The Braves tallied four two-strike hits last night, including the go-ahead home run from Dansby Swanson in the fifth inning. Swanson drove a 3-2 pitch out to left-center.

Atlanta leads all of baseball with 89 homers in two-strike counts this season.

Three of Atlanta's four total runs last night came with two strikes, and the Braves' 302 two-strike runs are also most in the majors.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Mets finish a three-game series tonight with the 19th and final meeting between the clubs this season...The two teams have not met since August 15-18 here in Atlanta, when the Braves took three-of-four.

A The Braves went 10-9 against the Mets last season, taking the season set from their NL East rivals for the fourth consecutive season...They went 7-3 in 2020, 11-8 in 2019 and 13-6 in 2018...The winner of tonight's game will take the season set as the teams have split the first 18 games.

A Despite splitting the first 18 games with the Mets, the Braves have outscored their rivals by 14 runs in the clubs head-to-head matchups this season...The Braves have 85 runs and are averaging 4.7 runs/game, while New York has scored 71 times and is averaging 3.9 runs/game in their matchups.

A The Braves have won five of the last six games with New York, outscoring the Mets 37-16 (+21) over the stretch...Atlanta allowed more than two runs just once in the six games.

A RHP Charlie Morton is 4-5 with a 3.53 ERA (36 ER/91.2 IP) in 17 career games, 16 starts, against the Mets...The 38-year-old righty beat the Mets in his last start against them on August 16 here in Atlanta, tossing 6.2 shutout innings while striking out 12 in a 5-0 win...Prior to that win, Morton was 0-2 with a 7.59 ERA (9 ER/10.2 IP) in two games against the Mets this season.

A RHP Chris Bassitt is 1-1 with a 2.77 ERA (4 ER/13.0 IP) in two career starts against the Braves, with both games coming this season...The 33-year-old righty beat Atlanta in his last start against them, going 6.0 innings and allowing one run, earned, in a 7-3 victory here at Truist Park... Bassitt is 9-2 on the road this season, but has a 3.68 ERA (32 ER/78.1 IP) away from Citi Field, compared to a 2.95 ERA (33 ER/100.2 IP) at his home park.

WIN: The Braves moved into sole possession of first-place in the NL East last night after beating the Mets, 4-2, in the middle game of the club's three-game series...The victory also gave the club 99 victories, moving them within one of the ninth 100-win season in franchise history and first since the 2003 team won 101.

A Since the club was a season low-tying four games under .500 at 23-27 after play on May 31, the Braves have gone 76-32 (.704), the second-best record in the majors...Only Los Angeles at 77-32 (.706) has been better.

A A win tonight would reduce the Braves' magic number to clinch the NL East to one.

A Atlanta is looking to remain in sole possession of first place for consecutive days for the first time this season...This is also the club's biggest division lead of the season...They have been in first place for five days total, with only last night and Friday, September 9, as the only days they were alone in the top spot.

AT HOME: The Braves end their regular season home schedule tonight, and are looking to win 55 games in their home park for the seventh time in franchise history.

A The franchise record is 62, done by the 1899 Boston Beaneaters...Five teams won 56 games, most recently the 2013 squad, while the 2003 team won 55.

A Atlanta (54-26, .675) is tied for the third-best home record in the majors with Houston (52-25, .675)...The Dodgers are 56-21 (.727), while the Yankees are 57-23 (.713).

HOME RUNS: The Braves hit two more home runs last night, extending their NL-leading total to 239...The Braves have now tied the second-most home runs a team has hit in franchise history.

A Last year's club also hit 239...The 2019 team holds the record with 249.

A In this series, the Braves have hit five home runs compared to the Mets' one.

DOUBLE-DIGIT WINS: RHP Charlie Morton looks for his 10th win tonight, which would give the Braves five double-digit winners this season.

A That would tie the franchise record for most such pitchers in a single season...The last Braves team to have five double-digit winners was the 2003 Braves (Mike Hampton, Greg Maddux, Russ Ortiz, Horacio Ramirez, Shane Reynolds).

A The first Braves team to accomplish the feat was the 1921 club, and it was then matched by the 1932 team...It also happened in 1953, 1955, 1998 and 1999.

A The Astros (Luis Garcia, Cristian Javier, José Urquidy, Framber Valdez, Justin Verlander) and Blue Jays (José Berríos, Adam Cimber, Kevin Gausman, Alek Manoah, Ross Stripling) are the only team this season with five 10-game winners.

A The major league record is seven double-digit winners, done three times and last by the 1976 Cincinnati Reds...The 1914 Philadelphia A's did it first before the 1939 Yankees had seven as well.

RALLIES: The Braves have rallied for both wins in this series, after New York took a 1-0 lead on Friday and a 1-0 and 2-1 lead last night.

A The Braves are now 28-46 (.378) when they allow the first run of the game...In comparison, the club is 71-13 (.845) when they score the first run of the game.

MORTON SIGNS: Charlie Morton tonight makes his first start since signing a one-year contract worth \$20 million on Friday for the 2023 season to remain in Atlanta.

A The deal includes a club option for 2024, and does not include a buyout.

A He has compiled a 23-12 record and a 3.80 ERA (149 ER/353.1 IP) with Atlanta since the start of last season, with 416 strikeouts.

Tonight's Game

- A Set for his 31st start of the season and the 322nd of his career...Tonight is his 323rd career appearance.
- A Has made 16 career starts and 17 appearances against New York, including three times this season...Is 4-5 with a 3.53 ERA (36 ER/91.2 IP) in his career against the Mets.
 - A In his three turns this season, is 1-2 with a 4.67 ERA and has allowed 10 runs, nine earned, in 17.1 innings...In his last start against New York, August 16 here at Truist Park, pitched 6.2 scoreless innings and fanned 12.
 - A Did not lose in five starts to the Mets last season, going 2-0 with a 2.36 ERA (7 ER/26.2 IP) and 34 strikeouts...Atlanta went 4-1 in his starts.
 - A Made the only relief appearance of his career against New York, pitching to inning of relief on September 21, 2008 in the final outing of his rookie season with Atlanta.
- A Last started on September 25 at Philadelphia and allowed a season-most six runs over just 4.2 innings...Surrendered six hits and three walks with a pair of homers, and struck out four...Took a no-decision after the Braves beat the Phillies, 8-7, in 11 innings.
 - A A win tonight would give Morton his 10th victory of the year and the sixth 10-win season of his career.
 - A Five of his six such seasons have come since 2017, doing so in every 162-game season in that span...Morton's 70 total wins since 2017 are tied for third most in the majors in that span, trailing just Gerrit Cole and Max Scherzer.
 - A With a win today Morton would become the fifth Atlanta pitcher with at least 10 wins this season, tying the franchise record...Since the Braves moved to Atlanta in 1966, just three staffs have had five pitchers with at least 10 wins, with the 2003 club the last to do so.
- A Morton fanned four in his last start, and his 200 strikeouts on the season are 11th most in the majors...Since June 1, his 154 strikeouts are fifth most in baseball.
 - A Morton's 200 strikeouts this season are sixth most in the National League, and he is one of just three pitchers in Atlanta franchise history to log at least 200 strikeouts in multiple seasons...He struck out 216 last year...Hall-of-Famers John Smoltz (five seasons) and Phil Niekro (three seasons) are the only others to do so
 - A Since the start of the 2018 season, Morton's 899 strikeouts are fifth most in the majors...Only Gerrit Cole (1187), Max Scherzer (1044), Aaron Nola (998) and Robbie Ray (925) have more.

2022 Recap

- A Started on August 21 vs. Houston, and allowed five hits and two runs over 6.0 innings...Walked two and struck out 11...Took a no-decision after the Astros rallied for a 5-4 win.
 - A Fanned 12 in his previous outing, and had double-digit strikeouts in back-to-back games for the fourth time in his career...He last did so in 2019, and has never fanned 10+ in three straight games.
- A Had 45 total strikeouts in June, most in the National League and tied for tops in the majors...The White Sox' Dylan Cease also had 45.
 - A Morton had never previously struck out 45+ batters in five or fewer starts in a single month...His previous high was 40 strikeouts, done over five starts in May of 2018.
 - A Furthermore, since the mound-to-plate distance was first set at 60'6" in 1893, Morton is the only Braves pitcher to fan at least 45 batters in five or fewer starts in a single month.
 - A Research courtesy the Elias Sports Bureau.
- A Made his first career start against Pittsburgh, June 11 at Trust Park...Allowed five hits and four runs over 6.0 innings...Walked three and struck out a season-most 12...The Braves beat the Pirates, 10-4...Pitched for the Pirates for seven years from 2009-15, going 41-62 with a 4.39 ERA in 142 starts.
 - A The effort was the 20th double-digit strikeout game of his career, and his first this season...Seventeen of his 10+ strikeout games have come since the start of 2018, tied for the 11th-most such outings in the majors in the span.
- A With his start on May 25, became the 10th active pitcher in the majors to make 300 career starts.
 - A Over his first 150 career starts, from his debut through August 20, 2015, Morton compiled a 44-65 record and a 4.46 ERA...In his next 150 starts, he went 66-33 with a 3.61 ERA.
- A Struck out Wil Myers in the third inning of his start, April 14 at San Diego, for the 1,500th strikeout of his career.
 - A Became the 18th active pitchers to reach 1,500 career strikeouts, with Max Scherzer's 3,043 strikeouts pacing active players.

Career Recap

- A A 15-year major league veteran, has compiled a 116-101 record and a 4.03 ERA (802 ER/1792.2 IP) across 322 games, 321 starts...Has fanned 1,692 and pitched a pair of shutouts.

- Pitched a scoreless inning in his Braves debut in Cincinnati on July 1.
- Went 2-1 with a 2.08 ERA in four starts and 20 total appearances with Tripe-A Gwinnett this season.
- Acquired by Atlanta from Boston for cash considerations on June 30.
- Born in Maracaibo, Venezuela...Same birthplace as former Braves outfielder Ender Inciarte.
- Made his debut with Arizona on August 20, 2015 and went 2-2 with 4.82 ERA through parts of five seasons.

- Owns a 1.78 ERA in 43 relief appearances with Atlanta (50.2 IP)...Had a 6.35 ERA in three appearances (5.2 IP) with Chicago (NL) and a 7.59 ERA in 11 appearances (10.2 IP) with Los Angeles (AL).
- At the trade deadline was traded to the Los Angeles Angels along with LHP Tucker Davidson in exchange for RHP Raisel Iglesias before returning for his fourth stint with Atlanta after being claimed off waivers from LA... Was also acquired earlier in the season from the Chicago Cubs in exchange for LHP Sean Newcomb on 4/20... Chavez also pitched for Atlanta during the 2021 World Series run and in 2010.
- Played for nine different MLB teams.

Raisel Iglesias • RHP • 6-2 • 190 • 32 yrs • #26

Saves/Opp: 1/2 **Holds:** 12 **1st Batter/Retired:** 26/18 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 4/1

- Allowed just one earned run in 26 appearances since being acquired by Atlanta on 8/2...His 0.37 ERA during that span is the lowest among pitchers with as many appearances.
- Logged 16 saves and 2-6 record while pitching to a 4.04 ERA in 39 appearances with the Angels this season.
- Acquired from the LA Angels on August 2 in exchange for LHP Tucker Davidson and RHP Jesse Chavez.
- Ranks eighth among active pitchers with 157 career saves.
- Iglesias, teammate Kenley Jansen and Aroldis Chapman are the only pitchers to record at least 30 saves each season dating to 2018 (not including the 2020 shortened season).
- Leads the majors with 37 saves of 4-plus outs since the beginning of the 2017 season.

- Leads the National League and ranks second in the majors with 39 saves.
- His next save will tie Hall-of-Famer Dennis Eckersley for the eighth most career saves in baseball history (389)... Will also become just the 10th player in history to post four different seasons with at least 40 saves.
- Logged his 35th save on 9/19 and has now posted seven seasons with at least 35 saves...Francisco Rodríguez, Joe Nathan and Hall-of-Famers Mariano Rivera and Trevor Hoffman are the only pitchers with more such seasons.
- Recorded his 30th save of the year on 8/31 and has now posted eight seasons with at least 30 saves...His eight such seasons are tied for the sixth most in major league history.
