TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue the homestand with the 2nd of 3 games against the Cincinnati Reds (1-0)...the Mariners are coming off a series win against the San Francisco Giants (2-1) to open the first homestand of the second half...following Wednesday's series finale against the Reds and an off day Thursday, Seattle will embark on a 7-game road trip at the Texas Rangers (4 G, 7/24-27) and Los Angeles Dodgers (3 G, 7/28-30)...tonight's game will be televised live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call with **Ryan Rowland-Smith** as field analyst...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzos** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners won yesterday's series opener against the Reds by an 8-0 final, Seattle's 8th shutout win of the season...Seattle is 43-24 (.642) when they homer, 36-14 (.720) when they score 4+ runs and 21-6 (.778) when they record 10+ hits.

- **Back on 1st** - The Mariners sit in 1st place in the American League West division, 0.5 game ahead of the Texas Rangers (50-50).
- **Seeing Red** - Seattle is 22-6 (.786) all-time against the Reds, their best all-time record against any opponent they have faced...the Mariners have won 8 of 9 series played against the Reds since 2002...since 1900, the Mariners .786 winning percentage against the Reds is the highest of any team against any single opponent.
- **Home Sweet T-Mobile Park** - The Mariners are 9-2 over their last 11 home games since June 21.
- **Grand Dumper** - **Cal Raleigh** hit the 6th grand slam of his career in last night's game, tied for 8th-most in Mariners history with teammate **J.P. Crawford** and Mike Blowers...Ken Griffey Jr.'s 12 grand slams are the most in franchise history.
- **The Farmhand Shuffle** - The Mariners made several minor league promotions yesterday, highlighted by their No. 5 prospect (*MLB Pipeline*) OF **Jonny Farnelo** and their No. 6 prospect (*MLB Pipeline*) INF **Felín Celesten** going from High-A Everett to Double-A Arkansas.
- **Rehab Update** - INF/OF **Brendan Donovan** has made 3 rehab appearances between Triple-A Tacoma (2 G) and the ACL Mariners (1 G) as he works his way back from the Injured List...Donovan has been on the IL since May 16 with left groin muscle strain.

BETWEEN THE ROCK AND HIS OLD PLACE...**Luis Castillo** is set to make his 2nd career start against the Cincinnati Reds, the team he spent the first five and a half seasons of his career (2017-22)...Castillo made 137 starts with the Reds, going 44-53 with a 3.62 ERA (319 ER, 792.1 IP), 287 walks, 860 strikeouts and a 1.20 WHIP in addition to being named an All-Star twice (2019 and 2022)...Castillo has made 124 appearances (121 starts) with Seattle (2022-c), going 43-39 with a 3.65 ERA (286 ER, 706.0 IP), 194 walks, 714 strikeouts and a 1.17 WHIP in addition to being named a 2023 All-Star..."La Piedra" was acquired by the Mariners from the Reds at the 2022 Trade Deadline in exchange for minor leaguers INF Noelvi Marte, INF Edwin Arroyo, RHP Levi Stoudt and RHP Andrew Moore

SECOND HALF J-ROD SHOW...**Julio Rodríguez** has been an excellent second-half hitter in his career, batting .296 (271x917) with 157 runs, 48 doubles, 3 triples, 59 homers, 157 RBI and 38 stolen bases, reaching base at a .349 clip and slugging .547 for an .896 OPS in 223 career games after the All-Star Break (2022-c)...his OPS is over 150 points higher in the second half than the first half (career .739 in first half), while his slugging percentage is 128 points higher than the first half (career .419 in first half).

MUÑ ON FIRE...closer **Andrés Muñoz** picked up his 95th career save and 17th of the season on Sunday...he has been flawless over his last 12 appearances (6/16-c), not allowing a run with 18 strikeouts and 4 walks, limiting opponents to a .125 batting average (5x40) with a 0.75 WHIP...during that span, Muñoz's 40.9% strikeout rate ranks 6th among MLB relievers and 3rd in the American League (min. 10.0 IP) behind only Hogan Harris-ATH (42.9%) and Ryan Zeferjahn-LAA (42.9%).

OPS. THERE IT IS...second baseman **Cole Young** has posted an impressive .843 OPS and is batting .267 (31x116) with 4 doubles, 9 home runs, 17 RBI and 5 walks, reaching base at a .309 clip and slugging .534 over his last 32 games (6/11-c)...Young leads AL second basemen and ranks 3rd among MLB second basemen (min. 50% G as 2B) with 3.4 Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball-Reference*) this season...he is on pace to join Ken Griffey Jr. (4x), Alex Rodriguez (3x), **Julio Rodríguez** (2x) and Ruppert Jones as Mariners to post a 3.0+ bWAR season at age-22 or younger.

PITCHING HAS BEEN OUTSTANDING...the Mariners pitching staff has excelled in 2026, ranking 1st in MLB in SO/BB (3.47), 1st in fewest BB/9 (2.53), 1st in fewest HR/9 (0.96), 4th in *FanGraphs* Wins Above Replacement (14.1), 3rd in WHIP (1.17) and 5th in ERA (3.57).

RANDY STILL SWINGING IT...in 93 games this season, left fielder **Randy Arozarena** is batting .284 (96x338) with 62 runs, 21 doubles, 1 triple, 11 home runs, 45 RBI, 38 walks and 19 stolen bases, getting on base at a .381 clip, slugging .450 with an .831 OPS this season...Randy is coming off his third All-Star selection (2023, '25-'26) and second with Seattle after being named an All-Star in back-to-back seasons...he became the 15th player in Mariners history to make multiple All-Star teams with the club.

DOM CANCRUSH...over his last 37 games (5/30-c), **Dominic Canzone** is batting .289 (35x121) with 18 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 10 home runs, 19 RBI and 12 walks, reaching base at a .358 clip and slugging .587 for a .945 OPS that ranks 8th in the AL during that span (min. 100 PA).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...last night the Reds intentionally walked **Dominic Canzone** before **Cal Raleigh** hit his 6th career grand slam and the Mariners 5th of 2026, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...it marked the first Mariners grand slam that was immediately preceded by an intentional walk since Seth Smith was intentionally walked and Franklin Gutierrez hit a grand slam on July 21, 2015 at Detroit?...additionally, each of the Mariners last 8 grand slams have come directly after a walk.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - JULY 21

- **1988** - The Mariners acquire OF Jay Buhner, RHP Rick Balaban and RHP Troy Evers from the New York Yankees in exchange for Ken Phelps.
- **1998** - Ken Griffey Jr. belts his 40th homer of the season, become the quickest player ever to reach that number in a season (100 games). It also marks his fifth season with 40+ home runs.
- **2015** - Franklin Gutierrez capped a five-run 8th inning with a pinch-hit grand slam to lead the Mariners to an 11-9 win over Detroit. The pinch-hit slam was just the 2nd in team history (Ben Broussard, 2007).
- **2018** - Félix Hernández recorded his 1,300th career strikeout at Safeco Field, becoming one of 4 pitchers since 1970 to record at least 1,300 strikeouts in a single ballpark.
- **2019** - Edgar Martinez is inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, New York.

ABOUT CASTILLO...

- The 33-year-old right-hander is set to make his 19th appearance (15th start) this season and his 262nd career appearance (259th start)...is making his 1st appearance against the Reds this season and is facing them for just the 2nd time in his career.
- Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on Dec. 23, 2011.
- Made MLB debut on June 23, 2017 vs. Washington (w/ CIN).
- Signed a 5-year contract extension with the Seattle Mariners on Sept. 24, 2022 after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati on July 30, 2022.
- Named an All-Star in 2019 (CIN), 2022 (CIN) and 2023 (SEA).

LAST TIME OUT...L#8 on July 10 at Tampa Bay, threw 5.0 innings and allowed 4 runs (4 ER) on 9 hits (3 HR) with 1 walk and 4 strikeouts...he threw 91 pitches (68 strikes) in his 18th start of the year.

HELLO OLD FRIEND...made his Major League debut with the Reds on June 23, 2017 vs. WSH and spent his first 6 seasons with Cincinnati before he was acquired by Seattle on July 30, 2022...across 137 career starts with Cincinnati, he went 44-53 with a 3.62 ERA (319 ER, 792.1 IP) and 287 walks to 860 strikeouts...was also named an All-Star in 2019 and '22 with the Reds...he has faced the Reds just once with the Mariners on April 15, 2025, throwing 4.1 innings...this will mark his first time facing the Reds at T-Mobile Park.

LA PIEDRA...among qualified pitchers since 2017 (his debut season), he ranks 5th in games started (258), T-5th in quality starts (138), 6th in innings pitched (1498.1), 6th in total strikeouts (1574) and 13th in wins (87).

HOME SWEET HOME...is making his 9th appearance (6th start) at home this season...across 64 games (61 starts) at home with the Mariners, he is 23-17 with a 3.05 ERA (126 ER, 371.2 IP) and has thrown 6.0+ IP in 42 of those starts with the Mariners going 30-12 when he tosses 6.0+ innings at home...among Mariners pitchers at home (min. 300 IP), he leads in ERA, ranks 2nd in WHIP (1.028) behind rotationmate **Logan Gilbert** (0.976), 2nd in opponent batting average (.265), 3rd in SO/9 (10.00), 4th in SO/BB (4.44) and 7th in strikeouts (413).

WHERE HE RANKS...among qualified pitchers at home since 2023, Castillo ranks T-5th in opponent average (.214), 6th in innings pitched (340.0 IP), 7th in strikeouts (371), T-7th in WHIP (1.05), 7th in SO/9 (9.82), T-7th in opp. OBP (.270), 8th in strikeout rate (27.0%) and 9th in ERA (3.20).

EN JULIO...across 46 career starts in the month of July, he is 18-11 with a 2.72 ERA (86 ER, 285.0 IP), 294 SO, 67 BB, 1.049 WHIP, 9.28 SO/9 and a 4.39 SO/BB...across 18 career starts with the Mariners during the month of July (2023-c), he is 9-5 with a 2.61 ERA (32 ER, 110.1 IP), 108 SO, 19 BB, 0.997 WHIP, 8.81 SO/9 and a 5.68 SO/BB while limiting batters to a .347 SLG...among pitchers with 10+ starts in July since 2023, he ranks 1st in innings pitched (110.1), T-2nd in wins (9), 8th in ERA (2.61), 10th in WHIP (0.997) and 10th in strikeouts (108).

👉👉...has thrown 6.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer earned runs allowed in 2 starts this season (last: 6/26 at CLE) and in 85 career starts, tied for 4th-most such games since 2017...in addition, his 33 such games since 2023 are 7th-most among American League pitchers across that span...trails teammates **Logan Gilbert** (4th, 35) and **George Kirby** (T-5th, 34)...Castillo's 38 such games as a Mariner are 9th-most in franchise history, trailing Gilbert (T-5th, 46 G) and Kirby (7th, 42 G).

AMONG MARINER GREATS...his 3.65 ERA with Seattle is the 8th-lowest ERA in franchise history (min. 500.0 IP), trailing **Bryan Woo**, Félix Hernández, Randy Johnson, Hisashi Iwakuma and James Paxton (all 3.42 ERA), **Logan Gilbert** (3.55) and **George Kirby** (3.61)...his 714 strikeouts with the Mariners are T-10th most in franchise history alongside Hisashi Iwakuma...also ranks 4th in SO/9 (9.1), 5th in SO/BB (3.68), and 5th in WHIP (1.171) (min. 500 IP).

IN EXCLUSIVE COMPANY...surpassed 1,550+ career strikeouts on June 7 at DET...is 1 of 3 pitchers with 250+ starts and 1550+ strikeouts since 2017, joining Aaron Nola-PHI (272 GS, 1795 SO) and Kevin Gausman-5Tms (270 GS, 1656 SO)...in addition, he is 1 of 15 pitchers all-time with 1500+ strikeouts and 500-or-fewer walks.

KEEPING IT 100...has thrown 100+ pitches in 4 starts this season, which leads the Mariners rotation...has thrown 100+ pitches in 104 career games, 5th-most such games in MLB since 2017...has thrown 100+ pitches and a quality start in 25 starts with the Mariners...the Mariners are 17-8 in those starts.

FEAR THE FASTBALL...among pitchers with 5,000+ pitches thrown since 2023, his 28.7% whiff rate on his 4-seam fastball ranks 5th-best in MLB...ranks ahead of teammate **Bryan Woo** (7th, 28.2%)...his 759 whiffs on his 4-seamer since 2023 are also most in MLB, ranking ahead of Joe Ryan-MIN (731 whiffs).

WHOLE LOTTA WHIFFS...has recorded 10+ swings and misses in 12 of his 18 appearances this year...registered a season-high 18 swings and misses plus 5 swinging strikeouts on May 9 at Chicago White Sox, surpassing his previous season-high 17 swings and misses in his first start of the season (3/30 vs. NYY)...his 3,582 career swings and misses are 2nd most in MLB since 2017, trailing only Kevin Gausman-5Tms (3,607) while his 1,311 career swinging strikeouts are 3rd-most in MLB since 2017, trailing Gausman (1,362) and Max Scherzer-5Tms (1,323), and ranking ahead of Gerrit Cole-3Tms (1,300).
