one month, with his last outing coming on Aug. 2 vs. CWS...prior to the injury, he had recorded a 1.62 ERA (16.2IP, 3ER) with 23 SO, 4 BB, and a 0.96 WHIP across his previous three starts (July 22-Aug. 2), holding opponents to a .197 (12-for-61) clip (0-for-8 with RISP).

WHAT'S AT STAKE—With a win tonight, the Rays would:

- ★ Record three consecutive series wins on the heels of a season-high three straight series losses (Aug. 14-23)...improve to 9-4-0 in their last 13 sets and 13-6-2 in their last 21.
- ★ Improve to 14-4-2 in their last 20 sets at home (April 24-pres.).
- ★ Earn their third straight series victory over the Mets, avoiding their first series loss to New York since May 16-18, 2023 at Citi Field and first at Tropicana Field since June 12-14, 2012...improve to 7-1-0 in their last eight series vs. NYM (2015-pres.) and 9-2-0 in their last 11 (2001-pres.).
- ★ Improve to 8-1 in their last nine meetings with the Mets (May 3, 2024-pres.) and 10-1 in their last 11 matchups with the club at Tropicana Field (Aug. 8, 2015-pres.).
- ★ Paired with Aug. 26 at DET, win back-to-back rubber games for the second time this season, joining a three-game winning streak from May 10-31.

STREAKING INTO SEPTEMBER—Junior Caminero has hit safely in a career-high 15 straight games, the majors' longest active streak and the longest by a Ray since **Chander Simpson's** career-best 18-game run from June 25-July 19, 2025...he is slashing .356/.406/.492 (21-for-59) with 2 2B, 2 HR, 9 RBI, and an .898 OPS during the streak, tying **MIN Luke Keaschall** and **LAA Zach Neto** for the AL's most hits since it began on Aug. 17...he has homered in two of his last four games on the heels of a career-high-tying 15-game drought without a long ball...with 37 HR, Caminero is tied with **HOU Yordan Alvarez** for the most homers in the AL, trailing only **PHI Kyle Schwarber** (40) and **CHC Pete Crow-Armstrong** (38) across all of MLB...the 37 HR marked the third most by a Ray before the end of August, trailing Caminero last season (39) and **Carlos Peña** (38) in 2009...he is 3 HR shy of becoming the first player in franchise history with multiple 40-HR campaigns (45HR in 2025) and needs 9 HR over the Rays final 24 games to tie Peña's franchise record from 2007 (46HR).

THE LEADING CHAN—**Chandler Simpson** (.310) is six points behind **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (.316) for the AL's best batting average...he is attempting to join **Yandy Diaz** (2023) as the only AL batting champions in Rays history...he could also become the sixth player in AL/NL history to win a batting title in one of his first two MLB seasons, including the third since 1942 along with **SEA Ichiro Suzuki** (.350, 1st season) in 2001 and Rays Hall of Famer **BOS Wade Boggs** (.361, 2nd season) in 1983...after posting a .295 (122-for-109) average last season, he is attempting to become the fifth player in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to bat .295 or better in each of his first two MLB seasons (min. 400AB in each season), joining **CHC Starlin Castro** (2010-11), **NY Y Robinson Cano** (2005-06), **STL Albert Pujols** (2001-02), and **Suzuki** (2001-02)...Simpson leads the AL in singles (131) and triples (6)—no Ray has ever paced the AL in the former category over a full season, and only **Carl Crawford** (4x, last: 2010) and **Mallex Smith** (2018) have finished atop the Junior Circuit's leaderboard in the latter...since 1983, only two AL hitters have led the league in both singles and triples: **CLE Amed Rosario** in 2022 and **KC Whit Merrifield** in 2019...Simpson needs 14 singles over the Rays final 24 games to match Crawford's club record from 2003 (145).

- ★ Over his last 61 games (June 19-pres.), Simpson paces the majors in batting average (.366/85-for-232), hits, and stolen bases (24).
- ★ In August, Simpson (41H, 11SB) became the first player in franchise history to lead the majors in both hits and steals during a calendar month, the first major leaguer to turn the trick since **LAD Shohei Ohtani** (42H/16SB) in September 2024 (Elias)...he became the first player with 40 hits or more and 10 stolen bases or more in any month since **PHI Trea Turner** in August 2025 (41H/10SB) and the second AL hitter since 2015, joining **SEA Julio Rodriguez** in August 2023 (45H, 11SB).
- ★ The 41 hits were fourth most by a Rays hitter during August, trailing **Carl Crawford** in 2007 (50) and **Aubrey Huff** in both 2002 (44) and 2003 (42)...it marked the second-most hits by a Ray during any month since 2011, trailing **Corey Dickerson** in May 2017 (44).
- ★ With 38 SB, third most in MLB, Simpson is two steals shy of joining **CAL Chad Curtis** (1992-93), **MON Delino DeShields** (1990-91), **STL Vince Coleman** (1985-86), and **NY Y Bert Daniels** (1910-11) as the only players in the modern era (since 1900) to reach 40 stolen bases in each of their first two major league campaigns.

THE RAY WAY—The Rays clinched a winning season before the end of August for the fourth time (excl. 2020), joining 2023 (82-52), 2021 (84-48), and 2008 (84-51)...this marks the 13th winning season across 29 campaigns in franchise history, all of which have come in the last 19 seasons becoming the Rays in 2008 after the Devil Rays had none across the franchise's first decade of existence (1998-2007)...including results thus far from this season, the 13 winning seasons since 2008 are tied with the Braves and Brewers for fourth most among all major league clubs, trailing the Dodgers (18), Yankees (17), and Cardinals (16)...the Astros, Guardians, and Red Sox (all 11) are the next closest AL teams over that timeframe.

- ★ This marks the fourth time the Rays entered September atop the AL East, joining 2021 (84-48), 2020 (25-11), and 2008 (84-51)...they went on to win the division crown in each of those seasons, including World Series appearances in 2020 and 2008 and a club-record 100 wins in 2021.
- ★ The Rays are approaching their first postseason berth since 2023 and sixth in the last eight seasons since 2019...as it stands, their five postseason appearances since 2019 are sixth most in the majors, trailing the Dodgers (7), Astros (6), Braves (6), Brewers (6), and Yankees (6)...they have made the postseason nine times since becoming the Rays in 2008, tied with the Astros and Brewers for fifth most in MLB behind the Dodgers (15), Yankees (13), Braves (10), and Cardinals (10).

PITCHER'S PARADISE—The Rays staff has yielded 3 ER or fewer in nine of the last 10 games, turning in a 2.27 ERA (91.0IP, 23ER) while holding opponents to a .177/.220/.274 (58-for-328) line...they lead the majors in opp. AVG, opp. OBP, opp. SLG, hits per 9.0 IP (5.74), walks per 9.0 IP (1.68), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.06) over that stretch (Aug. 22-pres.)...they also have MLB's best WHIP in that span (0.82), with the Guardians (1.05) being the next closest staff...entering that stretch, Rays pitchers had permitted five runs or more in a season-high six consecutive games (Aug. 16-21)...the starting rotation has a 2.11 ERA during the 10-game span, going 5-1 with 51 SO against 5 BB...seven of their last nine starts have been quality.

- ★ The Rays staff has recorded 10 strikeouts or more in three consecutive games (Aug. 30-pres.), the first time they have accomplished the feat since doing so in four straight from July 5-8.

CHOOSIN' TEXAS—The Rays begin a four-game set in Arlington, Texas against the Rangers tomorrow...the Rays won two out of three in their home series against the Rangers this season (July 28-30)...need to win two of the four games to claim their first season series against Texas since 2022 (4-3)...have dropped nine straight games at Globe Life Field dating back to July 17, 2023 and are 6-12 overall in their last 18 contests vs. the club in that span...went 12-7 in their 19 previous contests in Arlington from 2016-22.

TONIGHT’S START—**Griffin Jax**, who was reinstated from the 15-day IL (right elbow discomfort) earlier today, will toe the rubber for his 19th start and 30th appearance of the year, including his ninth start and 11th outing at Tropicana Field...marks his 19th straight start after pitching out of the bullpen in each of his first 11 appearances...is the 35th start of his major league career...acquired from the Twins for **RHP Taj Bradley** on July 31, 2025.

- With runners in scoring position and two outs this season, Jax has held opponents to a .121 (4-for-33) average, the ninth-lowest mark among AL right-handers (min. .30BF); teammate **Kevin Kelly** leads the majors under those parameters (.033).
- Min. 300 changeups thrown in 2026, Jax’s 41.3 pct. whiff rate on the pitch is the seventh-best mark in the majors and second best among active AL arms behind **TOR Dylan Cease** (50.4%).
- Has logged a 3.16 ERA (82.2IP, 29ER) in 18 starts compared to an 8.00 ERA (9.0IP, 8ER) in 11 relief outings this year.
- Over his last 10 starts (June 13–pres.), Jax has held opponents to an AL-best .108 (4-for-37) clip with RISP, tied with **CHC Javier Assad** for second in the majors to **STL Kyle Leahy** (.085/5-for-59).
- When receiving three runs of support or more this season, he is 5-1 with a 2.88 ERA (50.0IP, 16ER) compared to 0-6 with a 3.58 ERA (32.2IP, 13ER) when receiving two runs of support or fewer.
- While pitching in the third game of a series this year, Jax has gone 2-2 with a 1.45 ERA (31.0IP, 5ER), the sixth-best ERA in the majors and second best in the AL behind **TEX Jacob deGrom** (1.32) in such contests (min. 30.0IP).
- With a win tonight, Jax would match his single-season career high (7) from 2022 with the Twins.

LAST TIME OUT—Was dealt his second consecutive loss after spinning 5.0 innings and allowing three runs (one earned) in a 9-1 loss on Aug. 2 vs. CWS (L, 5.0IP, 4H, 3R-1ER, 8SO, HR)...his two runs allowed in the 1st frame were unearned, the first coming on his own fielding error and the latter on a wild pitch...retired six of his next seven batters through the 3rd inning, setting down five of those via the strikeout...surrendered a first-pitch solo home run to **Andrew Benintendi** to start the 4th inning, the fourth home run he has allowed on his sweeper this year...retired six of his final seven batters before handing the ball to **Craig Kimbrel** for the 6th inning.

- Has tossed a career-high 11 consecutive outings of 5.0 IP or more and has allowed three earned runs or fewer in 10 of those appearances.
- Reached 500 career strikeouts after he punched out **Drew Romo** on four pitches in the 2nd inning...has reached the 100-strikeout threshold in a season for the first time in his career (100), surpassing his previous season-best of 99.
- He struck out eight batters or more for the third time this season (last: 10SO - July 28 vs. TEX) and the fourth time in his career...has 42 strikeouts across his last six starts (July 6–pres.), joining **Ian Seymour** (47SO, July 18–Aug. 31) as the only Rays to strike out 42 batters or more within a six-start span in 2026.
- His average velocity was down on all five pitches in his repertoire, with his four-seam fastball (95.1mph) dropping 0.9 mph from his yearly average prior to the start (96.0mph).
- Made one rehab appearance with Triple-A Durham on Aug. 23 (L, 3.0IP, 3H, 3ER, 2BB, 2SO).

MEET THE METS—Jax has made five career appearances (all relief) opposite the Mets...has posted an 0-1 record with a 9.00 ERA (5.0IP, 5ER) against New York-NL...took his lone loss in his first career outing against the Mets on Sept. 10, 2023 at Target Field with Minnesota (L, 1.0IP, 2H, 2ER, 2SO, HBP)...made his most recent appearance against the club on April 15, 2025 at Target Field with the Twins (1.0IP, H, OR, SO), earning his fourth hold of the season before handing the ball over to **Jhoan Duran** for the 9th inning.

- Jax has a career 2-4 record with a 5.33 ERA (27.0IP, 16ER) across 21 outings (two starts) against NL East foes...as a starter against the division, he is 1-0 lifetime with a 1.80 ERA (10.0IP, 2ER) and nine strikeouts; both of those starts came earlier this season...earned the win in his most recent start against an NL East club on June 19 vs. WSH (W, 5.0IP, 4H, 2ER, 5SO, 2HR).

NO PLACE LIKE DOME—In 13 appearances (10 starts) at home this season, Jax has turned in a 3.23 ERA (47.1IP, 17ER) with a 1.10 WHIP and 64 strikeouts...in those starts, he boasts a 3-4 record, a 3.02 ERA (44.2IP, 15ER), a 1.10 WHIP and 58 strikeouts, and the Rays are 6-4 in those outings...has recorded 11.69 strikeouts per 9.0 innings pitched in home games this season, the fourth-highest mark in the AL (min. 40.0IP) and the seventh-highest clip in the majors.

HOW SWEEP IT IS—Jax throws his sweeper 25.1 pct. of the time, the fifth-highest mark among AL hurlers (min. 1,250 pitches)...despite this, his usage rate has dropped 18.9 pct. on the pitch from 2025 (44.0 pct.)...in 2026, he has limited opponents to a .203 (13-for-64) average on the pitch, seventh lowest in the AL (min. 60AB)...under the same parameters, his 37.0 pct. whiff rate on sweepers ranks 10th in the AL.

- Across 29 appearances this season, Jax has given up six extra-base hits on sweepers...five of them have come within his last 11 starts since June 1.

GET JAX UP AND MOVING—This marks the first time Jax has been a regular starter since his 2021 rookie season with the Twins, when he made his final 14 appearances as a member of the Twins rotation after his first four came in relief...he started two games for the Rays last season, working as an opener for **Ian Seymour** on Sept. 5 vs. CLE before starting a bullpen game on Sept. 10, 2025 at CWS...both starts lasted 1.0 scoreless frames...for his career, he is 8-12 with a 4.44 ERA (154.0IP, 76ER) in 34 starts compared to 21-28 with a 3.70 ERA (294.1IP, 121ER) in 294 relief appearances.

- Jax spent his first five professional seasons (2016-19, 2021) as a starter...he first transitioned to a full-time relief role in 2022...from 2016-21, 50 of his 55 minor league appearances were starts.

CAPTAIN JAX—Jax is currently a Captain in the U.S. Air Force Reserve, earning the promotion in June 2021, and remains the only Air Force Academy graduate to play in the majors...after his graduation from the Academy in 2017, he made five starts with Class-A Cedar Rapids and Rookie-level Elizabethton during his 60-day leave ahead of his first active duty assignment, departing on July 22 to begin his role as an acquisitions officer working with civilian contractors such as SpaceX and Boeing...the following year, he was accepted into the Air Force World Class Athlete Program, which allows soldiers to train for the upcoming Olympic Games as their active duty job responsibility for a two-year period, allowing him to continue his baseball career while completing his active duty requirement...became eligible for the program when baseball was readmitted for the scheduled 2020 Tokyo Olympics.

- He completed his active duty requirement and was admitted to the Air Force Reserve in November 2019...was notified of his promotion to Captain on June 5, 2021, the same day he was selected to the Twins major league roster ahead of his MLB debut three days later.

TOMORROW’S PROBABLE STARTER AT TEXAS RANGERS: SHANE MCCLANAHAN (10-6, 3.19)

LAST TIME OUT—earned his 10th win of the year and 43rd of his career on Aug. 28 vs. SD (W, 5.2IP, 3H, 4R-3ER, 2BB, 4SO, HR)...he tied teammate **Drew Rasmussen** (43) for sixth most wins in franchise history...became first pitcher in Rays history to record 10 wins or more in each of his first four major league campaigns.

vs. RANGERS—Is slated to make his fourth career start against Texas tomorrow, going 1-0 with a 3.38 ERA (16.0IP, 6ER), a 0.63 WHIP, and 14 strikeouts against the Rangers...tossed 3.0 hitless innings in his lone start against Texas earlier this season despite being removed from the game early due to left mid-back tightness.
