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## Detroit Tigers (47-54) at Chicago Cubs (57-44)

**WHERE THE RUBBER MEETS THE ROAD:** The Detroit Tigers and Chicago Cubs tonight play the rubber match of their three-game series after the Tigers picked up an 8-6, 10-inning win in the first game on Monday and the Cubs returned the favor with an 11-2 win last night at Wrigley Field ... tomorrow the Tigers begin a seven-game homestand against the Kansas City Royals (four games) and the Baltimore Orioles (three games starting Monday).

- The Tigers tonight aim for a series victory and winning road trip after starting the trek by taking two of three games at the Angels ... with a win tonight, the Tigers would notch a fourth road series win in a row for the first time since May 1-June 1, 2025 (five road series wins in a row).
- Despite last night's setback, the Tigers have won 12 of their last 17 and 17 of their last 27 games ... the Tigers are 25-16 (.610) in their last 41 games starting June 1, the second-best record in the A.L. and tied with the Cubs for the fourth-best mark in baseball in this span.

**WAR TIME:** The Tigers have four players with a 2.8 fWAR or better this season: Dillon Dingler (4.6), Kevin McGonigle (4.0), Riley Greene (2.8) and Casey Mize (2.8) ... the Tigers are the only A.L. team and one of only two teams in all of baseball with four players owning a 2.8 fWAR or better this year, joining the Los Angeles Dodgers with five such players.

**IT'S GOOD FOR SOMETHING:** 21-year-old Kevin McGonigle boasts a 4.8 bWAR this season, the second-best mark by any position player in the A.L. (just behind recently I.L.'d Bobby Witt Jr., 4.9 bWAR) and the fourth-best mark by any position player in the majors.

- Meanwhile, Dillon Dingler boasts a 4.6 fWAR this season, the fourth-best mark by a position player in baseball and tied for fifth-best overall ... there's no other catcher in Dingler's orbit in all of baseball as the next closest backstop is Shea Langeliers with a 2.7 fWAR.

**GREENE STREAK:** Riley Greene has reached 15 home runs for the third-straight season, only the second Tigers left-handed hitter to do so since Comerica Park opened in 2000 and the first since Chicago-native Curtis Granderson did so in four seasons in a row from 2006-09 ... Greene is only the seventh Tigers lefty to reach 15 homers, 20 doubles and 50 RBI in at least three-straight seasons in the last 50 years starting in 1976, the first since Granderson (also 2006-09).

**ON THE DOUBLE:** Dillon Dingler (21 doubles), Riley Greene (20 doubles) and Kevin McGonigle (20 doubles) have all reached 20 doubles this season, making the Tigers the only team in the A.L. with three players with at least 20 doubles so far this year ... in all of baseball, only the San Francisco Giants, with four players, have surpassed the Tigers' feat thus far in 2026.

**THE FULL MONTY:** Keider Montero makes his 16th start of the season tonight as he looks to bookend this road trip with a pair of wins, as Montero earned the victory with 3.1 innings of scoreless relief in Detroit's 2-1 win last Friday at the Los Angeles Angels ... Montero will join Tampa Bay's Griffin Jax, who is also starting tonight, as the only pitchers in baseball with at least 16 starts and at least six relief appearances this season.

- Montero is tied for the team lead with six wins this season ... the only Tiger in the last 35 years to finish a season leading the team in wins while making six or more relief appearances?: Alex Lange, who tied for the team lead with seven wins in 2022 (71 relief outings, zero starts).

**NO PANIC! AT THE DISH, OH?:** Dillon Dingler leads the A.L. with 31 RBI with two strikes this year, three shy of Cincinnati's Sal Stewart (34 RBI) for tops in the majors ... Dingler's 11 homers with two strikes rank second in the A.L. behind only Houston's Yordan Alvarez with 15 ... Dingler's .440 slugging percentage with two strikes ranks third in all of baseball ... Dingler also leads the majors with 34 two-out RBI this season.

**HORSE SHOES, HAND GRENADES, TIGERS GAMES:** The Tigers have seen a plethora of games - 46 - decided by two runs or less with the club going 13-33 ... the 33 such losses are the most in baseball while the 13 wins are the fewest in baseball despite the club tying for the 11th-most such games in baseball ... the Tigers are 35-21 in games decided by three runs or more.

- The Tigers are 10-14 in games decided by two runs or less at home ... the Tigers are 3-19 in games decided by two runs or less on the road (including two wins this road trip, double their pre-All-Star Break total), a .136 win percentage, the lowest in baseball.

**IT HAS BEEN A GRIND:** Through their first 26 games of 2026, the Tigers went 14-12 and woke up on April 24 with a share of first place in the A.L. Central ... in 75 games since, the Tigers have gone 33-42 to drop to 47-54 and fourth place in the division ... Detroit's 33-42 (.440) record starting April 24 is the seventh-lowest winning percentage in baseball in this span.

- Despite going 25-16 starting June 1, the Tigers have lost 29 of their last 56 games, 32 of their last 60 games and 37 of their last 66 games starting May 4.

**AND FINALLY:** Keider Montero tonight becomes only the third Tigers pitcher in the last 60 years to make at least 16 starts with at least six relief appearances in a season by the end of July, joining Anibal Sanchez in 2016 (16 GS + 8 relief outings) and Dan Petry in 1990 (19 GS + 6 relief outings).

- He and Colin Rea, tonight’s starter for the Cubs, are two of just three pitchers in MLB this year to start at least 15 games and record at least one save.
- Has gone back-and-forth between starting and reliever this year, starting each of his first 13 games before one relief appearance, two starts and five more relief outings before tonight’s start...in his last two starts (June 21 & 26), he went 7.0 innings in each game, allowing three total earned runs...has seven quality starts this year and three consecutive.
- Tossed 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing just one hit while striking out five on July 17 against the Angels...earned his sixth win of the year and second out of relief.
- Earned a three inning save on July 4 against Texas, walking one batter over his otherwise spotless frames, needing just 36 pitches to close out the game.
- Returned to the bullpen on July 1 against the Yankees, tossing two scoreless frames to earn the win...spun a scoreless bottom of the 10th inning to keep the game tied, and closed it out with a scoreless 11th frame.
- Made a relief appearance for Detroit on June 16 at Houston, getting tagged with the loss...was his first relief appearance of the season.
- Allowed just two hits over six scoreless innings while walking one and striking out seven on April 10 against Miami, earning his first win of the season.
- Optioned to Toledo to begin the 2026 season...made just one start for the Mud Hens prior to getting recalled on April 4.
- Pitched in two games (one start) for Team Venezuela in the 2026 World Baseball Classic...allowed two earned runs on five hits and three walks while striking out three over 4.1 frames.
- Did not allow an earned run in three games (5.1 innings) in the playoffs with Detroit last year...went 5-3 with a 4.37 ERA in 20 regular season games (12 starts), allowing 44 earned runs on 95 hits and 31 walks compared to 72 strikeouts over his 90.2 innings.
- Began the 2025 season with Triple-A Toledo, going 1-1 with a 2.79 ERA in his two starts...allowed three runs on six hits and one walk while striking out 11 over 9.2 innings.
- Saw his first Major League action in 2024, appearing in 19 games (16 starts) with Detroit, going 6-6 with a 4.76 ERA (52ER/98.1IP) and 77 strikeouts...made his Major League debut on May 29 against Pittsburgh.

- Named to the first All-Star game of his career this year, becoming the first Tigers catcher to make the team in 15 years (since Alex Avila in 2011) and only the sixth Tigers catcher in the last 50 years.
- Entering play on July 2, has a career-best 19 home runs and 59 RBI to go along with 18 doubles and two triples through 80 games this season...Dingler is only the third player in the 126-season history of the Tigers franchise to reach those totals within his first 80 games of a season, joining Hank Greenberg (3x, 1935, 1937 and 1946) and Rocky Colavito (1961), and is the only player in all of baseball to have reached those totals so far this season.
- Notched his 34th RBI with two outs this season on June 23, the most in the majors this year...in the last 50 years, only one Tiger has recorded more two-out RBI prior to the All-Star Break: Miguel Cabrera and his 37 RBI with two outs in 2013 amidst his second of back-to-back MVP campaign.
