ROAD TRIPPING REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals and division-rival Cincinnati Reds wrap up their four-game series today at Great American Ball Park ... After plating only 19 total runs over their previous eight games in the Queen City (Sept. 10, 2023-April 28, 2025), the Cardinals scored 15 runs yesterday in their first doubleheader sweep of the Reds in Cincinnati since **June 28, 1959 at Crosley Field** ... St. Louis enters today in 4th place in the NL Central Division, 4.0 games behind first place Chicago ... After today's game, the Cardinals fly home to begin a six-game homestand with the New York Mets and division-rival Pittsburgh Pirates.

SEEING RED: St. Louis has won back-to-back road games for the first time since Sept. 24-25, 2024 at Colorado, and with a win today, the Cardinals will have accomplished the following:

- clinched a road series for the first time this season
- won three straight on the road since May 12-14, 2024 at MIL/LAA
- secured their first winning 4-game series on the road since July 5-8, 2024 at Washington (3-1) & first in Cincy (3-1) since July 18-21, 2019.

AND NOW DEEP THOUGHTS: Yesterday's 9th inning back-to-back-to-back blasts by **Victor Scott II**, **Lars Nootbaar**, and **Masyn Winn** marked the 10th time in franchise history the Cardinals hit three consecutive homers and first time in the 9th inning Yesterday was also the first time in the Expansion Era (since 1961) St. Louis hit three consecutive homers by the 9-1-2 hitters in the order. - *Elias*

- St. Louis has hit eight 3-run homers, 2nd in MLB to the Red Sox (12) ... Last season, St. Louis ranked 30th with 10 three-run blasts.
- The 11-pitch HR by **Pedro Pagés** in Game 2 tied for the 2nd-most pitches in any at-bat that resulted in a homer in 2025, behind **Keibert Ruiz's** 12-pitch homer off Philly's **Zack Wheeler** on March 27.
- At age 23-040, **Masyn Winn** became the youngest Cardinal with a multi-homer game vs. the Reds since **Curt Flood** (age 22-149) on June 15, 1960 at Crosley Field, and youngest St. Louis shortstop overall to do so since **Édgar Rentería** (22-297) on May 31, 1999 at Florida.

THE MERRY MERRY MONTH OF MAY: Since moving into Busch Stadium III in 2006, the Cardinals have compiled a .500 or better record in the month of May in 13 of 18 seasons (missed 2000 due to COVID) ... Their best May was a 20-7 mark (.741 win pct.) in 2013, while their worst was a 9-18 (.333) spiral in 2019 on the heels of a strong 19-10 (.655) March/April start.

APRIL SHOWERS: Since MLB expanded to six divisions in 1994, the Cardinals have been in first or tied for first 11 times at the end of April in 31 seasons (excluding 2020) ... Of the 20 seasons not in first place at the end of April, the Cardinals have appeared in seven postseasons (2022, 2021, 2014, 2004, 2002, 2001, 1996) ... The largest deficit out of first at the end of the month was 10.0 games in 2023 to Pittsburgh.

BRING MAY FLOWERS: The 2002 Cards began 12-14 in April before rebounding to go 18-10 in May and make the postseason ... The 1985 Cards were 8-11 in April, then went 93-50 to close out their NL Championship season.

HERRERA TO BEGIN REHAB: Catcher **Iván Herrera** is scheduled to begin an injury rehab assignment at Memphis (AAA) tonight as the Redbirds take on Louisville (AAA-Reds) at AutoZone Park ... Herrera, who has missed the last 22 games due to left knee inflammation, is scheduled to DH tonight and catch approx. 5.0 innings tomorrow.

CINCINNATI CONNECTIONS

Late Reds Executive Advisor **Walt Jocketty** served as the Cardinals GM for 13 seasons (1995-2007)...during tenure, St. Louis compiled seven NL Central Division championships (1996, 2000-02, '04-06), two NL Championships ('04, '06), and one World Series Championship ('06).

José Barrero played 139 games over parts of four seasons (2020-23) with Cincinnati...previously rated by *Baseball America* as the Reds No. 1 prospect and "Best Defensive Infielder" in 2023...2021 Reds Minor League Player of the Year...Originally signed with the Reds organization as an international free agent (June 10, 2017).

Terry Francona played in 86 games in 1990 with the Louisville Redbirds (AAA), including five at pitcher...his father, **Tito Francona**, played parts of two seasons (1965-66) with St. Louis...became a Cardinal via trade by Cleveland in exchange for a player to be named (Dec. 15, 1964)...originally signed by the St. Louis Browns before the 1952 season (MLB debut for Baltimore in 1956).

Reds pitching coach **Derek Johnson** played baseball & coached at Eastern Illinois Univ. (1991-94)...coached at Southern Illinois Univ.(1995-97)...was **Sonny Gray's** pitching coach at Vanderbilt Univ.

Sonny Gray pitched three seasons with Cincinnati (2019-21)...named a 2019 NL All-Star.

Riley O'Brien made his MLB debut with Cincinnati (Sept. 28, 2021 at Guaranteed Rate Field).

Steven Matz (June 28, 2015 at Citi Field) & **Gordon Graceffo** (June 29, 2024 at Busch) made their MLB debuts vs. the Reds.

Reds Bullpen Coach **Matt Tracy** was born in St. Louis...graduated from Christian Brothers College HS.

Hall of Famer **Scott Rolen** played his final four seasons with the Reds (2009-12)...won the 2010 Gold Glove and was a two-time All-Star (2010-11).

Randy Wynne played college baseball at Missouri Baptist University in St. Louis.

Julio Rangel served as Bullpen Coach for the Reds in 2019.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Vince Coleman** played in 33 games for Cincinnati in 1996.

Reds Senior Advisor to the GM **Cam Bonifay** played two minor league seasons with the Cardinals...worked for St Louis as a professional scout and special assistant.

Reds broadcaster **Jeff Brantley** pitched in 48 games for St. Louis in 1998.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Jim Edmonds** played 13 games for the Reds in his final season (2010).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Julían Javier** played in 44 games for the Reds during his final 1972 season.

Reds President of Baseball Ops **Nick Krall** previously interned for the New Jersey Cardinals of the NY Penn League (SS).

Reds Senior Advisor to the GM **Eric Davis** played two seasons (1999-2000) for St. Louis.

Reds Special Assistant to the GM **John Morris** played five seasons for St. Louis (1986-90).

Cardinals Principal Owner and Chief Executive Officer **William DeWitt Jr.** was a prior owner of the Reds and shareholder of the Cincinnati Bengals...his father, **William O. DeWitt**, was a sole owner of the Reds from 1961-67.

Reds CEO **Robert Castellini**, Chairman **W. Joseph Williams Jr.** and Vice Chairman **Thomas Williams** were Cardinals investors from 1995-2006...interests were sold as a condition of their acquisition of a controlling ownership stake of the Reds.

- Suffered blown save #2 on Sat. (4/26) as the Brewers knotted the score at 5-5 with 2-run HR by Chourio in the 9th. It snapped a 35-game successful save conversion streak for Helsley at home that dated back to 5/17/23, the longest home save streak in Cardinals franchise history; **Prior to Saturday, Ryan had not allowed an earned run vs. MIL in his past 12 meetings (14.2 IP) dating to 9/14/22.**
- Rescued the Cardinals 1st one-run win (3-2) of the season on Fri. (4/25) vs. MIL with a scoreless 9th for his 4th save of the season; it was his 34th career save in a one-run game, 9th among current NL pitchers (*Elias*).
- Leads MLB with 53 saves since the start of 2024. **Emmanuel Clase** (CLE) ranks 2nd with 51.
