TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 22, 1959: Whitey Ford pitches a 1-0, 14-inning shutout at Griffith Stadium in Washington (7H, 7BB, 15K). Moose Skowron provides the margin of victory with a solo homer off Chuck Stobbs.

April 22, 1956: Don Larsen earns a no-decision (4.2IP, 4ER) but hits a grand slam in the Yankees' 13-6 win over the Red Sox.

April 22, 1903: The Highlanders play their first-ever game, a 3-1 loss at Washington. The team will go on to finish with a 72-62 record, good for fourth place in the eight-team American League.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 23, 2000: In a 10-7 Yankees win at Toronto, Jorge Posada and Bernie Williams become the first pair of teammates in Major League history to each hit home runs from both sides of the plate in the same game.

April 23, 1903: The Highlanders record the first win in franchise history, a 7-2 victory at Washington. Harry Howell is the winning pitcher.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will continue their seven-game homestand today with the first game of a four-game set vs. Oakland (through Thurs.)...are 2-1 on the homestand after winning two-of-three games vs. Tampa Bay this weekend...after this homestand, will embark on a seven-game road trip to Milwaukee (Fri.-Sun.) and Baltimore (4/29-5/2).

- Have won three of their last four games (since 4/17).
- Their 15-7 record (.682) is the fourth-best record in the Majors, trailing only Cleveland (16-6, .727), Atlanta (14-6, .700) and Milwaukee (14-6, .700)...their 15 wins are the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Cleveland (16).
- Marks just the fifth time in the last 21 years (since 2004) the Yankees have gone 15-7 or better to start a season (also went 16-6 in 2020 and '22 and 15-7 in 2010 and '17).
- *With a win today*, it would also mark just the third time in the last 21 years (since 2004) and the fourth time in the last 26 years (since 2000) the Yankees went 16-7 or better to start a season (went 19-4 in 2003, 17-6 in 2022 and 16-7 in 2020).
- The Yankees are in the midst of a 17-day stretch without an off day (4/19-5/5)...are 2-1 so far.
- Seven of the Yankees' 15 wins are come-from-behind wins... have recorded four wins this season when trailing after six innings...recorded just six such wins in 2023.
- Have won six of their seven series this season.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Rays, 5-4, to clinch a series win on Sunday at Yankee Stadium...**RHP Luis Gil** (5.2IP, 2H, 1R/OER, 3BB, 9K, 0HR, 2BK) started and earned his first win of the year...**1B Anthony Rizzo** (1-for-3, 1R, 1RBI, 1BB) hit an RBI single in the first inning...**LF Alex Verdugo** (3-for-4, 1R, 2RBI) recorded a season-high-tying 3H, including a go-ahead two-run single in the fifth inning...**C Jose Trevino** (1-for-4, 1RBI) and **3B Oswaldo Cabrera** (2-for-4, 1RBI) each hit RBI singles in the fifth inning...**RHP Luke Weaver** (1.1IP, 1K) tossed 1.1 scoreless innings of relief...**RHP Dennis Santana** (1.0IP, 3H, 3R/ER, 1BB, 1K) allowed 3R/ER in the eighth inning...**LHP Victor González** (1.0IP, 1BB, 1K) tossed a scoreless ninth inning to record his second save of the year.

- Improved to 3-0 in rubber games this season and 5-2 following a loss.

ON A ROLL: **C Jose Trevino** hit an RBI single in the fifth inning on Sunday vs. Tampa Bay...has hit safely in each of his last six games, batting .421/.476/.579 (8-for-19) with 3R, 1HR, 6RBI and 2BB over that span (since 4/13).

- Is 5-for-12 (.417) with 6RBI and 2BB with RISP this year... as a Yankee (since 2022), is batting .333 (47-for-141) with 7 doubles, 1 triple, 2HR, 47RBI, 8BB, 2HP and 1SF with RISP.

THREE'S COMPANY: The Yankees are 15-2 this season when scoring at least 3R.

FOR STARTERS: **Yankees starters** have posted a 3.01 ERA (116.2IP, 39ER) in 22 starts this year, the fourth-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (1.73), Philadelphia (2.25) and Kansas City (2.94)...have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 19 of their 22 starts, 2ER-or-fewer in 15 starts and 1ER-or-fewer in 10 starts... have not allowed more than 4ER in any start this season.

- Yankees starters have allowed just 4R/3ER over their last four starts (since 4/17), posting a 1.16 ERA (23.1IP, 3ER) with 27K.

GIL-IN' & DEALIN': **RHP Luis Gil** earned his first win of the year on Sunday vs. Tampa Bay after allowing 1R/OER in 5.2IP... marked his first Major League win since his big league debut on 8/3/21 vs. Baltimore...his 9K were a career high and matched the most by a Yankees starter this year (also Nestor Cortes' 9K on Saturday vs. the Rays).

- Has recorded at least 6K in each of his four starts, posting a 13.27 K/9.OIP ratio (29K/19.2IP).
- Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his four starts this year and 2R-or-fewer in three of those starts, posting a 2.75 ERA (19.2IP, 6ER) this season.
- Allowed just 2H to his 23BF...has allowed 3H-or-fewer in each of his four starts this year, holding opponents to a .125 BA (8-for-64).

WHERE'S WALDO?: INF/OF Oswaldo Cabrera hit an RBI single in the fifth inning on Sunday vs. Tampa Bay...is batting .429/.409/.619 (9-for-21) with 1 double, 1HR, 11RBI and 1SF with RISP this season.

- Has hit safely in 14 of his 18 games this year, batting .303/.338/.500 (20-for-66) with 11R, 4 doubles, 3HR, 14RBI and 4BB.
- Is hitting .316 (6-for-19) with 1 double vs. left-handed pitchers this year.
- Is 4-for-5 (.800) with 1 triple and 1HR against Oakland's LHP JP Sears.

VERDAWGO: OF Alex Verdugo recorded a season-high-tying 3H on Sunday vs. Tampa Bay, including a go-ahead two-run single in the fifth inning...is hitting .357 (15-for-42) with 10R, 6 doubles, 1HR, 4RBI, 6BB, 1HP and 15B over his last 12 games (since 4/8)...has reached base in 11 of those games.

PITCH PERFECT: **Yankees pitchers have posted a 2.99 ERA (198.2IP, 66ER) this year, the third-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (2.52) and Detroit (2.94)**...their 2.99 ERA is their second-lowest through the Yankees' first 22 games of a season in the last 43 years since 1982 (2.72 ERA in 2022).

- Have held opponents to 3R-or-fewer in 13 of 22 games this year (are 10-3 in those games)...are 13-3 this season when holding their opponent to 4R-or-fewer.

CLOSE CALLS: The Yankees have had 14 of their 22 games decided by 2R-or-fewer (are 10-4 in those games)...their 14 such games are the most in the Majors...are 7-2 in one-run games...their nine one-run games are tied with Oakland for the second-most in the Majors (Detroit-10).

- The Yankees have had 17 of their 22 games decided by 3R-or-fewer...their 17 such games are tied with St. Louis and Los Angeles-NL for the most in the Majors...are 11-6 (.647) in those games.
- Each of their last seven games, eight of their last nine games and nine of their last 11 games have been decided by 2R-or-fewer.

PEN PALS: **Yankees relievers** have posted a 2.96 ERA (82.0IP, 27ER) this season, the sixth-lowest ERA in the Majors...trails only Detroit (1.43), Cleveland (2.11), Seattle (2.69), Minnesota (2.84) and New York-NL (2.95).

- The Yankees are 8-0 this season when they lead after six innings, 12-0 when leading after seven innings and 12-0 when leading after eight innings.

THE GREAT JUAN: OF Juan Soto has reached base in each of his last 14 games (since 4/6), reaching base multiple times in nine of those games...**has hit .360/.492/.680 (18-for-50) with 11R, 4 doubles, 4HR, 16RBI, 14BB, 15B and 1SF in that span.**

- **Is batting .529/.609/1.118 (9-for-17) with 1 double, 3HR, 17RBI, 5BB and 1SF with RISP this season**...with RISP, leads the Majors in SLG and OPS (1.726), ranks third in OBP (second in AL) and fourth in BA (second in AL).
- Has reached base safely in 20 of his 22 games this season, hitting .337/.456/.578 (28-for-83) with 14R, 5 doubles, 5HR, 20RBI, 19BB, 15B and 1SF...has reached base multiple times in 14 of those games.
- Is hitting .370/.455/.630 (10-for-27) with 1 double, 2HR and 5BB against left-handed pitching this season.
- Ranks second in the Majors in OBP (.456, first in AL), tied for second in times on base (47, first in AL) and WAR among position players (1.6 - FanGraphs, tied for first in AL), third in walks (19, second in AL), fifth in OPS (1.035, first in AL), tied for sixth in RBI (20, tied for fourth in AL), tied for seventh in multi-hit games (nine, tied for fifth in AL) and tied for ninth in hits (28, tied for fourth in AL)...also ranks fifth in the AL in BA (.337) and seventh in SLG (.578).
- Is only the second Yankee in the last 18 years (since 2007) to reach base at least 47 times in the Yankees' first 22 games of a season, joining Aaron Judge (49TOB in 2018).

BATTERS' EYE: Yankees batters lead the Majors with a 4.12 pitches per plate appearance ratio.

- Lead the Majors with an 8.42 PA/BB ratio (842PA/100BB)...rank first in the AL and second in the Majors with 100BB, trailing only Los Angeles-NL (101BB).

WHAT A RUN: Yankees batters have scored at least 4R in 15 of their 22 games, at least 5R in 13 games and at least 6R in eight games.

MATCHING UP: Since 2022, the Yankees are 10-3 in their last 13 games vs. Oakland...are 16-6 in their last 22 games vs. the A's (since 8/31/19)...have won or split each of their last seven series (5-0-2) against Oakland (since 8/30/19).

- Have won each of their last eight games vs. the A's at Yankee Stadium (since 6/19/21)...are also 10-1 in their last 11 games vs. Oakland at Yankee Stadium (since 8/31/19) and 14-3 in their last 17 games against the A's in the Bronx (since 5/27/17).
- Have won each of their last six series vs. Oakland at Yankee Stadium (since 2017).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP CARLOS RODÓN (1-1, 3.66 ERA)

LHP Carlos Rodón will make his fifth start of the season in today's series opener vs. Oakland...the 31-year-old will make the start on extended five days' rest due to Thursday's team off day...made his fourth start of the season on Tuesday at Toronto, recording his first loss of the season after allowing 3ER in 4.0IP (5H, 4BB, 5K)... **has allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his four starts this season**...in his first season with the Yankees in 2023, went 3-8 with a 6.85 ERA (64.1IP, 65H, 51R/49ER, 28BB, 64K, 15HR) in 14 starts...missed 100 team games due to two injured list stints...since 2021, ranks second in the Majors with a 1.49 K/9.0IP ratio (min. 350.0IP), trailing only Blake Snell (1.78)...is tied for fourth in double-digit strikeout games (17) over that span, trailing only Gerrit Cole (23), Corbin Burnes (20) and Shohei Ohtani (20)...additionally, has recorded at least 10K and OBB in seven games since 2021, tied for the fifth-most such games in the Majors during that stretch, trailing only Jacob deGrom (10), Gerrit Cole (nine), Corbin Burnes (nine) and Kevin Gausman (eight)...has played in parts of 10 Major League seasons with the Chicago-AL (2015-21), San Francisco (2022) and Yankees (2023-24)...has finished in the top-six of Cy Young voting twice (fifth in 2021 and sixth in 2022)...is a two-time All-Star (2021 and 2022)...has made six Opening Day rosters (2016, '19-22, '24)...began the 2017, 2018 and 2023 seasons on the injured list...was originally selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 16th round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft but did not sign and went on to play three seasons at North Carolina State University (2012-14)...was selected by the Chicago White Sox in the first round (third overall) of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft...signed a six-year Major League contract with the Yankees extending through the 2028 season on 12/21/22.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his fourth start of the season on Tuesday at Toronto, recording his first loss of the season after allowing 3ER in 4.0IP (5H, 4BB, 5K)...his 4.0IP marked a season low...allowed a sac fly to Justin Turner in the third inning and a two-run single to Vladimir Guerrero Jr. in the fourth.

2024: Has made four starts this season, going 1-1 with a 3.66 ERA (19.2IP, 22H, 8ER, 11BB, 18K, 2HR)... **has allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his four starts this season.**
 ✦ Earned his first win of the season on 4/9 vs. Miami, allowing 2ER over 6.0IP (5H, 2BB, 6K, 0HR, 1BK).

VS. OAKLAND: In six career starts vs. the Athletics, has gone 4-1 with a 3.19 ERA (36.2IP, 31H, 13ER, 12BB, 36K, 3HR)...will mark his first start vs. the Athletics since 8/6/22 at Oakland with San Francisco (W, 5.1IP, 5H, 1ER, 0BB, 3K, 0HR).

- ✦ Over his last five starts vs. Oakland (since 4/6/16), is 4-1 with a 2.20 ERA (32.2IP, 26H, 8ER, 6BB, 31K, 2HR)...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in all five of those starts and 1R-or-fewer in two of those games.
- ✦ Has made two starts vs. Oakland at home (one in 2018 with Chicago-AL and one in 2022 with San Francisco), going 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA (14.0IP, 10H, 3ER, 2BB, 12K, 1HR).

HOME SWEET HOME: Will make his second home start this season (also 4/9 vs. Miami).

- ✦ Went 1-4 with a 6.15 ERA (33.2IP, 34H, 25R/23ER, 12BB, 25K, 7HR) in seven starts at Yankee Stadium in 2023...tossed 5.0-or-more innings in four of his seven starts.
- ✦ In 81 career games (79 starts) at home, has gone 31-24 with a 3.71 ERA (441.0IP, 387H, 195R/182ER, 165BB, 492K, 50HR).

ALL THAT'S LEFT: In his career, left-handed hitters have hit just .222/.298/.337 (160-for-722)...has also surrendered just 16HR.

- ✦ His 9.94 K/9.0IP ratio since his Major League debut in 2015 ranks fifth among left-handed pitchers in that span, trailing only Chris Sale (11.77), Robbie Ray (11.15), Blake Snell (11.07) and Clayton Kershaw (10.11).
- ✦ Since 2015, his 1,029K are the eighth-most among active left-handed pitchers (on a Major League roster in 2024)...his 24 double-digit strikeout games over that stretch among lefties are the fifth most in the Majors, trailing only Sale (63), Ray (40), Kershaw (39) and Snell (30).

2023: In his first season with the Yankees in 2023, went 3-8 with a 6.85 ERA (64.1IP, 65H, 51R/49ER, 28BB, 64K, 15HR) in 14 starts...missed 100 team games due to two injured list stints.

- ✦ Allowed 4H-or-fewer in nine of his 14 starts.
- ✦ Began the season on the 15-day injured list with a left forearm strain...was transferred to the 60-day injured list on 6/1...missed 88 team games...made three combined rehab starts with Double-A Somerset and High-A Hudson Valley, going 0-1 with a 0.84 ERA (10.2IP, 1ER) and 17K...was returned from rehab and reinstated from the 60-day injured list on 7/7.
- ✦ Made his Yankees debut on 7/7 vs. Chicago-NL (L, 5.1IP, 4H, 2ER, 2BB, 2K, 1HR, 1WP).
- ✦ Earned his first win as a Yankee on 7/26 vs. the Mets after allowing just 1ER over 5.2IP (4H, 3BB, 4K, 0HR, 1HP).
- ✦ Exited his start in the third inning on 8/6 vs. Houston with left hamstring tightness (ND, 2.2IP, 3H, 5ER, 2BB, 5K, 2HR)...was placed on the 15-day injured list on 8/7 with a left hamstring strain...missed 12 team games...was reinstated on 8/22.
- ✦ Took the loss on 9/17 at Pittsburgh despite recording a quality start and notching his 24th career double-digit strikeout game (6.2IP, 6H, 3ER, 0BB, 10K, 1HR, 1WP)...struck out Ke'Bryan Hayes swinging in the fourth inning for his 1,000th career strikeout...his 6.2IP, 10K and 103 pitches were season highs...marked the eighth time in his career he recorded double-digit strikeouts without issuing a walk.

CAREER NOTES: Has played in parts of 10 Major League seasons with Chicago-AL (2015-21), San Francisco (2022) and Yankees (2023-24), going 60-55 with a 3.83 ERA (931.1IP, 818H, 427R/396ER, 358BB, 1,029K, 108HR) in 170 games (165 starts)...is a two-time All-Star (2021 and 2022).

- ✦ Has finished in the top-six of Cy Young voting twice (fifth in 2021 and sixth in 2022).
- ✦ Since 2021, ranks second in the Majors with a 1.49 K/9.0IP ratio (min. 350.0IP), trailing only Blake Snell (1.78)...is tied for fourth in double-digit strikeout games (17) over that span, trailing only Gerrit Cole (23), Corbin Burnes (20) and Shohei Ohtani (20)...additionally, has recorded at least 10K and OBB in seven games since 2021, tied for the fifth-most such games in the Majors during that stretch, trailing only Jacob deGrom (10), Gerrit Cole (nine), Corbin Burnes (nine) and Kevin Gausman (eight).
- ✦ From 2021-22, went 27-13 with two complete games and a 2.67 ERA (310.2IP, 222H, 98R/92ER, 88BB, 422K, 25HR) in 55 combined starts...in that span, led the Majors in K/9.0IP (12.23) and opponents' SLG (.307), ranked second in opponents' BA (.196) and opponents' OPS (.567), third in WAR among pitchers (11.1, FanGraphs), fourth in ERA (2.67), opponents' OBP (.259) and double-digit strikeout games (16), fifth in HR/9.0IP (0.72), tied for sixth in wins and seventh in strikeouts...recorded at least 10K and OBB in six games, the fourth-most such games in the Majors during that stretch...trailed only Jacob deGrom (nine), Gerrit Cole (eight) and Corbin Burnes (eight).
- ✦ Tossed the 20th no-hitter in Chicago White Sox history on 4/14/21 vs. Cleveland, (9.0IP, 7K, 1HP)...retired his first 25BF before hitting Roberto Pérez in the ninth inning...was just the sixth pitcher to throw a no-hitter with the only baserunner reaching on a HBP...was the first no-hitter by a White Sox pitcher since Lucas Giolito's no-hitter on 8/25/20 vs. Pittsburgh...was the first no-hitter by a White Sox left-handed pitcher since Mark Buehrle's perfect game on 7/23/09 vs. Tampa Bay.
- ✦ Signed a six-year Major League contract with the Yankees extending through the 2028 season on 12/21/22.
- ✦ Was originally selected by the Chicago White Sox in the first round (third overall) of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of North Carolina State University.
