ANGELS AMONG US: The Detroit Tigers tonight return home for a quick three-game homestand and play the series opener vs. the Los Angeles Angels ... when we last met, the Tigers picked up a 4-1 win at Baltimore on Sunday night to snap a season-long eight-game losing streak ... after this series in Detroit, the Tigers head right back out on the road for a two-city, six-game trip to the Chicago White Sox (Friday-Sunday) and Tampa Bay Rays (June 1-3).

- The Tigers are back in Detroit having dropped 11 of their last 13 games and 16 of their last 19 games ... Detroit has endured a stretch of 16 losses in 19 games for the first time since going 3-16 from April 23-May 12, 2022 ... the Tigers have also dropped their last six home games, their longest losing skid in Detroit since a pair of separate seven-gamers in 2025.
- Through their first 26 games, the Tigers went 14-12 and woke up on April 24 with a share of first place in the A.L. Central ... in their last 28 games since then, the Tigers have gone 7-21 to drop their record to 21-33 and alone in last place in the A.L. Central ... Detroit's 7-21 (.250) record starting April 24 is the lowest winning percentage in baseball in this span.

AND THAT'S THE END OF THE FIRST PERIOD: The Tigers have reached this year's one-third mark with a 21-33 record ... a year ago, the Tigers completed 54 games with a 34-20 record, the best mark in the A.L. by 1.0 game at the time and just half-a-game behind Philadelphia for the best record in baseball ... Detroit's 21-33 record this year is its slowest start through 54 games since 2022 (21-33).

- The Tigers last year reached the one-third mark with a +79 run differential through 54 games, the second-best differential in all of baseball ... this year, the Tigers have a -25 run differential through 54 games ... in 2024, the Tigers reached the one-third mark of their schedule with a 27-27 record and a dead even run differential (225 for, 225 against).

WHAT A CATCH! Dillon Dingler leads A.L. catchers with 31 RBI and ranks second among all league catchers with 10 home runs, 10 doubles (tied), a .462 slugging percentage and a .773 OPS, trailing only the Athletics' Shea Langeliers in those runner-up categories ... metrics show that Dingler has received 94.48 called strikes looking above expected called strikes, by far the best number in the American League (Austin Wells is second at 82.08).

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Tigers arrive home having lost their last six series and eight of their last nine series dating to April 24 after going 5-2-1 in their first eight series to begin the season ... the Tigers last lost six series in a row within the same season from April 15-May 6, 2021 (0-6).

IT'S GOOD FOR SOMETHING: Kevin McGonigle has a 2.8 bWAR through his first 52 major league games, the sixth-best mark in the majors and the third-best mark in the American League this season behind only Bobby Witt Jr (3.4) and Cody Bellinger (2.9) ... Kevin is 21-years-old.

IT'S NOT EASY BEING GREENE: Riley Greene is now batting .353 (49-for-139) with 11 doubles, four homers, 18 RBI, a .444 on-base, a .518 slugging and a .962 OPS in his last 40 games over the past six+ weeks starting April 11 ... he leads the majors in batting average, is second in on-base percentage and seventh in OPS in this span.

O NO: The Tigers enter tonight's game having recorded seven hits or less in each of their last 11 games, the longest such streak in the history of the franchise (the previous single-season club record was nine-straight games in 1968) ... the last major league team to go 11 or more games in a row with seven hits or less?: the Los Angeles Angels with an 11-gamer from August 20-Sept. 1, 2025 ... 12 games or more?: the Cincinnati Reds with a 13-game run from Sept. 22-October 5, 2022.

TO OUR DISMAY: The Tigers have turned in a .207 (151-for-728) team batting average and .592 team OPS within the month of May, the third-lowest team average and the lowest OPS this month in the majors ... the Tigers have reached double digits in hits in just one of their last 20 games while scoring four runs or less in each of their last 13 games and in 18 of their last 19 games.

- The Tigers are in danger of posting their lowest team batting average in any calendar month since batting .199 in April of 2021 and are in danger of posting their lowest team OPS in any calendar month since turning in a .520 OPS in April of 2003.
- The Tigers are 5-17 in May, the lowest winning percentage (.294) in the majors this month ... the club is in danger of its weakest month of May in 30 years (4-23, .148, 1996).

NIGHT OWNS: The Tigers enter tonight's contest with 10-25 (.286) record in night games this season, the lowest winning percentage in the majors ... Detroit's 10-25 night game record is its roughest through 35 night games to start a season since also going 10-25 through 35 night games in 2003.

AND FINALLY: The Tigers on Sunday wrapped a 13-games-in-13-days stretch with a 2-11 record and four runs scored or less in all 13 games ... this active 13-game-streak is the second-longest such run by the Tigers in the last 50 years, trailing only a 17-game streak of scoring four runs or less from August 28-September 15, 2002 ... it's the longest streak by any major league club since the Miami Marlins went 23 games in a row with four runs or less from July 29-August 22, 2022.

- Has allowed three earned runs or less in seven of his nine starts this season entering tonight's game...registered back-to-back quality starts, allowing one earned run in 6.2 innings on May 2 and one earned run in 6.0 innings on May 8.
- Allowed just two hits over six scoreless innings while walking one and striking out seven on April 10 against Miami, earning his first win of the season...the performance snapped the team's five-game losing streak.
- Optioned to Toledo to begin the 2026 season...made just one start for the Mud Hens prior to getting recalled on April 4.
- Pitched in two games (one start) for Team Venezuela in the 2026 World Baseball Classic...allowed two earned runs on five hits and three walks while striking out three over 4.1 frames.
- Did not allow an earned run in three games (5.1 innings) in the playoffs with Detroit last year...went 5-3 with a 4.37 ERA in 20 regular season games (12 starts), allowing 44 earned runs on 95 hits and 31 walks compared to 72 strikeouts over his 90.2 innings.
- Began the 2025 season with Triple-A Toledo, going 1-1 with a 2.79 ERA in his two starts...allowed three runs on six hits and one walk while striking out 11 over 9.2 innings.
- Saw his first Major League action in 2024, appearing in 19 games (16 starts) with Detroit, going 6-6 with a 4.76 ERA (52ER/98.1IP) and 77 strikeouts...made his Major League debut on May 29 against Pittsburgh.

- Earned a six-out save on May 24 against Baltimore, striking out four over his two scoreless frames.
- Made the third big league start of his career on May 20 against Cleveland, his first since Aug. 7, 2021, with the Texas Rangers against the Athletics...tossed 4.2 scoreless frames, allowing just two hits and two walks while striking out a career-high seven batters.
- Threw 4.0 scoreless innings on May 15 against Toronto, allowing just one hit while striking out one...was called upon for long relief after the original Tigers bulk pitcher left the game early with an injury.
- Earned his first win of the season and second of his major league career on April 30 against Atlanta, tossing 2.0 scoreless frames...allowed one hit and one walk while striking out two, keeping Detroit within a run before they took the lead late.
- Earned his first career major league save with 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing two walks while striking out two in a victory over the Marlins on April 11.
- Signed with Detroit on a one-year major league contract with a club option for the 2027 season on Dec. 16, 2025.
- Spent each of the previous two seasons with the SSG Langers of the KBO League...went 12-7 with a 2.25 ERA (43 ER/171.2 IP) in 30 starts for SSG last season, recording 245 strikeouts in his 171.2 innings pitched, an average of 12.8 strikeouts per nine innings.
- In his two seasons with SSG, went 23-10 with a 2.91 ERA (93 ER/287.1 IP) in 54 appearances (53 starts)...released by Detroit after nine appearances with Triple-A Toledo in 2024 prior to signing with the Langers.
- Has spent parts of five seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies (2017-19), Chicago White Sox (2020) and Texas Rangers (2021) prior to joining the Tigers this year...also pitched with Hiroshima in the NPB for the 2022-23 campaigns.

- Earned the first Major League win of his career with a scoreless inning (one hit, two strikeouts) in his first appearance of the year on March 27 against San Diego.
- Posted a 2-0 record in the World Baseball Classic, helping Team Venezuela to a gold medal...struck out 11 batters with a 1.23 ERA (1 ER/7.1 IP) in the tournament.
- Had his contract selected by the Tigers on March 10, 2026, in the midst of the World Baseball Classic.
- Appeared and started in 30 games for the Kiwoom Heroes last season in the KBO with a 13-11 record and 3.68 ERA (72ER/171.1 IP), recording 171 strikeouts.

- Earned his first save of the season on April 30 against Atlanta, allowing one hit while striking out one in a scoreless ninth inning...marked his first save with the Tigers since Aug. 16, 2025, at Minnesota.

- Named the American League Rookie of the Month for March/April on May 4, becoming the seventh-ever Tiger to win the award and first since Colt Keith in July of 2024...is the second Tiger to ever win it in the first month of the season, joining Austin Jackson who did so in April of 2010.
- Reached base safely in 27 consecutive starts spanning exactly one month, from March 30-April 30...he is the first Tigers rookie to do so since outfielder Dick Wakefield reached in 29 straight starts back in 1943 (thanks to Elias)...the last 21-year-old or younger Tiger prior to reach base safely in 27-or-more starts in a row was Al Kaline, who reached in 34-straight starts nearly 70 years ago from July 26-Aug. 28, 1956.
- Is the first 21-year-old or younger Tiger with nine doubles in any calendar month in 110 years when 21-year-old Harry Heilmann also had nine doubles in April 1916.
- Just the fifth player in major league history with 30 or more hits, 10 or more doubles and less than 15 strikeouts in his first 25 big league games at 21-years-old or younger, and the first such player in 90 years when Cleveland's Roy Weatherly and New York's Joe DiMaggio each did so at 21-years-old in 1936.
- Clubbed his first major league home run on Sunday, April 12, against Sandy Alcantara and the Miami Marlins.
- Became the first Tiger to record six doubles in his first 15 major league games in 16 years since Brennan Boesch did exactly that in 2010.
- Became the first player in Tigers franchise history to notch a multi-RBI game in each of his first two major league games when he laced his tiebreaking, game-winning two-run eighth-inning single into right field in game two for Detroit.
- First Tiger with a go-ahead or game-winning RBI in the eighth inning or later within his first two major league games since Omar Infante was credited with an eighth-inning game-winning RBI on Sept. 7, 2002, in his big league debut at Yankee Stadium (Elias).
- Ripped the first pitch he ever saw in the big leagues into right field for a two-run double, instantly becoming only the sixth Tiger since the RBI became a stat in 1920 to record two RBI in his major league debut, the first since Isaac Paredes on Aug. 17, 2020...is the second of the six to accomplish this feat on Opening Day, joining Paredes, JaCoby Jones (Aug. 30, 2016), Rob Richie (Aug. 19, 1989), Jake Wood (Opening Day April 11, 1961), Hank Riebe (Aug. 26, 1942) and Sammy Hale (April 20, 1920) in turning this trick.
- Became the first Tiger ever with two doubles in his major league debut on Opening Day and the second in the history of the franchise with two doubles in his major league debut on any day, joining Hank Riebe on Aug. 26, 1942.
- McGonigle is the second player in franchise history to collect four hits in his major league debut, joining Billy Bean (April 25, 1987).
- At 21 years, 220 days old on Opening Day, he became the second-youngest player in the history of the Tigers franchise to make his major league debut in the starting lineup on Opening Day and the youngest in 112 years since starting first baseman George Burns made his major league debut on Opening Day April 14, 1914...thanks to Elias.
- Named to the Opening Day roster at 21 years old, marking the youngest Tigers player to do so since Omar Infante in 2003.
- Is a career .308 (208-for-676) hitter in three minor league seasons, collected 51 doubles, six triples, 25 home runs and 130 RBI over that span...also drew 123 walks compared to just 84 strikeouts, good for an OBP of .410.
