The Mariners and A's meet for the 8th of 13 matchups this season, and their final matchup at the Oakland Coliseum...the clubs are set to play in the final 3 games of the 2024 regular season from Sept. 27-29 at T-Mobile Park.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 10-game road trip today with the 2nd of 4 games against the Oakland Athletics...Seattle is coming off a 3-game series at the Los Angeles Angels (1-2) to begin the trip and will travel to Busch Stadium to take on the St. Louis Cardinals (3 G, 9/6-9/8) to finish the trip... tonight's game against in Oakland will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Mike Blowers** on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Dave Sims** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners fell to the A's by a 5-4 score, their 3rd-consecutive loss, each by just 1 run...with 24 regular season games left, the Mariners are 6.0 games back of Houston for the AL West Division lead, and 5.5 games back of Kansas City for the 3rd AL Wild Card spot.

- **Last Hurrah at the Coliseum** - Seattle is set to play its final series at the Oakland Coliseum...the Mariners have played 361 games at the Coliseum, going 157-204.
- **Robbing Third Base Blind** - The Mariners are 17-for-17 when attempting a steal of 3rd base, the only team in the Majors with at least 10 attempted steals of 3rd base without being caught...**Victor Robles** is 7-for-7 when stealing 3rd base since joining the club.
- **Shiners** - The Mariners lead the Majors with 94 hit-by-pitch this season, ranking ahead of second-place Minnesota (88 HBP)...Seattle also led the Majors in HBP in 2023 after being plunked a franchise-record 111 times...the Mariners are looking to become the first team to lead the Majors in hit-by-pitch in back-to-back seasons since Cleveland (2008-09).
- **Rock Beats OAK - Luis Castillo** is 3-0 with a 1.89 ERA (4 ER, 19.0 IP), 5 walks and 24 strikeouts in 3 starts against the A's since the start of the 2023 season.

THE BIG DUMPER...**Cal Raleigh** leads Major League catchers with 28 home runs, ranking ahead of Salvador Perez-KC (25 HR) and Shea Langeliers-OAK (25)...after pacing MLB catchers in homers in both 2022 (27 HR) and 2023 (30 HR), and setting the franchise record for most homers by a catcher in the process, Cal is trying to become the first catcher to lead his position group in homers in 3+ consecutive seasons since Hall of Famer Mike Piazza did it in 4 consecutive seasons from 1999-2002...additionally, with 2 more homers this season Cal would become just the 12th catcher in MLB history with multiple 30+ homer campaigns, with at least 50% of those games played at catcher.

THE GOLD STANDARD...**Cal Raleigh** leads American League catchers with 15 defensive runs saved (per *Sports Info Solutions*), 11 catcher framing runs (per *Baseball Savant*), a 3.29 catcher ERA, 116 games played at catcher and 953.0 innings caught...Cal is also tied for the Major League lead with 22 catcher caught stealing (also: Will Smith-LAD)...if Raleigh finishes with the Major League lead, he would become the first player to lead the Majors in CCS in back-to-back seasons since Hall of Famer Gary Carter for the Montreal Expos from 1982-83.

THE HUMAN ENERGIZER BUNNY...**Victor Robles** is batting .395 (15x38) with 5 runs, 3 doubles, 1 home run, 8 RBI, 2 walks and 5 stolen bases over his last 11 games (8/17-c), getting on base at a .415 clip and slugging .553 (.967 OPS) during that span...since joining the Mariners on June 5, he is batting .299 (49x164) with 21 runs, 11 doubles, 4 home runs, 16 RBI, 18 stolen bases, and a .791 OPS...Victor's 1.7 fWAR is the 2nd-most among Mariners position players since June 5, trailing only **Cal Raleigh** (2.3).

THE PITCHING STAFF...the Mariners pitching staff leads the Major Leagues in ERA (3.53)...Seattle is trying to lead the American League in ERA in back-to-back seasons (3.74 ERA in 2023) and the Majors in ERA for the first time since 2001 (3.54 ERA)...this season, the Mariners pitching staff also leads MLB in opponent batting average (.222), WHIP (1.09), fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.33), fewest hits-per-9 innings (7.45), strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.77), opponent OPS (.656) and quality starts (81)...Seattle's pitching staff has 13 shutout wins, tied with Boston for most in the American League.

SODO RUN CLUB...the Mariners are 116-for-141 (82.3%) in stolen base attempts this season, tied for the American League lead in stolen base percentage, with Toronto...Seattle is on pace to set the franchise record in stolen base percentage, surpassing the 80.6% mark achieved by the 2001 team...**Dylan Moore**, who swiped his 100th career bag on Saturday, has 28 stolen bases this year (T-6th in AL)...**Victor Robles** is 18-for-18 in stolen bases with the Mariners, passing Henry Cotto (1988) for most successful attempts without being caught to begin a Mariners career.

WELCOME TO THE J-ROD SHOW...center fielder **Julio Rodríguez** went 1-for-3 with 1 stolen base and 1 walk yesterday...over his last 32 games (7/4-c), Rodríguez is batting .306 (34x111) with 16 runs, 6 doubles, 6 home runs, 18 RBI and 12 walks, getting on base at a .391 clip, slugging .523 with a .913 OPS.

NEARLY UNBEATABLE WHEN SCORING FIVE-OR-MORE...in 48 games this season when scoring 5+ runs, the Mariners are 44-4 (.917) which is the best such record in the Major Leagues...Seattle is 25-65 (.278) when scoring 4-or-fewer runs...in 69 games when scoring 4+ runs, the Mariners are 56-13 (.812), 4th-best record in the Majors.

TAYLOR OF TROY...right-hander **Troy Taylor** tossed a scoreless inning Sunday, lowering his ERA to 1.08 on the year...the rookie has not allowed a run in 7 consecutive outings (8/17-c)...in 9 appearances to begin his Major League career, Taylor has a 1.08 ERA (1 ER, 8.1 IP) with 3 walks, 10 strikeouts and 0.84 WHIP, limiting opponents to a .133 batting average (4x30).

LUKE LALOOSH...**Luke Raley** is batting .271 (16x59) with 12 runs, 2 doubles, 6 home runs, 15 RBI and 11 walks over his last 22 games (8/2-c), getting on base at a .400 clip and slugging .610 (1.010 OPS) during that span...since Aug. 2, Raley's 1.010 OPS ranks 4th in the American League (min. 50 PA), trailing Aaron Judge-NYY (1.302), Yordan Alvarez-HOU (1.221) and Vladimir Guerrero Jr.-TOR (1.127).

TURNING IT UP A NOTCH...**Justin Turner** is batting .300 (12x40) with 5 runs, 2 home runs, 5 RBI, 4 walks and 2 hit-by-pitch over his last 12 games (8/18-c), getting on base at a .383 clip, slugging .450 with a .833 OPS...he recorded his 17th-career multi-homer game on Saturday, joining **Edgar Martinez** (2x) and Raúl Ibañez (3x) as the only players 39-or-older to hit 2+ home runs in a game for the Mariners.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Julio Rodríguez** swiped his 20th base of the season in yesterday's game, joining Ichiro Suzuki (2001-03) as the only players in franchise history to steal 20+ bases in each of his first 3 seasons, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that Julio is one of only 3 active players to steal 20+ bases in each of his first 3 seasons?...he is joined by Bobby Witt Jr. (2022-24) and Andrew McCutchen (2009-11)...if Julio reaches 25 stolen bases this season, he will join Witt Jr. as the only active players with 25+ SB in his first 3 Major League seasons.

ABOUT CASTILLO...

- The 31-year-old right-hander is set to make his 29th start of the year and 2nd against Oakland...he is also making his 210th Major League start and 7th career start against the Athletics.
Has been named an All-Star in 2019, 2022 and 2023.
Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on 12/23/11.
Made MLB debut on 6/23/17 vs. Washington (w/ Cincinnati).
Signed a 5-year contract extension with the Seattle Mariners on Sept. 24, 2022 after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati on July 30, 2022.

LAST TIME OUT...W #11 on 8/28 vs. Tampa Bay...he threw 5.2 innings and allowed 2 runs on 6 hits (1 home run) with 2 walks and 4 strikeouts.

YOU GET A STRIKEOUT...in the month of August he was tied for 7th in the American League in strikeouts with 37, while running a 11.5 SO/9.

BARNSTORMING...since 9/25/22, he has thrown 5.0+ innings in 28 consecutive road starts...marks the 2nd-longest active streak in the Majors, behind, Corbin Burnes-BAL/MIL (34)...this is the longest such streak by a Mariners pitcher in franchise history.

9x5...in his start on 8/23 vs. SF, he tallied up 9 strikeouts tying his season-high... he also struck out as many against the Mets (8/11), Tigers (8/6), Rockies (4/20) and Cubs (4/14)...this season 54.6% (89) of his 163 strikeouts have come off his 4-seam fastball, 25.2% (41) on his slider, 11.7% (19) on his sinker and 8.5% (14) from his changeup.

FUN IN THE SUMMER SUN...during July, the right-hander went 3-1 with a 1.99 ERA (7 ER, 31.2 IP) and 27 strikeouts to 8 walks in 5 starts...his 1.99 ERA was the 5th-lowest during the month in the Majors and the 3rd-lowest in the AL...it was his lowest ERA over a month since March/April 2023 (1.82)... all 5 of his outings were quality starts.

100 PITCHES AND STILL GOING...he is 1 of 9 pitchers in 2024 to record 12+ games with at least 100 pitches thrown...since he made his Major League debut, he has thrown 100+ pitches in 77 outings, 5th-most in the Majors during that time.

GETTING AHEAD AND STAYING AHEAD...the right-hander has a 64.9% 1st pitch strike rate so far this year...this marks his best 1st-pitch strike rate in his career, previous career-high (63.7% 2023).

WHIFF ARTIST...currently ranks in the top-15 in the AL in strikeouts this season with 167 (6th) and in swings-and-misses (15th, 351) this year...since he made his Mariners debut on 8/3/22, Castillo is 2nd the Major Leagues, and 1st in the AL, with 1,022 swings-and-misses and 1st in the AL in strikeouts (463).

FOR CLUB & COUNTRY...in MLB history, he ranks highly among Dominican-born pitchers in various categories...minimum 1100.0 innings pitched, he ranks 2nd in SO/9 (9.76), 2nd in SO/BB (3.27), 7th in ERA (3.56) and tied for 13th in strikeouts (1323)...among active Dominican-born pitchers, he is 2nd in games started (209), wins (73), innings pitched (1220.0), strikeouts (1323) and quality starts (116)...in each he trails Johnny Cueto...Castillo was born in Bani, Dominican Republic.

PITCHING WITH THE LEAD...over his two full seasons with the Mariners, opposing hitters are slashing .223/.284/.402 against him when the Mariners are leading in the game...he has pitched with the lead in 36 separate games across that time and the Mariners are 28-8 in those contests, including winning 22 of the last 25.

CRITICAL MOMENTS...in 2024, he is holding opposing hitters to a .185 (10x54) average with runners in scoring position with 2 outs...has allowed 12 runs in such situations this season, with 16 strikeouts and 2 walks.

4-SEAM DREAM...hitters this season are batting .204 (52x280) against Castillo's 4-seam fastball...the .204 average against his fastball is the 10th-best in the Majors (min. 200 PA)...he is also posting a 33.2% SO% this season with his 4-seamer, 4th-best in the Majors.

QUANTITY AND QUALITY...during his start against the Chicago Cubs on 4/14, he earned his 100th quality start in his career...he is 1 of 30 active pitchers to have 100 or more quality starts in their career (27th, 116).

QUALITY STRETCHES...twice this season, the right-hander has made 7 consecutive quality starts...his first span came between April 14-May 18 and the second span between July 5-Aug. 11...he is the first player to have multiple 7-game quality start streaks in the same season since Walker Buehler-LAD in 2021...he is the first Mariners pitcher to do so since Félix Hernández in 2013 and 2009...the 3rd different Mariner in
