TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 3 (1-1) of a 3-game series vs Warren Miller's Rockies and Game 3 (1-1) of a 6 -game homestand that includes an upcoming 3 -game set vs the Pirates beginning tomorrow night...following this homestand, the Redlegs will visit Atl's SunTrust Park (4g) before returning to Great American Ball Park for a 7-day, 6-game homestand vs the Angels ( 2 g ) and Cubs ( 4 g ).

150th CELEBRATION: During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the 150th anniversary of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the 1869 Red Stockings...this season, the team will wear 15 uniforms from various periods throughout the team's history...this afternoon are wearing replica uniforms from 1967...the Reds are 2-7 wearing throwback uniforms...already wore uniforms from 1902, 1911, 1912, 1919, 1935, 1936, 1939, 1956 and 1961...as part of the seasonlong celebration, the Reds Hall of Fame and Museum underwent a comprehensive modification, while the 1869 Pavilion at the southwest corner of the ballpark was dedicated on May 4, the 150th anniversary of the Red Stockings' $45-9$ win over the Cincinnati Great Westerns in the first professional baseball game...more than 20 anniversary park benches, featuring Reds mascots wearing the 15 throwback uniforms, are on display at locations across Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds and Rockies are meeting for the second time this season...coming out of the All-Star break, the Reds suffered a 2-1 series loss at Coors Field...that series included a 17-9 win in which the Reds became the first Major League team in the modern era to produce in a game at least 5 triples and at least 3 HR....beginning in 2002 and with a minimum of 40 games played, the Reds' .345 winning percentage at Coors Field (20-38) is their second-lowest at any current road ballpark in th Coors Field (20-38) is their second-lowest at any current road ballpark in that span (Phi's Citizens Bank Park, 18-36, .333) Cin's $3-1$ series win from 5/30-6/2, 2016 is its only series win at Coors since 8/27-8/29, 2012.

PIRATES UP NEXT: The Reds are 46-47 since the bench-clearing incident on $4 / 7$ at Pit that led to the ejections of David Bell, Amir Garrett and Yasiel Puig...from 4/4-4/7 the Pirates swept a 4-game series from the Reds for the first time since 7/11-7/14, 1991 at Riverfront Stadium and did it in Pittsburgh for the first time since 8/22-8/24, 1969 at Forbes Field... from 3/31-4/5 the Reds were shut out by the Pirates in 3 consecutive games ( $5-0,2-0,2-0$ ) for the first time since 7/31-8/2, 1931 (5-0 \& 1-0 losses at Pit, 3-0 loss at Cin)...last season the Reds lost 8 of their last 9 and 10 of their last 12 games vs the Pirates, including a 7-game losing streak from 7/20-9/28...was Cin's longest losing skid vs Pit since a 9-game losing streak from 5/1-7/19, 1991

CATCH A BREAK: The Reds have used 5 catchers this season, including Tucker Barnhart, Curt Casali, Kyle Farmer, Juan Graterol and Ryan Lavarnway...the 3 catchers on the club's Opening Day roster - Barnhart (IL), Casali (IL) \& Farmer (concussion) - simultaneously were unable to play for 8 days (7/18-7/25) until Barnhart came off the injured list prior to Fri night's game...Barnhart and Farmer have returned to the active roster...Barnhart on Fri filled the roster spot vacated by Graterol, who went on the 7 -day concussion list...Farmer was reinstated from the 7 -day concusion list prior to today's game...he relaced Lavarnway, who was designated for assignment...per @EliasSports, the Reds used 6 catchers in a season just 7 times in their history, most recently in 1992 (Troy Afenir, Scott Bradley, Joe Oliver, Jeff Reed, Dan Wilson, Rick Wrona)...also used 6 catchers in 1963, 1961, 1937, 1925 and 1895...the 1909 Reds used a club-record 8 catchers (Tommy Clarke, Tom Downey, Emil Haberer, Mike Konnick, Larry McLean, Si Pauxtis, Duck Pearce, Frank Roth).

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP Michael Lorenzen has appeared in 64 of the Reds' 102 games so far this season, including 43 times solely as a pitcher, twice as a pinch hitter/pitcher, once as a pitcher/LF/RF (7/22 at Mil), once as a pitcher/LF (6/2 vs Wsh), 3 times as a CF, 3 times as a LF, 7 times solely as a pinch runner, once as a pinch runner/CF (3/28 vs Pit, CF), once as a pinch runner/LF (5/9 at Oak) and once as a pinch runner/RF (5/24 at Chi) and once as a CF/P (7/17 at Chi)... 9 times in his career, including twice this season ( $4 / 9 \mathrm{vs} \mathrm{Mia}, 4 / 15$ at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch... 5 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...Lorenzen this year became the first player in Reds history, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in each of the first 6 games of a season (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with more than 300 career innings pitched (381.1) to play center field since Hal Jeffcoat in 1958...Ron Mahay was the last Major League pitcher with at least 300 innings also to play CF...Mahay played in 5g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 300th inning in 2006 for the Rangers.

BLACK \& BLUE: Derek Dietrich has been hit by a pitch 22 times, the most in the Major Leagues and third-most in Reds history (Shin-Soo Choo, 26, 2013 \& Jason LaRue, 24, 2004)...was hit 4 times in a 3-game series at Chi from 7/15-7/17 and was hit by a pitch 6 times in the 4 -game series at Mil from 6/20-6/23...he is the only player in modern Major League history to get hit by a pitch 6 times in a series of any length...was hit by a pitch twice in that series opener vs the Brewers, a 7-1 Reds win...in the 11-7 win in Game 2 became the first Reds batter in the modern era to be hit by a pitch 3 times in a game, tying the Major League record accomplished many times, and the first Reds batter ever to be hit at least twice in consecutive apps...in 15 apps this season vs the Brewers, Dietrich has been hit by a pitch 8 times...he has been hit by a pitch 115 times in his career...notes courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

AND THIS ONE BELONGS....: Hall of Fame broadcaster Marty Brennaman is in his 46th and final season calling Reds games for 700 WLW Radio...joined the Reds radio team in 1974 and for 31 seasons (1974-2004) shared the 700 WLW Radio booth with Reds Hall of Fame pitcher Joe Nuxhall, tying LA's Vin Scully and Jerry Doggett for the longest running broadcast duo in baseball history... is only the eighth Major League Baseball broadcaster to work for the same team for at least 46 seasons, joining Scully ( 67 seasons, 1950-2016), Ralph Kiner of the Mets (52, 1962-2013), KC's Denny Matthews (51, 1969-2019), Mil's Bob Uecker (49, 1971-2019), Jack Buck $(48,1954-2001)$ \& Mike Shannon $(48,1972-2019)$ of the Cardinals and LAD's Jaime Jarrín (47, 1973-2019).

Alex Wood this afternoon is making his Reds and season debut...has been on the Reds' injured list all season with a lower back injury....has been on the 60 -day IL since $5 / 31 \ldots$ made 1 start for the Reds in spring training, on $\mathbf{2 / 2 5}$ at Sea ( $1 \mathrm{ip}, 2 \mathrm{~h}, 3 \mathrm{er}, 1 \mathrm{bb}, 0 \mathrm{k}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$ )...beginning $7 / 6$ made 4 rehab starts for Class AAA Louisville (3gs) and Class AA Chattanooga (1gs) and combined to go 1-1, 3.18...in December was acquired from the Dodgers, along with C/IF Kyle Farmer, OF Matt Kemp, OF Yasiel Puig and cash, for RHP Homer Bailey, IF Jeter Downs and RHP Josiah Gray.

## RED HOTS

Sonny Gray is a 2019 National League All-Star...tomorrow will make the fifth start of his career and fourth of the season vs the Pirates...has made 5 consecutive quality starts, the longest streak by a Reds pitcher this season (2-1, 1.62)...began the season with 9 starts without a win, the longest such streak of his career to begin a season...was bothered in spring training by stiffness in his right elbow and made just 3 exhibition starts, but he started the Reds' second game of the season...hasn't missed a turn since...with the completion of the second inning on $7 / 17$ at Cubs reached 1,000 career innings pitched...on $7 / 12$ at Col, his strikeout of Charlie Blackmon to end the fifth inning was the 900th strikeout of his career.
