RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals continue their season-opening six-game homestand tonight at Busch Stadium as the New York Mets make their annual visit to St. Louis for a three-game series ... The Cardinals opened their 135th regular season of play in the National League by taking two-of-three from the Tampa Bay Rays over the weekend ... St. Louis enters today tied with Cincinnati for second place in the National League Central Division, 1.0 game behind Milwaukee (3-0).

SIX IS A SERIOUS NUMBER: The Cardinals have scored six or more runs in each of their first three games, longest such streak to begin a season since 2003 (first 3 games) and the 9th time in franchise history (1892-present) ... The 1962 Cardinals hold the franchise record by plating 6+ runs in each of their first seven games ... If St. Louis scores 6+ tonight, it will mark the longest streak since the 1967 Redbirds (first 4 games).

- The Cardinals and Brewers are the lone two MLB teams this season to score 6+ runs in every game, while the 22 total runs scored by St. Louis in 2026 are tied for 4th-most in MLB (Brewers lead with 29).
- Last season, St. Louis was 42-12 (.778 win pct.) when scoring six or more runs in 54 games.

MARCH MADNESS: St. Louis is 10-11 all-time in March during the regular season (5-4 at Busch III) ... 20 different Cardinals have homered in the month of March, led by five bombs by **Paul Goldschmidt** ... Active Cardinals with March homers include **Nolan Gorman** (2), **Pedro Pagés** (2), **Victor Scott II** (1), **JJ Wetherholt** (1), **Jordan Walker** (1) and **Alec Burleson** (1).

100 Masyn Winn was named the 2025 winner of the Rawlings Gold Glove Award at shortstop, the first of his career and the 100th by the Cardinals - the most all-time for any MLB franchise since the award's inception in 1957.

- Winn joined **Ozzie Smith** (11 times), **Édgar Rentería** (2), and **Dal Maxvill** (1) as the fourth Cardinals shortstop to win the award ... Winn was honored and celebrated by the Cardinals and Rawlings in a pregame ceremony yesterday at Busch Stadium.
- Cards Hall of Famer **Keith Hernandez** earned six consecutive NL Gold Glove Awards at first base from 1978-83.

THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (March 30, 2022): Coinciding with **Albert Pujols**'s Spring debut in his return to St. Louis, the Cardinals go wild in West Palm Beach by collecting 26 hits and routing the Nationals, 29-8, at the Ballpark of the Palm Beaches ... The 29 runs scored were the most by any MLB Spring Training team since **Elias** began compiling Spring Training statistics in 1993 ... St. Louis sent 19 batters to the plate while scoring 15 runs in the 8th inning.

YOUNGRIER: According to *Baseball America*, the Cardinals entered the 2026 season with the youngest Opening Day roster across Major League Baseball with an average age of 27.3, while the Braves sport MLB's oldest average age at 30.9 ... At age 23.5, **JJ Wetherholt** is the 16th-youngest in the National League and the circuit's youngest middle infielder.

Masyn Winn (Aug. 18, 2023 at Busch III), **Chris Roycroft** (May 7, 2024 at Busch) and **Matt Swanson** (April 17, 2025 at Citi) made MLB debuts against the Mets.

Ryne Stanek pitched parts of the last two seasons with the Mets (2024-25).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Matt Morris** was born in Middletown, NY...graduated from Valley Central High School in Montgomery, NY...played college baseball at Seton Hall University.

Luke Weaver was selected by the Cardinals in the 1st round (No. 27) of the 2014 MLB Draft...pitched parts of three seasons with St. Louis (2016-18) before packaged in a trade to Arizona for **Paul Goldschmidt** (Dec. 5, 2018)...2016 Cardinals Minor League Pitcher of the Year.

Cardinals Hall of Famer & Mets broadcaster **Keith Hernandez** was selected by the Cardinals in the 42nd round of the 1971 MLB Draft...played 10 seasons in St. Louis (1974-83)...won the 1979 NL MVP Award...named to two National League All-Star teams and won six Gold Gloves.

Mets Clubhouse Operations Coordinator **Scott Keltner** previously worked in the Cardinals organization in the Busch Stadium (2016-21) and AutoZone Park (2014-15) visiting clubhouses.

Devin Williams was born in St. Louis and is a Hazelwood West High School graduate.

Oliver Marmol was born in Elizabeth, NJ.

Mets Baseball Operations Special Assistant **Carlos Beltrán** played two All-Star seasons with St. Louis in 2012-13.

Kyle Discoll is a native of Toms River, NJ...played collegiately at Rutgers University...held multiple roles with the Mets organization from 2019-2023, including Pitching Data and Movement Analyst, Rehab Coordinator, Assistant Pitching Coordinator, and Triple-A pitching coach.

Luis García pitched in 34 games for St. Louis in 2021.

Cardinals.TV broadcaster **Mark Sweeney** was traded to the Mets with **Jeromy Burnitz**, **Lou Collier**, **Jeff D'Amico**, and cash (January 21, 2002)...attended Spring Training with New York before being released (March 13, 2002).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **José Oquendo** played the first two seasons of his MLB career with the Mets...traded by NY with **Mark Davis** to St. Louis for **John Young** and **Angel Salazar** (April 2, 1985).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Jason Isringhausen** was selected by the Mets in the 44th round of the 1991 MLB Draft...pitched parts of five seasons in New York (1995-97, 1999, 2011).

Jeff Albert worked nine seasons in the Cardinals organization as a St. Louis hitting coach (2019-22) and minor league hitting coach (2008-12).

Jared Young played in 75 games for Memphis (AAA) in 2024.

Cardinals broadcaster **Ricky Horton** was born in nearby Poughkeepsie, N.Y...graduated from F.D. Roosevelt High School in Hyde Park.

Hall of Fame Manager **Joe Torre** played for and managed both the Cardinals (1969-74 & 1990-95) and Mets (1975-77 & 1977-81).

Mets VP of Amateur & International Scouting **Kris Gross** was a Cardinals amateur scout for three seasons (2010-12).

Cardinals reporter **Jim Hayes** was born in New York City and raised in nearby Nyack, NY...graduated from SUNY-Geneseo.

Cardinals Asst. GM **Moisés Rodríguez** is from the Lower East Side of Manhattan in New York City...formerly worked for MLB in New York (1998-2007).

The Mets made their National League debut in St. Louis on April 11, 1962, losing to the Cardinals at Busch Stadium I on Opening Day, 11-4...The day prior before the season opener was rained out, a dozen Mets players were trapped in the Chase Park Plaza elevator for about an hour.

TONIGHT'S GAME:

- **Making his 2026 season debut tonight as he makes his 2nd career MLB start and his first career start at Busch Stadium.**
- Has pitched parts of three Major League seasons for the Cardinals (2023-25), making 97 relief appearances and one start.
- Primarily operated out of the bullpen for the first time in his professional career the last three seasons after starting 72-of-89 games over his first four professional seasons (2018-19, 2021-22).
- Has allowed 10 home runs in his 98 career outings, the fewest by a Cardinal through his first 98 career games since **Génesis Cabrera** allowed eight homers from 2019-21 and fewest by a St. Louis right-hander since **Jordan Hicks** gave up three HRs from 2018-19.
- Spent the entire 2025 season with St. Louis and led MLB with 32 relief appearances of at least 1.1 innings, the most by a Cardinals reliever since **John Frascatore** had 32 such appearances in 1998.
- Made his first career MLB start in the 2025 season finale on Sept. 28 at Chicago Cubs working 3.0 scoreless innings with one hit allowed, no walks and one strikeout. Was his first start since July 29, 2023 with Triple-A Memphis vs. Iowa (Cubs).
- **Kyle's 97 career relief appearances before his 1st career Major League start (Sept. 28, 2025 at CHI) were the most by a Cardinals pitcher since Jordan Hicks (April 21, 2022 at Miami) who made his 1st career start after having made 114 career relief appearances.**
- Led Cardinals relief pitchers as a rookie in 2024 in Inherited Runners Scored Pct. (11.8%), stranding 15-of-17 of those with 10 or more Inherited Runners. Ranked T-7th among N.L. relievers with 15-or-more inherited runners.
- Ranked 3rd among National League rookies in 2024 with a 1.03 WHIP, trailing only Bryan Hudson (MIL, 0.72) and Porter Hodge (0.83, CHI).
- Is facing New York Mets for the 4th time in his career - is 0-0 with 1.69 ERA in 5.1 relief IP.
- Was 1-1 with a 4.58 ERA in 5 Spring Training starts, striking out a team-high 20 in his 17.2 IP.
- His .215 Opp. BA ranked 5th best in MLB in Spring Training and his 1.08 WHIP was ranked 8th.

2025 NOTES:

NL Reliever Ranks: Innings Pitched (85.0, 1st), Batters Faced (354, 1st), Strikeouts (79, 8th).

MULTI-INNING MAGIC: Spent the entire season with St. Louis and led MLB with 32 relief appearances of at least 1.1 innings, the most by a Cardinals reliever since **John Frascatore** had 32 such appearances in 1998.

INNINGS EATER: Pitched an NL-high 85.0 innings as a reliever, the most by a Cardinals relief pitcher since **Manny Aybar** tossed 93.1 innings of relief in 1999. His 61 relief appearances were also the most among Cardinals right-handed pitchers.

TAKE A WHIFF: Became the first Cardinals reliever since **Tyler Lyons** (2017) to strike out at least seven batters in 3.2 IP or fewer on 7/22 at Colorado and the 6th to do so in franchise history, along with **Dave LaPoint** (1983), **Doug Bair** (1982), **Bobby Shantz** (1963) and **Dizzy Dean** (1934). His seven K's were tied for the third most among NL relievers in 2025, behind only CHC's Ben Brown and ATL's Chris Sale, who both had nine.

SPECIAL TRIBUTE: His career-high 7 strikeout performance on 7/22 at Coors Field came on the same day he learned of the passing of his grandmother. Kyle often-times attended Rockies games as a child with his grandparents.

LET'S GET STARTED: Made his first career MLB start in the season finale on 9/28 at CHC, working 3.0 scoreless innings with one hit allowed, no walks and one strikeout, his first start since 7/29/23 with Triple-A Memphis vs. Iowa (Cubs).

VERSATILITY: Became the first Cardinals pitcher to make at least 62 appearances and at least one start since **Jeff Fassero** (62 G, 6 GS) in 2003 and the first Cardinals right-hander to do so since **Manny Aybar** (65 G, 1 GS) in 1999.

OUT OF THE GATE: Allowed a combined three runs through his first 15 appearances across March/April for a 1.47 ERA (3 ER/18.1 IP) that led the team (min. 10.0 IP) and led all NL relievers with a .086 opp. batting average (5-58) in March/April that was the lowest by a Cardinals pitcher since **Todd Worrell** posted a .059 mark (2-34) in 1992.

STREAKING: Compiled a career-high, 14.0-inning scoreless streak from April 21-May 20 that was the second-longest streak of the year by a Cardinals reliever, trailing only **Matt Svanson** (15.2 IP, 7/29-8/21).

DOUBLE THE PLEASURE: Generated eight double plays as a relief pitcher (9 total) to lead the St. Louis relief corps. and T-8th among NL relievers.

UNDER THE HOOD: Ranked in the 96th percentile in extension at 7.2 ft., and in the 93rd percentile with 9 runs prevented via breaking ball run value, which measures the effectiveness of a pitch by calculating the run impact of every event, factoring in count, runners on base, and outs.

CAREER:

- Graduated from Erie (Colo.) High School. Named Boulder County Player of the Year and was selected to play at the High School Futures Game at Coors Field.
- Played college baseball at Colorado Mesa University in Grand Junction, Colo., going 22-2 with a 3.13 ERA (204.1 IP), 188 strikeouts and six complete games.
- Allowed nine home runs to 852 total batters faced while pitching in high altitude (Grand Junction is 4,583 ft above sea level).
- Posted a 13-0 record with a 1.41 ERA during his sophomore season, earning First Team All-American, First Team Academic All-American, and was the South Central Regional Tournament MVP.
- Pitched two summers for the Waterloo Bucks of the collegiate summer Northwoods League (2016-17).
- His father, Tim Leahy, played college basketball at Kansas State University.
- His uncle, Thomas Leahy, pitched in the Braves organization (1991-93) advancing to Durham (High-A).

LEAHY VS. NEW YORK (N.L.):

- Is facing New York Mets for the 4th time in his career - is 0-0 with 1.69 ERA in 5.1 relief IP.
- Gained a Hold in Cardinals 6-5 win at Busch Stadium on 5/4/25 in his last appearance against the Mets, working 2.0 scoreless IP
- Is 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA in 17 career games pitched against NL East clubs.
