# PITTSBURGH PIRATES (13-14) vs. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (13-14) APRIL 27, 2024 at Oracle Park, San Francisco, CA - 6:05 PDT - GAME \#28/ROAD \#16 LHP MARTíN PÉREZ (1-1, 3.45 ERA) vs. RHP JORDAN HICKS (2-0, 1.61 ERA) 

THE PIRATES:...were walked off in the opener of their three-game series last night against the Giants...Began the season 5-0 for the first time since 1983... Won nine of their first 11 games before losing nine of their next 11 from 4/9-21...Are in a stretch that has the team playing 13 straight days before their next scheduled off day on $5 / 2$ coming back from the west coast...Have lost four straight and five of their last six games on the road...Have not been charged with an error in two straight and four of their last five games.


ABOUT TONIGHT'S STARTER: Martín Pérez gets the start tonight in the middle game of this weekend series against the Giants...Pérez was charged with his first loss of the season in his last start Sunday afternoon against the Red Sox after allowing four runs in 4.0 -plus innings... Pérez comes into today with the sixth-lowest ERA (3.45) among qualified National League left-handed pitchers (teammate Bailey Falter has the fifth-best ERA among National League southpaws with a 3.33 ERA).

START ME UP: Quinn Priester tossed 6.0 shutout innings with six strikeouts and a career-high tying 14 whiffs last night against the Giants...Pittsburgh's starting rotation comes into today with the sixth-lowest ERA (3.56) in all of MLB...The only five starting rotations in all of MLB to record a lower earned run average are the Red Sox (2.15), Phillies (2.18), Royals (2.89), Yankees (3.26) and Dodgers (3.50).

FROM LAST NIGHT: Last night the Pirates played in their eighth game of the season that was decided in the last at-bat (the Bucs are 4-4 in those games)...The only team in MLB to play in more games decided in the last at-bat are the Tigers (Detroit is 9-3 in games decided in the last at-bat).

GO JOE: Connor Joe extended his on-base streak to 10 games with his double in the first inning last night....Joe's 10-game on-base streak is tied for the longest by a Pirate this season along with Jared Triolo, who reached base safely from March 28 to April 8.
TAYLOR MADE: Michael A. Taylor singled in each of his final two at-bats on Friday with singles in the seventh and ninth innings...Taylor comes into today tied for the third-best batting average (.400) in all of MLB in the seventh inning or later...Tampa Bay's Amed Rosario leads MLB with a .433 average in the seventh inning or later.

BACK AT THE BEST BALLPARK IN AMERICA: Today PNC Park is scheduled to host four high
school baseball games...Eden Christian Academy will face Southside High School at 10 a.m., Grove City will play against Slippery Rock at 12:40, Seneca Valley will take on Gateway at 3:20, and Dubois Central Catholic will play against Clarion Area High School at 6 p.m.

HUNTING THE GOOD: Hunter Stratton threw seven of his 11 pitches for strikes on Friday while lowering his ERA to 3.21 (14.0ip/5er)...Stratton ranks first among all rookies in MLB in appearances (13), seventh in ERA (3.21) and tied for the sixth-best WHIP (1.00).

LIKING ALIKA: Alika Williams has improved his batting average by . 125 from last season (.198) to this season (.323)...That is the fourth-largest improvement among all MLB players with at least 100 at-bats in 2023 and 30 at-bats in 2024...Williams brings a seven-game hitting streak into today, which is tied for the longest by a Pirate this season.

INTO THE DRINK: Last season on May 29 Jack Suwinski recorded a multi-homer game with each of the two home runs landing in McCovey Cove... He joined Barry Bonds as the only players in Oracle Park's history to hit multiple long balls into the water in the same game as well as the only visiting player to do so.

A BART DART: Joey Bart went deep for the third time in his first seven games as a member of the Pirates on Thursday...Bart's bomb in the first inning was the first three-run homer of his career...The 419-foot blast was the second-longest home run by a Pirate this year behind Rowdy Tellez' 425 -foot homer on March 31 at Miami.
