LOCASTRO TIES A RECORD (SINCE 1951): Tim Locastro's steal of second base in the seventh inning on April 2 @ Padres was his 27th straight stolen base to start his career, matching Tim Raines (1979-81) for the longest streak to start a career since 1951.
