TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 3 (0-2) of a 3 -game series vs Ken Griffey Jr.'s Mariners and Game 3 (0-2) of the Reds' second consecutive 3-city, 10-day road trip...following this series will visit Ari's Chase Field (3g) and Chi's Wrigley Field (3g)...the Redlegs flew to Seattle following Sunday afternoon's game at Great American Ball Park and spent Monday's off day here...this is the fourth of the Redlegs' 4 scheduled visits to the West Coast ( $0-3$ at LAD \& 3-1 at SD, 1-2 at Oak \& 2-1 at SF, 0-2 at LAA)...following this road trip the Reds return to GABP for their final homestand ( 3 g vs NYM, off day, 3 g vs Mil)....will finish the 2019 championship season with 3 games at Pit's PNC Park...the Reds' elimination numbers are 3 in the NL Central and 6 in the Wild Card.

SERIES NOTES: Tonight the Mariners are looking for their first series sweep of the Reds since 5/20-5/22, 2016 at Great American Ball Park and their first series sweepin Seattle since 6/18-6/20, 2010...the Mariners swept 3 of the first 5 series...the Redlegs are 2-15 all-time vs Sea, including this series and 0-3 in 2016 at Great American Ball Park, 1-2 in 2013 at GABP, 0-3 in 2010 at Safeco Field, 1-2 in 2007 at Safeco and 0-3 in 2002 in the final season of Cinergy Field...the Reds won their first game at the ballpark then known as Safeco Field, 16 -1 on 6/22/07, but since then have lost 7 straight games at what is now named T-Mobile Park.

CLEMENTE AWARD: RHP/OF Michael Lorenzen is the Reds' nominee for the prestigious Roberto Clemente Award, given each year to the Major League player who best represents the game through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy and positive contributions, both on and off the field...he will be recognized Wednesday on MLB's 18th annual Roberto Clemente Day... 18 former award winners are in the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, including Barry Larkin of the Reds.

DOUBLE UP: In last night's game, Joey Votto recorded the 400th double of his career...became the seventh active player with at least 400 career doubles, joining Ryan Zimmerman, lan Kinsler, Nick Markakis, Robinson Canó, Miguel Cabrera and Albert Pujols...Votto's 703 career extra-base hits are fourth-most in Reds history (Barry Larkin 3rd, 715)...beginning in his first full season in 2008, Votto's 692 extra-base hits are second only to Ryan Braun's 719 extra-base hits...Votto has recorded at least 28 doubles in 11 of his last 12 seasons...the only other player in the Majors Leagues with 10 seasons of at least $\mathbf{2 8}$ doubles in that span is Robinson Canó.

FIRST WATCH: In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs (118), HR (43), RBI (115) and slugging percentage (.573) while ranking third in the NL in batting average (.297) and on-base percentage (.360)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, 118-76, and are 33-13 (.717) when leading after the first inning... 6 times this season scored at least 4 runs in the first inning...Eugenio Suárez' franchise record 14 HR in the first inning lead the Major Leagues.

PLAYER \& ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: Aristides Aquino was the National League's Player of the Month and Rookie of the Month for August...led the Major Leagues in HR (14) and RBI (33) and led the National League in slugging percentage or HR ...stablished a new National League record for HR by a rookie in a calendar month and tied the franchise record RBI are second-most ever by a Reds batter in August (Frank Robinson, 34 RBI, August 1962).

THE PUNISHER: Rookie Aristides Aquino has produced 15 HR in his first 41 career games and 156 plate apps, including a 3 -homer game on $8 / 10$ vs Cubs in which he homered in 3 consecutive innings (2nd, 3rd, 4 th)

Holds modern Major League records for fewest career games to 14 HR (28) and fewest career plate apps to 15 HR (122). is the only player in modern Major League history with 13 HR in his first 100 career plate apps, the only player with 14 HR in his first 108 career plate apps and the only player with $\mathbf{1 5}$ HR in his first $\mathbf{1 2 2}$ career plate apps...Phi's Rhys Hoskins (98th PA) and LAD's Will Smith (100th PA) are the only other players, since 1900, to produce as many as 12 HR in their first 100 career plate apps...Hoskins retains the record since 1900 for fewest plate apps to 16 HR (137).
Holds modern Major League records for HR in a player's first 12 career games (8), first 14 career games (9), first 16 career games (10), first 17 career games (11), first 22 career games (12), first 27 career games (13) and first 28 career games (14)...Rhys Hoskins retains the Major League record since 1900 for fewest career games to 15 HR and 16 HR (32).

RUTHIAN: Per @EliasSports, in the $8-5$ win on $9 / 4$ vs Phi Michael Lorenzen joined Babe Ruth (6/13/1921 vs Det) as the only Major League players since 1900 to earn the win, hit a home run and play the outfield in the same game...entered in the seventh inning as the Reds' third pitcher of the game and suffered a blown save after Jay Bruce homered to tie the score at $5-5$...in the bottom of the eighth hit his first HR of the season and seventh of his career, a 2-run HR off Blake Parker that extended the Reds' lead to 8-5...played center field in the top of the ninth. in the bottom of the ninth inning of Sun's $4-3$ walkoff win vs Ari, Lorenzen pinch hit and doubled off T.J. McFarland to drive in the game-ending run...was his fifth career pinch hit, his first of this season, and his first career walkoff hit.

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP Michael Lorenzen has appeared in 93 of the Reds' 146 games ( 68 g at $\mathrm{P}, 8 \mathrm{~g}$ in LF, 8 g in CF, 4 g in RF, 13 g as pinch runner, 4 g as a pinch hitter)...he is a career .267 hitter (28-105) with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 7 HR, 23 RBI and an .821 OPS.. this season as a pinch hitter is 1-4 with 1 RBI...in his career as a pinch hitter is 5 -for- 24 (.208, 7 RBI ) with 3 HR , on 4/6/17 off Phi's Adam Morgan, 6/24/18 off Chi's Mike Montgomery and 6/30/18 off Mil's Jacob Barnes (grand slam)...played CF in the ninth inning of the 8-5 win on 9/4 vs Phi and then the next day vs Phi made his first career start at that position ( $0-3,1 \mathrm{bb}$ ).

## RED HOTS

Tyler Mahle's last name rhymes with RALLY...at just 24 years old already is in his third Major League season...tonight is making his third start for the Reds since he was promoted on $9 / 1$ as 1 of 5 September callups...will be his first career appearance vs the Mariners...this season has left 10 runners on base, and all 10 scored...in Fri's $7-5$ loss vs Ari allowed 4 runs on homers, a solo HR by Nick Ahmed in the third inning and a 3-run HR by Ketel Marte in the sixth...was charged with another run scored off Lucas Sims...from 7/22-8/21 was on the 10-day injured list with a left hamstring strain...on 8/16 and 8/21 made rehab starts for Louisville before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Louisville on 8/22...made 1 more start for the Bats, a 9-0 Bats win on $8 / \mathbf{2 6}$ vs Columbus, before he was promoted on $9 / 1$ to start the day game of the doubleheader at StL...in consecutive starts on $5 / 2$ and $5 / 7$, suffered the 1-0 loss at NYM in which Noah Syndergaard became just the seventh pitcher in Major League history to homer in a 1-0 complete game and then a 2-0 loss at Oak in which Mike Fiers threw his second career no-hitter...in those 2 games, Reds batters combined to go 4-for-57 (.070)...made his second straight Opening Day roster...started the Reds' sixth game of the season.

## RED HOTS

Luis Castillo in his third Major League season at just 26 years old, was the Reds' Opening Day starter and is a 2019 National League All-Star...per Baseball America, his changeup was voted by managers, scouts and executives the best in the National League...has established new career highs in wins, innings pitched and strikeouts...in the second inning of Sat's 2-0 loss vs Ari recorded his 200th strikeout of the season (Josh Rojas)...in his last 34 apps beginning 9/1/18 is $\mathbf{1 7 - 7}$ and in that span ranks fourth among all Major League starting pitchers with an ERA of $\mathbf{2 . 8 7}$...this season ranks among the National League leaders in wins (4th), ERA (11th), strikeouts (T5th) and strikeouts per 9 innings (10.78, 7th)...in his career has allowed 13 HR in the first inning, his highest total in any inning and including 3 HR in the first frame this year...in his $7-4$ win on $8 / 5$ vs LAA, his career-high 13 strikeouts are the most by a Reds pitcher since Raisel Iglesias had 13 strikeouts on $\mathbf{8 / 2 3 / 1 5}$ vs Ari...produced 8 starts in which he threw at least 5.0 innings while allowing 2 hits or fewer and 2 runs or fewer, a single-season franchise record...was the National League's Pitcher of the Month for March/April (7gs, 3-1, 1.45)...since his Major League debut in 2017, leads the Reds' pitching staff in almost every statistical category, including wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts.
