SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

LAST GAME: The D-backs lost the series opener, 6-1, @ Mariners.

♦ **Zac Gallen** worked 5.0 innings (3 R, 3 H, 1 BB, 5 K) before being removed in the sixth inning due to right hamstring tightness.

♦ **Kevin Newman's** solo home run was his second in the last 3 games.

♦ **Joc Pederson** had 2 walks and a hit-by-pitch.

♦ **Ketel Marte** and **Christian Walker** each had a single and a walk.

♦ **Justin Martinez** worked 2.0 scoreless frames with 3 strikeouts (0 H, 0 BB).

VS. MARINERS: The D-backs are in Seattle for the sixth time (also: 1999, 2001, '09, '15, '21).

♦ Are 5-2 in last 7 games @ Mariners.

OPPOSITE CORNERS: **Slade Cecconi's** hometown of Oviedo, Florida (near Orlando) is roughly 2,555 air miles to Seattle, spanning from the southeast corner to the northwest corner of the country.

♦ Cecconi opened his last start with 4.2 hitless innings.

RACKING UP FREQUENT FLIER MILES: The D-backs' roadtrip will have covered approx. 5,027 air miles with the team trekking from Phoenix to San Francisco (651 miles) to St. Louis (1,735) to Seattle (1,710) to Phoenix (1,111).

bWAR RANKINGS: Courtesy Baseball Reference (@baseball_ref), **Ketel Marte's** 2.1 bWAR makes him 1 of 2 position players with a 2.0+ bWAR along with Mookie Betts/LAD (2.7 bWAR).

♦ **Ketel Marte's** 0.8 defensive bWAR leads the Majors while his 1.4 offensive bWAR is ninth in the Majors.

♦ **Christian Walker's** 0.5 defensive bWAR is tied for 10th in the Majors (Mookie Betts/LAD, Matt Chapman/SF).

DRS [courtesy fieldingbible.com]: **Ketel Marte's** 7 defensive runs saved (DRS) are tied for the most in the Majors with Marcus Semien/TEX while **Christian Walker's** 6 DRS are tied for third (5 others).

♦ The D-backs' 14 DRS are fifth in the Majors behind the Royals (20), Rangers (19), Blue Jays (19) and Dodgers (16).

INJURED LIST: The D-backs' injured list includes 7 players from the Opening Day roster and 2 additional players who started the year on the injured list, starting pitcher **Eduardo Rodriguez** and closer **Paul Sewald**.

TIES TO THE EMERALD CITY: The D-backs have a handful of ties to Seattle and the Mariners:

• **Corbin Carroll** returns home for the first time in the regular season... the 2019 graduate of Lakeside School was the Gatorade Washington Player of the Year as a senior (.540 AVG, 9 HR, 26 RBI).

• **Ketel Marte** played his first 2 seasons for the Mariners in 2015-16.

• **Eugenio Suárez** played for the Mariners in 2022-23.

• **Ryan Thompson** grew up in Turner, Oregon, roughly 4 hours south of Seattle, and as a kid, his dad would take him on an annual trip to a Mariners home series (Media Guide pg. 98).

WINS BY 13+ RUNS: The D-backs have set a franchise record with 3 wins by 13+ runs (thru just 27 games)...the 3 wins by 13+ runs also lead the Majors (no other team has 1 such win)...the most wins by 13+ runs in a season since 1998 are the 1999 Phillies' 6 wins [source: STATS LLC].

STOP THE RUNNING GAME: D-back backstops' 5 stolen bases allowed and 10 attempts are the fewest in the Majors.

♦ **Gabriel Moreno's** 57.1 caught-stealing pct. (4-for-7) is second in the Majors behind Christian Bethancourt/MIA (60.0, 3-for-5).

• **Gabriel Moreno** leads active catchers with a 40.7 caught-stealing pct. (33-for-81) while teammate **Tucker Barnhart** is 12th with a 30.8 caught-stealing pct. (171-for-556).

MARTE AMONG NL LEADERS: **Ketel Marte**, among NL leaders, is tied for fourth with 13 extra-base hits and 57 total bases, sixth with 34 hits, tied for sixth with 8 doubles and 10th with a .915 OPS.

GURRIEL'S ROAD STREAK: **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** has hit safely in 10 of 11 road games at a .360 clip (18-for-50)/.805 OPS with 3 doubles, 6 RBI and 2 walks.

SNAKEBITES: The D-backs' 13 games with a first-inning run are tied for second in the Majors with the Phillies behind the Dodgers (14).

♦ 19 times scoring first (11-8) are tied for the most in the Majors (also: Red Sox, Phillies).

♦ 12 innings with 4+ runs are tied for the most in the Majors with the Cubs and Reds [source: STATS LLC].

♦ +30 run differential is seventh in the Majors behind the Braves (+48), Royals (+47), Guardians (+45), Dodgers (+38), Brewers (+36) and Cubs (+32).

RISP-Y BUSINESS: Among teams with runners in scoring position over the last week, since April 20, the D-backs are third with a .954 OPS, fourth with 25 runs and a .319 AVG and tied for fourth with 6 extra-base hits.

NEXT STARTER: RHP BRANDON PFAADT (1-1, 4.97)

♦ In his last 2 starts - April 17 vs. Cubs and April 22 @ Cardinals - has a 2.92 ERA (5 R-4 ER in 12.1 IP) and .178 OPP AVG with 8 hits, 3 walks and 10 strikeouts.

♦ Second career start vs. Mariners, first on the road...did not figure in a 4-3 win vs. Mariners last July 29, working 5.2 innings with 3 runs, 8 hits, 1 walk and 3 strikeouts.

AT A GLANCE: Second season with the D-backs.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Is making his second start of the season.

- Recalled from Triple-A Reno on April 21...made 4 starts with the Aces (2-2, 4.58 ERA, 10 ER in 19.2 IP, 17 H, 8 BB, 23 K).
- First start against an AL West opponent...faced the Rangers out of the bullpen on Aug. 21, 2023 @ Chase Field (ND; 1 ER in 5.0 IP, 3 H, 0 BB, 2 K).
- In 3 career road starts, is 1-0 with a 3.68 ERA (6 ER in 14.2 IP), 0.95 WHIP, .192 opponent average (10-for-52) and 9 strikeouts.

LAST START: Earned his first Major League win in his season debut on April 21 @ Giants (2 ER in 6.0 IP, 2 H, 0 BB, 3 K).

- Retired 14 of the first 15 batters faced...did not allow a hit until the fifth inning.
- His 33 pitches through 4.0 innings were the fewest by any pitcher in the Majors this season and the second fewest through 4.0 IP in D-backs history behind Curt Schilling who had 26 on Aug. 21, 2002 [source: STATS LLC].

VS. MARINERS: Is making his first career start against the Mariners.

- Third youngest (24-308) D-backs starter to face the Mariners on the road, behind Humberto Castellanos (23-161) in 2021 and Robbie Ray (23-299) in 2015.
- Sixteenth D-backs starter to face the Mariners in Seattle.

2023 ROAD RECAP: In 3 road starts in 2023, went 0-0 with a 3.97 ERA (5 ER in 11.1 IP, 8 K).

2023 RECAP: In 7 games (4 starts) over 2 stints in his first Major League season, went 0-1 with a 4.33 ERA (13 ER in 27.0 IP).

- Rated as the D-backs' No. 9 prospect by MLB Pipeline.
- Appeared in 3 games in relief and went 0-0 with a 1.93 ERA, 0.75 WHIP, .206 opponent average and 5 strikeouts.
- Walked just 4 of his 111 batters faced.
- Optioned to Triple-A Reno on Sept. 4...went 1-1 with a 4.05 ERA (6 ER in 13.1 IP) in 3 starts with the Aces.
- Recalled by the D-backs on Sept. 22 and made 1 relief appearance @ Yankees (1 ER in 2.2 IP, 2 K).
- Optioned to Triple-A Reno on Sept. 25.
- Went 5-9 with a 6.11 ERA (79 ER in 116.1 IP) in 23 starts with Triple-A Reno.

DEBUT DETAILS: Made his Major League debut on Aug. 2, 2023 @ Giants and allowed 2 runs in 4.2 IP (4 H, 1 BB, 2 K).

- Alex Young is the only other D-back pitcher to make their big league debut @ Giants on June 27, 2019.
- Became the second D-backs starter to make his debut in 2023... Brandon Pfaadt made his debut on May 3 @ Rangers.

HOW IT STARTED: Selected by the D-backs as a Competitive Balance A selection (33rd overall) in the 2020 draft out of the University of Miami.

- Attended the University of Miami from 2019-2020.
