TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue the 7-game homestand against AL West opponents with the second of 4 games against the Athletics (0-1)...Seattle will also host the Texas Rangers for a 3-game set (9/8-10) on the homestand...the Mariners are coming off a 6-game road trip where they saw both the Red Sox (2-1) and the Blue Jays (0-3)...tonight's game will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** and **KING 5** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryon Healy** on the call and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** serving as field analyst...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped yesterday's series opener to the Athletics by a 7-4 score...Seattle is 49-20 (.710) when they score at least 4 runs, 42-11 (.792) when they score at least 5 runs and 56-35 (.615) when they hit a home run.

- **Offensive Explosion** - Over the last 4 games since Aug. 31, the Mariners offense has scored 29 runs and is batting .305 (46x151) with 10 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, 27 RBI, 5 stolen bases and 21 walks, reaching base at a .401 clip and slugging .483 for an .885 OPS.
- **20+ Home Run Quartet** - **Randy Arozarena** (22 HR), **Dominic Canzone** (21 HR), **Cal Raleigh** (20 HR) and **Julio Rodríguez** (20 HR) are 1 of 5 teammate quartets with 20+ homers apiece this season, along with the Cubs, Reds, Braves and Nationals.
- **September to Remember** - Last season, the Mariners went 17-8 (.680) in September...over the last 5 seasons (2022-c), the Mariners are 65-50 (.565), the 4th-best September/October record in the American League behind the Yankees (72-40/.643), Guardians (72-45/.615) and Astros (63-48/.568).
- **Recent Roster Moves** - Today, the Mariners recalled RHP **Troy Taylor** from Triple-A Tacoma and placed LHP **Hoby Milner** on the Family Medical Emergency List...yesterday, the Mariners selected OF **Stuart Fairchild** from Triple-A Tacoma and placed OF **Victor Robles** on the Family Medical Emergency List...to clear 40-man space for Fairchild, OF **Brennen Davis** was recalled from Triple-A Tacoma and placed on the 60-day Injured List (left hamstring strain).

JULIO REACHES 20/20, AGAIN...**Julio Rodríguez** last night went 1-for-4 with a run, a double, 2 RBI, a walk and 3 stolen bases...he secured his 5th-consecutive 20+ home run and 20+ stolen base season, becoming the first player in Major League history to record 20+ home runs and 20+ stolen bases in each of the first 5 seasons of their career...Rodríguez also reached the 400 career RBI mark last night, becoming one of 25 players since 2022 to record 400+ RBI...overall this season, Rodríguez is batting .245 (126x515) with 64 runs, 21 doubles, 20 home runs, 60 RBI, 42 walks and 20 stolen bases, reaching base at a .306 clip and slugging .402 (.708 OPS).

- **Juliooooo** - Through his first 5 career seasons, Julio has amassed 25.3 *Baseball-Reference* Wins Above Replacement (bWAR), the T-10th highest bWAR by a centerfielder (min. 50% G as CF) through a players first 5 seasons in MLB history.

WALTER'S WORLD...over 27 starts this season, **Logan Gilbert** is 11-8 with a 3.42 ERA (61 ER, 160.1 IP), 166 strikeouts, 40 walks and a 1.035 WHIP, limiting opponents to a .212 batting average...among starting pitchers in the Majors this season, he ranks 7th in WHIP, T-8th in opponent average and 11th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.15)...Gilbert has also tossed 995.2 innings in his career and with at least 4.1 innings pitched today, would become just the 7th pitcher in Mariners history to record 1,000+ innings with the team, joining Félix Hernández (2,729.2 IP), Jamie Moyer (2093.0 IP), Randy Johnson (1828.1 IP), Mike Moore (1457.0 IP), Mark Langston (1197.2 IP), Freddy García (1096.1 IP).

A RALEIGH GOOD STRETCH FOR CAL...over his last 12 games since Aug. 21, **Cal Raleigh** is batting .302 (13x43) with 9 runs, 2 doubles, 7 home runs, 12 RBI and 7 walks, reaching base at a .400 clip and slugging .837 for a 1.237 OPS in 50 plate appearances...during that span, Cal leads the Majors in slugging percentage and ranks 3rd in OPS...Raleigh, who is the reigning American League Player of the Week, hit his 20th home run of the season in Monday's game at Boston for his fifth consecutive 20+ homer season (2022-c), becoming the 8th Mariners player with at least five 20+ homer seasons.

RANDY TO ROLL...over the last 4 games (8/31-c), **Randy Arozarena** has gone 7-for-18 with 4 runs, 2 doubles, 2 home runs and 8 RBI for a 1.283 OPS in 20 plate appearances...over his last 22 games since Aug. 11, Randy is batting .256 (22x86) with 18 runs, 4 doubles, 8 home runs, 17 RBI, 12 walks, a .373 on-base percentage and slugging .581 for a .954 OPS...Arozarena's 4.8 bWAR this season ranks T-6th in the American League with Junior Caminero-TB.

THE LAZER SHOW HAS ARRIVED...in his second Major League game last night, **Lazaro Montes** hit a 2-out, RBI single in his first plate appearance...Montes made his MLB debut on Tuesday at Boston, going 2-for-4 with 1 walk, 1 home run and 2 RBI...he became the youngest Mariners player and 6th overall to hit a home run in his debut and also became the first Mariners player since Hall of Famer Ichiro Suzuki to record multiple hits in their debut...the No. 56 overall prospect (*MLB Pipeline*) slugged 38 home runs over 123 games between Triple-A and Double-A this season, tied for 2nd-most among all MiLB batters at the time of his call-up.

OUT WEST...the Mariners are in the middle of 13-game stretch against AL West opponents (9/3-16)...6 of Seattle's last 7 series of the season are against AL West opponents, including each of its last 6 games of the year (2 G vs. HOU, 4 G vs. LAA)...Seattle is 20-14 against AL West opponents this season, including 10-4 at home.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Julio Rodríguez** last night stole 3 bases to reach 20 stolen bases on the season, securing his 5th-consecutive 20+ home run and 20+ stolen base season...**YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...**Randy Arozarena** has also reached the 20/20 mark this year (22 HR, 21 SB), but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that the Mariners are the only team in the Major Leagues to have 2 players each with a 20+ home run and 20+ stolen base this season?...it is also only the 4th time in franchise history that Seattle has had multiple players with 20+ HR and 20+ SB in a season...Rodríguez and Arozarena (2025, '26) join Ken Griffey Jr. and Alex Rodríguez (1998, '99) as the only duos to accomplish the feat in Mariners history.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - SEPTEMBER 4

- **1981** - The Mariners won two games from the Boston Red Sox, taking an 8-7 victory in the 20th inning of the game suspended the night before with the score tied at seven. The Mariners then won the regularly scheduled game, 5-2. The first game was the longest in the 69-year history of Fenway Park. It was suspended due to the American League's 1 a.m. curfew. Bob Stoddard, the first Mariners' farm product to pitch for the parent club, received credit for the win.
- **2003** - Rafael Soriano was named AL Rookie of the Month for August after going 2-0 with a 1.62 ERA (16.2 IP, 3 ER) in 12 relief appearances.
- **2015** - The Mariners scored a season-high 6 runs in the 3rd inning, overcoming an early 5-1 deficit in an 11-8 win at Oakland...Jose Ramirez earned his first MLB win, throwing 1.2 innings of scoreless relief...Ketel Marte recorded his 9th multi-hit game of the season.
- **2021** - Kyle Seager hits two 3-run home runs to power the Mariners to an 8-5 win over the Diamondbacks...**J.P. Crawford** record second career 4-hit game in the same game.

ABOUT LOGAN GILBERT...

- Gilbert, 29, is making his 28th start of the season and the 174th start of his career...also marks his 3rd start against the Athletics this season and the 17th of his career.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Rob Mummau on June 16, 2018.
- Spent 3 seasons at Stetson (FL) University, 2016-18...in 2017, was ASUN Pitcher of the Year and ASUN 1st-Team All-Conference.
- Named the 2022 and the 2024 Mariners Most Valuable Pitcher by the Seattle Chapter of the BBWAA.
- Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2024.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for June 15-21, marking the 2nd time he has won the award (also: July 3-9, 2023).

LAST TIME OUT...L#8 on Aug. 30 at Toronto, threw 5.0 innings and allowed 3 runs (3 ER) on 6 hits (1 HR) with 1 walk and 4 strikeouts...he threw 87 pitches (59 strikes) in his 12th road start of the season.

THE HOME STRETCH...across his last 7 home starts (6/16-c), he is 5-1 with a 2.38 ERA (12 ER, 45.1 IP) and 11 walks to 52 strikeouts while throwing a quality start in 6 of those 7 starts.

GIVE ME FIVE...has thrown 5.0+ innings in each of his last 21-consecutive starts (4/28-c), tied for the 3rd-longest such streak in MLB this season and T-2nd longest active streak (also: Sandy Alcantara-MIA)...his 150 career starts of 5.0+ IP rank 6th-most in MLB since 2021 while his 96 career starts of 5.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer ER allowed rank 7th-most in MLB since 2021.

THE WILD WEST...owns a 2.91 ERA (11 ER, 34.0 IP) with 32 strikeouts to 8 walks allowed across 6 starts against AL West opponents this season...across 62 career starts against AL West opponents, he is 21-13 with a 3.16 ERA (126 ER, 359.0 IP), 360 strikeouts, 74 walks allowed and a 0.98 WHIP...among pitchers in franchise history (min. 200 IP) against AL West teams, he ranks 1st in WHIP (0.98), 2nd in SO/BB (4.86), 3rd in BB/9 (1.86), 5th in SO/9 (9.03) and 5th in strikeouts (360).

AGAINST THE A'S...his 16 starts against the A's are 2nd-most among all teams he has faced in his career, trailing only his 19 starts against Texas...his 0.871 WHIP against the Athletics is the 4th-lowest WHIP among all pitchers against any single opponent since 2021 (min. 10 GS)...his 0.871 WHIP against the A's is also the lowest mark in franchise history among pitchers against any opponent (min. 10 GS) while his 6.13 SO/BB against the Athletics is 4th-lowest SO/BB mark among Mariners pitchers against any opponent (min. 10 GS)...lastly, his 2.81 ERA against the A's is the 2nd-lowest ERA among all Mariners pitchers against the Athletics (min. 10 GS), trailing only **Bryan Woo's** 2.22 ERA.

HEATING UP?...in his last home start on 8/24 vs. PHI, threw 13 pitches over 98 mph in the 1st inning...it's the most pitches he's thrown over 98 mph in a game in his career (prev. 12 pitches on 8/19/26 at MIL)...recorded 11+ pitches over 98 mph in each of his 3 games from Aug 13-24...his career high in such pitches thrown in a game was 11 prior to Aug. 19...he has increased the avg. velocity of his four-seamer throughout the season, starting at 95.4 mph in Mar/Apr to 97.1 mph in Aug. (+1.7 mph).

COMING UP...with 4.1 more innings, he would become the 8th pitcher to throw 1000 innings since 2021, joining Dylan Cease, Zack Wheeler, Kevin Gausman, Aaron Nola, Logan Webb, Luis Castillo and Framber Valdez...would become the 1st pitcher that debuted in 2021 or later to reach 1,000 IP.

WATCH HIM WHIP...owns a 1.04 WHIP this season, which is tied for 8th among qualified pitchers this season and T-5th in the American League...his 0.97 WHIP since 2024 ranks T-2nd in MLB among qualified pitchers (also: **Bryan Woo**), trailing only **Tarik Skubal-LAD/DET** (0.91).

LOONEY PLATOONS...is limiting left-handed hitters to just a .199 average (65x326) with a 10.88 SO/9 across 27 starts this season...among pitchers with min. 50 IP against LHH this season, he ranks T-6th in strikeouts (108), 7th in SO/9 (10.88), 10th in opp. average (.199), 11th in WHIP (1.041).

WINNING WITH WALTER...the Mariners are 17-10 when he takes the mound this season, including 13-4 across his last 17 starts (5/22-c) with Logan holding a 2.86 ERA (33 ER, 103.2 IP) and 109 strikeouts in that stretch...across his career, the Mariners are 102-71 when Logan takes the mound, including 55-27 when he throws a quality start.

EXCLUSIVE COMPANY...on Aug. 13 at NYY, he eclipsed 150 strikeouts this season becoming just the 2nd pitcher with 5-consecutive seasons of 150+ strikeouts since 2022 (also: Dylan Cease-3Tms)...his 5 such seasons rank 3rd-most in franchise history, trailing Félix Hernández (10 seasons) and Randy Johnson (8 seasons), while ranking ahead of Mark Langston (4 seasons).

HENRY'S DAD SHOVES...was named AL Player of the Week for June 15-21 after tossing a combined 13.1 innings and allowing 2 runs (2 ER) on 5 hits (1 HR) with 3 walks and 18 strikeouts...across the 2 starts, he held opponents to a .116 average (5x43) with only 1 XBH allowed and a .401 OPS.
