METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action and defeated the Nationals, 8-1, last night...The Mets have won three straight games after dropping three straight...New York is seeking their second consecutive series victory...New York hits the road for a six-game trip (1-0) against the Nationals (1-0) and Braves (three games).

RISP BUSINESS: In 16 games in August, the Mets are batting .352 (44-125) with eight doubles, seven home runs, 61 RBI, 21 walks, a .429 OBP, and a .584 SLG with RISP...Their .352 average is second in the majors and tops in the National League in August.

HANG 10: The Mets have recorded 10 hits in four straight games, which is tied for their longest streak of the season (also, June 5-8)...The Mets are batting .326/.373/.597 over that span with 27 runs, 12 doubles, nine home runs, 27 RBI, 12 walks and a .971 OPS...The last time the Mets recorded 10 or more hits in five or more games was a streak of five such games from April 12-16, 2019.

DOG DAYS OF SUMMER: In 16 games this month, the Mets are batting .267/.337/.478 with 29 doubles, 29 home runs, 87 RBI and 55 walks...They rank fifth in the majors with a .267 AVG and eighth with a .337 OBP...Over the last eight games, the team is batting .323/.381/.596 with 55 runs, 20 doubles, 19 homers, 55 RBI, 27 walks and a .977 OPS.

RETURN OF THE MARK: Over the last two games, Mark Vientos is 3-7 with two runs, two home runs, one walk for a 1.730 OPS...He is batting .261 (18-69) with five runs, four doubles, three homers, 14 RBI and a .723 OPS after the All-Star break.

BRETT THE MET: Brett Baty has reached base safely in seven straight games, posting a .423 OBP in that span...In 11 games this month, Baty is batting .344 (11-32) with eight runs, three homers, six RBI, four walks, a steal, a .417 OBP and a .625 OPS...In 23 games following the All-Star break, Baty is batting .282/.350/.507 (20-71) with 15 runs, one double, five homers, 10 RBI, eight walks and an .857 OPS...He has recorded a career-high 14 home runs in 98 games this season.

HAPPY JEFF: Over the last four games, Jeff McNeil is batting .471 (8-17) with six runs, two doubles, one homer, three RBI, one walk, a .500 OBP and a .765 SLG...He is slashing .302/.353/.429 with nine runs, five doubles, one homer, six RBI, five walks and a .782 OPS in 16 games this month...His .795 season OPS is the highest mark since he recorded an .836 mark in 2022.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Francisco Lindor is on a seven-game hitting streak, batting .500 (15-30) with eight runs, four doubles, three homers, seven RBI, three walks, two steals, a .545 OBP and a .933 SLG in that span.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Francisco Lindor is the first primary shortstop in Major League history with five separate 20/20 seasons...His three 20/20 seasons as a Met are the second-most in franchise history behind Darryl Strawberry and Howard Johnson who each had five such seasons.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 26-34 on the road this year (.433 winning percentage)...They have posted a 3.91 ERA, which is sixth in the majors and third in the National League.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 13 straight games against the NL East...They Mets are 1-0 in that span...The Mets are batting .260/.325/.455 against the NL East, while posting a 3.89 ERA.

NATIONALS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 77-75 all-time at Nationals Park...The Mets are batting .311/.386/.525 at Nationals Park in 2025.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has reached base safely in all 16 games this month...He is batting 16-59 (.271) with 14 runs, six homers, 10 RBI, 13 walks, five steals, a .405 OBP and a .576 SLG...Soto has recorded a Major League-leading 97 walks this year...He is looking to recorded his sixth season with 100+ walks...With three more walks, he will become the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier...John Olerud recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season.

20/20 VISION: The Mets became the only team in the National League feature four players with 20 or more home runs (Pete Alonso, Francisco Lindor, Brandon Nimmo and Juan Soto)...The Yankees, Angels and Athletics also have four players with 20+ homers...The Mets have had seven seasons in which at least four players recorded 20+ homers (also: 2024, 2023, 2019, 2016, 2000, 1987)...The team's record is five players with 20+ homers in 2019 (Alonso, Michael Conforto, J.D. Davis, Todd Frazier and Jeff McNeil).

OVER THE WALL AND ON THE BASEPATHS: Juan Soto has 31 home runs and 20 stolen bases while Francisco Lindor has 24 home runs and 20 stolen bases...The pair joins Carlos Beltrán and David Wright (2007), Howard Johnson, Kevin McReynolds and Darryl Strawberry (1988) and Johnson and Strawberry (1987) as the only pair/trio of Mets teammates to record 20+ home runs and 20+ stolen bases in the same season...Lindor has recorded his fifth 20/20 season which ties Randy Arozarena for the second-most such seasons in the majors since 2018 (most: 7, José Ramírez).

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed two runs over 5.2 innings on five hits, while recording seven strikeouts against one walk on August 14 vs. Atlanta...Marked his longest start since June 12 vs. Washington (also: 5.2 IP)...His seven strikeouts were his most since May 31 vs. Colorado... His 20 career games with seven or more strikeouts are the fifth-most such games in franchise history through a Mets pitcher’s first 49 career Major League games...Only Dwight Gooden (34), Matt Harvey (28), Jacob deGrom (27) and Noah Syndergaard (23) had more through their first 49 games in the majors.

SO FAR SO GOOD: In 18 starts this season, the right-hander has gone 7-4 with a 2.35 ERA (26 ER/99.2 IP)...He has thrown at least 5.0 innings in 14 of those 19 starts and has allowed three runs or fewer in 16 of those starts...Among pitchers who have thrown at least 80.0 innings this season, he ranks fifth in ERA (second in NL)...With the same qualification, his 6.77 H/9.0 IP ratio ranks seventh, his .205 opponent batting average (75-363) is the eighth best and his 47.6 groundball percentage is the 10th-highest in the National League...Has held right-handers to a .185 average this season (32-173) compared to a .226 average vs. lefties (43-190).

KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST: Senga has picked up 64 of his 95 strikeouts on the ghost fork this season...Has held batters to a .118 average with his ghost fork this season, which is the lowest opponents' batting average among any qualified pitcher throwing a split-finger pitch and the fifth-lowest opponent batting average among any qualified pitcher throwing any pitch...Has a run value of eight with his forkball this season, which is tied for the second-best among all qualified pitchers throwing a split-finger pitch...His 41.1% whiff rate is the second highest, trailing only Fernando Cruz's 60.2% whiff rate with his split-finger ball...In his rookie year (2023), Senga's "ghost fork" accounted for 110 of his 202 strikeouts...The pitch had a 59.5% whiff rate and a 28.2% put away rate...Opponents managed just 18 hits in 163 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .110 batting average.

GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES: Has allowed three earned runs or fewer in 43 of his 49 career starts...Has allowed three or fewer runs in 43 of his first 49 career starts, tied with Jacob deGrom and Lance McCullers Jr. for the third-most such starts in Major League history through a pitcher’s first 49 Major League starts since the mound was lowered in 1968...His 43 such starts are tied with deGrom for the most in franchise history through a starters first 49 career games...He had allowed three earned runs or less in 31 consecutive starts from 6/23/23 to 7/11/25...It was the longest active streak in the majors and tied the second-longest such streak in franchise history...He trailed only Jacob deGrom’s 40 starts (from 9/9/19-9/18/22) and deGrom’s 31 starts (from 4/16/18-4/3/19).

SENGA GENESIS: Through Senga's first 49 career starts he has posted 306 strikeouts...His 306 strikeouts through his first 49 Major League games are the fifth-most in Mets history behind Gooden (413), Harvey (349), Syndergaard (343) and deGrom (328)....His 306 strikeouts are also the fifth-most among Japanese-born pitchers through their first 49 starts, trailing only Yu Darvish (393), Hideo Nomo (392), Shohei Ohtani (333) and Masahiro Tanaka (308)...His career 2.75 ERA (83 ER/271.1 IP) is the eighth-best in franchise history through a player's first 49 starts with the club.

VS. WASHINGTON/NATIONAL LEAGUE: Will be making his fifth career start against the Nationals tonight...Has gone 1-1 with a 1.99 ERA (5 ER/22.2 IP), 1O walks and 22 strikeouts in those games...Against NL East opponents, Senga is 8-3 with a 2.35 ERA (22 ER/84.1 IP) in his career...The Mets are 10-5 in games this season where Senga has started against a National League team...He has gone 6-3 with a 2.15 ERA (19 ER/79.2 IP) in those games...In his career, he is 19-8 with a 2.49 ERA (58 ER/209.1 IP), 92 walks and 230 strikeouts against NL teams...The Mets have gone 24-13 in those contests.

2024 REWIND: He missed nearly the first four months of the 2024 season with a right shoulder capsule strain...Returned and made one regular season start on July 26 vs. Atlanta, throwing 5.1 innings and allowing two runs on two hits with nine strikeouts and one walk before exiting with an injury...Missed the rest of the regular season with a strained left calf...He made it back for the Postseason and he made his first career Postseason start on October 5 in Game 1 of the NLDS against the Phillies...Threw 2.0 innings allowing one run, a home run in the first inning, and recorded one walk and three strikeouts...Finished the Postseason making three appearances and pitching 5.0 innings while striking out four.

REMARKABLE ROOKIE: During his rookie campaign in 2023, Kodai Senga recorded 202 strikeouts and became the 18th rookie pitcher in the Modern Era (Since 1900) to have 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Senga's 202 punch outs were the second-most by a Mets pitcher behind only Dwight Gooden's 276 strikeouts in 1984...He joined Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsusaka (201) as the

only Japanese-born rookie hurlers to reach 200 strikeouts...Senga's 12 wins were tied with Ron Darling (1984) for the seventh-most wins in a single season by a Mets rookie and was the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee (13, 2011)...His 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP) was the fifth-lowest in a single season by a Mets rookie behind only Jerry Koosman (2.08, 1968), Jon Matlack (2.32, 1972), Dwight Gooden (2.60, 1984) and Tom Seaver (2.76, 1967)...He finished seventh in NL Cy Young voting.

HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: In 2023 Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver (1967) as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He was the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.
