**TAKE A WALK ON THE WILD SIDE:** Tue's 4-2 loss vs **Pit** coupled with **NYM**'s 9-7 win at **Chc** dropped the Reds 1.0 game off the pace for the NL's final Wild Card spot...it also tied them with **AZ** (-1.0)...**NYM**, **Cin**, **AZ**, **StL**, and **Mia** all lost yesterday/last night...**SF** and **StL** are idle today.

- The **Mets**, Reds (-1.0), **Diamondbacks** (-1.0), **Giants** (-3.5), **Cardinals** (-3.5), and **Marlins** (-4.0) enter today's games vying for the National League's final Wild Card spot...the **Giants**, **Cardinals** and **Marlins** will be eliminated from the race with their next loss or **Mets'** win.
- The Reds entered Tue's game tied with **NYM** for that coveted third Wild Card spot...it marked the first time after the All-Star break that the Reds held a Postseason position.
- Cin owns the head-to-head tiebreakers over **NYM** and **AZ**.
- The Redlegs climbed to within a half-game of that final spot on 8/22 before losing 10 of 13 and falling 6.0 games off the pace.
- Had been "the first team out" until they were leapfrogged in the Wild Card standings by both **SF** and **AZ** during a 3-11 run.
- Since the 5-4 loss vs **NYM** on 9/5 (Cin had the bases loaded with no outs in the 9th inning), the Reds have gone 10-7 while the **Mets** have posted are 5-12 mark over that same span.

**HARD TO SWALLOW:** Last night's 11-inning 4-3 loss vs **Pit** marked just the third time this season in which the Reds produced 14 base runners but only 3 runs or fewer (8/2 vs **Atl** 14, runners/ 2 runs & 7/11 vs **Col**, 14 runners/2 runs).

- Last night dropped to 3-12 (.200) in extra-inning games...haven't finished a full-season with a winning pct. that low in extra-inning affairs since 1959 (2-8, .200).
- Have played the T77th-most extra-inning games this season (15g) and scored the T2nd-fewest runs in extra-innings (9r)...only the **Rockies** (6g, 4r) have scored fewer runs after regulation.
- Are 21-22 (.488) in 1-run games this season and 36-50 (.419) in such games since the beginning of last year.

**SERIES NOTES:** The Reds today are trying to avoid being swept by **Pit** for the first time since 4/20-4/23, 2023 in the **Steel City** (4g)...Cin hasn't been swept by the **Pirates** here at **Great American Ball Park** since 9/12-9/14, 2022 (4g).

- In the last meeting between the Reds and **Pirates**, the division rivals split a 4-game series at **PNC Park** from 8/7-8/10...Cin lost 2 of 3 at **Pit** from 5/19-5/21 but swept the **Pirates** in 3 games at **Great American Ball Park** in their first meeting (4/11-4/13)...it was Cin's first sweep of **Pit** since 8/5-8/8, 2021 at **GABP** (4g).
- Cin has played the **Pirates** 507 times since both teams became charter members of the **National League Central** in 1994 (263-244, .519), more than any other **Pit** opponent.
- Cin owns a 105-87 record all-time vs **Pit** at **Great American Ball Park**...the Reds and **Pirates** played the first regular-season game at **GABP** on 3/31/03 (10-1 **Pirates** triumph).
- The 2-0 loss at **Pit** on 4/23/23 was the Reds' 100th loss at **PNC Park**...are 98-109 overall there...the Reds and **Pirates** played the first regular-season game at **PNC Park** on 4/9/01 (8-2 Reds triumph).
- The Redlegs have lost 45 of the last 66 and 14 of the last 21 games they've played at **PNC Park**, including an 11-game losing streak spanning 9/3/18 to 9/27/19 and an 8-game losing streak to begin the 2019 season (4/4-9/27, 2019).

**LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in the decision in the 7-4 win on 9/19 vs Chc (4.2ip, 9h, 4r/4er, 2bb, 7k, 94TP).

- Eclipsed 400 career innings.
- Allowed 11 batters to reach, his most since 5/3 vs Wsh (14).
- Allowed 2 homers in this game and 5 over his last 2 starts after having given up just 2 HR over his previous 7 starts.
- Was his sixth straight app without a quality start...hasn't posted a quality start or reached 6.0 innings pitched since his complete-game shutout on 7/23 at Wsh.

**SEPTEMBER 14 at ATH:** Suffered the 7-4 loss on 9/14 at Ath (5.1ip, 8h, 5r/5er, 0bb, 5k, 3hr, 91TP).

- His homerless streak was ended at 16.0 innings (Jacob Wilson, solo HR in the 4th inning)...his 3 home runs allowed matched a career high (also: 4/18/23 vs TB).
- Retired his first 6 batters.

**SEPTEMBER 8 at SD:** Did not factor in the decision in the 10-inning 4-3 loss on 9/8 at SD (5.0ip, 2h, 0r/0er, 1bb, 2k, 79TP).

- Marked the sixth time this season he's posted an outing of 5.0 or more scoreless innings...was the 10th such outing of his career.
- Was his third straight homereless app.
- Allowed just 3 of his 18 batters to reach base.
- Gave up just 2 hard-hit balls (balls in play at or above 95mph).
- Was the 16th time this year he allowed fewer than 2 walks.

**SCRATCHED ON 9/2 vs TOR:** Did not make his scheduled start on 9/2 vs Tor due to illness.

**AUGUST 27 at LAD:** Suffered the 5-1 loss on 8/27 at LAD (4.2ip, 5h, 4r/4er, 1bb, 6k, 76TP).

- Was activated earlier in the day from the 15-day IL (left index finger blister).
- Retired each of his first 9 batters until Shohei Ohtani led off the 4th inning with a single...allowed 6 batters to reach in that inning...was replaced by Scott Barlow with 1 on and 2 outs in the 5th inning.
- Had not walked any of his last 148 hitters batting 7,8,9 in the order until his 4th inning intentional walk to No. 7 hitter Miguel Rojas...he had last walked a batter at the bottom of the order on 8/22/24 when he issued a 5th-inning free pass to Pit's Jared Triolo, the Pirates' #7 hitter.

**AUGUST 4 at CHC (INJURED):** Faced 5 batters and threw 23 pitches before he left the 8/4 game at Chc with a blister on his left index finger..was placed on the 15-day IL the next day.

- Didn't allow a run over 1.2 perfect innings (1k).

**JULY 29 vs LAD:** Did not factor in the decision in the 5-4 loss on 7/29 vs LAD (5.1ip, 6h, 2r/2er, 1bb, 11k, 1hr, 94TP).

- Was his 22nd start of the season, a new career high.
- His 11 strikeouts were a season high.
- Ran his consecutive scoreless innings streak to 15 until it was snapped by a 2nd-inning 2-run HR by Tommy Edman.
- Struck out all 3 batters he faced in the 1st inning, marking the third time this season he fanned all 3 batters he faced in an inning, the 11th time in his career.
- His 5.13 strikeout-to-walk ratio (123k/24bb) is the highest mark by a Reds pitcher through his first 22 starts of a season since 1893 (*courtesy Elias*).
- Was in line for the 4-2 win but fell victim to Graham Ashcraft's blown save...left the game in the 6th inning after inducing a leadoff groundout from Freddie Freeman.

Has issued 2 walks or fewer in each of his 27 starts this season, the second-longest streak by a Reds pitcher to begin a season since 1900, behind only Paul Derringer (30g) in 1940 (*Elias*).

CAREER HIGHS

- Has reached career highs this season with 27 starts, 149.1 innings, and 144 Ks .
- Needs 1 more win to match that career high.

DOUBLE-DIGIT DIPSY-DOODLES

On 7/29 vs LAD, collected his sixth career double-digit strikeout game, fourth-most by a Cin left-handed pitcher since the mound moved to its current distance in 1893, behind Reds Hall of Famers Johnny Vander Meer (16), Joe Nuxhall (10), and Don Gullett (7).

400 STRIKEOUTS

Collected his 400th career strikeout on 7/18 at NYM (Juan Soto, 3rd inning)...became the third-fastest Reds pitcher by appearances (67g) to reach the 400-strikeout mark since 1893, behind only teammate Hunter Greene (59g) and Luis Castillo (66g).

PERSONAL:

- Graduated from Damien High School in La Verne, CA, the same school attended by **Mark McGwire**, rock guitarist **Buckethead** and former Reds pitcher **Frank Pastore**.
- As a junior at Texas Christian University in 2019 was named second team All-American and first team All-Big 12.
