METSCOLLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Padres, 11-5, last night...With a win today, the Mets could claim their 14th series of the season...New York is 13-2-2 in 17 series this year...The Mets continue a 10-game, 11-day California road trip (3-2) at the Dodgers (2-2), Padres (1-0) and Angels (three games).

PETCO PARK, WHERE THE METS GO: Tomás Nido has hit safely in all five career games at Petco Park...He is 8-18 (.444) with two runs, a home run, three RBI and two walks at the ballpark...Jeff McNeil is 7-16 (.438) with four runs, two doubles, an RBI and a walk in four contests at the yard...Mark Canha is 8-20 (.400) with five runs, a double, a home run, three and four walks in five career games at Petco Park...Eduardo Escobar owns a .271 (35-129) batting average with 16 runs, seven doubles, a triple, four home runs, 22 RBI and 11 walks in 33 career games in SoCal.

I WANT TO RIDE MY CYCLE: Eduardo Escobar recorded his first career cycle and the 11th cycle in franchise history last night...He finished the game going 4-5 with three runs, a double, triple, home run and six RBI...It was the first cycle recorded in the history of Petco Park...According to Elias, the last player before Escobar to finish off a cycle with a triple and home run in the eighth inning or later was Luis Gonzalez for Arizona on July 5, 2000 (triple in 8th, home run in 9th)...Escobar and Treva Turner (7 RBI, April 25, 2017) are the only players in the last 10 years with a cycle and 6+ RBIs in the same game.

PADRES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 24-35 in San Diego since Petco Park opened in 2004.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a major league leading 37 times this year...The Mets have been hit six times in the last seven games...The Mets have been hit 271 times since the start of the 2019 season...That is first in the majors and 19 times more than the second-place team, the Chicago Cubs...Since 2019, Mark Canha has been plunked 60 times, which is the second-most in the majors...Pete Alonso ranks sixth with 45 HBP, while Starling Marte is seventh with 42 HBP.

MV-PETE: Alonso has safely hit in four straight games, going 6-18 (.333) with eight runs, a double, three home runs, seven RBI, a walk with a 1.257 OPS in that span...He has safely hit in eight of his last 10 games, batting .316 (12-38) in that span with 12 runs, two doubles, five home runs, 13 RBI, nine walks with a .440 OBP, a .763 SLG and a 1.203 OPS in that span...He is batting over .300 since the start of May, hitting .303/.387/.621 with 18 extra-base hits and 37 RBI.

FOGO POWER: Escobar collected six RBI in a game for the fifth time in his career last night...Over his last 14 games, Escobar is batting .333 (20-60) with 10 runs, five doubles, a triple, three home runs, 15 RBI with a .600 SLG and a .923 OPS...He is batting .317/.354/.650 against left-handed pitching this season.

TRIPLES MAKES IT SAFE. TRIPLES IS BEST: The Mets lead the major leagues with 14 three-baggers this year...Brandon Nimmo is tied for the major league lead with four triples, while Eduardo Escobar is tied for fourth with three...Francisco Lindor and Starling Marte have hit two each, placing them tied for 13th in The Show...The Mets recorded 18 triples in 2021...The franchise record is 49 triples accomplished by the 2009 Mets...Lance Johnson holds the franchise record with a single-season total of 21 triples, doing so in 1996.

LET'S GO STREAKING: The Mets have won three straight games...They are batting .322 (37-115) with 25 runs, seven doubles, a triple, six home runs, 10 walks with a .385 OBP, a .557 SLG and a .941 OPS during the current streak...The Mets have outscored opponents 25-13 in that span...The team is 8-2 over their last 10 games, batting .293/.359/.469 in that span with 14 doubles, three triples, 14 homers and an .827 OPS...The Mets have outscored opponents 67-32 over the last 10 games.

JUST THE HITS!: The Mets collected 16 hits last night...It marked the sixth time this season New York recorded 15 or more hits in a game...That is the most in the majors...The Mets are 5-1 this year when collecting 15 or more hits in a game...The Mets recorded only five games with 15+ hits in 2021...The 2019 Mets were the last team to record more games with 15+ hits, doing so in 10 games and compiling an 8-2 record.

HANG 10: The Mets have scored 10 or more runs in a major league-leading eight games this year...The Mets are 7-1 in such games...In 2021, the Mets scored 10 or more runs in only nine games...The Mets have recorded at least 10 hits in 20 games this season...The Mets are 17-3 when collecting at least 10 hits in a contest...Their 17 wins when recording 10 hits is second in the majors...The Cardinals are 20-3 with 10+ hits in a game this season.

CANHA GET AN AMEN?: Mark Canha has recorded back-to-back multi-hit games...Over his last eight games, he is batting .393 (11-28) with eight runs, two doubles, two RBI, two walks with a .452 OBP, a .464 SLG and a .916 OPS...He is batting .319/.382/.435 over his last 18 games.

TWO-FERS: The Mets are batting .251/.330/.398 with two outs this season...Their 110 RBI with two outs are tops in the major leagues...The Mets have hit .203/.276/.284 with two strikes this year...Their .203 batting average is the best in the majors, as is their .276 OBP.

DINGERS!: New York has homered in 12 of their last 14 games, hitting 20 home runs in that span...The Mets hit a total of 34 home runs in their previous 43 games...New York is tied for 16th in the majors and tied for ninth in the NL with 54 home runs this year...Pete Alonso ranks tied for second in the majors and is tied for the NL lead with 16 round-trippers.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Mets lead the majors with a .291 average with runners in scoring position...They rank third in MLB with a .362 OBP and fifth with a .458 SLG in those situations...Nido leads the club, hitting .400 (10-25) in those situations...Jeff McNeil - .391 (18-46), J.D. Davis - .364 (8-22), Pete Alonso - .360 (18-50), Mark Canha - .318 (14-44) and Francisco Lindor - .310 (18-58) are all hitting .300 or better with RISP...Alonso leads the majors with 41 RBI in RISP situations and has nine home runs with runner(s) in scoring position this year, four more than any other hitter in the majors.

ROAD WARRIOR: Pete Alonso is batting .276/.323/.545 with nine home runs and 31 RBI on the road this year...He owns a lifetime .944 OPS on the road...His .944 OPS is the highest in franchise history (min. 900 PA)...His .583 SLG on the road is also the best in franchise history...In 2022, his nine road homers are tied for third in the majors and are tied for the most in the NL...His 31 RBI on the road are second-most in the majors and top the NL.

ROAD TRIPPIN': New York is 19-11 on the road this year...Their .633 road winning percentage is the fourth-best in the majors and is the third-best in the NL...The Mets did not record their 19th win on the road until July 4 in 2021 in their 44th road game (19-25)...The Mets finished the first-half of the 2021 season going 19-26 on the road...They did not record their 20th road win until July 18 in 2021 (20-28)...New York is batting .263/.332/.408 away from Citi Field...Their .263 road average ranks second in the majors, while their .332 OBP ranks third.

RIGHT AWAY: The Mets are batting .275/.342/.422 against right-handed pitchers this year...Their .275 average and .337 OBP against righties is the best in The Show, while their .422 SLG is second-best...Jeff McNeil is third in the majors with a .353 (48-136) average against right-handed pitchers...Pete Alonso is 10th in the NL with a .298 (50-168) mark, while Starling Marte is 11th in the Senior Circuit with a .294 (45-153) average...The Mets are 28-10 when facing a right-handed pitcher this year.

TOMÁS THE TANK ENGINE: Over his last nine games, Tomás Nido is batting .407 (11-27) with five runs, a double, five RBI, three walks with a .911 OPS...Over his last 18 games, he is batting .315 (17-54) with five runs, two doubles, seven RBI, five walks with a .373 OBP...He is 10-25 (.400) with runners in scoring position this season.

BY THE WAY: New York has won 38 games this season, the most in the National League...Their .667 winning percentage is second in the majors and is the best in the NL...The team has posted a 38-19 record through the team's first 57 games...Only the 1986 (41-16) team posted a better record through the first 57 games of the season...The 1988 Mets also went 38-19...The Mets are a season-high 19 games above .500...The last time the team was more than 19 games above .500 was on October 1, 2015 (89-70).

MARTE PARTAY: Starling Marte has safely hit in 16 of his last 19 games and is batting .314 (27-86) in that span with 19 runs, five doubles, two triples, four home runs, 13 RBI, three walks and an .895 OPS in that stretch...He owns a .278/.317/.443 slashline with 36 runs, 10 doubles, two triples, seven home runs, 33 RBI and eight walks in 49 games this season.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, DAVIS: Over his last 11 games, J.D. Davis is batting .368 (14-38) with seven runs, four doubles, six RBI, three walks with a .419 OBP, a .474 SLG and an .892 OPS in that span...Over his last 21 games, Davis is batting .279/.346/.382...He owns a .321/.406/.491 slashline in 19 road games, compared to a .170/.264/.213 slashline in 16 games at Citi Field in 2022.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz has recorded 11 saves this season, tied for the sixth-most in the majors...He is season in the major leagues and first in the NL among relievers with 41 strikeouts...His 16.28 strikeouts per nine innings is second in the majors and in the NL...He has struck out 41 of the 91 batters he faced, good for 45.1%...He is 2-1 with 11 saves, a 2.38 ERA (six earned runs/22.2 innings), allowing 16 hits and 10 walks...The Mets are 22-1 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

WALKER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered his first loss of the season June 2 against the Dodgers at Dodger stadium ending a three-game win streak...Allowed two earned runs on seven hits, one walk and two strikeouts...Has five straight starts with three earned runs or fewer, the longest such streak by a Mets starter this season.

NO FLY ZONE: Walker has allowed just two home runs in 40.2 innings this season, good for a 0.44 HR/9 ratio...That ranks 12th in the majors and sixth in the NL among pitchers with at least 40.0 innings...Since allowing a pair of home runs on May 5 at Philadelphia, he has gone five starts without yielding a long ball, totaling 29.2 innings.

VS. SAN DIEGO: In six career starts against the Padres, Walker is 3-2 with a 1.97 ERA (seven earned runs/32.0 innings)...According to *Sportradar*, he's one of only five active pitchers with a sub-2.00 ERA versus San Diego (minimum 5 GS), while his .171 opponent batting average and 0.84 WHIP are each the third lowest against the Padres among actives...In three career starts at Petco Park, Walker is 2-1 with a 1.59 ERA (three earned runs/17.0 IP).

SPLIT-FINGER SUCCESS: In eight starts this season, Walker has used his splitter nearly 30% of the time and has held opposing hitters a .164 (7-61) batting average in at-bats ending in the pitch...15 of Walker's 21 strikeouts this season have come via the splitter.

FEW K, THAT'S OK: Through eight starts this season, Walker is 3-1 with a 2.88 ERA (13 earned runs/40.2 IP) with 21 strikeouts...His 21 strikeouts are tied for the fourth fewest by a starting pitcher through their first eight starts to begin the season since 2012 with a sub-3.00 ERA (Min 35.0 IP)...Walker is tied with Pete Schourek (1992) for the eighth fewest strikeouts by a Mets starter with a sub-3.00 ERA in their first eight starts of the season.

JOYFUL IN JUNE: In 20 June starts, Walker is 11-5 with a 3.12 ERA (42 earned runs/121.1 innings) his best totals for any month...Has 116 strikeouts in June, the second most in any month (Most: April, 120 Ks)...Last season, Walker went 2-2 with a 3.26 ERA (11 earned runs/30.0 innings) in five June starts...His 33 strikeouts last season in June were the most in any month.

ROAD IMPROVEMENT: In five road starts this season, Walker is 2-1 with a 2.81 ERA (eight earned runs/25.2 innings)...Last season, Walker went 3-7 with a 5.82 ERA (44 earned runs/68.0 innings) in 14 road starts.

LIMITING LEFTIES: Since 2021, Walker has held left-handed batters to .194 (61-314) average, the seventh best mark among right-handed pitchers in that span (min. 200 left-handed batters faced)...Since his debut year, 2013, Walker has limited left-handed batters to a .229 (328-1431) average, 10th-best among right-handed arms during that span (min. 1,500 LHB faced).

DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS: Last season, Walker tied a career-high with four pickoffs, tied for the fifth most in the majors and the most among right-handed pitchers last season...In his second start of the season, Walker picked off Nick Castellanos at first base..The righty also posted a career-high 33 assists which ranked second in the National League and third in the majors, as well as a career-high 16 putouts which tied for 10th in the National League.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CHRIS BASSITT (4-3, 3.74)

LAST TIME OUT: In his first start at Dodgers Stadium, Bassitt went 6.0 innings allowing four runs, three earned, on five hits against the Dodgers...He came out of the game with a team-high 110 total pitches after matching a season-high eight strikeouts and walking two.

RIGHT WHERE HE WANTS THEM: When Bassitt is ahead in the count against opponents they are held to a .182 batting average...He owns a sub-.200 opponent batting average when there are two strikes in any count.

- Owns the MLB lead in games with at least four RBI (six) and is second in games with multiple RBI (13) this season...He is the first player since Carlos Lee in 2005 with at least six 4+ RBI games in his team's first 55 contests...The only players with more through 55 team games are Juan Gonzalez (eight in 1998), Jimmie Foxx (seven in 1938) and Lou Gehrig (seven in 1930)...All three of those players finished the season with at least 157 RBI.
- Hit two homers and drove in five on June 4 at Los Angeles-NL...Was his 13th career multi-homer game (tied for most since 2019).
- Has a 1.426 OPS with runners in scoring position, going 18-50 (.360/.486/.940) with two doubles, nine homers, 41 RBI and 15 walks.
- After putting up a .744 OPS in April, owns a 1.008 OPS since May 1 (ninth-best in MLB)...Set a Mets record with 30 RBI in May...Willie Montañez (1978) had the old mark with 28 RBI in May...He is the seventh Met with 30+ RBI in a calendar month.
- Hit his third career walk-off home run on May 19 vs. St. Louis to help the Mets win a four-game series.
