**Sept. 15, 1926:** Bob Meusel ties a still-standing Major League record with three sacrifice flies in the Yankees' 6-4 win at Cleveland's League Park. Don Mattingly is the most recent Yankee to accomplish the feat (5/3/86 vs. Texas).

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**Sept. 16, 2020:** Kyle Higashioka hits a career-high 3HR vs. Toronto. He becomes just the third player in franchise history to hit 3HR in a game as a catcher, joining Bill Dickey on 7/26/39 vs. St. Louis-AL and Mike Stanley on 8/10/95 vs. Cleveland-G1.

**Sept. 16, 2008:** Derek Jeter singles off Chicago-AL's Gavin Floyd in the first inning for his 1,270th career hit at Yankee Stadium, surpassing Lou Gehrig for the most all-time hits at the ballpark.

**Sept. 16, 1979:** The Yankees hold "Catfish Hunter Day" for the future Hall of Famer who has announced that he will retire following the season.

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees continue their seven-game road trip tonight with the first game of a three-game set at Pittsburgh (through Sun.)...went 3-1 in their four-game set at Boston... after this series, will return home for their final homestand of the season that includes a three-game set vs. Toronto (9/19-21) and a three-game series vs. Arizona (9/22-24).

- ▶ Have won four of their last five games after losing their previous three... **are 12-5 in their last 17 games** (since 8/28) and 14-8 in their last 22 games (since 8/23).
- ▶ **Seven of the Yankees' last eight wins have been come-from-behind wins.**
- ▶ **Have won nine of their last 11 road games** (since 8/28).
- ▶ Have won four of their last five series (since 8/28).

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees split their doubleheader on Thursday at Boston.

- ▶ The Yankees fell to the Red Sox, 5-0, in Game 1... **RHP Michael King** (4.2IP, 6H, 1ER, 1BB, 8K, 0HR) made his sixth start of the season and took the loss... **Yankees batters** were shut out for the ninth time this season... **2B Gleyber Torres** (2-for-4, 2 doubles) and **3B Oswald Peraza** (2-for-4) each recorded multi-hit games... **RF Oswald Cabrera** (1-for-2, 2BB) reached base three times... **RHP Greg Weissert** allowed 1ER in a career-high 2.1 innings of relief (2H, 3K, 1HR)... **RHP Matt Bowman** allowed 3ER in the eighth inning (1.0IP, 2H, 1BB, 1K, 1HR).
- ▶ The Yankees defeated the Red Sox, 8-5, in Game 2... **RHP Clarke Schmidt** (5.1IP, 7H, 4R/3ER, 3BB, 3K, 1HR, 1HP) started and did not record a decision... **DH Aaron Judge** (1-for-2, 1R, 1HR, 4RBI, 3BB) reached base four times and hit his sixth career grand slam in the second inning... **1B DJ LeMahieu** (3-for-5, 1R, 1 double, 2RBI) hit an RBI single in the second inning and a go-ahead RBI double in the eighth inning... **3B Oswald Peraza** (2-for-5, 2R, 1 double, 1HR, 2RBI) hit his first HR of the season and second of his career with a two-run shot in the ninth inning... **RHP Zach McAllister** (0.2IP, 1H, 1ER, 1K) allowed 1ER in 0.2IP... **LHP Wandy Peralta** (1.0IP, 1H) earned his fourth win of the season... **RHP Tommy Kahnle** (2.0IP, 1BB, 4K) tossed 2.0 scoreless innings to earn his second save of the season.

**FOR STARTERS:** Yankees starters have posted a 2.85 ERA (126.1IP, 40ER) in their last 24 games (since 8/20)...have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 22 of those 24 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 19 of those starts.

**ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge** reached base four times and hit his sixth career grand slam -- second of the season -- in the second inning in Game 2 of Thursday's doubleheader (also 8/23 vs. Washington)...recorded at least 4RBI for the third time this season and reached base at least four times in a game for the eighth time this year.

- ▶ Has reached base in 19-of-45 plate appearances over his last 10 games (since 9/5), posting a .422 OBP in that span (6H, 13BB).
- ▶ **The Yankees have gone 166-53 in his career when he homers...since 2020, the Yankees are 94-24 in those games...the Yankees are 22-4 this season when he homers.**
- ▶ 16 of his 32HR this season have either tied the game (two) or given the Yankees the lead (14).
- ▶ **Despite missing 51 games on the injured list this year, his 32HR this season rank fourth in the AL and his 75BB are tied for sixth.**
- ▶ Since being reinstated from the injured list on 7/28, leads the AL with 40BB and ranks second in the Majors, trailing only Philadelphia's Kyle Schwarber (51).

**LEMACHINE: INF DJ LeMahieu** recorded a season-high-tying 3H, including an RBI single in the second inning and a go-ahead RBI double in the eighth in Game 2 of Thursday's doubleheader...has reached base in 12 of his last 13 games (since 8/30), 30 of his last 33 games (since 8/1), 47 of his last 52 games (since 7/4) and 54 of his last 61 games (since 6/23).

**GLEYSER DAY: INF Gleyber Torres** went 3-for-9 with 2 doubles during Thursday's doubleheader...is batting .353/.389/.471 (6-for-17) with 1R, 2 doubles, 3RBI and 1BB in four games on the current road trip.

- ▶ Has reached base multiple times in nine of his last 15 games (since 8/28) and 11 of his last 19 games (since 8/24).
- ▶ Is batting .315/.396/.570 (47-for-149) with 25R, 11 doubles, 9HR, 21RBI, 18BB, 2HP and 5SB in 39 games since 8/1...has hit safely in 28 of those games and has reached base safely in 32 of those contests.
- ▶ Since 7/6, is batting .308/.368/.529 (70-for-227) with 35R, 12 doubles, 1 triple, 12HR, 29RBI, 21BB, 2HP, 35F and 6SB in 58 games.
- ▶ Has recorded a career-high 57BB in 144 games this season.

**COLE TRAIN: RHP Gerrit Cole** will make his 31st start of the season tonight at Pittsburgh... **is 13-4 with a 2.79 ERA (187.0IP, 58ER) and 204K in 30 starts this season...owns the lowest ERA in the American League and the third-lowest in the Majors**, trailing only San Diego's Blake Snell (2.43) and Chicago-NL's Justin Steele (2.49).

- ▶ Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 25-of-30 starts this season, 2R-or-fewer in 23 of those starts and 1R-or-fewer in 12 of those starts... **his 23 starts of 2R-or-fewer are tied with San Diego's Blake Snell for the most in the Majors.**
- ▶ **His 23 starts of 2R-or-fewer this season match the third-most by a Yankees starter in a single season in franchise history**, trailing only Jack Chesbro (28 in 1904) and Ron Guidry (26 in 1978)...is just the seventh pitcher in franchise history to accomplish the feat...Russ Ford (23 in 1910), Whitey Ford (23 in 1964), Mel Stottlemyre (23 in 1968) and Stan Bahnsen (23 in 1968) also recorded 23 such starts in a season...is the only Yankees pitcher in the last 45 years (since 1979) to record 23 such starts in a single season and just the second Yankees starter (also Guidry) to do so in the last 55 years (since 1969).
- ▶ **According to Elias, his 2.79 ERA is the lowest by a Yankees starter through his first 30 starts of a season in the last 31 years (since 1993) and the second-lowest in the last 44 years (since 1980)**, trailing only Melido Pérez's 2.78 ERA in his first 30GS in 1992...the last time a qualified Yankee finished a non-strike season with as low of an ERA was 1980 when Rudy May recorded a 2.46 ERA in 41G/17GS (Tommy John had a 2.63 ERA in 20GS in 1981 and Ron Guidry posted a 2.76 ERA in 23G/21GS in 1981).
- ▶ Has tossed at least 7.0 innings in five of his last nine starts (since 7/28), six of his last 12 starts (since 7/8) and seven of his last 15 starts (since 6/20)... **his nine starts of at least 7.0IP are tied for the third-most in the AL.**
- ▶ **Has tossed at least 6.0 innings in 24 of his 30 starts, the most such starts in the AL and tied with San Francisco's Logan Webb for the most such starts in the Major this season**...has tossed at least 6.0 innings in 12 of his last 13 starts (since 7/2) and in 17 of his last 19 starts (since 5/28).
- ▶ Leads the Majors in quality starts (22) and WHIP (1.03), ranks third in ERA (2.79, first in AL), innings pitched (187.0, first in AL), opponents' OBP (.269, third in AL) and opponents' OPS (.607, first in AL), tied for third in starts (30, tied for first in AL), fourth in winning percentage (.765, second in AL), fifth in strikeouts (204, third in AL) and opponents' SLG (.338, second in AL), seventh in opponents' BA (.214, second in AL) and WAR (4.3, third in AL - FanGraphs), 10th in BB/9.0IP (2.17, fourth in AL) and tied for 10th in wins (13, tied for fourth in AL)...also ranks fifth in the AL in K/9.0IP (9.82), K/BB (4.53) and HR/9.0IP (0.96).
- ▶ **Is the first Yankee in franchise history to record at least 200K in three different seasons...is just one of two Major League pitchers since 2015 to record at least six seasons with at least 200K**, joining Max Scherzer (also six).
- ▶ Will face his former team for the first time as a Yankee and for the second time in his career (also 1ER in 6.0IP on 6/25/19 at Minute Maid Park with Houston)...will also mark his first career start at PNC Park as an opposing pitcher...was the first overall pick of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft by the Pittsburgh Pirates...spent five seasons in Pittsburgh (2013-17), going 59-42 with a 3.50 ERA (782.1IP, 304ER) and 734K in 127 starts...in 64 career starts at PNC Park with Pittsburgh, went 25-19 with a 3.56 ERA (397.1IP, 157ER) and 352K.

**ROBERTO CLEMENTE DAY:** Today, Major League Baseball celebrates Roberto Clemente Day in honor of the Hall of Famer and humanitarian who perished in a plane crash on New Year's Eve in 1972 while on a mission to assist earthquake victims in Nicaragua...in honor of the day, Yankees 2023 Roberto Clemente Award nominee **OF Aaron Judge**, along with **DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton** and **C Kyle Higashioka**, will wear No. 21 for tonight's game.

**ON A ROLL: INF Oswald Peraza** hit his first HR of the season and second of his career with a two-run shot in the ninth inning of Game 2 on Thursday...collected multiple hits in both games of yesterday's doubleheader, going 4-for-9 with 2R, 1 double, 1HR and 2RBI.

- ▶ Has hit .375 (15-for-40) with 3R, 5 doubles, 1HR and 6RBI in his last 10 games (since 9/2).
- ▶ Owns a career-high seven-game hitting streak (since 9/6).

**BATTERS' EYE: Since the All-Star break, the Yankees lead the Majors with a 9.34 PA/BB ratio and a 4.05 pitches per plate appearance ratio**...prior to the All-Star break, ranked 20th in the Majors in both categories (11.90 PA/BB and 3.86 P/PA).

## TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP GERRIT COLE (13-4, 2.79 ERA)

**RHP Gerrit Cole** will make his 31st start of the season in tonight's series opener at Pittsburgh...the 33-year-old will start on regular four days' rest...last started on Sunday vs. Milwaukee and allowed just three baserunners over 7.0 scoreless innings in a no-decision in the Yankees' 13-inning win vs. Milwaukee (3H, 0BB, 9K, 1WP)...**is 13-4 with a 2.79 ERA (187.0IP, 58ER) and 204K in 30 starts this season...owns the lowest ERA in the American League and the third-lowest in the Majors**, trailing only San Diego's Blake Snell (2.43) and Chicago-NL's Justin Steele (2.49)...**has allowed 2R-or-fewer in 23 of his 30 starts this season, tied with San Diego's Blake Snell for the most such starts in the Majors**...started for the American League in the 93rd Midsummer Classic on 7/11 and retired all 3BF, becoming the 12th pitcher in franchise history (20th time) to start an All-Star Game...was named to his sixth career All-Star team via the player ballot...reached 10 years of Major League service on 5/29...recorded his 2,000th career strikeout on 5/23 vs. Baltimore (Jorge Mateo swinging), becoming the third-fastest pitcher in Major League history to reach the milestone (in terms of games and innings pitched)...his Major League-leading 257K last season were the most by a Yankees pitcher in a single season in franchise history, surpassing Ron Guidry's previous record of 248K in 1978...the six-time All-Star (2015, '18-19, '21-23) has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting five times (second in 2021, fourth in 2020, second in 2019, fifth in 2018, fourth in 2015)...his career 10.46 K/9.0IP ratio (2,134K/1,837.0IP) is the eighth-highest in Major League history (min. 1,000.0IP)...in 105 starts with the Yankees, is 49-23 with a 3.14 ERA (642.0IP, 224ER) and 798K...since 2018, leads the Majors in wins (84), strikeouts (1,400), and innings pitched (1,054.2), ranks second in K/9.0IP (11.95), third in opponents' BA (.205), WAR among pitchers (27.5 - FanGraphs) and winning percentage (.718, min. 60 decisions), fourth in WHIP (1.00) and K/BB (5.28), and seventh in ERA (2.96)...was originally selected by the Yankees in the first round (28th overall) of the 2008 MLB First-Year Player Draft but did not sign and went on to play at UCLA for three seasons (2009-11)...was the first overall pick of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft, the 15th pitcher (and 11th right-hander) to be chosen first...is the fifth player selected first overall to play for the Yankees, joining Alex Rodriguez, Darryl Strawberry, Tim Lincecum and Ron Blomberg...signed a nine-year contract extending through the 2028 season with a player opt-out following the 2024 season on 12/18/19.

**LAST START:** Allowed just three baserunners over 7.0 scoreless innings in a no-decision in Sunday's 13-inning win vs. Milwaukee (3H, 0BB, 9K, 1WP)...**marked his fourth start this season where he tossed at least 7.0 innings and allowed three-or-fewer baserunners (H/BB/HP)...his four such starts are tied with Mike Mussina (four in 2001) for the most in a season in franchise history.**

- ✦ Marked his sixth scoreless start of the season (also 0R in 7.0IP on 7/28 at Baltimore, 0R in 6.0IP on 5/17 at Toronto, 0R in 5.2IP on 4/22 vs. Toronto, CGSHO on 4/16 vs. Minnesota and 0R in 6.0IP on 3/30 vs. San Francisco)...his six scoreless starts of at least 5.0 innings this year are tied for the fourth-most in the AL and match the third-most by a Yankee in the last 22 years (since 2002), trailing only Hiroki Kuroda's nine such starts in 2013 and his own seven such starts in 2021...marks his third straight season of recording at least six such starts.

**STRIKEOUT MACHINE:** Has recorded at least 200K for the sixth time in his career (also 2015, '18-19, '21-22)...has reached the 200K plateau for his fifth straight 162-game season (also 2018-19, '21-22; recorded 94K in the abbreviated 60-game season in 2020)...is the first Yankee in franchise history to record at least 200K in three different seasons (previous: twice by Luis Severino in 2017 and 2018, David Cone in 1997 and 1998, and Ron Guidry in 1978 and 1979)...is just one of two Major League pitchers since 2015 to record at least six seasons with at least 200K, joining Max Scherzer (also six).

- ✦ Has recorded at least 8K in 13 starts this season and has notched five double-digit strikeout games this year...his five such games are tied for the third-most in the AL and tied for the fifth-most in the Majors this season.
- ✦ Has recorded double-digit strikeouts in 47 games since the start of 2019, marking the most in the Majors over the span (next: Max Scherzer-31)...his 55 games with at least 10K since the beginning of 2018 are also the most in the Majors over that stretch (next: Max Scherzer-49).
- ✦ Recorded his 2,000th career strikeout on 5/23 vs. Baltimore (Jorge Mateo swinging)...became the third-fastest pitcher (in terms of games and innings pitched) in Major League history to reach the milestone (278th career game and 1,714.2IP).

**30 FOR 30:** Has made at least 30 starts for the seventh time in his career (also 2015, '17-19, '21-22), the most such seasons by any Major League pitcher since 2015.

**2023:** Is 13-4 with a 2.79 ERA (187.0IP, 58ER) and 204K in 30GS this season...**has allowed 2R-or-fewer in 23 of his 30GS this year, tied with San Diego's Blake Snell for the most in the Majors...his 23 starts of 2R-or-fewer this season match the third-most by a Yankees starter in a single season in franchise history**, trailing only Jack Chesbro (28 in 1904) and Ron Guidry (26 in 1978)...**is just the seventh pitcher in franchise history to accomplish the feat**...Russ Ford (23 in 1910), Whitey Ford (23 in 1964), Mel Stottlemyre (23 in 1968) and Stan Bahnsen (23 in 1968) also recorded 23 such starts in a season...**is the only Yankees pitcher in the last 45 years (since 1979) to record 23 such starts in a single season and just the second Yankees starter to do so in the last 55 years (also Guidry).**

- ✦ Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 16 of his last 18 games (since 6/3), including 11 consecutive starts from 6/3-8/2.
- ✦ **Has started after a Yankees' loss 14 times this season...the Yankees are 11-3 in those games with Cole going 7-2 with a 2.72 ERA (89.1IP, 27ER) in those starts.**
- ✦ **Has allowed more than 3R just five times this season**, allowing 27 of his 61R in those five starts: 6R on 5/7 at Tampa Bay, 5R on 5/23 vs. Baltimore, 6R on 5/28 vs. San Diego, 4R on 8/7 at Chicago-AL and 6R on 8/19 vs. Boston...**in his other 25 starts, has allowed just 34 runs, averaging just 1.36 runs per game in those starts.**
- ✦ 13 of his 20HR allowed this season have been solo home runs.
- ✦ Has received 3R-or-fewer of support in 20 of his 30 starts...has received 2R-or-fewer of support in 14 of his starts.
- ✦ **Has tossed at least 6.0 innings in 24 of his 30 starts, the most such starts in the AL and tied with San Francisco's Logan Webb for the most in the Majors**...has tossed at least 6.0 innings in 12 of his last 13 starts (since 7/2) and in 17 of his last 19 starts (since 5/28).
