DETROIT TIGERS (60-64) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (61-65)

August 17, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 7:05 EDT - Game #127/Home #64

LHP Framber Valdez (7-8, 4.26 ERA) vs. RHP Carmen Mlodzinski (6-5, 3.79 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have won two of the first three games on this six-game homestand vs. Boston (2-1, Friday-Sunday) and Detroit (Monday-Wednesday), including an 8-3 win on Sunday vs. Boston at PNC Park (gave them their first series win since July 18-19 at Cleveland)...Will embark on a nine-game, 11-day road trip to Los Angeles-NL (August 21-23), San Diego (August 24-26) and St. Louis (August 28-30) following Wednesday's game vs. the Tigers (it will mark their longest road trip since another nine-game trip from July 4-13, 2025 to Seattle, Kansas City and Minnesota and their longest against National League teams since a nine-game trip from September 19-28, 2023 to Chicago, Cincinnati and Philadelphia)...Have hit 151 home runs (they hit 117 home runs in 2025)...Have the most hits (1116) in Major League Baseball...Have scored the third-most runs (633) in Major League Baseball, behind only Washington (670) and Chicago-NL (645), after scoring 583 runs in 2025...Have struck out the third-most batters (1171) in Major League Baseball, behind Philadelphia (1231) & Milwaukee (1211).

FAMILIAR FOE: Pittsburgh is hosting Detroit for three games at PNC Park this week (Monday-Wednesday)...Tonight's game will be broadcast on ESPN, marking the Pirates' first game in Pittsburgh on "The Worldwide Leader in Sports" since August 7, 2019 vs. Milwaukee...Pittsburgh will end its season with three games at Comerica Park (September 25-27), marking the third time it ends a year with an interleague series (also September 25-27, 2020 at Cleveland and September 27-29, 2024 at New York)...The Bucs' 43 games vs. the Tigers at PNC Park are their most vs. any team in interleague play (Cleveland, 27 games, is second on the list).

AMERICAN SPIRIT: Pittsburgh has won a record eight straight home series vs. American League teams (interleague play began in 1997)...The Pirates swept a three-game series from July 21-23, 2025 vs. Detroit, won two of three games last year from August 18-20 vs. Toronto, won two of three games last year from September 19-21 vs. the Athletics, swept a three-game series from April 3-5 vs. Baltimore, won two of three games from April 17-19 vs. Tampa Bay, swept a three-game series from May 29-31 vs. Minnesota, won two of three games from June 23-25 vs. Seattle and won two of three games from Friday-Sunday vs. Boston...Pittsburgh's 21-12 (.636) interleague record ranks third in MLB, behind Los Angeles-NL (29-16, .644) & Milwaukee (25-14, .641).

FROM THE START: Lake Bachar became the ninth different starting pitcher used by the Pirates when he tossed 3.0 scoreless innings on Sunday vs. Boston...Pittsburgh has also used Paul Skenes (25), Braxton Ashcraft (24), Bubba Chandler (23), Mitch Keller (22), Jared Jones (14), Carmen Mlodzinski (11), Mason Montgomery (five) and Yohan Ramirez (one)...The nine starters used are tied with Arizona and San Francisco for the fourth-fewest in MLB, behind Seattle (six), Cleveland (seven) and St. Louis (eight).

LEFTY LOVE: The Pirates are facing a left-handed starter for the third time in four games (they defeated Boston's Jake Bennett on Friday and Boston's Patrick Sandoval on Sunday)...They are looking to win three straight games when they are opposed by a left-handed starter for the third time this year...The Pirates won on March 31 at Cincinnati (Brandon Williamson), April 1 at Cincinnati (Andrew Abbott) and April 10 at Chicago-NL (Shota Imanaga)...Pittsburgh also did that on July 4 at Washington (Carson Palmquist), July 11 (G2) vs. Milwaukee (Shane Drohan) and July 12 vs. Milwaukee (Robert Gasser)...The Pirates are 23-for-81 (.284) against lefties since Thursday at loanDepot park.

IN THE NICK OF TIME: Nick Yorke, who played in his first Major League game since May 16 vs. Philadelphia, went 2-for-4 with three RBI and a steal on Sunday vs. Boston (his first game vs. the team that drafted him with the No. 17 overall pick in the 2020 Draft)...He is 13-for-50 (.260) with three doubles, three homers, nine RBI and an .815 OPS in his 14 career interleague contests.

THE MAGICIAN: Esmerlyn Valdez doubled twice, walked and scored twice on Sunday vs. Boston...He was the fifth Pirates rookie in the 21st century with two doubles, two runs and a walk in a game, joining Jason Jaramillo (April 25, 2009 at San Diego), Garrett Jones (July 22, 2009 vs. Milwaukee), Bryan Reynolds (August 11, 2019 at St. Louis) and Nick Gonzales (July 4, 2023 at Los Angeles-NL)...Valdez is 9-for-23 (.391) with three doubles, three RBI, a .922 OPS and five runs on his six-game hitting streak (since August 11 at Miami).
