Padres vs. Mariners

- The Padres will play their final "away" game today against the stadium-sharing Mariners...after the regular season Korea Series from March 20-21, the Padres will return home to play the Mariners again for 2 exhibition games at Petco Park from March 25-26.
- San Diego will play the Mariners 4 times in the 2024 regular season, first for a 2-game set in San Diego from July 9-10 and then for 2 games in Seattle from Sept. 10-11.

Padres and Dodgers announce Seoul Series starting pitcher matchups

- Yu Darvish will get the 2024 Opening Day nod vs. Tyler Glasnow for Game 1 of the Seoul Series on March 20 in Korea...Joe Musgrove will start Game 2 on March 21 vs. Yoshinobu Yamamoto the day after (Padres are at home on the 20th and on the road on the 21st).
- It'll be Yu Darvish's 1st time pitching in Asia in a professional game since he pitched for the Hokkaido Nippon-Ham Fighters in Japan in his last season in Nippon Professional Baseball (NPB) in 2011.
- It's Darvish's 3rd Opening Day start in his 4 seasons with the Friars (1st since 2022), and he joins a group of 5 pitchers that have started at least 3 opening days for the Padres...Randy Jones, Jake Peavy and Eric Show all started 4, and Andy Benes started 3...he did not make his 3rd consecutive Opening Day start last year due to his pitching commitments for Team Japan in the World Baseball Classic (which he won with former teammate Yoshinobu Yamamoto).

Yu Darvish gets the nod

- At 9:00 am MST today, Darvish was named as the Padres' Opening Day starter on March 20 vs. the Dodgers in Korea opposite LAD's Tyler Glasnow.
- Minutes before Yu Darvish was to make his last start on March 8 vs. the Giants, the sky opened up in Peoria, and the game was cancelled due to rain...he has made 3 prior Cactus League outings so far this Spring, tossing 8.1 innings in total for a 3.24 ERA (3 ER) and 10 strikeouts against 0 walks...he's posted a 1.08 WHIP and a .290 opponent batting average...in his last outing on March 4 vs. CHC, he went 3.1 scoreless innings in his start with 5 hits, 6 punchouts, and 0 walks.
- RHP Yu Darvish, RHP Joe Musgrove, and RHP Michael King have 3 of the spots in the rotation on lock...other options on the current 40-man roster in competition for the remaining two spots are RHP Jhony Brito and RHP Randy Vásquez (who came to the Padres from New York in the Juan Soto trade), RHP Pedro Avila and RHP Matt Waldron.

Camp re-assignments (37 now in ML Camp)

- On Monday, the Padres optioned INF Matthew Batten to minor league camp and re-assigned OF's Cal Mitchell, Jakob Marsee, and Tim Locastro, INF Mason McCoy, and C Kevin Plawewski to minor league camp...we now have 37 players remaining in Major League Camp.

Bench and outfield spots competition

- The Padres have seen a healthy competition this Spring for left field, center field, a bench, and two rotation spots...for the outfield, Jose Azocar, Oscar Mercado, Jurickson Profar, Tim Locastro, Cal Mitchell, and prospects Jacob Marsee and Jackson Merrill are standouts.
- Said Mike Shildt on March 4, "It's a balancing act, you don't want to over-evaluate Spring Training, but nonetheless, we are here in Spring Training. Guys are competing for spots and playing well in the games. We can't ignore what we're seeing."

Padres in their 31st Spring Training

- The Padres are guaranteed to play 187 games between pre-season and regular season in 2024.
- For the club's 31st Spring in Peoria, Ariz., the Padres will play a 23-game Cactus League schedule...they'll play 13 Spring games in Peoria, and their schedule features 12 games against AL opponents including the Guardians, Royals, White Sox, A's, Angels and Mariners...SD will face NL foes 11 times featuring contests vs. the Dodgers, Brewers, Cubs, Giants, D-backs and Reds.
- On July 13, the Padres released their schedule for the 2024 regular season, featuring a 2-game series against the Dodgers in Seoul, South Korea to open the season...home weekends for the Padres in 2024 are highlighted by series against NL West opponents, including 2 weekend tilts against the Giants, 2 vs. the Diamondbacks, and a weekend series against the Dodgers and Rockies...the Blue Jays, Phillies, Yankees, Brewers, Braves, Mets, and White Sox also pay weekend visits to Petco Park...the Padres will host the Giants at Petco Park on Easter (March 31), Dodgers on Mother's Day (May 12), Marlins on Memorial Day (May 27), and Tigers on Labor Day (September 2).

Matsui update

- Yuki Matsui, who has been suffering from back tightness sustained in an on-field drill last week, began throwing Friday and is making progress in his recovery...he's continued to ramp up his throwing, and he is making progress in his recovery.

Hey Seoul Sister

- On July 12th, MLB announced that the Padres will open the 2024 season against the Dodgers in Seoul, South Korea from March 20-21...the Padres will depart Arizona for Korea on March 13th after their 1:10 first pitch game vs. the A's.
- The Seoul Series will be the 1st MLB regular-season games ever played in Korea, and it'll be the 9th time that the season opened outside the 50 U.S. states and Canada (1st time in 5 years since the A's vs. Mariners in 2019 in Tokyo, Japan)...it'll be the Padres' 2nd time opening a season abroad, having done so in 1999 in Monterrey, Mexico (Rockies vs. Padres)...it will be the 2nd consecutive season that the Padres will play a series outside of the United States or Canada (Mexico City, 2023).
- Both Ha-Seong Kim and Woo-Suk Go will return to Korea, where Kim played for 7 seasons from 2014-20 with the Kiwoom Heroes and Go played for 7 seasons as well from 2017-23 with the LG Twins...said Kim, "It would be appreciated if many Padres fans from Korea came to support us. See you in Seoul."
- The Padres will be the home team for Game 1 on March 20, and the

Dodgers will be the home team on March 21...the Friars will then have 3 off days over that weekend, and despite having already begun the regular season the week prior, they'll play 2 more Spring Training games against the Mariners at Petco Park on March 25-26, have an off day on the 27th, and then have their "home opener" on Thursday, March 28th against the Giants for the 1st of a 4-game set.

Padres have four Asian-born players on roster

- The Padres have four Asian-born players on their roster in Yu Darvish (Japan), Yuki Matsui (Japan), Ha-Seong Kim (South Korea), and Woo-Suk Go (South Korea)...no Padre team has ever had more than two Asian-born players on its Opening Day roster, and other than Yu Darvish and Ha-Seong Kim from 2021-23, the only time they had multiple on their OD roster was in 2006 with current Padres' Special Assistant, Baseball Operations Chan Ho Park (South Korea) and Dodgers' Manager Dave Roberts (Japan).
- The last team with 4+ Asian-born players on its Opening Day roster was, in fact, the Dodgers in 2008: Chin-lung Hu (Taiwan), Hong-Chih Kuo (Taiwan), Hiroki Kuroda (Japan), and Takashi Saito (Japan), per Elias.

Tale of Two Seasons

- In the 2022 regular season, the Padres led the National League in both 1-run wins (30) and extra-inning wins (12)...in 2023, however, they finished last in the NL in both 1-run wins (9) and extra-inning wins (2)...in doing so, it was the 3rd time in MLB history in which a team went from leading the league in both categories in one season to finishing last in their league in both categories, joining the 1933-34 Washington Senators and the 1918-19 Washington Senators (Elias).
- Despite the Padres tying for the 8th-best winning percentage of any National League team in 2023 (.506), their +104 run differential was the 3rd best in the NL, trailing the Dodgers (+207) and the Braves (+231)...among all teams in MLB history to finish the year with a +100 run differential, their .506 winning % was the lowest (Elias).

Xander Moves from SS to 2B

- On February 16, Mike Shildt announced that Xander Bogaerts will move to 2B with Ha-Seong Kim moving to SS...topic was broached to Xander when Mike visited him in Aruba in the offseason.

Rotation

- The Padres have three of the rotation spots solidified in RHP's Yu Darvish, Joe Musgrove, and Michael King...other options on the current 40-man roster in competition for the remaining two spots are RHP Jhony Brito and RHP Randy Vásquez (who came to the Padres from New York in the Juan Soto trade), RHP Pedro Avila and RHP Matt Waldron.
- LHP Adrian Morejon, who entered camp healthy after an injury-ridden 2023 season, has started before, but he's in competition for a multi-inning/possible long relief role.

Prospect Watch

- INF/OF Jackson Merrill (No. 2 Padres prospect), OF Jakob Marsee, and INF Graham Pauley could potentially debut in 2024.
- 17-year-old catcher Ethan Salas is in Major League Camp for the 1st time after making his professional debut last season...the Padres signed Salas at 16 years old out of Caracas, Venezuela when he was the No. 1 ranked overall prospect in the 2023 International Draft class... Salas was awarded the Minor League "Debut of the Year" award on October 2, and he finished his year in Double-A.

Solidified roster spots

- Said Manager Mike Shildt on February 21, "It's the most open camp I've seen, relative to my management experience. I think it's great."



Guys are gonna get after it, guys are gonna get opportunities. You don't want to over-evaluate in spring training, but the reality is we're gonna make decisions based on what it looks like."

- The spots that are solidified are Jake Cronenworth at 1B, Xander Bogaerts at 2B, Ha-Seong Kim at SS, Manny Machado at 3B, Fernando Tatis Jr. in RF, Luis Campusano at C, and Kyle Higashioka at C (Campusano is believed to get more opportunity).

Outfield questions/Bench spots

- Per Manager Mike Shildt, center field options include Jose Azocar, Bryce Johnson, Graham Pauley, Oscar Mercado, Jakob Marsee, Jurickson Profar, and Jackson Merrill...with Merrill, historically a shortstop, he's been getting more and more work in the outfield (combination of center and left field)...vying for outfield roles overall are Cal Mitchell, Bryce Johnson, Oscar Mercado, Robert Perez Jr., Jackson Merrill, Jakob Marsee, Tirso Ornelas...battling for bench spots are Matthew Batten and Eguy Rosario.

Golden Boys

- On Nov. 10, 2023, Fernando Tatis Jr. was awarded the NL Platinum Glove for his work last year in right field, the 1st Padres to ever win the Platinum Glove...when Mike Shildt visited Tatis in the Dominican Republic this offseason, he said he was going to petition to MLB for Fernando to play both right and left field and to be able to hit twice in the lineup. Tatis will focus on playing right field this season...said Fernando in his first day back at camp, "My confidence is through the roof, and I just want them to sit down and see what I'm gonna do this year...I feel way better than I did last year. Talents plus work ethic...this offseason's work ethic, it feels like this is gonna be special."
- SS Ha-Seong Kim won the 2023 "Utility" NL Gold Glove award, joining Tatis as 2023 Gold-Glove winners...Kim was also the Padres' representative for MLB's Heart & Hustle Award in 2023.

Trainer's Table

- Manny Machado had right elbow extensor tendon repair surgery on October 3, 2023 in Los Angeles...the procedure was performed by Dr. Neal ElAttrache, and his estimated recovery timeline was slated at 4-6 months. Spent his offseason in San Diego working on his rehab and being involved in the community...said Manny this Spring, the biggest obstacle is to be able to tolerate the throwing day in and day out and building up the arm strength...he hadn't thrown in months (started throwing again in January) but his arm feels great in how he's been building up the strength...is hoping to be able to start at 3B in time for the Korea Series, but that is still to be determined...if Machado does not open the season at third, it could be filled by Eguy Rosario, Matthew Batten, Tyler Wade or Mason McCoy (amongst others).
- Jake Cronenworth was hit by a pitch on his right wrist on August 25, 2023, and he was placed on the IL with a right wrist fracture...it ended his season, but no surgery was required. Is at 100% entering camp.
- Last season on August 4, 2023, the Padres placed Joe Musgrove on the 15-Day IL with right shoulder capsule inflammation...Musgrove began experiencing stiffness in his shoulder following his July 28 start, and he was shut down from throwing for 4 weeks...Musgrove was shut down in mid-September and transferred to the 60-Day IL on September 30...he received a couple of MRIs in the offseason on his shoulder...everything was looking right, and he got clearance from the medical staff to go at 100% with his offseason training.
- Last season, Yu Darvish was shut down for the season with a stress reaction in his right elbow on September 12, 2023, having made his last start of the season on August 25 @ Milwaukee...on Feb. 11, Mike Shildt said Darvish is "a full go...no question that Yu is in a really good place physically...his recovery has been really good and he's been throwing the ball really well."

King's Gambit

- On the Padres/Yankees trade, King said "I can't be more complimentary of the players coming with me. [Kyle Higashioka] is the centerpiece for me because he knows how to command a pitching staff...I'm looking forward to the Padres' future."
- Says his greatest strength is knowing the hitter's weakness. Said King, "homework on hitters is my favorite thing to do."
- "Knowing I have a spot (in the rotation) is a lot better. It makes me feel like I can actually use Spring Training to work on stuff and try things out instead of having to fight for a spot...With the Yankees, I wanted to be a starter and begged Aaron Boone for it a lot."
- Doesn't think he was fit to be a starter when he first arrived in the big leagues. Says he basically had just a sinker and command of a changeup. He didn't have four-seamer, nor a slider. Corey Kluber taught Michael his slider. He calls it the "Kluber ball." It became one of his best pitches the last couple of years. His four-seamer got better, so now he has a pitch package where he feels like he can flip a lineup multiple times and either save things or have better pitch sequences later in the game.
- 10 days after the Padres/Yankees trade went down, he married his now-wife, Sheila, on Dec. 16, 2023 at the The Pierre Hotel on Fifth Avenue and Central Park in NYC. "It was like our going away party," King said. "And we had a freaking blast." Coincidentally, in January, he and Sheila attended another wedding in San Diego. While he was there, he threw a bullpen and attended the team's pitchers camp.

New Pacific Rim kids on the block

- Yuki Matsui, in his introductory media availability this Spring, introduced himself to the media in Japanese, Spanish, and English... he memorized a two-minute introductory speech in English, which was greeted by applause (is close with fellow Japanese pitcher Yu Darvish, and he and Steven Wilson are locker-mates). Since he and Steven have a similar fastball, they talk pitching together.
- On Feb. 11, Mike Shildt said Matsui is "adapting extremely well... his acclimation has been completely accelerated."...Matsui was a closer in Japan, and in regard to his role with the Padres, he says he knows he needs to earn the trust of the team and perform well.
- Woo-Suk Go ("W" is silent), on opening the season in Korea, said he wants to compete for a roster spot and be able to pitch in his home country...in coming to MLB, he feels like he's a rookie, and in your rookie year in Korea, you feel like you have to first make the roster, and that's why he feels competitive and thinking of it that way.
- He was attracted to the Padres because Ha-Seong Kim was with the Padres and because of San Diego's weather. It was the best offer he got and a last-minute deal...on playing against his brother-in-law Jung-Hoo Lee (who signed with the Giants)...Lee signed too early, so he never thought about it. He never even thought or talked about playing against one another because there are so many teams.

Rest in Peace, Peter

- On November 14, Padres' Chairman and Owner Peter Seidler passed away at the age of 63. Peter's bio can be accessed [here](#). The Padres will honor Peter with a celebration of life ceremony at Petco Park on Saturday, March 23 at 1:00 p.m. PT. The team will also wear a "PS" jersey patch in Seidler's memory during the entirety of the 2024 regular season.
- Current and former Padres, team and league executives, local dignitaries, family members and special guest speakers will be in attendance for the celebration of life with Padres broadcaster Don Orsillo serving as Master of Ceremonies. Admission is free, with fans required to claim digital tickets beginning Thursday, February 29th. Gates will open at 12:00 p.m. for all those attending. Seating will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. Parking is free of charge and will be available in neighboring Padres-controlled lots, including the Lexus Premier Lot, Tailgate Lot and Padres Parkade.
