METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated Miami, 4-0 last night...The club continues a six-game trip (2-0) to Miami (2-0) and Washington (three games)...This Mets are in a stretch of 27 games in 26 days (2-0), a span that includes two doubleheaders (August 6 vs. Atlanta and August 20 at Philadelphia) and one scheduled off day (August 11)...The Mets are 48-11 when scoring first this season...New York is 23-6-3 in 32 series this year.

LET'S GO STREAKING: The Mets have won five-straight games and have won nine of their last 12...The team's five game winning streak is the second-longest of the season... The Mets won six straight from May 27 - June 1...The team is batting .295/.361/.555 in the five-game winning streak and has outscored opponents 27-14 in that span.

HECK OR HIGH-WATER MARK: The Mets are a season-high 26 games over .500...It's the most games over .500 since they were 32 games over with a record of 97-65 to end the 2006 season...New York has won 63 games this season, second-most in the National League...Their .630 winning percentage is fourth in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 63-37 record through the team's first 100 games... Only the 1986 (68-32) team posted a better record through the first 100 games of the season.

C IS FOR COOKIE: Carlos Carrasco has thrown 18.2 scoreless innings to finish out the month of July...Overall, he went 3-0 with a 0.90 ERA (three earned runs/30.0 innings) with nine walks and 27 strikeouts...That is his lowest ERA for any month in his career... His 0.90 ERA in July is the fourth-lowest ERA for any single month (min. 30 innings)...He trails only Mets pitchers with a sub-1.00 ERA in a single month since 1990 (min. 30 IP): Frank Viola (April 1991 - 0.86 ERA), AI Leiter (April 2002 - 0.92 ERA), R.A. Dickey (June 2012 - 0.93 ERA) and Jacob deGrom (April 2021 - 0.51 ERA).

HOW SWEEP IT IS: The Mets are looking for their second consecutive sweep and their fourth sweep of the season...It would be the team's first three game sweep of the Fish since August 17-19, 2020 in Miami...On the other side, the Mets have yet to be swept in a series of three-or-more games this year...According to Elias, the Mets have gone 107 games since they were last swept in a series of three or more games...It's their longest stretch avoiding a sweep since they went 120 games spanning the 2018-2019 season... This includes the final 87 games of 2018 and first 33 games of 2019...The franchise record is 167 games avoiding a sweep, spanning the 1987 and 1988 seasons...The single season record is the final 134 games of 1987 season.

BLANK STREET: The Mets recorded their 14th shutout of the season last night...That is the most in the National League and tied with the Yankees for the most in the majors... The team's 14 shutouts are the most since they recorded 15 in 2018...The Mets have been blanked only five times this season.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 11 straight games against the NL East...The Mets are 2-0 during the stretch...Overall, the Mets are 30-12 against the East this year...There .714 division winning percentage is the best in baseball...They have not lost a series in the division all season long...The team has not lost back-to-back games in a division series as well this year...Since May 27, the team has gone 17-5 in the division... Overall, the Mets have posted a 2.95 ERA against the East, while hitting .252/.332/.408... The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents 208-130 this season.

QUALITY EATS: Taijuan Walker has made eight straight quality starts...That is the longest streak of his career...He previously recorded seven straight quality starts from May 29 - July 1, 2015...In those eight starts since June 12, Walker has gone 5-0 and posted a 2.12 ERA (12 earned runs/51.0 innings) with 11 walks and 51 strikeouts...That is the fourth-lowest ERA in the NL in that span.

WALK THIS DAY: Walker has gone 4-0 with a 1.04 ERA (six earned runs/52.0 innings) with 12 walks and 45 strikeouts in eight starts in day games this year...His 1.04 ERA during the sunshine is fourth in the majors and is the best in the National League.

DAY MAN: New York is 25-15 in day games this season...The team's .625 winning percentage in the sunlight is the fourth-best in the majors and the second-best in the National League...The Mets have posted a 2.99 ERA with 101 walks and 388 strikeouts in the daytime...Their 2.99 ERA in the daytime is third in the majors and second in the NL, while their 388 punchouts are fourth in the majors and the second-most in the Senior Circuit.

FOR STARTERS: Since Max Scherzer returned from the Injured List on July 5, Mets starters have posted a 1.84 ERA (25 earned runs/122.0 innings) in the team's last 20 games with 132 strikeouts and 33 walks...That is nearly a full run better than the nextbest club, the Dodgers (2.83)...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.09 to 3.59 in that span...The Mets rank sixth in the majors and third in the National League with a 3.59 ERA from their starters.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: The Mets have struck out 250 hitters in the seventh month of the year...That sets a new franchise record...The team's 250 strikeouts are second in the majors for the month and first in the NL...The Mets are 16-8 with a ...667 winning percentage in July...The team's 16 wins this month are the most in the month of July since 2008 when they went 18-8...The team's 16 wins this month are the third-most in the National League.

JULY! JULY! JULY!: New York's 2.45 team ERA (60 earned runs/219.1 innings) this month is the best mark in the majors...Mets starters have gone 9-5 with 2.32 ERA (37 earned runs/143.1 innings) with 36 walks and 162 strikeouts in 24 games in July...Their 2.32 ERA is the best in The Show, while their 162 strikeouts from starters is second-best.

MARLINS-METS NOTES: These two clubs have played 164 games since beginning a four-game series here in Miami on July 29, 2013, nine years ago... The Mets are 96-68 in that span and have outscored the Fish, 709-587 (+122 run differential) in those games.

CONNECT FOUR: New York is 53-5 when scoring at least four runs in a game...The team's 53 wins when scoring at least four runs is tied for second in the majors...Their .912 winning percentage when scoring four or more runs is the best in the majors...The Mets have won 21 consecutive games in which they've scored at least four runs, and are 31-1 since May 27 when scoring at least four times...The 2021 Mets went 62-19 when scoring four or more.

JUST ME AND THE OPEN ROAD: New York is 32-20 on the road this year...The Mets have surpassed their 2021 road wins total (30-51)...Their .615 road winning percentage is the third-best in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...New York is batting .254/.323/.407 away from Citi Field...Their .254 road average ranks third in the NL...Jeff McNeil ranks fifth in the NL with a .313 (47-150) road batting average, while Brandon Nimmo is seventh with a .303 (60-198) mark

HIT IT TO THE CHAIRS: The Mets have hit 30 home runs in 24 games this month, more than the 24 they socked in 25 June games...New York has tallied multiple homers 11 times in July, their most multi-homer games in a calendar month this year...The Mets have homered in five straight games, socking nine home runs in that span...It is their second-longest homer streak of the year...The Mets homered in eight straight from May 23-31...This season, the Mets are 22-5 when hitting multiple home runs in a game.

LINDOR CITY OVER HERE: Francisco Lindor is batting .329 (24-73) with a .970 OPS in his last 18 games...He is on a six-game hitting streak, batting .455 (10-22) with five runs, three doubles, a home run, three RBI, four walks with a .538 OBP and a .727 SLG in that span...He ranks second in the majors with 20 go-ahead RBI behind teammate Pete Alonso (23)...He is tied for 15th in the NL with 59 runs and is tied for seventh in MLB and fifth in the NL with 69 RBI...He ranks 13th in the majors and eighth in the National League with a .3.9 fWAR.

TAKING OUR TALENTS TO SOUTH BEACH: Pete Alonso has 20 career homers vs. the Marlins, his most against any one opponent, fifth-most among active players and tied for 23nd all-time...David Wright (26) is the only Met with more home runs against Miami...Francisco Lindor has six home runs and 16 RBI in 13 games against Miami this year...Has eight homers and 26 RBI in his last 21 games against the Fish...J.D. Davis owns a lifetime .333/.453/.567 slashline vs. Miami...Davis ranks third in average, fourth in OBP, eighth in SLG and fifth in OPS (1.020) vs. the Fish since 2019 (min. 100 PA).

ON LOAN: Brandon Nimmo is batting .391 (9-23) with four runs, three doubles two home runs and five RBI in five games this season at loanDepot Park...Since the start of the 2020 season, Nimmo has hit safely in 10 of his 12 games there, batting .370 (17-45) with seven runs, four doubles, two triples, three home runs, seven RBI, four walks with a .420 OBP and a .739 OPS...In 32 career games at the ballpark, he owns a .260/.342/.460 slashline with 12 runs, 10 extra-base hits and 12 RBI.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets rank third in the majors with 951 strikeouts this season...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 767 times this season...That is the fourth-fewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit... The Mets have struck out 15 or more batters in a game seven times this year, which is the second-most in the majors...The team has struck out 10 or more in a game 51 times this year, the most in MLB.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz, the reigning NL Reliever of the Month, has posted a 1-0 record with 13 saves, a 0.39 ERA (one earned run/23.0 innings) with 11 hits, three walks and 50 strikeouts over his last 23 appearances since May 27...30 of his last 39 outs have been recorded via the strikeout...He has recorded 23 saves this season, which places him fourth in the majors...He leads the major leagues among relievers with 84 strikeouts...His 18.14 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...He has struck out 84 of the 160 batters he faced, good for 52.5%...He is 2-1 with 23 saves, a 1.51 ERA (seven earned runs/41.2 innings), allowing 26 hits and 12 walks... The Mets are 37-5 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

MARTE PARTY: Starling Marte is batting .377 (29-77) with nine runs, three doubles, four homers, 10 RBI, five walks with a .422 OBP and a .597 SLG in 19 games this month...He has recorded a hit 13 of those 15 games...He has hit in 16 of those 19 games...Marte leads the club and ranks seventh in the NL with a .301 average...He has recorded multiple hits in six of his last eight games...He has 13 multi-hit games over his last 23 games...Marte is batting .376 (35-93) during that span since June 25, the third-highest average in the majors.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 65 times this year...The Mets have been hit 299 times since the start of the 2019 season...That is the most in the majors in that span...Since 2019, Mark Canha has been plunked 66 times, which is the second-most in the majors...Pete Alonso ranks sixth with 49 HBP, while Starling Marte is seventh with 45 HBP and Jeff McNeil is tied for ninth at 39 HBP...Brandon Nimmo has tied a franchise record with 50 HBP in his career...Michael Conforto was also plunked 50 times...Pete Alonso is one away from tying the record as well.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his eighth win of the season on July 26 against the Yankees at Citi Field, surpassing his 2021 win total...Walker allowed three runs over 6.0 innings on seven hits, one walk and three strikeouts...Allowed back-to-back home runs to Aaron Judge and Anthony Rizzo in the first inning, just the second time Walker has allowed two home runs in a start this season (Also: 5/5 @ PHI)...Has tossed at least 6.0 innings in a career-high nine straight starts...Has won five straight decisions, matching a career-high (Also: 6/10/15 - 7/1/15).

GUALITY EATS: Walker has tossed a quality start in each of his last eight starts, the longest streak of his career...During that span, Walker is 5-0 with a 2.12 ERA (12 earned runs/51.0 innings) with 51 strikeouts and 11 walks...It is tied with Noah Syndergaard (7/13/19 - 8/22/19) for the longest quality start streak by a Mets pitcher since 2019.

NO FLY ZONE: Walker has allowed just six home runs in 97.2 innings this season, good for a 0.55 HR/9 ratio...That is the eighth-lowest rate among pitchers with at least 90.0 innings...Walker allowed a three-run home run to Brandon Drury in third inning on July 4, ending a season-high streak of 32.2 innings, spanning five starts...In five starts from May 12-June 2, Walker had not yielded a long ball, totaling 29.2 innings...The streak ended after he allowed a leadoff home run to Jurickson Profar on June 7.

FLOURISHED IN THE FIRST HALF: In 16 first half starts, Walker went 7-2 with a 2.55 ERA (26 earned runs/91.2 innings)...His 2.55 ERA is the lowest first half mark in his career and his seven wins are tied with 2021 season for the most in Walker's career during the first half of the season...Walker is the eighth Mets starting pitcher to allow four or fewer first half home runs (Min. 12 first half starts).

FISH FRIED: For his career, Walker is 2-2 with a 3.45 ERA (18 earned runs/47.0 innings) in eight outings (seven starts) against the Marlins...This season against Miami, Walker is 2-0 with a 1.83 ERA (four earned runs/19.2 innings) and 21 strikeouts., the highest total against a single opponent this season...Walker has recorded a quality start in each of his last four outings against Miami.

SPLIT-FINGER SUCCESS: In 17 starts this season, Walker has used his splitter around 29 percent of the time and has held opposing hitters a .169 (23-136) batting average in at-bats ending in the pitch...38 of Walker's 76 strikeouts this season have come via the splitter.

ROAD IMPROVEMENT: In 10 starts this season, Walker is 5-2 with a 3.23 ERA (20 earned runs/55.2 innings)...His five road wins are tied for fifth in the NL and tied for 10th in the majors...Last season, Walker went 3-7 with a 5.82 ERA (44 earned runs/68.0 innings) in 14 road starts.

SHINE BRIGHT IN THE DAYLIGHT: In eight day game starts this season, Walker is 4-0 with a 1.04 ERA (six earned runs/52.0 innings)...Walker's day game ERA ranks number one in the majors among pitchers with at least five daytime starts...Walker also ranks in third in opponent's OPS (.480), eighth in WHIP (0.88) and joins Kevin Gausman, Zack Wheeler and Jeffrey Springs as the only pitchers to not allow a home run in a day game this season (min. five day starts).

NICE TRY: Walker leads the majors with four pickoffs this season...Since 2021, Walker has eight pickoffs, the most by a right-handed pitcher during that span and tied for the second-most overall in that span...His 17 pickoffs since his debut year of 2013, are the fourth-most by a right-handed pitcher.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MAX SCHERZER (6-2, 2.09)

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 7.0 shutout innings on his 38th birthday against the Yankees on July 27 at Citi Field...Was the second oldest pitcher to throw at least 7.0 shutout innings on their birthday...Sad Sam Jones threw a shutout on his 42nd birthday for the White Sox on 7/26/1934.

I USED TO WORK THERE: Scherzer will return to Nationals Park for his 98th career start in D.C. and his second as a visitor...Only two pitchers have started there more often: Stephen Strasburg (128) and Gio Gonzalez (100)...Scherzer has the best K/9 (11.89), WHIP (0.97), K/BB (5.73) and H/9 (6.63) in the ballpark's history (min. 100.0 IP).

Has 20 career homers vs. the Marlins, his most against any one opponent, fifth-most among active players and tied for 23nd all-time...David Wright (26) is the only Met with more home runs against Miami.

- Hitting .417 (10-24) a .517 OBP since the All-Star break.
- Tied for fifth in the majors and third in the NL with 26 homers...Leads the NL and is second in the majors with 84 RBI...Ranks 20th in the NL with 55 runs scored.
- Ranks ninth in MLB and third in the NL with a .535 SLG...Is 11th in the majors and sixth in the NL with a .887 OPS...Is 18th in the NL in OBP (.351).
- Has four homers and 15 RBI in his last 16 games since he ended a career-high 10-game RBI drought and an 11-game home run dry spell on July 9 vs. Miami. Hit a game-tying RBI double in the first inning on July 26 vs. the Yankees and a go-ahead home run in the opening frame on July 27 against NYY.
