THE HUNT FOR A RED OCTOBER: The Cardinals begin their final regular season road trip (CHI-4, ARI-3) tonight, as they open a four-game series at Wrigley Field...the Cardinals posted a 5-1 win over Washington yesterday afternoon, taking 2-of-3 from the Nationals to improve to 20-games over .500 (49-29) at Busch Stadium...the Cardinals have 10 games remaining (seven against the Cubs) and entered play today in first place in the NL Central, 3.0 games ahead of the Cubs & Brewers.

SERIOUS SEVEN: According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last time teams in the same division played each other at least seven times in their last 10 games of a season with one team in first place and the other team no more than three-games back was 1996 (Sept. 19-29) when the 1st place Dodgers, holding a 1/2-game lead in the NL West, played seven of their last 10 against the Padres.

RIVALRY RARITY: This year's schedule marks the first time the Cardinals and Cubs have squared off this many times over the final 10 games when both teams were at the top of the division. The two rivals played seven of the final eight against each other in 1951, and seven of their last 10 in 1950, but neither team was in contention in either of those seasons.

WRIGLEY NIGHTS: The Cardinals and Cubs are scheduled to play their 66th night game all-time at the Friendly Confines tonight since lights were installed in 1988...the Cubs have a 42-23 edge over the Cards in night games at Wrigley.

NOT SO FRIENDLY: The Cardinals are 0-6 at Wrigley this season, and have lost seven-straight dating to 2018, their longest losing stretch in Chicago since dropping eight straight (September 18, 2005-July 30, 2006)...St. Louis' record for consecutive losses in Chicago to open a season series (April 11-June 26, 1907 at West Side Park) was eight games.

TIME TO FLY: After a five-game losing streak on a West Coast trip to Oakland and Los Angeles-NL (August 3-7), the Cardinals are 27-12 since August 9, leading Major League Baseball in wins while boasting a MLB-best 2.90 ERA...the Cardinals lead the N.L. in winning pct. (.41-23; .641) since the All-Star break.

TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS: The Cardinals are 41-28 in divisional play, including a 26-11 (.703) mark since the All-Star Break...their .594 divisional win pct. leads all NL Central clubs and the 41 wins equals last year's win total.

TURN TWO: **Kolten Wong** turned his 103rd DP yesterday, four shy of his career-high 107 in 2015...the Cardinals highest total since 2000 by a 2nd baseman was 108 by **Mark Grudzielanek** in 2005...**Paul DeJong's** Major League-leading 109 DP's are ranked 4th all-time among Cardinals shortstops, with **David Eckstein** (2005) holding the top mark with 123.

MOLINA MILESTONES: **Yadier Molina's** appearance at catcher yesterday tied him with **Brad Ausmus** (1,938) for 7th all-time in Major League history. On Tuesday night, Molina recorded his 378th career double to pass **Joe Medwick** for 4th place all-time in Cardinals history, and also became the 5th Cardinal in franchise history to reach 100 or more hits in 12 seasons. Molina is one double away from tying **Jorge Posada** (379) for 9th all-time in MLB history among primary catchers, and two extra-base hits shy from tying **Ted Simmons** (541) for 10th all-time in Cardinals history.

RUNNIN' REDBIRDS: The Cardinals (111-for-138) lead the NL in stolen bases this season, four more than 2nd place Washington (107). Their 80.4% SB success rate (T3rd in NL) currently stands as the highest all-time in franchise history since 1951 (*STATS LLC*)...19 different Cardinals have stolen at least one base, most in MLB and T5th-most in franchise history (record held by 1906 club with 21 Cardinals)...St. Louis has stolen multiple bases in 30 games (1st in MLB).

A WINNING TRADITION: The Cardinals have posted their 12th consecutive winning season (2008-19), something they'd done just once previously in franchise history when they compiled 15 consecutive winning seasons from 1939-53. Only the Yankees (27 seasons) sport a longer active consecutive winning season streak in Major League Baseball.

CHICAGO CONNECTIONS

Dexter Fowler played two seasons (2015-16) with Chicago...member of 2016 World Series champions...initially became a Cub via trade by the Astros for **Dan Straily** and **Luis Valbuena** (Jan. 19, 2005).

Paul DeJong graduated from Antioch (Ill.) Comm. High School...played college baseball at Illinois State University (2013-15) while majoring in biochemistry and pre-medicine.

Daniel Ponce de Leon was selected by the Cubs in the 14th round of the 2013 MLB Draft after his junior season, but failed his physical due to concerns about the ulnar nerve placement in his right elbow.

Kolten Wong (August 13, 2016 at Wrigley Field), **Dakota Hudson** (July 28, 2018 at Busch Stadium), **Tyler O'Neill** (April 19, 2018 at Wrigley Field), **Andrew Knizner** (June 2, 2019 at Busch Stadium), and **Tommy Edman** (June 8 2019 at Wrigley Field) all made MLB debuts against the Cubs.

John Brebbia earned his first Major League win against Chicago (June 17, 2018).

Mike Maddux's younger brother, **Greg Maddux**, was a Hall of Fame pitcher for Chicago for parts of 10 seasons (1986-92, '04-06)...originally selected by the Cubs in the 2nd round of the 1984 MLB draft.

Jason Heyward played the 2015 season with St. Louis...originally traded by Atlanta with pitcher **Jordan Walden** to St. Louis for pitchers **Tyrell Jenkins** & **Shelby Miller** (Nov. 17, 2014).

As compensation for the departure of Heyward signing with the Cubs, **Dakota Hudson** was selected by St. Louis with the 34th overall pick in the first round of the 2016 MLB draft.

Daniel Descalso played parts of five seasons in a Cardinals uniform (2010-14)...appeared in 44 postseason games and was a member of the 2011 World Champion Cardinals...originally selected by St. Louis in the 3rd round of the 2007 MLB Draft.

Steve Cishek appeared in 27 games with St. Louis in 2015...originally traded by the Marlins to St. Louis for **Kyle Barraclough** (July 24, 2015).

Rowan Wick was selected by St. Louis as a catcher in the 9th round of the 2012 MLB draft...played/pitched six minor league seasons in the Cardinals organization before selected off waivers by San Diego (Feb. 16, 2018).

Cardinals broadcaster and Hall of Fame outfielder **Jim Edmonds** played part of 2008 with the Cubs.

Cubs Bullpen Coach **Lester Strode** pitched for the Triple-A Louisville Redbirds (1987-88) in the Cardinals' minor league organization.

Cubs Director, Player Development **Jaron Madison** previously served as the Cardinals Assistant Director of Scouting (2008-09).

Cubs Catching Coach **Mike Borzello** played four seasons (1991-94) in the Cardinals minor league system...originally selected by St. Louis in 1991.

Cardinals VP/General Manager **Michael Girsch** is a Chicago native...graduated from the University of Notre Dame and the University of Chicago.

TONIGHT’S GAME

- Makes his 31st start of the season and his 64th career start (65th appearance).
- Has established single-season career highs in wins (10), innings pitched (174.1), strikeouts (206), quality starts (17) and games started (30).
- Is the 8th different Cardinal (19th instance) and youngest in franchise history to strike out 200 or more batters in a season.
- Struck out 10 in his last two starts (Sept. 8-present), his 4th double-digit strikeout game of the season and 7th career. His 7 games with 10+ strikeouts in his first 64 games ties Alan Benes (1995-97) for the Cardinals record.
- Ranks 2nd among NL pitchers with 194 strikeouts Post All-Star Break over the last two seasons (2018-19) behind only Jacob deGrom (221).
- His 408 career strikeouts are most by a Cardinal in their first 64 career appearances and rank 12th-most in National League history.
- Sports the lowest ERA (1.05) in Major League Baseball since the All-Star Break (12 GS). It’s the majors 5th-lowest single-season post All-Star ERA all-time.
- Has allowed just six earned runs in his last 71.0 innings (0.76 ERA).

Over a 12-start span from July 7-Sept. 8, went 6-2 with 0.80 ERA (7 ER/78.1 IP) and .146 opp. BA. Since ERA became an official stat in 1913, the only other pitchers in MLB history to have a sub-1.00 ERA and sub-.150 opp. BA over a single-season 12-start span Jake Arrieta (2015) & Chris Sale (2018).

Named N.L. Pitcher of the Month for August, becoming the first Cardinal to win the award since Adam Wainwright (Sept. 2014). Went 4-1 with 0.71 ERA in his six August starts.

LAST TIME OUT

- Allowed three runs in 6.0 frames in a 5-2 loss to the Brewers last Saturday (9/14) at Busch Stadium. Struck out 10 for the second straight outing. Became the youngest and 8th different Cardinal (19th instance) to strike out 200 or more batters in a season.

- His 5th start against the Cubs in 2019 matches MIL for most against any opponent.
- Allowed one hit with nine strikeouts over 7.0 scoreless innings in his last start vs. the Cubs in a 8-0 win. Carried a no-hitter 17 outs into the game before Nicholas Castellanos broke up the bid with a two-out single in the 6th inning.
- Has struck out 7 or more batters in five of his seven career starts vs. the Cubs.
- Limiting the Cubs to a .176 average against, trailing only John Tudor’s .170 (13 G, 12 GS) for 2nd-lowest all-time among Cardinals (minimum six starts).
- Threw 5.0 innings allowing one run on two hits and struck out nine (110 pitches) in an 18-5 rout of the Cubs while pitching opposite Jon Lester (7/20/18).
- Came away with a ND in last start (6/8) at Wrigley after receiving four runs in the 1st inn., before the Cubs rallied for nine unanswered in his 2nd-shortest start of the year.
