METS NOTES



Mets: Improved to 16-5 at home, 13-10 in one-run games and 3-2 against San Diego this season...Their 13 one-run wins are tied for the most in the majors...Their .762 winning percentage at home leads MLB.

- Have allowed three runs or fewer in 10 consecutive home games, the longest streak in the majors this season and tied for the longest by the Mets since April 15-May 10, 1992...Have allowed two runs or fewer in 16 of their 21 home games this season.

Jacob deGrom (6.0 IP, H, 10 K): Exited after the sixth with right flexor tendonitis...Extended his scoreless streak to 22.0 innings with his third consecutive scoreless start...Lowered his season ERA to 0.56 (4 ER/64.0 IP) and his WHIP to 0.53, both the lowest ever through 10 starts...Recorded his 51st career double-digit strikeout game.

- Reached 100 strikeouts in just 61.2 innings this season...That is the quickest a starting pitcher has reached 100 strikeouts since the mound moved to its current distance in 1893 (thanks to ESPN Stats & Info).
- Completed his ninth consecutive perfect first inning to begin tonight's start...He is the first Mets starter ever to retire his opponent's 1-2-3 hitters to begin a game nine times in a row...The last pitcher in the majors to accomplish the feat was Yonny Chirinos (May 29-July 12, 2019)...Thanks to Elias for research assistance.
- Lowered his career ERA vs. San Diego to 1.28 (10 ER/70.1 IP).

deGrom at the Plate: Hit a two-run single in the fifth inning to extend New York's lead...He is batting .400 (10-25) and has more RBI (five) than ER allowed (four) this season...He has 10 hits in his first 10 starts...The last pitcher with at least 10 hits in his first 10 games of a season was Dan Haren (11 hits in 2010).

Mets Pitching: The Mets recorded at least 15 strikeouts for the ninth time this year, three more times than any other club.

- New York's starters have a 2.82 ERA (86 ER/274.0 IP) this season, the best mark in the majors.

Edwin Díaz (1.1 IP, H, 2 K): Entered with the tying run on base in the eighth inning and punched out two in the ninth...Recorded his 11th save of the season and his second of more than 1.0 inning.

Billy McKinney (2-3, 2 2B, RBI, R): Broke a scoreless tie in the fifth with an RBI double...Hitting .302 (13-43) since joining the Mets.

- Has 12 RBI and a 1.106 OPS in 13 games with the Mets...His 10 extra-base hits through 13 games with the team are tied for the second-most in club history...Only Pete Alonso (12) had more in his first 13 games as a Met.

Miguel Castro (0.1 IP, 2 H, 2 ER, BB, K): Left the game with a stiff neck...Allowed a two-run home run in the seventh inning.

Aaron Loup (0.2 IP, H, K): Left the game after being struck by a comebacker in the eighth inning.

Jonathan Villar (2-4): Had his fifth multi-hit game in his last 12 appearances...Is batting .366 (15-41) in that span.

Albert Almora Jr.: Went 0-3 and played 5.0 innings in center field tonight for Syracuse (AAA)...He is 1-8 with a home run in three games on his rehab assignment.



PADRES NOTES



Padres: Have lost three straight games...Have lost three in a row to New York after winning their first two matchups of the year.

Jake Cronenworth (1-4, HR, 2 RBI, R): Cut the Padres' deficit to one run with a two-run shot in the seventh inning.

Blake Snell (4.0 IP, 5 H, 3 ER, 3 BB, 4 K): Exited with no outs in the fifth after permitting three runs to score in that inning...Had pitched 4.0 shutout frames prior to that point.
