RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals and New York Mets play the second game of a three-game weekend series at Citi Field this afternoon as the Redbirds continue their 11-day, eight-game international road trip through New York (0-1), the nation's capital to play the Nationals (June 19-21), and across the pond in London, England to face the division-rival Cubs (June 24-25).

FLIGHT PATTERN: The Cardinals have lost six straight and enter today in last place in the NL Central, 8.5 games behind 1st place Milwaukee and 5.5 games behind 4th place Chicago ... St. Louis is at its low watermark of the season at 16 games below .500 ... The Cardinals have spent 52 of 79 days in last place on this season's MLB schedule (April 26-May 19 and May 29-present) ... This season is the Cardinals slowest start since beginning 25-45 (.357) in 1978.

UNIFORM COMBOS: The Cardinals packed four uniforms (white, cream, gray, & victory blue) and five hats (red, navy, Sunday, Father's Day, & batting practice) to create six different uniform combinations for their eight-game road trip:

- 👉 Road Grays & Red hats (yesterday)
- 👉 Victory Blues & Red hats (today)
- 👉 Road Grays & Father's Day hats (tomorrow)
- 👉 Road Grays & Navy hats (Monday-Wednesday in Washington)
- 👉 Home Creams & Red hats (Saturday vs. Cubs as home team in London)
- 👉 Home Whites & Sunday hats (Sunday vs. Cubs as home team in London)

START SPREADING THE NEWS: Despite a 22-26 all-time record at Citi Field, St. Louis enters today winners of eight of their last 13 games in Queens while outscoring the Mets 71-56 ... With a victory today, the Cardinals will have won their 200th road game in New York over the Mets (199-182 record).

WAINO'S FINAL BITE OF THE BIG APPLE: Adam Wainwright makes his first appearance against the Mets since Sept. 2021 when he posted a 7-0 win at Citi Field in the midst of the Cardinals record 17-game winning streak ... St. Louis has won each of Waino's last five starts at Citi Field with Adam going 4-0.

- 👉 Adam made his MLB debut vs. the Mets (Sept. 11, 2005) in a 7-2 loss at Busch Stadium II (his only career appearance at Busch II).
- 👉 "Uncle Charlie" appeared in three games of 2006 National League Championship Series vs. Mets as a rookie, and earned saves in both Game 5 & the series-clinching Game 7 win with strikeout of Carlos Beltran at Shea Stadium.
- 👉 Today is Wainwright's 465th career appearance, tying Bill Sherdel (1918-32, '32) for 3rd all-time in Cardinals history.

MR. MET: Among Major Leaguers with at least 110 career plate appearances vs. the Mets, Paul DeJong ranks 2nd all-time in slugging pct. (.700) to only Mark McGwire (.742) while ranking 7th in OPS (1.053) ... Among all MLB players with 50+ plate appearances at Citi Field (2009-present), DeJong ranks 3rd in slugging (.660) and 8th in OPS (.962).

HEIR JORDAN: Jordan Walker has hit safely in nine straight (.406/.457/.688, 13-32), tied with José Ramírez for MLB's 3rd-longest active hitting streak behind Shohei Ohtani (13) and Mookie Betts (10) ... Walker also opened the season by hitting in his first 12 games to establish a new Cardinals rookie record to begin a career and tie the MLB record for longest by a player 20 years old or younger with Eddie Murphy (Philadelphia Athletics) in 1912 ... MLB Pipeline's top overall prospect in baseball has hit safely in 27-of-32 games with a PA this season, with his 35 career hits coming off 34 different pitchers from all 11 opponents he's played against.

THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (June 17, 1993): Ozzie Smith drives in a career-high six runs while going 5-for-5 with three doubles and a sacrifice fly in the Cardinals 11-10 win over the Cubs ... After doubling in three straight at-bats, Smith records a sac fly in his final plate appearance to score José Oquendo in the 9th inning that proves to be the difference in the afternoon slugfest at Wrigley Field.

NEW YORK CONNECTIONS

- Steven Matz** was originally selected by the Mets in the 2nd round of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Ward Melville High School in East Setauket, NY and pitched parts of his first six seasons (2015-20) in New York...was born in Stony Brook, NY.
- Tommy Edman** doubled off Steven Matz for his first career MLB hit (June 14, 2019 at Citi Field).
- Adam Wainwright** (Sept. 11, 2005 at Busch II), **Jordan Hicks** (March 29, 2018 at Citi Field), and **Brendan Donovan** (April 25, 2022 at Busch III) made their MLB debuts against the Mets.
- Cardinals Bench Coach **Joe McEwing** played five seasons with the Mets (2000-04)...appeared in 11 games with the Mets during the 2000 postseason as the club reached the World Series...originally traded by St. Louis to New York in exchange for **Jesse Orosco** (March 18, 2000)...played college baseball at the County College of Morris in Randolph Township, NJ, where his uniform is retired.
- Cardinals Hall of Famer **José Oquendo** played the first two seasons of his 12 year MLB career with the Mets...traded by New York with **Mark Davis** to St. Louis in exchange for **John Young** and **Angel Salazar** (April 2, 1985).
- Mets Clubhouse Operations Coordinator **Scott Keltner** previously worked in the Cardinals organization in the Busch Stadium (2016-21) and AutoZone Park (2014-15) visiting clubhouses.
- Adam Ottavino** was selected St. Louis in the 1st round (#30 overall) of the 2006 MLB Draft...pitched parts of six seasons in the Cardinals minor league organization (2006-11)...made his MLB debut with St. Louis in 2010.
- Max Scherzer** is a native of Chesterfield, Mo...graduated from Parkway Central (Mo.) High School...originally selected by St. Louis in the 43rd of the 2003 MLB Draft, but did not sign to pitch at the University of Missouri (2005-07).
- Tommy Pham** played parts of five seasons in St. Louis (2014-18)...originally selected by the Cardinals in the 16th round of the 2006 MLB draft...traded by St. Louis to Tampa Bay with international bonus money for **Genesis Cabrera**, **Roel Ramirez**, and **Justin Williams** (July 31, 2018).
- Cardinals Hall of Famer & Mets broadcaster **Keith Hernandez** was selected by the Cardinals in the 42nd round of the 1971 MLB Draft...played 10 seasons in St. Louis (1974-83)...won the 1979 NL MVP Award...named to two National League All-Star teams and won six Gold Gloves.
- Hall of Fame Manager **Joe Torre** played for and managed both the Cardinals (1969-74 & 1990-95) and Mets (1975-77 & 1977-81).
- Mets Pitching Coach **Jeremy Hefner** pitched his final professional season (2016) in the Cardinals minor league organization.
- Tyler Megill's** older brother, **Trevor Megill**, was originally selected by St. Louis in the 3rd round of the 2014 MLB Draft, but did not sign to return to from Loyola Marymount (Calif.) University.
- Dominic Leone** pitched parts of two seasons (2017-18) with the Cardinals.
- Mets First Base Coach **Wayne Kirby** played in 98 games for Memphis (AAA) in 1998, where he was teammates with **Ron "Pop" Warner** and **Joe McEwing**...traded by St. Louis to the Mets for **Shawn Gilbert** (June 10, 1998).
- Cardinals broadcaster **Ricky Horton** was born in nearby Poughkeepsie, N.Y....graduated from F.D. Roosevelt High School in Hyde Park.
- Cardinals reporter **Jim Hayes** was born in New York City and raised in nearby Nyack, NY...graduated from State Univ. College at Geneseo, NY.
- Cardinals Hall of Famer **Jason Isringhausen** was selected by the Mets in the 44th round of the 1991 MLB Draft...pitched parts of four seasons in New York (1995-97, 1999, 2011).
- Cardinals AGM/Player Development **Gary LaRocque** previously served as Scouting Director, AGM and VP/ Player Development and Scouting with the Mets from (1998-2005)...appointed VP of Professional Scouting in 2006.

TODAY'S GAME

- Makes his 8th start of the season & 465th career appearance (398th career start).
- Is facing the Mets for the 1st time since 2021 season; has a winning career mark against each of the NL East teams and is 42-23 (.646 win pct.) combined: 10-4 vs. ATL, 8-2 vs. MIA, 7-6 vs. NYM, 7-6 vs. PHI & 10-5 vs. WSH.
- Has pitched between 5.0-5.2 innings in all seven starts this season, while departing with the lead in four of his seven outings.
- With his 465th career appearance today, ties **Bill Sherdel** for 3rd all-time in appearances in franchise history behind **Bob Gibson** (528) and **Jesse Haines** (554)
- Today is Wainwright's 398th career start, ranking 3rd all-time among Cardinals pitchers **Bob Gibson** (482) & **Bob Forsch** (401). Wainwright's 398 career starts, all with St. Louis, rank 13th-most, exclusively with one organization in MLB history, while Gibson (482) ranks 6th. **Walter Johnson** of the Washington Senators leads at 666.
- Is three wins shy of 200 career, 13 wins from 210 (T-2nd all-time Cardinals history with **Jesse Haines**), and three starts away from reaching 400 career.
- At age 41, Wainwright is one of four active players age 40+ with **Rich Hill** (43), **Nelson Cruz** (42) and **Miguel Cabrera** (40).
- Missed the first 33 games of the season due to a groin injury he suffered while working out during the WBC Finals. Made two injury rehab starts for Springfield (AA) and one for Memphis (AAA).

LAST TIME OUT

- Scattered eight hits, allowing three runs across 5.2 innings (matching season high for IP) for a no-decision in the Cardinals 4-3 loss to Cincinnati last Sun. (6/11). It was his 2nd straight no-decision in a one-run 4-3 loss.

- Earned career win No. 197 against the Reds at Great American Ball Park (5/23), allowing five runs on eight hits. Departed w/ 7-5 lead w/ runners on first and second and two outs.
- Earned 196th career win on 5/18 vs. LAD. Gave him 107 career home wins with the Cardinals, T-2nd most in Cardinals history with Jesse Haines. Held a 9-2 lead when he departed and Cardinals held on for 16-8 win as the Redbirds blasted seven homers.
- Became the 21st pitcher in MLB history with 300.0 or more career innings in Interleague play in his start at Boston (5/14). Passed Jesse Haines (39) for 2nd place all-time among Cardinals with 40 starts over the age of 40. Trails only Grover Cleveland Alexander (80). Allowed back-to-back home runs for only the 9th time in his career.
- Made season debut vs. DET (5/6) and took a no-decision the Cardinals lost in 10 innings.

BUSCH STADIUM III (2006-present)

- Needs one Home win to pass **Jesse Haines** (107) for 2nd all-time among Cardinals.
- Has made 208 career starts at Busch Stadium III, surpassing **Bob Forsch** (207 at Busch Stadium II) for 19th-most at a single stadium in MLB history.
- Has 107 career regular-season wins at Busch Stadium III, tied with **Wilbur Cooper** (107 at Forbes Field) for 22nd-most wins at a single stadium.
- Is one of 22 pitchers in MLB history to hold a stadium's record for both appearances (239) and starts (208). Joins **Bob Forsch** (233 app/207 GS at Busch II) as Cardinals on that list.
- Has 1,189 regular season strikeouts at Busch Stadium III, 15th-most all-time at a single stadium. Jim Palmer (1,191 SO at Memorial Stadium) ranks 14th.
- Is tied with **Lance Lynn** and **Trevor Rosenthal** for most Postseason appearances at Busch (13). Leads in PS starts (8), IP (62.0), strikeouts (72) at Busch III.

CAREER

- He and **Yadier Molina** finished with 328 career games as batterymates together. They set a new MLB career record on Sept. 14, 2022 by passing the 324 career starts mark set by **Mickey Lolich** and **Bill Freehan** of the Detroit Tigers (1963-75).
- 2023 is his 18th season played with the Cards, 2nd only to **Stan Musial** (22) and **Yadier Molina** (19). His 19th season overall as a Cardinal, missing all of 2011 (elbow surgery).
- Wainwright is the longest tenured active Major Leaguer to appear with the same franchise (2005-23).
