AMF LAUNCHES METS NIKE RBI PROGRAM: The Amazin' Mets Foundation (AMF) has launched the New York Mets participation in Major League Baseball's Reviving Baseball in Inner Cities (RBI) program, an outreach initiative designed to increase involvement and interest in baseball and softball for underrepresented communities... The Mets Nike RBI team will consist of 18-20 local, talented baseball players, ages 11 and 12...These athletes will wear special Mets uniforms as they compete in tournaments throughout the tri-state area... Mets first baseman Pete Alonso will serve as the team's Nike RBI ambassador.

HIGH FIVE: Griffin Canning is set to take the bump today...The right-handed pitcher has not recorded a loss since his Mets debut at Houston on 3/29...He has also recorded a win in each of his last five decisions (since 4/11 at ATH)...For Canning, this is the longest winning streak of his career.

LUIS, LUIS: Luis Torrens is on a five-game hitting streak, tied for the second-longest stretch of his career...He is batting .429 (6-14) in that span with two runs, two doubles, one triple, one RBI, four walks and a 1.270 OPS...He has reached base safely in 10 straight games, his third-longest streak of his career...In the 10 games since April 22, Torrens is slashing .345/.472/.517 with four extra-base hits and five RBI.

NO HOMERS CLUB: Entering Friday, Pete Alonso has not hit a home run in 58 at-bats (62 PA)...His 58 at-bats without a home run is the longest stretch in his career...He has gone 14 straight games without a home run...That is tied for the second-longest streak in his career (also, 8/5-18/22)...His longest streak is 15 games without a homer (4/27-5/14/21).

OUCH: The Mets have been plunked 28 times this year, which is the most in the National League...New York was hit 92 times last season, the third-most in the majors and the most in the Senior Circuit...Pete Alonso owns the franchise record, having been hit by 90 pitches in his career...Brandon Nimmo is second with 81, followed by Jeff McNeil at 77 HBP.

23 AND ME: The Mets have won the last 24 games in which Francisco Lindor has homered...The streak that goes back to July 9, 2024 is the longest streak in team history...Prior to Lindor's streak, the longest was 21 straight wins when George Foster homered between July 3, 1985, and June 29, 1986...The next-longest active streak by any major leaguer is Boston's Ceddanne Rafaela at 17 straight wins...Courtesy of Stats Perform.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Francisco has hit six lead-off homers as a member of the Mets...That is tied with Mookie Wilson for the seventh-most in team history...Michael Conforto is next with seven leadoff homers.

IN THE CITI: The Mets are 17-5 at home this season...Their .773 winning percentage at home is the best in the majors this season... Mets pitchers have recorded a 2.40 ERA at home this season which is the second-lowest in the majors.

PITCHING IN: The Mets lead the majors with a 2.82 ERA and are sixth with 448 strikeouts...They are tied for fifth with five shutouts... New York's starting staff has posted an MLB-best 2.83 ERA this year...The bullpen ranks third in the majors with a 2.81 ERA.

MAKE IT A DOZEN: Over his last 12 games, Jeff McNeil is batting .286 (6-21) with two runs, one double, one triple, one homer, four RBI, 10 walks, a .516 OBP and a .571 SLG...He safely reached base in all but four of his 21 games this season...He has not struck out over his last 10 games, a total of 15 at-bats and 25 plate appearances.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Diaz has not allowed an earned run over his last nine games, recording four saves and allowing four hits, three walks and 12 strikeouts during that span...He has not allowed a hit over last five appearances.

LAST TIME OUT: Gave up two earned runs over 5.1 innings on May 17 at Yankee Stadium, he tied a season-high giving up seven hits and gave up two home runs in a game for the first time since September 22, 2024, at Houston...He struck out four batters and he has struck out at least four in eight of his nine starts this season.

START ME UP: His 2.47 ERA (13 ER/47.1 IP) is the best of his career through his first nine games of a season, topping his 3.93 ERA through his first nine starts of 2019...His ERA is the 16th best in the majors among starters and sixth in the NL (min. 45.0 IP)...His ERA is also the 10th-lowest through a starter’s first nine games with the club, and the lowest since Max Scherzer’s 2.26 ERA from April 8 - July 5, 2022.

QUEENS SUCCESS: In five career starts at Citi Field he has a 2-0 record and a 1.61 ERA (5 ER/28.0 IP)...He has allowed just one earned run in all five of his starts in Queens...Has allowed no more than one run in each of his four home starts this season, becoming the seventh Mets starter to accomplish the feat, joining Jacob deGrom (8 GS), David Cone (5 GS), Jason Vargas, Jae Weong Seo, Al Leiter and Craig Swan.

VS. DODGERS: In four starts against the Dodgers, he owns a 2-1 record with a 3.86 ERA (9 ER/21.0 IP) and 16 strikeouts...Three of his starts against the Dodgers have come as a member of the home team and he has a 2.45 ERA (5 ER/18.1 IP) in those starts.

GRIFFIN FANNING: During Spring Training, he struck out 22 batters over his 14.1 innings of work, highlighted by his nine strikeouts in 4.2 innings vs. Tampa Bay on March 17...His 22 strikeouts ranked ninth in the Grapefruit League and tied for the 17th-most across the majors...Canning finished the spring with an impressive 1.88 ERA (3 ER/14.1 IP) and a K/9. rate of 13.8%...He struck out a season-high eight batters on April 17 vs. St. Louis and he has racked up 46 strikeouts through his first nine starts of this season...In his last two major league seasons, Canning has recorded 130 and 139 strikeouts respectively.

SLIDE TO THE LEFT: Canning has thrown his slider more this season than he ever has before...So far, he has thrown his slider 34.1% of the time compared to 24.1% of the time last season and 29.9% during the 2023 season...He has picked up 17 strikeouts on his slider so far this season and is generating a 34.0% whiff rate on the pitch...His 17 strikeouts with his slider are tied for the 21st-most in the majors this season...He has thrown his slider 274 times this season which is the 10th-most anyone has thrown their slider in majors this year.

WORKHORSE: Last season, he set a career-high with 31 starts and 171.2 innings pitched for the Angels and in 2023 he finished with 127.0 innings...He is just one of 51 pitchers to throw at least 125.0 innings in each of the past two seasons...In the last two seasons combined, Canning has thrown 298.2 innings which ranks 48th in the majors over that time.

KEEP THE CHANGE: Canning's changeup is one of his best pitches and last season it had a run value of four which ranked eighth in the majors...He threw his changeup 26.7% of the time and he held his opponents to a .259 batting average against that pitch...He also generated a 28.8% whiff% on his changeup which was the 11th-highest clip in the majors...So far this season he has thrown it 23.8% and it produced a 25.2% whiff rate while picking up 12 strikeouts with the pitch...His changeup has produced a positive three run value, which is tied for 12th-best mark in the majors this season.

STAY GOLDEN: Canning was awarded the American League Rawlings Gold Glove in 2020, and he owns a career .955 fielding percentage...Last season he had a perfect fielding percentage on his 32 chances, and he is perfect through his first eight chances so far this season.

WELCOME TO NEW YORK: He signed a one-year contract with the Mets on December 19, 2024, and he had spent his entire five-year major league career with the Angels prior to signing with the Mets this past offseason...Canning owns a career 30-35 record with a 4.59 ERA (283 ER/555.1 IP) and 529 career strikeouts.

- Earned his third win of the season after tossing 2.1 scoreless innings in relief on May 21 at Boston (H, 4 K)...Entered the game with the bases loaded in the fifth inning and stranded all runners...Marked his most strikeouts in a game since July 6, 2024 (5 K)...Has stranded 14 of 16 inherited runners this season (12.5%), which is tied for the seventh-best percentage among qualified Major League relievers and tied for the best in the National League with teammate Max Kranick.
- Tossed a scoreless seventh inning in relief on May 18 at the Yankees (H, 2 BB, K)...Loaded the bases and struck out Anthony Volpe to end the inning...Pitched on consecutive days for the fourth time this season (also: 4/8-9, 4/22-23 and 5/4(G1)-5)...On May 17 at the Yankees, retired each of his five batters faced in relief (1.2 IP, K)...Also stranded two inherited runners in the sixth inning.
- Has not allowed an earned run over his last 10 appearances (13.2 IP, since April 27)...In that span, has allowed just four hits to 50 batters faced (.093 opponents' BA, 4 BB, 15 K).
- Has gone 3-0 with one save, six holds and a 0.90 ERA (3 ER/30.0 IP) through 22 appearances (two starts as an opener) this season, holding batters to a .152 average (15-99)...18 of his 22 outings this season have been scoreless...With runners on base, has held

- batters to a .089 average (4-45)...He is one of seven Mets pitchers (eighth time) to record as low of an ERA through their first 22 games of a season and is the first to do so since Francisco Rodríguez's 0.79 ERA in 22 games from 4/2-5/19/11.
- Has recorded a 1.00 ERA (3 ER/27.0 IP) in 20 games as a reliever this season...Among qualified NL relievers this season, is third in ERA, sixth in WHIP (0.78), is tied for sixth in wins, 10th in opponents' OPS (.487).
 - He has a 1.50 ERA (2 ER/12.0 IP) over nine appearances at home this season and has held batters to a .171 batting average (7-41) at Citi Field.
 - Eight of his 20 relief appearances have been for five or more outs and each of those outings have been scoreless...Is also one of five relievers to record at least six scoreless appearances of 2.0+ innings.
 - Has produced a run value of five with his sinker this season, tied for the ninth-best among qualified Major League pitchers.

- Tossed a scoreless eighth inning on May 19 at Boston (1.0 IP, 2 H).
- Threw 2.0 innings scoreless innings on May 16 against New York-AL (BB, K)...It marked the 12th time since the start of 2024 season that he pitched at least 2.0 innings without allowing an earned run in relief, which is tied for the seventh-most such games in the majors over that span.
- Has not allowed just two hits to his last 17 batters faced (since 5/9, 2 BB, 5 K).
- In 17 appearances this season, has gone 2-0 with one hold, a 2.77 ERA (8 ER/26.0 IP), 12 walks and 24 strikeouts...Has allowed one run or fewer in 15 of his 17 appearances and 11 of his appearances have been scoreless...Has allowed just two home runs this season to 109 batters faced, posting a 0.69 HR/9.0 IP ratio.
- Has recorded four or more outs in 11 appearances this season, tied for the third-most such outings among Major League relievers...Seven of those appearances have been scoreless, which is tied for the fifth-most such outings...Is also one of eight relievers to record at least five scoreless appearances of 2.0+ innings.
