To clinch a spot in the postseason for the 10th time in team history and the first time since 2023.

RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their six-game homestand against the Padres (1-0, two to play) and Mets (three to play) today, their shortest homestand since June 8-10 vs. BOS (3G)...despite dropping seven of nine between Aug. 14-22, they are 15-8 in their last 23 games (Aug. 3-pres.) and have MLB's best record since July 20 at 24-12 (.667)...have the hardest remaining schedule in the AL with an opp. winning pct. of .514...have spent 103 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...this includes a season-high 63 consecutive days in first place (June 27-pres.)...only the Dodgers (150), Braves (148), and Brewers (118) have spent more time leading their divisions...have held the AL's best record for 102 days, second most in team history behind 2023 (106), according to Stats Perform.

- With a 9-4 victory over the Padres, the Rays became the first AL club to 80 wins this season...it marked the fourth-earliest date they have reached 80 wins in franchise history, behind 2023, 2021, and 2008 (each Aug. 27).
- Yandy Diaz** (119HR/470RBI) opened the scoring with a solo home run in the 3rd inning...with the blast, he surpassed **B.J. Upton** (118HR) for fifth-most home runs in team history and surpassed **Carlos Peña** (468RBI) for fourth-most RBI in franchise history.
- Shane McClanahan** earned his 10th win of the season and 43rd of his career, surpassing **Blake Snell** (42) and tying teammate **Drew Rasmussen** for sixth-most wins in team history...he became the first pitcher to have double-digit wins in each of his first four major league seasons since NYY **Masahiro Tanaka** (2014-17) and the first southpaw to turn the trick since FLA **Dontrelle Willis** (2003-06)...additionally, he surpassed **Scott Kazmir** (28) for the third-most wins at Tropicana Field in the ballpark's history.
- Rays baserunners swiped three bases without being caught, snapping a streak of six straight attempts being caught (Aug. 21-25), that was tied for the longest streak in franchise history (also: Aug. 28-Sept. 7, 2002).
- The Rays scored first for the sixth straight game and have plated the opening run in 26 of their last 39 games (July 17 (G2)-pres.)...they have held a lead in each of their last three losses, tied for their second-longest streak this season (also: July 17 (G2)-19) behind March 26-April 3 (5G).
- With 16 wins in August, the Rays have secured their fifth straight month with a winning record...it marks the second time in franchise history the club has begun a season with five straight winning months, joining 2008, the 2008 Rays went 13-14 in September.
- Today's probable starter, **Nick Martinez**, has 12 quality starts this season, one shy of his career high in 2015...his 13 wins are a career high and his 2.93 ERA (147.2IP, 48ER) is on pace to be the best of his career...his 2.93 ERA is also on pace to be the seventh best by a qualified Rays pitcher in a single season (see table on the right).

WHAT'S AT STAKE

- Win their second straight set after dropping a season-high three straight series (Aug. 14-23).
- Earn their 81st win of the season and secure a .500 record or better before the end of August for the fifth time in team history (see table on the right).
- Claim their fourth series against the NL West in 2026.
- Secure their eighth straight win at Tropicana Field against the NL West and improve to 10-1-1 in their last 12 series against the NL West at the ballpark (Aug. 15, 2016-pres.).

THE ARMORY—Rays pitchers have yielded three earned runs or fewer in six straight games (Aug. 22-pres.), and have posted a 1.70 ERA (53.0IP, 10ER) over that span...this streak comes on the heels of a season-high streak of six straight games permitting five earned runs or more (Aug. 16-21), which was their longest since June 16-22, 2021 (also 6G)...if they were to extend their active streak to seven games today, it would mark the third time this season (also: 10G, July 20-30; 16G, April 22-May 10)...opponents are slashing .153/.178/.258 (29-for-190) in that span with 44 strikeouts against five walks, and Rays pitchers have produced a 0.64 WHIP.

- The Rays have issued three walks or fewer in 11 straight contests for the 22nd time in team history...paired with a 14-game streak between July 31-Aug. 15, they have allowed three or fewer in 25 of their last 26 games (July 31-pres.)...over that 26-game span, they have issued 45 free passes, tied for the fourth-fewest walks in any 26-game stretch in Rays history (4x, last: June 10-July 8, 2026).
- Over their last six games (Aug. 22-pres.), Rays starting pitchers have turned in a 1.16 ERA (31.0IP, 4ER) with a .131 (14-for-107) opp. average, .349 opp. OPS, and 24 strikeouts to three walks...it marks the seventh time this season they have gone six straight starts with three earned runs or fewer allowed (last: 10G, July 20-30).
- Rays pitchers have combined to allow nine baserunners or fewer in each of their last six games, tied for the second-longest streak in team history (May 25-30, 2025) and two games behind the franchise record of eight games from earlier this season (June 25-July 3, 2026).

THE CHAN, THE MYTH, THE LEGEND—Since breaking out of a 3-for-44 skid (May 30-June 17), **Chandler Simpson** has hit safely in 47 of his last 57 games (June 19-pres.), pacing the majors in average (.369), hits (80), multi-hit games (26), and steals (23) over that timeframe—CLE **Steven Kwan** (.341) is the only other player batting .330 or better in that span...the .369 average is the second best by any Ray across a 57-game span within a single season (min. 150AB) in franchise history, behind **Aubrey Huff** (.378) from July 19-Sept. 17, 2002...on the year, Simpson leads the AL with 46 multi-hit games, ahead of HOU **Yordan Alvarez** (44G)—he could join **Yandy Diaz** (2025, 11st) as the only Rays to pace the AL in the category...Simpson leads the majors in infield hits (54; Baseball Savant) and is tied for the major league lead in bunt hits (14, also MIL **David Hamilton**), he is tied for the AL lead in triples (6) and is second in stolen bases (37)...he owns the majors' second-lowest strikeout rate (8.3%) and third-lowest whiff rate (10.3%).

- Simpson (.309) is nine points behind Alvarez (.318) for the AL's best batting average...he is attempting to join Diaz (2023) as the only AL batting champions in Rays history...he has previously won an NCAA Division I batting title at Georgia Tech in 2022 (.433) and a Minor League Baseball batting crown in 2024 (.355). Simpson and Diaz (.302) are on pace to become the third pair of qualified Rays teammates to both bat .300 or better—they would join Bartlett (.320)/**Carl Crawford** (.305) in 2009 and Crawford (.315)/**B.J. Upton** (.300) in 2007.
- With 81 SB, Simpson is the 14th player in the modern era (since 1900) to swipe 80 SB across their first two major league seasons...he joins CIN **Elly De La Cruz** (2023-24, 102SB) and SEA **Ichiro Suzuki** (2001-02, 87SB) as the only players in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to turn the trick...he is three stolen bases shy of joining CAL **Chad Curtis** (1992-93), MON **Delino DeShields** (1990-91), STL **Vince Coleman** (1985-86), and NYY **Bert Daniels** (1910-11) as the only players to reach 40 stolen bases in each of their first two major league campaigns in the modern era.
- The outfielder paces the majors with in both hits (37) and stolen bases (10) in August...per Elias, he would become the first Rays player in franchise history to lead the majors in both categories across a month...he is also hitting .385 (37-for-96) this month, second in the majors to KC **Jac Caglianone** (.419).
- Simpson stole two bases last night, his seventh multi-steal game of the year, tied for the fifth most in a season in team history...his 14 career multi-steal contests are tied with **José Caballero** for third most in Rays history.

HIT MAKERS—The Rays .260 (1,170-for-4,497) average paces the majors in 2026, ahead of the Dodgers (.258) and Brewers (.256)...it would mark the first time in franchise history they have led the majors in average and their fourth time finishing inside the top three, joining 2023, 2018, 2005 (each 3rd)...the .260 mark would rank as the eighth highest in Rays history, their best since 2008 (.260; behind by decimal points) and just ahead of 2023 (.260; ahead by decimal points).

- Junior Caminero** is on a career-best 11-game hitting streak (Aug. 17-pres.), tied for the longest streak by a Ray in 2026 (also: **Yandy Diaz**, Aug. 9-20) and tied for the longest active streak in the majors (also: ATH **Tyler Soderstrom**, Aug. 1-pres.)...Caminero has gone 15 games without a long ball, tied for the longest streak of his career (also: Sept. 1-15, 2024).

THE BAKE SHOW—**Bryan Baker** converted his 27th consecutive save opportunity on Mon. at DET, extending the longest streak in franchise history...it marks the majors' second-longest streak this season behind SD **Mason Miller**'s 28-save run (March 28-July 29) and is the longest single-season streak by an AL pitcher since CLE **Emmanuel Clase** converted 34 straight saves from May 20-Sept. 25, 2024...his MLB-leading 38 saves are seventh most in a season in team history, including the most since **Alex Colomé** had 47 in 2017...his 38 saves are more than 19 clubs have had as a team this season...Baker is on pace for 46 saves, which would mark the third most by a Ray behind **Fernando Rodney** (48) in 2012 and Colomé (47) in 2017...he's already the fifth Ray to hold the outright MLB lead in saves at any point after the calendar flips to August, joining Colomé (2017, led MLB), Rodney (2012, latest date: Sept. 18), **Rafael Soriano** (2010, latest date: Sept. 21), and **Roberto Hernández** (1999, latest date: Sept. 4), according to Stats Perform...with three games to play, Baker is two saves shy of tying Colomé (40) in 2017 for the most in club history before the end of August.

FRIARS IN FLORIDA—The Rays continue their three-game set against the Padres tonight at Tropicana Field...the Rays swept the Padres in their three-game series at Petco Park last season (April 25-27), outscoring them 9-3 on the heels of dropping two straight series (2-4) from 2023-24...the Rays have won 15 of their last 20 games vs. San Diego dating back to 2010 and are 11-8 all-time when facing the club at Tropicana Field, including wins in nine of their last 11.

- In the four career games against the Padres, **Chandler Simpson** went 8-for-15 (.533) with 1 2B, 1 RBI, 2 BB, and 4 R...he has three straight multi-hit games against the Padres, tied for the longest streak against the club in Rays history with **Josh Lowe** (June 18, 2023-Aug. 31, 2024) and **Willy Adames** (Aug. 12-14, 2019).

TODAY'S START—Nick Martinez will make his 26th start of the season and 14th start at home...marks his 155th career start (306th appearance) and fifth start (sixth appearance) opposite the Padres...ranks second in the AL in winning pct. (.765/13-4) to **BOS Sonny Gray** (.800/16-4), is third in wins (career-high 13), and owns the fifth-best ERA (2.93)...the Rays are 19-6 in his starts, including 9-4 at home...has yielded three runs or fewer in 20 of 25 starts and two runs or fewer in 18 of 25...signed as a free agent on Feb. 10, 2026.

- ★ He has posted a 4-1 record with a 2.28 ERA (47.1IP, 12ER) across eight day starts this season, the eighth-lowest mark by an AL pitcher in day games this season (min. 40.0IP)...six of his 12 runs allowed in daytime affairs came on June 3 vs. DET—he has a 1.25 ERA (43.1IP, 6ER) in his other seven day starts.
- ★ Across three Saturday starts in 2026, Martinez has turned in a 0.54 ERA (16.2IP, 1ER) with a 1.08 WHIP and 13 strikeouts...his ERA on Saturdays is the second-lowest clip in the majors this season (min. 15.0IP) behind **STL Michael McGreevy's** 0.00 ERA.
- ★ His 14 starts with one or zero runs allowed are tied for the second most in the majors with three others behind **NY Yankees Cam Schlichter** (17).
- ★ Boasts the fourth-highest left-on-base percentage in the majors (82.9%), the second-highest mark in the AL behind **BOS Sonny Gray** (83.7%)...Martinez has fashioned a 0.94 WHIP with runners on in 2026.

LAST TIME OUT—Earned his 13th win of the season after tossing his 12th quality start of the year on Aug. 23 at BAL, working 6.0 innings of one-hit ball (W, 6.0IP, H, 0ER, 4SO)...retired his first seven batters faced before yielding a double to **Colton Cowser** with one out in the 3rd inning...set down his final 11 batters faced before handing the ball over to the bullpen.

- ★ Became the oldest pitcher (36.018) in franchise history to pitch 6.0 innings or more and allow one or zero baserunners in a start and the eighth-oldest AL pitcher in the modern era (since 1900) to do so (12x), the first since **HOU Justin Verlander** (39.184) on Aug. 23, 2022 vs. MIN...he is the seventh-oldest pitcher (9x) in the modern era to turn the trick without walking a batter.
- ★ Was the second-oldest pitcher in franchise history to toss 6.0 innings or more with one or zero hits and no walks allowed by one day behind **Corey Kluber** (36.019) on April 29, 2022 vs. MIN...Martinez also turned the trick on April 5 at MIN, becoming the second-oldest pitcher to toss multiple games of 6.0 innings or more with one or zero hits allowed in 2026 (also: 2x. **ATL Chris Sale**) and the oldest AL arm since **TEX Max Scherzer** in 2023 (2x).
- ★ Became the fourth Rays pitcher to make 25 starts in an age 35-or-older season (age as of June 30), joining Kluber (31) in 2022, **Charlie Morton** (33) in 2019, and **Bobby Witt** (32) in 1999.

SLAM DIEGO—Martinez is set for his sixth career appearance (fifth start) against the Padres, including his third outing at home...marks his first outing against San Diego since Sept. 8, 2025 with Cincinnati at Petco Park, when he took the loss as a reliever in the 10th inning on a walk-off sacrifice fly by **Fernando Tatis Jr.** (L, 0.1IP, 1R-0ER)...made his most recent start against the club with the Reds on June 27, 2025 at Great American Ball Park, earning his lone win against the Padres after throwing a career-high-tying 112 pitches across 8.0 innings of one-hit ball (W, 8.0IP, H, 0ER, 2BB, 6SO)...in that start, he became the fourth-oldest pitcher (34.326) in Reds history to toss 8.0 innings or more with one or zero hits allowed; the last older Reds pitcher to do so was **Joe Nuxhall** (36.359) on July 24, 1965 at HOU [G2].

- ★ He has logged a 3-1 record with a 2.25 ERA (48.0IP, 12ER) with 34 strikeouts across eight Interleague starts this season...his ERA in Interleague games is the sixth-lowest clip in the AL this season (min. 40.0IP) and the seventh-lowest mark in the majors...across 66 career Interleague games (30 starts), he has fashioned a 3.67 ERA (215.2IP, 88ER) with 175 strikeouts...Martinez's 46 career walks in Interleague games are tied for the 11th fewest since MLB implemented Interleague games in 1997 (min. 200.0IP).
- ★ Is set to make his fourth start of the season against an NL West club, going 2-0 with a 2.16 ERA (16.2IP, 4ER) and 12 strikeouts in those starts...across 66 career outings (22 starts) opposite NL West foes, he boasts a 3.76 ERA (191.1IP, 80ER) with 166 strikeouts...his teams are 2-1 against the division this season and 38-28 in his career.

TROP DAY IS THE BEST DAY—Martinez has turned in a 7-3 record with a 3.87 ERA (74.1IP, 32ER) and 47 strikeouts across 13 starts at Tropicana Field this season...has lost his last two starts at the Trop after winning three straight, yielding a combined 12 earned runs and five home runs in his last two home outings since July 31...with a win today, he would become the sixth-oldest Rays starting pitcher (36.024) in franchise history to earn a win at Tropicana Field (oldest: **Rich Hill**, 41.104 - June 23, 2021 vs. BOS)...would also earn his eighth home win of the season, becoming the second-oldest pitcher to win eight games or more in a season at Tropicana Field behind **Charlie Morton's** (35.317) eight wins in 2019.

- ★ Among pitchers with 50.0 IP or more at home this season, Martinez's 13 walks are tied for the fourth fewest in the AL behind **TOR Spencer Miles** (9), **MIN Joe Ryan** (11), and **SEA Bryan Woo** (12).

I CAN GO THE DISTANCE—On Aug. 11 at ATH, Martinez recorded his first career 9.0-inning complete game, the third by a Ray since the start of 2017 along with **Zack Littell** on May 31, 2025 at HOU and **Ryan Yarbrough** on June 3, 2021 at NYY...he became oldest pitcher in franchise history (36.006) to record a 9.0-inning complete game and one of five pitchers since the start of 2020 to do so after turning 36 (9x), joining **AZ Merrill Kelly** (May 15, 2026 at COL - 37.213), **STL Adam Wainwright** (5x, last: Aug. 13, 2022 vs. MIL - 40.348), **HOU Zack Greinke** (June 4, 2021 at TOR - 37.226), and **WSH Max Scherzer** (May 2, 2021 vs. MIA - 36.279)...he became the eighth pitcher in franchise history (15x) to toss a 9.0-inning complete game on 101 pitches or fewer and the first since **Chris Archer** on Aug. 20, 2015 at HOU (98 pitches).

- ★ He was the first pitcher in the majors to toss a 9.0-inning complete game while allowing four earned runs or more since **KC Jordan Lyles** on May 9, 2023 vs. CWS and the first to turn the trick and earn the win since **MIN Bartolo Colon** on Aug. 4, 2017 vs. TEX...Martinez is the 10th pitcher in the modern era (since 1900) to earn the win in a 9.0-inning complete game while throwing 101 pitches or fewer and allowing four earned runs or more.
