BIRD WATCHING: The St. Louis Cardinals wrap up their home slate with the opener of a three-game weekend series against the Washington Nationals tonight at Busch Stadium ... The Cardinals have split the first six of their nine-game homestand against the White Sox (2-1) and Giants (1-2) ... With nine games remaining, St. Louis enters tonight's game in 4th place in the National League Central and 9.0 games out of the final NL Wild Card spot ... The Cardinals could be mathematically eliminated from postseason contention with a loss or a Padres win tonight.

PRIETO RE-JOINS ST. LOUIS: Prior to tonight's series opener, the Cardinals placed OF **Joshua Báez** (left oblique strain) on the season-ending 10-Day Injured List and recalled INF **César Prieto** from Memphis (AAA).

NATIONAL NEWS: Since relocating from Montreal to the Nation's Capitol and re-branding as the Nationals in 2005, the Cardinals .598 overall win pct. (79-53) against "Natitude" is the 2nd-highest in MLB among annual opponents behind the Dodgers (83-44, .654) ... St. Louis has won seven of its last nine over Washington since 2025.

AN ERA OF EXCELLENCE: St. Louis needs to go 6-3 to finish with a .500 record and avoid consecutive losing campaigns in full seasons (78-84 in 2025) for the first time since **1958** (72-82) and **1959** (71-83) ... The **67 years** represents the 2nd-longest timespan all-time by any franchise of the four major North American sports leagues (MLB, NBA, NFL, & NHL). - *excludes those shortened by war, work stoppages, or COVID*

- The NHL's **Montréal Canadiens** hold the record of **80 years** between consecutive full losing seasons occurring from 1938-39 to 1941-42 (4 seasons), and then again during the 2021-22 and 2022-23 seasons.
- The **Los Angeles Dodgers** have the 2nd-longest active streak, last experiencing losing seasons **39 years** ago from 1986-87.

VICTORY BLUES: Coinciding with St. Louis Blues Night and tonight's hockey jersey gate giveaway, the Cardinals are wearing blue uniforms in St. Louis for only the 3rd time in history ... The Cardinals have traditionally worn their modern Victory Blue uniforms for Saturday road games since 2019 and previously donned their original Powder Blues in road games from 1976-84.

- **Saturday, August 5, 2012 vs. Milwaukee (W 3-0):** St. Louis donned throwback Powder Blues for the 30-year anniversary of the 1982 World Series in a 3-0 shutout of the Brewers ... **Daniel Descalso** went 3-for-4 with a triple as **Kyle Lohse** (6.0), **Edward Mujica** (1.0), **Mitchell Boggs** (1.0), and **Jason Motte** (1.0) combined to blank Milwaukee.
- **Saturday, July 25, 2026 vs. Cincinnati (W 7-0):** The Cardinals hung seven runs on **Hunter Greene** as **Andre Pallante** (7.0) and **Gordon Graceffo** (2.0) combined for the shutout as 15,000 ticketed fans took home a Victory Blue jersey.

LET THE KIDS PLAY: The three youngest active MLB rosters include the **Nationals** (25.8 yrs), **Cardinals** (26.3), and the **Giants** (26.3).

NOTHIN' BUT 'G' THANG: **Gordon Greceffo** is currently riding a career-high scoreless streak of 16.2 innings (Aug. 16-present), longest by any Cardinal this season and tied for the NL's 2nd-longest active behind Pittsburgh's **Mason Montgomery**, (21.2 IP).

HAPPY BIRTH-DRE: Happy 28th birthday to **Andre Pallante** ... Other notables born on this day include former Cardinals player **Taylor Motter** (37) and instructor **Mark DeJohn** (73); All-Star pitcher **Harvey Haddix** (1925-94); Hall of Famer **Ryne Sandberg** (1959-2025); actors **Jason Sudeikis** (51) and **James Gandolfini** (1961-2013); former basketball player **Toni Kukoc** (58); and former NHL and St. Louis Blues coach **Scotty Bowman** (93)...catcher **Pedro Pagés** turned 28 yesterday.

THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (September 18, 1968): **Ray Washburn** authors a no-hitter against the San Francisco Giants at Candlestick Park in a 2-0 Cardinals win ... 16 hours earlier, San Francisco's **Gaylord Perry** no-hit the Cardinals while besting **Bob Gibson** in a game that ended 1-0.

Nationals.TV reporter **Alexa Datt** covered the Cardinals as a studio host and reporter for Bally/FanDuel Sports Midwest from 2022-25.

Cardinals Communications Gameday Associate **Sean Rocca** was born and raised in Norfolk, Va., and often attended Cardinals-Nationals games at Nationals Park.

NL RANKINGS: Swords (29, T-7th), Winning percentage (.714, T-8th)

TONIGHT'S START:

- The 29-year old Colorado native (makes his 29th start of the season (30th career) and 127th career appearance. Leahy's first 97 Major League career appearances all came in relief (2023-25).
- Making his first career start vs. the Nationals after previous 2 appearances in relief.
- Since throwing 90 pitches at Cincinnati (8/18) has not thrown more than 63 pitches in his next 4 starts.
- Received more than 3 runs of support only once (8/12 vs. PHI - 5 runs) in his 1st 18 starts dating back to May 30; 2nd-lowest RSA (3.64) in the National League behind Merrill Kelly (3.15).
- Since June 23, is 5-0 with a 1.94 ERA. Ranks 2nd in MLB (min. 50.0 IP) in ERA to Jesus Luzard (1.65) with 13 of his 14 starts yielding 2 runs or fewer (6 scoreless).**
- Allowed 2-or-fewer runs in a career-high 12 straight starts from June 23-August 29, matching the longest streak by a Cardinals hurler since at least 1900, with **Adam Wainwright** (12 in 2009). The streak was snapped in his start at COL (9/6).
- Surrendered just 8 runs combined over those 12 starts (1.37 ERA), the fewest by a Cardinal in any 12-start span since **Jack Flaherty** gave up 8 in a 12 start span from Aug 1-Sept. 29, 2019.
- Joins **Andre Pallante** (12) as the only two Cardinals with double-digit wins this season.
- Enters tonight on a career-high 5-game winning streak (June 28-present), tying **Andre Pallante** (5/23[1]-6/22) for the longest on the team this year. Has not received a decision since 8/18 at CIN and a loss since 6/17 vs. SD.
- His 135.0 innings pitched are a single-season MLB career high, as are his 128 strikeouts. His career single-season high for IP as a professional is 144.2 in 2022 between Memphis (AAA) and Springfield (AA).
- Ranks in MLB's 97th percentile in arm extension (7.3 ft.), which is measured from how far off the mound he releases the ball on average.
- Led off his Aug. 12 start vs. PHI by striking out Kyle Schwarber (looking) for his 100th strikeout this season, marking his first MLB season with 100+ strikeouts.
- Kyle's 97 career relief appearances before his 1st career Major League start (Sept. 28, 2025 at CHI) were the most by a Cardinal since **Jordan Hicks** (April 21, 2022 at Miami) who made his 1st career start after having made 114 career relief appearances.

LAST TIME OUT (Saturday, Sept. 12 vs. Chicago-AL): ND, L, 6-5; 3.0 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 0 ER, 0 BB, 4 SO - 38 pitches.

- Threw a season-low 38 pitches over 3.0 scoreless innings on a pitch limit. Received a no decision in a game the Cardinals lost 6-5.
- Was his 7th scoreless start of the season.
- Has not allowed more than 3 runs at home in his last 14 starts dating back to his first home start of the season vs. NYM (3/30) with 4 runs.

2026 HIGHLIGHTS:

HOME COOKING: Has not allowed more than 3 runs in a home start since 3/30 vs. NYM (4 runs). His 14 consecutive starts without allowing 3 runs in a home game ranks 7th-longest in franchise history and longest since **Jack Flaherty** with 17 from 2019-21; 3rd-longest in a single-season (**John Lackey** 17 in 2015 & **Adam Wainwright** 15 in 2009). 2nd-longest in MLB this season behind 15 by **Cristopher Sanchez** (PHI), which was ended by the Cardinals.

DON'T WALK: Became one of three Cardinals to strike out 8-or-more batters with 0 walks in his 8/7 start vs. COL, along with **Dustin May** (9 SO, 0 BB) on 5/27 at MIL and **Matthew Liberatore** (9 SO, 0 BB) on 8/19 at CIN.

BEND, DON'T BREAK: Ranks 1st among MLB starting pitchers in opponent batting average with 2 outs & RISP at .123 BA (7-57).

CENTRAL FOCUS: Earned four wins against NL Central opponents this season (April 28 at PIT, May 4 vs. MIL, July 4 at Chicago, Aug. 18 at Cincinnati) to improve to 6-1 in his career against divisional opponents.

EN GARDE: **Ranks T-8th among NL pitchers with his 29 Opponent's Sword Swings (1st: Cade Cavalli, 43).** *A "sword" swing is an expression of the art of forcing a batter to take an uncomfortable, awkward swing.*

AIR BENDER: Boasts average swing & miss distances of 5.5 inches on his sweeper, 2nd among Cardinals starters (**McGreevy**, 5.6 inches).

HELLO 4TH OF JULY: Hurled 5.0 scoreless innings through the Wrigley Field fog as the Cardinals handed the Cubs a 3-0 shutout on Independence Day ... Leahy allowed three singles and struck out six on only 77 pitches ... Following a 49-minute pre-game rain delay, **JJ Wetherholt** homered on the first pitch of the game . The game was also halted for 15 minutes after the 6th inning due to heavy fog combined with smoke from nearby fireworks.

PARK PLACE: Has made 8 starts this year at a Park (Last: 8/23 at Citizen's Bank Park); each of his first six road games took place at Parks (Petco Park, Comerica Park, Daikin Park, loanDepot park, PNC Park, Great American Ball Park). His start at Target Field on June 12 ended the string.

STRETCHING OUT: Worked at least 5.0 innings in 20 of his 28 starts on the year, including a career-high 6.1 innings on 6/23 vs. Arizona.

LEAHY VS. WASHINGTON:

- Is making his first career start and 3rd career appearance vs. the Nationals.
- Posted an 0-0 record with a 7.71 ERA in his 2 relief app., last pitching on JULY 10, 2025 at Busch Stadium (2.0 IP, 1 R)
- Along with the Dodgers and Giants (and Cardinals), the Nationals are one of 3 remaining N.L. teams he has yet to start against in which he has a relief app.
