The Mariners have a consensus Top-10 farm system in baseball...they are ranked No. 3 by *The Athletic*, No. 7 by *ESPN*, No. 8 by *MLB Pipeline* and No. 10 by *Baseball America*.

30/30

Julio Rodríguez hit 32 HR and collected 30 SB in 2025, becoming the only player in Mariners history with multiple 30 HR/30 SB seasons (also: 2023).

50

The Mariners will embark on the 50th season in club history tonight.

#51

Randy Johnson's #51 is set to be retired by the Mariners on May 2, joining Ken Griffey Jr. (#24), Edgar Martínez (#11), Ichiro Suzuki (#51) and Jackie Robinson (#42, retired across MLB) to have their numbers retired by the Mariners.

85+

The Mariners are 1 of 4 teams with 5-consecutive seasons of at least 85 wins (2021-c), joined by the Astros, Brewers and Dodgers...it also marks the longest streak of above .500 seasons in Mariners history (previous: 2000-03).

The Mariners and Guardians meet for the first of two matchups this year...Seattle will travel to Cleveland from June 26-28...Seattle is opening the season with Cleveland for the 5th time (last: 2023).

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners embark on the 2026 campaign, the 50th in franchise history, tonight with the 1st of 4 games against the Cleveland Guardians...Seattle will also host the New York Yankees (3 G, 3/30-4/1) on the opening homestand...tonight's game will be televised live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call and **Angie Mentink** serving as field reporter...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...Seattle is 30-19 (.612) on Opening Day all-time, the 2nd-best record in MLB history, trailing only the New York Mets (41-23/.641)...the Mariners are 4-1 over their last 5 Opening Day Games (2021-c), 6-2 over their last 8 Opening Day Games (2018-c) and 15-4 over their last 19 Opening Day Games (2006-c), tied for the best Opening Day record in the Majors since 2006 (also: Dodgers).

- **Nationally Televised** - The Mariners will be televised nationally tomorrow (**Apple TV**) and Sunday (**Peacock**) during the opening series...Seattle is set to be televised nationally 40 times in 2026, including 13 national exclusive games.
- **Tenured Voices** - Mariners primary play-by-play voice **Rick Rizzs** enters his 41st and final season calling games for the Mariners, having announced his retirement following the 2026 season...Mariners Public Address Announcer **Tom Huttyler** enters his 40th season as the voice of the Mariners ballpark.
- **Happy Birthday** - INF/OF **Rob Refsnyder** and Hitting Coach **Kevin Seitzer** celebrate birthdays today.
- **The Core Returns** - Of the 26 players on the Mariners Opening Day roster, 22 of them appeared in a game with the club during the 2025 season (in addition to 4 on the Injured List to start the season)... new additions include All-Star INF/OF **Brendan Donovan**, INF/OF **Rob Refsnyder** and pitchers **Cooper Criswell** and **José A. Ferrer**.

CAL RALEIGH: A SEASON FOR THE AGES...Cal Raleigh finished as the runner-up for the AL MVP in 2025 after batting .247 (147x596) with 110 runs, 24 doubles, 60 home runs, 125 RBI, 14 stolen bases, a .359 OBP and slugging .589 for a .948 OPS and 171 OPS+...he led the Majors with 60 home runs, becoming the 4th player in AL history to reach 60 home runs, in addition to setting the Mariners record (previous: Ken Griffey Jr.: 56 HR in 1997 & '98), the catcher record (previous: Salvador Perez-KC: 48 HR in 2021) and the switch-hitter record (previous: Mickey Mantle-NYY: 54 HR in 1961) for most home runs in a season.

OPENING DAY ROSTER...the Mariners set their Opening Day, 26-man roster...the roster includes **13 pitchers**: starters **Luis Castillo**, **Logan Gilbert**, **Emerson Hancock**, **George Kirby** and **Bryan Woo**...right-handed relievers **Eduard Bazarro**, **Matt Brash**, **Cooper Criswell**, **Casey Legumina**, **Andrés Muñoz** and **Carlos Vargas** and left-handed relievers **José A. Ferrer** and **Gabe Speier**...the roster included **13 position players**: catchers **Mitch Garver** and **Cal Raleigh**...infielders **Ryan Bliss**, **Josh Naylor**, **Leo Rivas** and **Cole Young**...outfielders **Randy Arozarena**, **Dominic Canzone**, **Victor Robles** and **Julio Rodríguez**...infielder/outfielders **Brendan Donovan**, **Luke Raley** and **Rob Refsnyder**...Seattle has 4 players on the Injured List to begin the season: INF **J.P. Crawford** (10-day IL, right shoulder inflammation), RHP **Logan Evans** (60-day IL, right elbow surgery), RHP **Bryce Miller** (15-day IL, left oblique strain) and INF/OF **Miles Mastrobuoni** (10-day IL, right calf strain).

THE COACHING STAFF...manager **Dan Wilson** enters his second full season as Mariners skipper...returning to the Mariners coaching staff in the same roles are Bench Coach **Manny Acta**, Director of Pitching Strategy **Trent Blank**, Assistant Pitching Coach and Major League Pitching Strategist **Danny Farquhar**, Infield Coach **Perry Hill**, Asst. Hitting Coach **Bobby Magallanes**, Senior Director of Hitting Strategy **Edgar Martínez**, Hitting Coach **Kevin Seitzer**, Pitching Coach **Pete Woodworth** and First Base Coach **Eric Young Jr.**...joining the staff this season are Third Base Coach **Carlos Cardoza**, Major League Field Coordinator **Jake McKinley** and Bullpen Coach **Austin Nola**...**Fleming Báez** and **Justin Novak** both return as Bullpen Catchers.

MARINERS TV AVAILABLE ON CABLE, SATELLITE AND STREAMING IN 2026...the Mariners announced that Mariners TV will bring Mariners Baseball to fans across television and streaming services throughout the region...in-market streaming will be available on Mariners.TV for \$99.99/season or \$19.99/month...Mariners TV is available across major providers including Xfinity, DIRECTV, Fubo, Spectrum and more...fans can use the channel finder tool on **Mariners.com/watch** to find providers in their area.

GILBERT RUNS IT BACK ON OPENING DAY...Logan Gilbert is set to make his second-consecutive Opening Day start...on last year's Opening Day against the Athletics, Logan turned in a gem, allowing just 1 run on 2 hits (1 HR) with 8 strikeouts over 7.0 innings...Gilbert became the first Mariners pitcher to record 8+ strikeouts and no walks in an Opening Day start...he became the first Seattle hurler to record 8+ K's on Opening Day since Félix Hernández (10 K) on April 6, 2015.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE...the Mariners were 51-30 (.630) at T-Mobile Park in 2025, the 6th-best home record in MLB and 2nd-best in the AL...Seattle was also an MLB-best 26-9 (.743) at home after the All-Star Break, which included a franchise-record tying 11-consecutive wins at home (Aug. 27- Sept. 25) matching the mark set from May 20-June 8, 2001.

FIVE MORE YEARS OF NAYLZ...first baseman **Josh Naylor** signed a 5-year contract through the 2030 season on Nov. 17, 2025 to remain in Seattle...Naylor was originally acquired by the Mariners from the Diamondbacks prior to the trade deadline on July 24, 2025...in 54 regular season games after the trade, Naylor hit .299 (58x194) with 32 runs, 10 doubles, 9 home runs, 33 RBI and went 19-for-19 in stolen base attempts, getting on base at a .341 clip and slugging .490 (.831 OPS)...in 11 Postseason games, he hit .340 with 3 home runs, 5 RBI and a .966 OPS.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...Julio Rodríguez is entering his 5th Major League season in 2026...through his first 4 Major League seasons, J-Rod is batting .274 (654x2384) with 368 runs, 110 doubles, 9 triples, 112 home runs, 341 RBI and 116 stolen bases with a .331 OBP, slugging .469 for a .800 OPS and a 130 OPS+, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...among centerfielders through their first 4 seasons, Rodríguez ranks 2nd in home runs, trailing only Joe DiMaggio (137 HR) and 3rd in bWAR (22.9), trailing only Mike Trout (27.6) and DiMaggio (27.1)?...Julio finished 6th in AL MVP voting in 2025 after recording 32 home runs, 30 stolen bases, 95 RBI, a .798 OPS and 6.8 bWAR in 160 games.

- **2000** - The Kingdome, which was the home of the Mariners from 1977-June 27, 1999, is demolished.
- **2025** - the Mariners announced they extended catcher **Cal Raleigh** to a 6-year contract through the 2030 season.

ABOUT LOGAN GILBERT...

- Gilbert, 28, is making first start of the 2026 season and his 2nd consecutive and 2nd career Opening Day start.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Rob Mummau on June 16, 2018.
- Spent 3 seasons at Stetson (FL) University, 2016-18...in 2017, was ASUN Pitcher of the Year and ASUN 1st-Team All-Conference.
- Named the 2022 and the 2024 Mariners Most Valuable Pitcher by the Seattle Chapter of the BBWAA.
- Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2024.

2025 TOTALS...in 25 regular season starts, went 6-6 with a 3.44 ERA (50 ER, 131.0 IP) with 173 strikeouts and 31 walks, posting a 1.031 WHIP...led the Majors in strikeouts-per-nine innings (11.89), and ranked 2nd in strikeout rate (32.3%) during the regular season (min. 100.0 IP).

WHERE IT RANKS...his 11.9 SO/9 last season is the 4th-best mark among starters in a single season in Mariners history (trailing Randy Johnson's 1995, '97, '98 seasons) while his 9.5 career SO/9 ratio is tied for the 2nd-best in franchise history (min. 500 IP), alongside James Paxton, trailing Randy Johnson's 10.6 career SO/9 mark.

LAST YEAR'S DEBUT...made his first career Opening Day start last season on March 27 vs. ATH, tossing seven innings of 1-run baseball, with 8 strikeouts while allowing 2 hits, no walks.

- Joined Félix Hernández (2015) and Randy Johnson (1994) as 1 of 3 pitchers in franchise history to have pitched 7.0+ innings while giving up 2-or-fewer hits on Opening Day.
- Became the 4th pitcher (done 8x) in franchise history to allow 1-or-fewer runs over 7+ innings on Opening Day, joining Félix Hernández (2007, '09, '12, '13, '15), Randy Johnson (1993) and Robbie Ray (2022).
- Tied for 3rd-most strikeouts (8) in an Opening Day debut in franchise history, alongside Erik Hanson (1991).

HOME SWEET HOME...his 2.24 home ERA (17 ER, 68.1 IP) across 13 starts last season ranks 5th-best in Mariners history (min. 13 GS) while his 0.761 WHIP ranked best in franchise history and his 13.30 strikeouts-per-nine innings was second to Randy Johnson's 13.66 SO/9 mark in 1997.

HOT START...is 7-2 with a 2.32 career ERA (31 ER, 120.1 IP) and 144 strikeouts across 21 starts in March/April...his 144 strikeouts in the opening month of the season ranks 5th-most in Mariners history.

2025 POSTSEASON...went 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA (7 ER, 15.0 IP), striking out 14 batters and allowing 19 hits (2 HR) and 3 walks... tossed 2.0 innings of scoreless relief in Game 5 of the ALDS against the Tigers at T-Mobile Park, in the 3-2 win that lasted 15 innings...marked Gilbert's first career professional relief appearance.

BATTLED BACK...fought through a right elbow flexor strain last season, keeping him on the 15-day Injured List from April 26-June 15 with the injury, which included 3 Major League rehab starts with Triple-A Tacoma.

DOWN IN THE DESERT...finished 2026 Spring Training with a 2.38 ERA (3 ER, 11.1 IP) across four starts, allowing 11 hits, 1 home run, and 6 walks while striking out 12 batters.

AMONG THE LEAGUE...his 884 strikeouts since 2021 lead the American League while his 835.1 innings pitched are 3rd most in the AL across that span.

CAREER DAY...set career-highs with 13 strikeouts and 25 swings and misses on Aug. 24 vs. Athletics...surpassed previous marks of 12 strikeouts (8/8/23 vs. SD) and 22 swings-and-misses (done 2x, last: 4/1 vs. DET).

TRIO OF SORTS...was 1 of 3 Mariners to toss 13+ strikeouts with 1-or-fewer walks in a game last season, joining Bryan Woo (13 SO and 1 BB, 9/13 vs. LAA) and George Kirby (2x, last: 14 SO, 0 BB, 7/14 vs. LAA)...they are the first trio to do so in Mariners history and are also the first team in MLB to have 3 different players toss 13+ strikeouts with 1-or-fewer walks in a game since the 2018 Astros.

PLENTY OF PUNCHIES...tossed 7+ strikeouts in 15 of his 25 starts last season, doing so in 5 consecutive starts to begin the season (3/27-4/19)...also tossed 10+ strikeouts in 4 games last season (last: 8/24 vs. ATH)...his 9 career games with 10+ strikeouts are tied with Mike Moore for the 5th-most such games in Mariners history, trailing James Paxton (11), Mark Langston (28), Félix Hernández (35), Randy Johnson (94).

AMONG THE GREATS...his 3.58 career ERA (332 ER, 835.1 IP) is 6th-best among starters in Mariners history (min. 500 IP), trailing Randy Johnson, Félix Hernández, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton who each hold a 3.42 career ERA, and Luis Castillo (3.46)...his 884 career strikeouts are 6th-most in Mariners history.
