That day, the Braves swept the Miami Marlins at home, winning 6-1 and 9-1 at Truist Park, with Game 1 starting at 1:35 and Game 2 at 7:35.

Atlanta only played one doubleheader in 2019, on April 20 at Cleveland, but that was a traditional format.

Teams all played seven-inning traditional doubleheaders in 2020 and 2021.

TODAY'S GAMES: The Braves and Mets continue a five-game series with the 10th and 11th of 19 meetings between the clubs this season...The teams will meet a week from Monday in Atlanta for another four-game series...That will mark the last time the clubs will meet until the penultimate series of the season, September 30-October 2.

A The Braves and Mets also played a five-game series here last season, July 26-29, with Atlanta taking three of the games in the set...Today's doubleheader comes after Atlanta's originally scheduled first trip to New York, April 4-5, was canceled due to the lockout.

A The clubs last met July 11-13 for three games in Atlanta with the Mets taking two-of-three.

A The Braves went 10-9 against the Mets last season, taking the season set from their NL East rivals for the fourth consecutive season...The Braves are now 45-31 (.592) over this stretch, which began in 2018...They went 7-3 in 2020, 11-8 in 2019 and 13-6 in 2018.

A RHP Jake Odorizzi is 0-1 with a 3.18 ERA (4 ER/11.1 IP) in two career games, both starts, against the Mets...The 32-year-old righty last faced the Mets in 2019 while with Minnesota, going 4.2 innings and allowing three runs, earned, in a 9-6 loss here in New York...His other start came while with Tampa Bay in 2015.

A LHP Max Fried is set to face the Mets for the 19th time in his career tonight and for the 14th time as a starter...The 28-year-old lefty is 5-4 with a 2.85 ERA (25 ER/79.0 IP) against the Mets, and has not allowed more than two runs in any of his last seven starts against them, dating to the start of the 2020 season...Fried matched up with RHP Max Scherzer in his last start against the Mets, a 4-1 loss on July 11 in Atlanta.

A LHP David Peterson is 2-3 with a 5.40 ERA (18 ER/30.0 IP) in six career games, all starts, against the Braves...The 26-year-old lefty has both of his wins against the Braves here at Citi Field, where he owns a 3.27 ERA (4 ER/11.0 IP) against the Braves...In Atlanta, he is 0-3 with a 6.63 ERA (14 ER/19.0 IP).

A RHP Max Scherzer is 11-9 with a 3.77 ERA (69 ER/164.2 IP) in 28 career games, 26 starts, against the Braves...The 38-year-old righty beat LHP Max Fried and Atlanta earlier this season at Truist Park, going 7.0 innings and allowing one run, earned, with nine strikeouts.

WIN: The Braves avoided their first three-game losing streak of the season last night, beating New York, 9-6... Atlanta scored the first eight runs of the game and then hung on to move 21 games over .500.

A The Braves improved to 25-1 (.962) this season when they lead after the first inning...That is the best such record in the majors and the fewest such losses...The Dodgers, Orioles, Pirates and Marlins all have four such losses.

DOUBLEHEADER: The Braves are set for their second doubleheader of the season today...Their first also came here at Citi Field on May 3, and New York swept both games, 5-4 and 3-0.

A Atlanta's last doubleheader in 2021 also came here in New York, which they split, winning Game 1, 2-0 and losing Game 2, 1-0.

A The Braves played six different doubleheaders last season, the most for the club in a single season since the team played eight in 1990.

A Atlanta went 5-7 in doubleheader games last season, getting swept in two, sweeping one and splitting the other three.

A The 1945 Braves team played 46 doubleheaders to set the franchise record for most in a single season.

DEBUT: RHP Jake Odorizzi is set to make his Braves debut today after the club acquired him from Houston on August 2 from Houston in exchange for LHP Will Smith.

A Odorizzi is set to become the third of four Braves players acquired via trade this month to debut for the team...OF Robbie Grossman doubled in his only at-bat with team so far, while RHP Raisel Iglesias tossed a scoreless eighth inning yesterday with two strikeouts in his first appearance with the club.

A The other acquisition, INF Ehire Adrianza, has yet to play for the team this season, but was with the club during its World Series run last season.

A Odorizzi is set to become the 227th pitcher to start a game for the Braves since the team moved to Atlanta in 1966...RHP Phil Niekro holds the Atlanta-era record with 594 starts for the club.

ACUÑA JR.: OF Ronald Acuña Jr. collected a career high-tying four hits last night, a game after snapping a career-long homerless drought with a drive out to center field.

A Acuña Jr.'s five hits over the last two games match his amount from his previous seven games.

A Since making his season debut on April 28, Acuña Jr. has had 42 pitches that were out of the zone called strikes on him...That total is the second most in the National League over this stretch, and one off the lead of Jurickson Profar.

HARRIS II: OF Michael Harris hit his 10th home run of the season out to left field last night...Yesterday marked Harris II's 60th career game, and that tied 1B Earl Torgeson for the 14th fewest amount of games to double-digit homers in the franchise's modern era (since 1900).

A 3B Austin Riley holds the modern-era record, reaching double-digit homers in 26 games.

A Harris is batting .333 (16-for-48) with two home runs and five stolen bases over his last 14 games.

Today's Game

- A* Set to make his Braves debut with today's start...Is his 13th start of the season, the 228th turn of his career and his 232nd career appearance.
- A* Was acquired by Atlanta from the Houston Astros on Tuesday in exchange for LHP Will Smith.
 - A* Went 4-3 with a 3.75 ERA (25 ER/60.0 IP) in 12 games, all starts, for the Astros this season.
 - A* He missed 42 games with a lower left leg injury from May 17-July 4, but since returning to the Houston rotation went 1-1 with a 4.45 ERA (14 ER/28.1 IP) in five starts.
 - A* In his latest outing on July 31 vs. Seattle, allowed two hits over 7.0 shutout innings.
- A* Has made just two career starts against New York, and is 0-1 with a 3.18 ERA (4 ER/11.1 IP)...Last faced them in 2019 while with Minnesota.
 - A* Started that game here at Citi Field, April 10, 2019 with the Twins, and took the loss after allowing just one hit in 4.2 innings, but walking four and yielding three runs...The Mets beat the Twins, 9-6.
- A* Has played his entire career in the American League, appearing with Kansas City, Tampa Bay, Minnesota and Houston...In 30 career starts against the National League, all of which have come in interleague play, is 11-7 with a 3.50 ERA (62 ER/159.1 IP).
- A* Makes his sixth daytime start of the season, and is undefeated during the day...Is 2-0 with a 2.54 ERA (8 ER/28.1 IP) in day games.
 - A* Has an ERA over two runs higher at night, going 2-3 with a 4.83 ERA (17 ER/31.2 IP) during nighttime starts.
 - A* For his career, is 28-18 with a 3.50 ERA in 79 day games, and 44-48 with a 4.17 ERA in 152 appearances at night.
- A* Eight of his 12 starts this season have come against opponents with a winning percentage under .500, including four of his five starts in July...Pitched against the Royals to open the month, before three straight starts against Oakland.
 - A* In his four starts versus teams with a winning record, has gone 1-1 with a 1.96 ERA, allowing just five earned runs in 23.0 total innings.

2022 Recap

- A* Went seven straight starts without a loss, April 26 to July 17, compiling a 4-0 record with a 2.31 ERA (10 ER/39.0 IP) in that span.
 - A* The run marked his first winning streak of at least four games since May 26 to June 15, 2019.
- A* Opened the season going 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA in his first three starts, allowing 12 total runs, nine earned, over 9.0 innings...Opponents batted .400 against him in that span.
 - A* In nine starts since, dating to April 26, has pitched to a 4-1 record and a 2.82 ERA (16 ER/51.0 IP), while opponents have batted just .195 against him.
 - A* Has allowed one earned run or less in six of these nine turns.
- A* Started on May 16 at Boston and allowed two runs, one earned, over 5.0 innings before being carted off with a lower left leg injury after just 62 pitches.
 - A* He suffered the injury while running to cover first base.
 - A* He was placed on the injured list the following day, May 17, and missed 42 games before returning on July 4...Made a pair of rehabilitation starts with Triple-A Sugar Land and Double-A Corpus Christi.
- A* Made his season debut, April 8 at the Angels, and allowed six hits and two runs over just 4.0 innings...Fanned two and did not issue a walk...Took a no-decision in Houston's win, 13-6.
 - A* Followed that start by going just 4.1 innings in his next turn, April 15 at Seattle...Allowed eight hits and four runs to take his first loss.

Career Recap

- A* Originally drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers 32nd overall in 2008 out of Highland High School in Highland, Ill., made his major league debut in 2012 with Kansas City...He moved to Tampa Bay the following season before joining Minnesota in 2018.
 - A* Over 231 career games, 227 starts, Odorizzi is 72-66 with a 3.94 ERA (528 ER/1,207.0).
- A* Was a 2019 All-Star with Minnesota, and won a career-best 15 games that season.
- A* He joined Houston in 2021 and appeared in Game 1 of the World Series against Atlanta last season, striking out five over 2.1 innings out of the bullpen.

- A **N.L. Pitching Ranks:** HR/9.0 IP (1st, 0.41), bWAR (2nd, 4.7), BB/9.0 IP (2nd, 1.63), Innings (5th, 132.1), Wins (T6th, 10), ERA (5th, 2.58)
- A Set for his 22nd start of the season and the 100th of his career...Is his 117th career appearance.
- A Has made 18 appearances, 13 starts, against New York, and is 5-4 with a 2.85 ERA (25 ER/79.0 IP) and 87 strikeouts...Atlanta is 9-9 in his 18 games.
 - A In two starts this season, is 1-1 with a 3.27 ERA (4 ER/11.0 IP) and 11 strikeouts...Started here at Citi Field on May 2 and allowed four hits and two runs over 6.0 innings to earn the win.
 - A Has made more appearances against the Mets than any other team in baseball.
- A Last started on July 31 vs. Arizona and pitched 7.0 scoreless innings, allowing just four hits and two walks while fanning five...Took a no-decision as Atlanta walked-off the D-backs, 1-0.
 - A The outing was his final start in July, and he went 3-1 with a 2.13 ERA (9 ER/38.0 IP) over six starts in the month...Went 7.0 or more innings three times, and turned in quality starts in five of the six turns.
- A His 10 wins on the season are tied for sixth most in the National League.
 - A Since becoming a full-time starter in 2019, Fried's 48 wins are the second most in baseball, trailing only the Yankees' Gerrit Cole's total of 52 for the major league lead.
- A Did not allow a home run in his start versus Arizona, and has not surrendered a homer in any of his last nine starts...Fried's 59.1-inning homerless streak is the longest in the majors.
 - A Fried last surrendered a home run in the fourth inning of his start on June 9 vs. Pittsburgh, when Jack Suwinski took him deep for a solo shot.
 - A Fried has allowed just six total homers in 132.1 innings this season, and his rate of 0.408 is lowest in the National League...Since becoming a full-time starter in 2019, Fried's rate of 0.76 HR/9.0 IP is lowest in all of baseball (min. 450 IP).

2022 Recap

- A Started on July 16th in Washington, going 7.0 innings and earning the victory in a 6-3 win...Fanned four and did not walk a batter, one start after walking a career high-tying five on July 11 vs. New York (NL).
 - A The victory was the 50th of his career, and his 10th of the season...Marked the third time the lefty has reached double-digit wins in his career.
 - A Since the Braves moved to Atlanta in 1966, just two pitchers have reached at least 50 wins in as few appearances as Fried...Pat Jarvis won 51 of his first 114 games, while Kevin Millwood won exactly 50...They both started over 105 of their first 114 career games.
- A Was named to his first career All-Star Game after being selected to the N.L. pitching staff...Joined teammates Ronald Acuna Jr., William Contreras, Travis d'Arnaud, Austin Riley and Dansby Swanson as All-Star selections...He was not active for the game.
 - A He is the first Braves pitcher to be selected to the game since Mike Soroka in 2019, and the first left-hander from Atlanta to go since Jonny Venters in 2011.
- A Went undefeated in the month of June, posting a 2-0 record and 2.16 ERA (8 ER/33.1 IP), while Atlanta won all five of his starts.
 - A His ERA ranked 12th in baseball, but his 1.91 FIP led the National League and was second lowest in the majors...Only the White Sox Dylan Cease had a lower mark (1.89).
- A Went just 5.2 innings in his start on June 14 at Washington, allowing six hits and four runs...The run snapped a streak of 10 consecutive starts of at least 6.0 innings.
 - A The run was the second longest of his career...He finished the 2021 season with 12 consecutive starts of at least 6.0 innings.
- A Started on June 3 at Coors Field and pitched 8.0 scoreless innings, allowed two hits and a walk while striking out four...Took a no-decision in Atlanta's win, 3-1, in extra innings.
 - A Fried became just the second pitcher in franchise history to pitch at least 8.0 scoreless innings in Colorado...Hall-of-Famer Tom Glavine did so twice, pitching shutouts against the Rockies in 1995 and 1997.
- A Made the 100th appearance of his career, May 2 at NYM, his 83rd as a starter... He pitched to a 43-20 record and a 3.32 ERA (176 ER/477.0 IP) over his first 100 career games.
 - A Since the Braves moved to Atlanta in 1966, just three pitchers earned more wins in their first 100 appearances than Fried...Kevin Millwood went 47-26 and pitched to a 3.75 ERA, Pat Jarvis compiled a 46-31 record and a 3.39 ERA, and Tommy Hanson tallied a 44-27 mark with a 3.51 ERA.
 - A Millwood started 94 of his first 100 appearances, Jarvis made 95 starts and all of Hanson's first 100 games came as a starter...Fried started just 83 games.

- A Acquired by the Atlanta Braves along with INF Jace Peterson, OF Dustin Peterson and OF Malle Smith from the San Diego Padres in exchange for OF Justin Upton and RHP Aaron Northcraft on December 19, 2014
