METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off on Thursday...Tonight, the team returns to action for a brief three-game homestand against the Giants...On Wednesday, the Mets defeated the Rays, 10-4 at Tropicana Field...The Mets improved to 10-12 in rubber games this year...New York earned their 18th series win of the season and their eighth on the road...The Mets are 16-11 over their last 27 games.

LAST TIME OUT: Nolan McLean earned his 10th win of the season after not allowing an earned run over 7.0 innings on August 29 vs. Houston (7.0 IP, 2 H, R, 3 BB, 4 K)...Hasn't allowed an earned run over his last two starts...Became the 12th Mets rookie ever to record a 10-win season...His 15 career wins are tied with Dillon Gee and John Matlack for the fourth-most in franchise history among rookies.

ROLLIN' NOLAN: McLean has completed at least 6.0 innings in 12 of his last 13 starts and he has allowed two or fewer earned runs in 14 of his last 16 starts...Over his last 11 starts dating back to June 30, he has pitched to a 1.76 ERA (13 ER/66.1 IP) and recorded 66 strikeouts...His ERA is the best in the NL over that span and the second-best in the majors, only behind Dylan Cease's 1.36 ERA...Over that same span, he is the only pitcher in the majors who has thrown at least 6.0 innings and allowed two or fewer runs in at least 10 games.

RECORD BOOKS: Through 35 career starts, McLean is 15-9 with a 2.83 ERA (64 ER/203.2 IP) and 229 strikeouts...His 229 strikeouts are the sixth-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first 35 career starts, only trailing Dwight Gooden's 302, Matt Harvey's 257, Noah Syndergaard's 247, Kodai Senga's 236 and Jacob DeGrom's 234...Per Elias...He is one of nine pitchers in Major League history to strike out 229+ batters and allow 64 or fewer earned runs through their first 35 appearances (also: Matt Harvey, Jacob Misiorowski, Paul Skenes, Jose Fernandez, Stephen Strasburg, Jacob DeGrom, Kodai Senga and Cam Schlitler).

NATE THE GREAT: Nate Lavender recorded five outs without allowing a run and earned his eighth hold of the season on September 2 at Tampa Bay (1.2 IP, H, 2 K, BB)...Over 12 appearances this season he has thrown 12.2 scoreless innings while recording 14 strikeouts and only allowing five hits...His 12 consecutive scoreless appearances to begin his career is the second-longest streak in team history...Joe Smith holds the record with 17 straight scoreless outings.

GIVE ME A BREAK: In 43 games following the All-Star break, Francisco Lindor is batting .244/.332/.470 with 25 runs, six doubles, one triple 10 homers, 21 walks, 24 RBI and an .818 OPS...This compares to a .216/.298/.373 with 22 runs, three doubles, three triples, five homers, 12 RBI, 16 walks and a .671 OPS in 40 games in the first half of the season.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga recorded his fifth save on Monday, tossing 1.0 scoreless inning...He has appeared in 11 games since the trade deadline and is 0-1 with a 1.74 ERA (2 ER/10.1 IP), five walks and 12 strikeouts...He has converted all five save opportunities.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: The Mets have had nine players make their Major League debut this year - OF Carson Benge, OF A.J. Ewing, LHP Nate Lavender, OF Nick Morabito, RHP Dylan Ross, RHP Matt Seelinger, LHP Zac Thornton, RHP Jack Weisenburger and LHP Jefry Yan...The Mets had nine players make their Major League debut in 2025.

BLAME IT ON THE BENGE: Over his last 32 games dating back to July 29, Carson Benge has a .339/.383/.516 (42-124) slashline with 11 extra-base hits, 14 RBI, 17 runs and a .900 OPS...Ranks first in the NL in hits during that span...Also leads all qualified NL hitters in average during that span...His 141 hits this season are the sixth-most in a single season by a Mets rookie...Jay Payton (2000) is next with 142, following by Ron Hunt (1963) with 145...Pete Alonso has the rookie record with 155 hits in 2019.

DOWN ON THE FARM: The Syracuse Mets recorded their sixth shutout in their last 10 wins to defeat the Rochester Red Wings, 4-0, on Thursday night at NBT Bank Stadium...Syracuse (32-26, 70-63) took an early lead in the second inning...The Mets pitching staff kept Rochester off the scoreboard throughout the night...Rochester's offense registered nine hits, but went 0-for-7 with runners in scoring position...Xzavion Curry started for the Mets, tossed four innings and two-thirds with one strikeout, before Tobias Myers entered in the fifth...Myers worked two innings and a third with only allowing one baserunner and three strikeouts...Chayce McDermott took over in the eighth and completed the shutout with three strikeouts in the ninth.

PUT IT IN THE BOOKS: The New York Mets announced the club will honor legendary broadcaster Howie Rose with a special retirement ceremony prior to the team's final regular season home game of the 2026 season on Sunday, September 20 against the Philadelphia Phillies at 1:10 p.m. at Citi Field...Rose, whose unmistakable voice has been part of Mets baseball for nearly four decades, announced that the 2026 season would be his final year in the Mets radio booth...The first 15,000 fans will receive a "Put it in the books" notebook and scorecard.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets enjoyed a day off on this day in 1986...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title today.

NEW SKIPPER: Andy Green has been named Interim Manager for the remainder of the 2026 season...Green, who joined the Mets organization in 2023 and previously served as Senior Vice President, Baseball Development, managed the San Diego Padres from 2016-19, guiding the club to a 274-366 (.428) record...The 48-year-old played parts of four Major League seasons with the Diamondbacks (2004-06) and appeared in four games with the Mets in 2009...He will wear #70...The Mets are 29-30 since Green took the helm.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his 10th win of the season after not allowing an earned run over 7.0 innings on August 29 vs. Houston (7.0 IP, 2 H, R, 3 BB, 4 K)...Hasn't allowed an earned run over his last two starts...Became the 12th Mets rookie ever to record a 10-win season...His 15 career wins are tied with Dillon Gee and John Matlack for the fourth-most in franchise history among rookies.

ROLLIN' NOLAN: Has completed at least 6.0 innings in 12 of his last 13 starts and he has allowed two or fewer earned runs in 14 of his last 16 starts...Over his last 11 starts dating back to June 30, he has pitched to a 1.76 ERA (13 ER/66.1 IP) and recorded 66 strikeouts...His ERA is the best in the NL over that span and the second-best in the majors, only behind Dylan Cease's 1.36 ERA...Over that same span, he is the only pitcher in the majors who has thrown at least 6.0 innings and allowed two or fewer runs in at least 10 games.

AHEAD OF THE PACK: This season, he is 10-8 with a 3.06 ERA (53 ER/155.2 IP) with 172 strikeouts and is holding opposing batters to a .203 batting average (114-561)...Among qualified NL pitchers, he ranks third in opponents' batting average, sixth in WHIP (1.12), seventh in strikeouts and eighth in ERA...Among all qualified rookies in the majors, he ranks first in strikeouts, second in innings pitched, third in opponents' batting average, sixth in ERA and seventh in WHIP.

SPIN THAT THING: This season, he has thrown his curveball 14.5% of the time and he is generating an average of 3,360 RPM on the pitch...That is the highest average RPM on any qualified pitch in the majors this season...He is posting a 39.8% whiff rate on his curveball, which is the seventh-highest mark on a qualified curveball this season...Batters are hitting just .104 (10-96) in at-bats ending with his curveball, which is the lowest opponents' batting average in at-bats ending with a curveball in the majors among qualifiers...Over his first 35 career starts, opposing batters are hitting .098 (12-123) in at-bats ending with McLean's curveball, and he has recorded a career 44.9% whiff rate on the pitch.

SINK SINK BABY: McLean has thrown his sinker 33.3% of the time this season, up from 27.9% last season...His sinker has produced a 25-run value, which is tied for the second-highest run value on any pitch in the majors this season and is the highest mark on any sinker this season according to Baseball Savant...Batters are hitting just .175 (40-229) in at-bats ending with his sinker, which is the third-lowest batting average among qualifying sinkers.

KEEPIN IT 200: Recorded his 200th career strikeout with a punchout of Heriberto Hernández to end the first on July 30 vs. Miami...Joins Dwight Gooden, Matt Harvey, Noah Syndergaard and Kodai Senga as the only pitchers in franchise history to reach the 200-career strikeout mark in 30 games or fewer.

VS. SAN FRANCISCO: Will be making his second career start and his second this season against San Francisco...His start against the Giants earlier this season came on April 3 in San Francisco, and he fired 5.1 innings and allowed one earned run while striking out four (5.1 IP, H, 2 R, ER, 2 BB, 4 K)...He retired each of the first 15 batters he faced during that start.

PERFECT FIVE: He has retired each of his first 15 batters faced twice this season (4/21 vs. MIN and 4/3 at SF) ...He is the third pitcher in franchise history to be perfect through 5.0 innings multiple times in a season (also: Steve Trachsel, 2002 and Rick Reed, 1998)...His is the first pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to retire each of his first 15 batters multiple times in his first 13 career starts...*Per Elias*...When he was perfect through 5.0 innings on April 3 he became the first Mets pitcher to retire each of their first 15 batters faced since Sean Manaea retired each of the first 17 batters he faced on August 21, 2024, vs. Baltimore.

ROOKIE SENSATION: McLean was called up to the Majors on August 16, 2025, and he finished the season with the big-league club...Last season he made eight starts for the Mets, and he finished 5-1 with a 2.06 ERA (11 ER/48.0 IP) and 57 strikeouts...The Mets went 6-2 as a team in games started by McLean...His ERA is the third-best in franchise history through a player's first eight career starts, only trailing Terry Leach's 1.68 ERA and Rick Aguilera's 1.92 ERA...His 57 strikeouts are the third-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first eight career games, only trailing Nolan Ryan's 64 and Dwight Gooden's 59...He became the first pitcher in Major League history to throw at least 5.0 innings, strikeout five or more, and allow two or fewer earned runs in each of his first seven career starts...He is one of four players in Major League history to record 57 or more strikeouts and allow 11 or fewer earned runs through their first eight career games...He joins Nolan Ryan,

Stephen Strasburg, and Paul Skenes as the only other pitchers to do so...Because McLean threw less than 50.0 innings last season, he is still considered a rookie under MLB's eligibility criteria...He entered the season as the No. 6 prospect in all of baseball, the No. 1 pitching prospect in baseball, and the No. 1 prospect in the Mets system according to *MLBPipeline.com*.

MC-USA: He represented the USA in the WBC...He made two starts and he finished with a 5.87 ERA (5 ER/7.2 IP) with eight strikeouts...He held opposing batters to a .222 (6-27) batting average during the event....He got the ball in the championship game vs. Venezuela on March 17 and he tossed 4.2 innings and allowed two earned runs while striking out four.

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Last season, he appeared in 21 games between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse and posted a 2.45 ERA (31 ER/113.2 IP)...He recorded 127 strikeouts over those 113.2 innings, good for a K/9 of 10.06...His 127 strikeouts were the second-most among Mets minor leaguers and the 18th among all minor leaguers at the time of his callup...He only surrendered two or more earned runs in one of his last 14 appearances prior to being called up...Overall from 2023-2025, he made 48 minor league appearances (44 starts) and finished 12-15 with a 3.10 ERA (78 ER/226.2 IP) and 245 strikeouts.

TWO-WAY COWBOY: The Willow Spring, North Carolina native, was a two-way player during his time at Oklahoma State and during the beginning of his professional career...During his final collegiate season he pitched in 14 games and posted a 3.30 ERA (11 ER/30.0 IP) while batting .250 (31-124) and having a .911 OPS...Overall he finished he career at Oklahoma State with a career .957 OPS and 36 home runs...Was originally drafted by Baltimore in the third round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft but decided to return to school and was drafted by the Mets in the third round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft...He hit in his first two professional seasons and overall he finished as a .185 (27-146) hitter with nine home runs and 24 RBI.
